An Old Cotton Gin Gets New Life

There isn't much in Dixie, La. but a whole lot of farmland. However, an old cotton gin, now called the Dixie Gin, has breathed new life into the serene area. Just a few miles from downtown Shreveport, the old cotton gin, which operated as such until 1997, now serves as a wedding destination.

"This was really supposed to be a hobby, but it turned




into a full-time job," said Lauren Allen, co-owner of Dixie Gin Productions.

Allen and her business partner, Ginger Stone, started leasing the facility back in 2008. Up until then, it was being used as a storage facility by its owner.

"I knew about the building because I would hold an annual 4th of July party at the location. That's where Lauren and I met," added Stone.

A discussion about party planning quickly turned into

a reality and Allen and Stone found themselves in business. They mainly booked children's parties at first but then someone booked a wedding.

"That changed everything. We planned two weddings that first year. We now handle up to 50 weddings a year," said Allen.

The two women are clearly amazed and appreciative

of their success, but what's also clear is that they have learned a lot along the way. Allen's husband, Kyh, is a local farmer who grows cotton, soybeans and wheat. Stone's husband, John, has cattle and grows corn, soybeans and watermelons.

"It's nice that our husbands are farmers," said Allen. "They work all the time, so they understand when we are working long hours and weekends to make sure an event goes off without a hitch. As farmer's wives, we understand you don't get time off at either of our businesses."

Allen laughed as she recalled a young bride requesting that the cows not "moo" during the ceremony. Stone added, "Our agriculture background also helps us explain to our clients that a tractor may be passing by during the ceremony and the cows sometimes participate in the ceremony. There are some things that will be beyond our control."

People have come from all over the country — Arkansas, California, Hawaii, New Jersey, Texas and Washington — to get married at the Dixie Gin. It also brings exposure and visitors to North Louisiana. One of those visitors was a Hollywood casting director who found the Dixie Gin on the internet and decided to marry there.

"We never dreamed this would take off. I remember when we were discussing going into business together


Strain Urges Public Not to Move Firewood

Laurel Wilt Disease and the Redbay Ambrosia Beetle Confirmed in North Louisiana

The Redbay Ambrosia beetle and the tree killing fungus it transmits, Laurel wilt, are now confirmed in Union Parish, La. Laurel wilt, also called Laurel wilt disease, is a vascular disease of trees caused by the fungus *Raffaelea lauricola*.

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) was notified of dying Sassafras trees on a private landowner's property in August. LDAF, members of USDA U.S. Forest Service (USFS) and Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) assessed the property near Bernice, La.

Funnel traps baited with beetle attractants were installed at the site and tree tissue samples were collect-



ed and sent off for analysis. Beetle specimens from the traps were collected and confirmed as the Redbay Ambrosia beetle. Officials also confirmed the disease as Laurel wilt disease.

The Redbay Ambrosia beetle is a non-native pest that attacks the Laurel family of trees, which include the Red Bay, Sassafras, Spicebush and Camphor trees. The beetle is believed to have been introduced to the U.S. through solid



wood packing material imported from Southeast Asia. The beetle is very small, about 2 mm in length, and dark brown to black in color. The beetles feed on the fungus that is associated with Laurel wilt disease.

Laurel wilt disease is spread two ways:

- Through the beetle's natural reproduction and migration
- Through the sale and transport

of beetle infested wood such as logging and firewood.

"The message we're trying to get out to people is to buy or obtain firewood in the same regional area where they plan to use it. A lot of forest pests can travel long distances hidden in firewood. It is best to dispose of infected wood by cutting, chipping or burning it on site through prescribed burning," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

Symptoms of Laurel wilt disease are dieback and drooping foliage with a reddish or purplish discoloration in the crown of the tree. Removal of tree bark reveals a black discoloration in the outer sapwood. Evidence of the ambrosia beetle can be seen in the tree stem. The beetles bore into the wood and symptoms

gradually progress until the tree dies.

Crawfish Elegante

- 3 tablespoon sherry
- Salt and red pepper to taste

In one skillet, sauté crawfish in ½ stick of butter for 10 to 15 minutes. In a second skillet, sauté onions and parsley in one stick of butter. Blend in flour and gradually add half and half stirring constantly to make a thick sauce. Add sherry and crawfish tails. Season with salt and pepper to taste. This may be used with pasta, in patty shells, in a chafing dish with Melba toast or over chicken, fish or steaks.

Sweet Potato And Crawfish/Shrimp Bisque

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 ½ cups chopped onion
- 1 ½ cups chopped green bell pepper
- 1 ½ cup chopped celery
- 1 teaspoon minced garlic
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/8 cup molasses
- 1/2 teaspoon ground curry powder
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 1 (15-ounce) can sweet potatoes (yams), drained, or
- 1 cup fresh sweet potatoes, cooked, mashed
- 1/2 cup Half & Half
- 1 pound crawfish tails or cleaned shrimp
- Salt and pepper to taste
- *Option: Green onions for garnish

In large nonstick pot coated with nonstick cooking spray, heat oil, sauté' onion, green pepper, celery, garlic until tender, 7-10 minutes.

Stir in flour, stir one minute. Add molasses, curry, chicken broth, and sweet potatoes, bring to a boil.

Reduce heat; cook 10-15 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Add Half & Half, crawfish and season to taste.

Continue cooking 5 more minutes or until heated thoroughly.

Makes 8 (1-cup) servings.

Option: Garnish with green onions.

Ham And Cheese Rolls Purse Pockets

- 4 packs dinner rolls
- 2 pounds ham
- 2 cups grated cheddar cheese
- 2 cups grated Swiss cheese
- 2 sticks butter
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 3 tablespoons poppy seeds

- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

Slice rolls in half. Place ham and cheese on the bottom half and replace the top half.

Plants can be protected from frost, freeze damage

BATON ROUGE – Early freezing temperatures this year are causing concern among Louisiana homeowners and gardeners.

“If you look around at some of our landscapes, particularly in south Louisiana, you would think we live in the tropics,” said LSU AgCenter horticulturist Dan Gill. “Indeed, some winters the temperature never does dip much below the mid- to upper 20s, allowing tropical plants to survive.”

This year, however, the looming freeze means people have to take action.

“All it takes is one night of temperatures in the low 20s or teens to severely damage or kill many tropicals,” Gill said.

Plants come in different degrees of hardiness, Gill said. A plant that will tolerate a temperature of 15 degrees is hardier than one that will be killed at temperatures below 25 degrees.

“Our commonly used landscape plants, including trees, shrubs, ground covers, lawns and vines, are hardy to at least 10 or 15 degrees and will not be damaged by typical winter weather,” he said.

“Basically, a plant is considered hardy if it can reliably survive winter temperatures where you garden with no protection or, at most, some mulch,” Gill said. “On the other

hand, a plant is considered tender when it will not reliably survive winter temperatures where you garden without extensive protection.”

Freezes can be characterized as radiational or advective.

Radiational freezes or frosts occur on calm, clear nights when heat radiates from surfaces of objects. These freezes are generally considered light and primarily damage the foliage of tropicals.

Plant damage from a radiational freeze can be minimized by reducing radiant heat loss from plants by covering them.

Advective freezes occur when cold air masses move down from northern regions causing a drastic drop in temperature. The conditions are quite different from a radiational freeze. Temperatures tend to be much lower and are liable to last longer during advective freezes, and protecting plants is more difficult.

A gradual decrease in temperature over a period of time will harden off plants allowing them to withstand freezing temperatures better, Gill said. “A sudden drop to below-freezing temperatures as we’re having now may cause damage even to hardy plants that might otherwise have suffered little or no damage.”

This is not true for especially tender tropical plants, though, because they can’t tolerate freezing tempera-

tures in any circumstances.

Finally, plants do not “feel” wind chill. “Do not focus on wind chill temperatures – it is the actual temperature you need to pay attention to,” Gill said.

Three ways to protect plants from freeze damage include moving them inside, mulching them or covering them, Gill said.

Move all tender plants in containers and hanging baskets into buildings where the temperature will stay above freezing. If this is not possible, group all container plants in a protected area – such as the inside corner of a covered patio – and cover them with plastic.

For plants growing in the ground, mulches can help protect them. “Use a loose, dry material such as pine straw or leaves,” Gill said. Because mulches will only protect what they cover, they are best used to protect below-ground parts or crowns or to completely cover low-growing plants to a depth of 4 inches.

“Leave mulch that completely covers plants in place no more than three or four days,” he said. “Mulch at the base of a plant can remain in place all winter.”

If they are not too large, individual plants can be protected by covering them with various sized cardboard or plastic foam boxes. Larger plants can be protected by covering them with fabric or plastic.

Covers will work best for radiational freezes by preventing or blocking heat loss. Even with protection, many plants may still die during extreme, prolonged cold that occurs during advective freezes.

“If you are growing vegetables, harvest any broccoli, cauliflower, fava beans or peas that are ready,” Gill said. Freezing temperatures will

not hurt the plants but can damage the heads, pods and flowers. Also, harvest any ripe citrus fruit prior to a hard freeze.

When it comes to citrus, protection becomes important when severe freezes occur. Determining what to do depends on the type and age of the tree, the expected low temperature and the expected duration of the freeze, Gill said.

Satsumas, for example, do not need protection until the temperatures approach 20 degrees. Lemons, limes and oranges generally need to be protected when the temperature dips below 26 degrees.

Any of these trees, however, may be killed or damaged at these temperatures if they are not sufficiently

hardened, Gill said. Hardening occurs when trees are gradually exposed to cooler temperatures and become more tolerant to freezing temperatures. So chilly but above-freezing nights during fall and early winter before major freezes make the trees more cold-tolerant.

The length of time citrus trees are exposed to sub-freezing temperatures is also significant. “If the temperature is below freezing for 24 to 36 hours, damage can usually be expected,” Gill said.

All ripe fruit should be harvested if a significant freeze is expected. Temperatures cold enough to damage the tree will also ruin the fruit. It takes temperatures in the mid- to low 20s five to 10 hours to freeze the fruit.

and my goal was to not have to drive into town for my job. I never ever thought we’d have the business we do,” said Allen.

Most of their business comes to them word of mouth. For the first two years, they put everything they earned back into the business. They didn’t even have a decent bathroom in the gin when they first started. Now there’s a kitchen area for the caterer, a covered area for the ceremony which includes church pews for guests to sit, and over time, they’ve added a bar, new doors and exquisite lighting that adds to the ambiance of the setting. The old loading dock serves as a dance floor, and they still use the gin’s original fans.

The original gin dates back to the 1800s and was a wooden building that kept burning down until it was rebuilt as a metal structure in 1953. While Allen and Stone say they would love to have another facility as historical, quaint and charming as the Dixie Gin, they hope for continued suc-



cess with their current location.

“We meet so many different people here. People just love it here,” said Allen. Stone agreed, “It’s amazing the different people we meet. A couple just stopped by one day because they liked the building and simply wanted to sit outside and have a picnic.”

Besides weddings and receptions, the Dixie Gin can be the location for birthday parties, reunions, corporate functions, rehearsal dinners,

crawfish boils, anniversaries and school functions. The facility has been featured in Southern Weddings, Weddings Unveiled and Bayou Life magazines as well as greenweddingshoes.com and stylemepretty.com.
