Alma Plantation & Sugar Mill Gets into the Rum-Making Business

A wedding celebration in Guatemala became a little sweeter for Cane Land Distilling Company founder Walter Tharp. Tharp's family owns Alma Plantation and Sugar Mill in

Pointe Coupee Parish. He grew up with sugar in his blood. When other sugar mill owners, who also attended the wedding, asked him why he did not make rum since the ingredients were in his backyard,

he did not have an answer. On the trip home, the seed for Cane Land Distilling was planted.

"We have coined the phrase "From Cane to Glass" to describe our spirits. We not only grow the sugarcane in Louisiana, but mill the cane at Alma in Lakeland and distill it in Baton Rouge. We love the fact that we are producing a product that pays homage to the rich history of sugar in our state," said Tharp.

While the idea was planted four years ago, today, the facility is located on St. Philip Street in downtown Baton Rouge. Cane Land Distilling Company's marketing director, Angie Ray, added "We plan to have tours, a tasting room, space for private events and an outdoor courtyard." The tasting room incorporates implements from Alma Plantation in its décor. Blades from a combine hang on the wall, gears from the sugar mill serve as a base for a glass table and lights are made out of discs from plows. While the design reflects the history of the sugar mill, the location in downtown Baton Rouge was a strategic one.

"We definitely wanted our

location to be downtown as a destination for tourists whether they are visiting the state capitol, a museum or the riverboats. Our location is also close to the Mississippi River Bridge so people can come from the west and it's close to LSU, as well," said Ray.

Cane Land's head distiller, Jonny Ver Planck, comes with more than 25 years of rum making experience. He spent six years in the Caribbean but ended up in Missouri where he last distilled rum. "For years I bought all of my sugar products from Louisiana. It is the best quality, and the molasses here is superior," said Ver Planck.

Cane Distilling Company plans to produce a rum agricole, three types of rum, a cane vodka, whiskey and gin. All of the spirits will be made with the freshest ingredients – fresh pressed cane juice & molasses- from Alma Plantation and Sugar Mill. "For example, to create rum agricole, which was originally produced in the Caribbean, you must use the first pressing of cane. The juice starts spoiling immediately, so you only have a few hours to start the fermentation process," added Ver

Planck. "We believe we will be one of the only producers of rum agricole in the continental U.S.," according to Ver Planck.

"With Alma, we are tied to the agriculture of our state and hope every bottle we make does justice to our rich agricultural history, particularly the sugarcane industry," said Ray. Both Ray and Ver Planck stress the importance of knowing where your agricultural products come from and in this case, their products are Louisiana grown and produced.

Cane Distilling Company is scheduled to open in May. Initially, the company will sell its product out of the distillery with plans to start distribution regionally this summer.

Alma Plantation and Sugar Mill is located in Pointe Coupee Parish and has been family owned for more than 150 years. Alma produces over 370 million pounds of sugar, seven million gallons of molasses, and mills approximately 45,000 acres of Louisiana sugarcane from more than 40 farmers from surrounding parishes annually. It is one of only 11 sugar mills still operating in the state of Louisiana.

Strain appointed to national agricultural, science board

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., is the newest member of the Council for Agricultural Science and Technology (CAST) Board of Trustees (BOT). CAST, which is based in Iowa, includes members with agricultural, research, biotechnology, business and nonprofit backgrounds.

CAST addresses issues pertaining to animal sciences, food sciences and agricultural technology, plant and soil sciences, and plant protection sciences through publications. According to its website, CAST has published more than 400 documents that are all reviewed by reputable

scientific experts. As a BOT, Strain will provide an oversight role and will review proposed publications.

“CAST board members are trying to work more closely with state departments of agriculture on issues their publications may be addressing in the future,” said Strain. “I was selected because of my science background as a doctor of veterinary medicine and my focus on the importance of science.”

CAST’s science-based information is made available to policymakers, media, the private sector and the public. CAST BOT members include agricultural experts and academia who share their knowledge and perspectives

concerning emerging issues and challenges facing agriculture and food production systems including policy issues, animal welfare, food safety and security, energy, and the environment.

CAST is a nonprofit organization. It was established in 1972 following a meeting by the National Academy of Sciences.

Some of its member societies include: American Association of Avian Pathologists, American Association of Bovine Practitioners, American Bar Association, Section of Environment, Energy, and Resources–Agricultural Management, American Dairy Science Association, American

Meat Science Association, American Meteorological Society, Committee on Agricultural and Forest Meteorology, American Society for Nutrition, American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers, American Society of Animal Science, American Society of Plant Biologists and the American Veterinary Medical Association.

Nonprofit Organizations include: American Farm Bureau Federation, Animal Agriculture Alliance, Animal Health Institute, Biotechnology Industry Organization and Crop Life America.

Strain issues emergency rule to protect rice industry

LDAF Seed Lab discovery prevents significant rice losses

Baton Rouge, LA (February 20, 2017) – Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., issued an Emergency Rule Friday relative to the sale of seed rice which does not meet germination standards. Germination is the process by which a plant grows from a seed.

“While performing routine tests like purity and germination on seed rice, the LDAF Seed Lab discovered the quality was significantly negatively impacted during the historic 2016 flooding in rice production areas,” Strain said.

Most seed rice available to Louisiana growers is certified and is

required to possess a higher purity and germination quality percentage (80 percent) than non-certified seed rice (60 percent). The LDAF Seed Programs Division administers the state’s Seed Certification Program.

“After testing numerous seed rice samples, our seed analysts confirmed that much of the seed rice available to producers for the 2017 planting season does not meet the current minimum certified seed germination standard. Had we not discovered this, it could have resulted in a significant shortage of rice for the 2017 planting season and a more than \$100 million loss for our rice farmers. It could have also put some of our rice farmers

out of business,” said Strain.

The Emergency Rule allows the germination standards to be temporarily lowered for 120 days to allow more seed rice to be made available to farmers to plant.

Louisiana rice farmers produce some of the highest quality rice in the world because of our rigorous standards. Even though the germination is lower, it will still produce a healthy product. This allows our farmers to adjust their planting rates to produce enough rice to sell and get through the 2017 planting season which could have been ruined had our analysts not made this discovery,” added Strain.

According to the LSU AgCenter,

there are 1,024 rice producers in the state. Rice planting season typically starts in March. Rice is an approximately \$482,000,000 industry in the state of Louisiana.
