Pointe Coupee Pecan Company

Fall is a busy time for Pointe Coupee Pecan Company. That's when they harvest pecans - the sweet, subtle, smooth flavored nut that has been their family business for more than 100 years.

"My great grandfather had a small grocery in New Roads, La. where he shelled pecans. The business grew from there," said Myles Bergeron. Bergeron Pecans is what it is known as now. The business started in 1910.

In 1990, part of the Bergeron family branched off and started Pointe Coupee Pecan Company. "We focus more on gourmet style treats. We started with sugar coated pecans, then roasted, chocolate and even spicy," said Sharon Bergeron. "We specialize in flavored pecans which people tend to use for gifts."

Pointe Coupee Pecan's most recent creation is their pecan oil. "We're not the first people to create pecan oil, but we felt we could create a gourmet oil that has a pecan taste," added Myles. "We give all of the credit to my dad, Donald Lee Bergeron, who is really forward thinking."

Donald Lee's wife, Sharon, says the oil is versatile and the pecan, buttery flavor blends nicely on salads and fish. "Anything you put butter or olive oil on, you can use pecan oil. It's healthier, too, because it has less saturated fat," she added.

Pointe Coupee Pecan is truly a family business.

Their orchards are located near False River in Pointe Coupee Parish. "We treat our customers, employees and vendors like family. That's helped us stay in business," said Myles.

Sharon and Myles said the demand for pecans is high in the south and call it a "Southern thing."

"Who doesn't like pecans or pecan pie," added Sharon. But while Georgia and Texas are the biggest pecan suppliers, they said their competitors are buying their pecan oil because it is just that good and they consider that a great compliment.

"There is a difference in the pecans you find in different states. Texas pecans are bigger and dryer. Georgia pecans tend to be bigger, as well, but Louisiana pecans are richer and oilier," added Myles.

You can find Pointe Coupee pecans and the pecan oil in local grocery stores. Their products can also be purchased on their website (www.PCpecan.com) or picked up from their retail facility located in Port Allen, just across the bridge from Baton Rouge.

Pointe Coupee Pecan is working toward selling pecan pies and pecan flour, but as in all of their products, they have certain expectations. "It's taking a little while to work out the logistics, but as we grow our product line, we want it done the right way. That is most important to us," said Myles.

USDA designates natural disaster areas

Ten parishes are eligible for disaster assistance as a result of extreme and continuous rainfall in 2017 according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), said Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

The parishes, which are contiguous to primary natural disaster areas in Mississippi

include: Concordia, East Carroll, East Feliciana, Madison, St. Helena, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, Tensas, Washington and West Feliciana.

“The USDA determined there was significant crop loss from excessive rainfall and flooding that occurred starting in April,” said Strain.

Strain said farmers located in

these parishes are eligible for low-interest emergency loans from the Farm Service Agency (FSA) provided eligibility requirements are met. Farmers in eligible areas have eight months from the disaster declaration date to apply for emergency loans to help cover losses.

The parishes listed were designated natural disaster areas

on September 29, 2017.

FSA has a variety of programs, in addition to the emergency loan program, to help eligible farmers recover from adversity. For more information, farmers and ranchers may contact their local parish FSA office. Additional information is also available online at <http://disaster.fsa.usda.gov>.

PSA grower training, optional GAPs Food Safety Plan writing workshop set for Nov., Dec.

Fruit and vegetable growers and others interested in learning about produce safety, the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) Produce Safety Rule, Good Agricultural Practices (GAPs) and co-management of natural resources and food safety should attend this food safety training. The two-day training will be offered on Nov. 14-15 in Lafayette and Dec. 7-8 in Oak Grove.

The PSA Grower Training Course is one way to satisfy the FSMA Produce Safety Rule requirement outlined in section 112.22(c) that requires At least one supervisor or responsible party for your farm must have successfully completed food safety training at least equivalent to that received under standardized curriculum recognized as adequate by the Food and Drug Administration.

Fresh produce growers, packers, and processors and extension agents are encouraged to take this opportunity to learn more about GAPs and GHPs. Although this is not a requirement of FSMA, it is for those being asked by their buyers to have a food safety plan and undergo a 3rd-party audit. Financial assistance in the form of a cost reimbursement program will be established and will support 75% (up to \$1000) of the auditing fees associated with GAPs certification for a minimum of 25 producers. Producers attending this workshop will be eligible for the cost reimbursement program on a first come first served basis.

37 receive Master Cattleman certification

(10/20/17) ALEXANDRIA, La. — Thirty-seven central Louisiana cattle producers and other industry professionals were recognized Oct. 19 for completing a Louisiana Master Cattleman course hosted by the LSU AgCenter.

The graduates of the program — which teaches ways to raise cattle profitably and sustainably — received certificates at a ceremony held during a cattle and forage field day at the AgCenter Dean Lee Research and Extension Center near Alexandria.

AgCenter agent Vince Deshotel, who coordinates the Master Cattleman program in the AgCenter Central Region, said members of the class come from 10 parishes. A total of 117 people have completed the program in central Louisiana since 2014.

“We’re quite proud of that,” Deshotel said.

To earn the Master Cattleman designation, program participants must attend 30 hours of classroom lessons, most of which are taught by

AgCenter personnel. They cover topics such as animal health, nutrition, handling practices, pasture management, marketing and reproduction.

“There’s always something new to learn,” Deshotel said. “We cover just about all the facets of beef cattle production in Louisiana.”

The program attracts people who are new to the cattle industry and seasoned producers alike, Deshotel said, adding that some have gone through the program as many as four times.
