



Planting seeds of change at LCIW

For Willie Sims and his horticulture students, failure is not an option. “My students are the leaders of the institution and this is my ministry.” Sims is a licensed horti-

culturist and instructor at the Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women located in St. Gabriel where he spends his days teaching them how to grow and care for

plant life.

“My students learn everything from greenhouse crop production, fruits and vegetable production to pest control and landscaping,” said Sims.

Through this program and at their own expense, students can obtain various licenses through the Department of Agriculture, such as Louisiana Nurseryman, Herbicide, Pesticide and Landscape/Irrigation.

A small group of Sims’ students joined him to discuss the horticulture program and how they plan to use their new skills and knowledge when they are released from prison.

“Being a convicted felon, it’s hard to get a job, but with horticulture, you have more opportunities to work,” said Jessica Giavotella. “I feel like we can be successful despite our past.”

That is the goal of the program. Jeanne Ray has spent 18 years behind bars and is nearing her release date. Her goal is to be in business for herself when she goes back home to Jonesboro. “By the time I get out, I will have all of my

licenses. I will be qualified to handle greenhouse production, irrigation, pesticide related matters, you name it.” Ray says she has grown to love the horticulture industry and has embraced it so much, she prides herself in being able to identify all plants.

Melissa Porche says she knew the value of the program early on and it took four years on a waiting list before she was able to join the class. Now, she even serves as a certified tutor. “This program is truly designed to help people get jobs. I’ll never leave horticulture. This is something I’ll never give up on even if it is just a hobby.” Porche says her future plans include starting a horticulture program in another prison one day.

Sims supports his students every step of the way. “I want to see these women have a chance and succeed in life when they are released. We lack females in the green industry. Once they secure their GED and get into one of these programs at the prison, they are on their way to achieving their goals,” added Sims.

Ray said, “It’s awesome to be a

part of this program. You can read something in a book, but when you get to apply what you learn, it becomes more meaningful.”

The students take care of the greenhouses, landscaping and all the food and plants grown on the grounds.

Jill Hillshire, who has a college degree and was a counselor by profession before she went to prison, said, “I never dreamed I’d learn as much as I have.” Hillshire plans to become an arborist and start a tree removal service in Mississippi upon her release. “Women start the program and you can see their self-esteem grow.”

Giavotella added, “I went to nursing school before I came to jail. I lost all that, but I related botany to my nursing career. We need to leave with a sense of accomplishment. I’ve started liking myself more. It’s done more for me than just an education.”

The students also participate in a horticulture therapy program for inmates with special needs. Plants are provided to those inmates so they can care for them. “They’ll *See LCIW, cont’d. on page 16*

Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

A message from the USDA

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Secretary Tom Vilsack recently announced that more than 23,000 of the nation's dairy operations - over half of all dairy farms in America - have enrolled in the new safety-net program created by the 2014 Farm Bill, known as the Margin Protection Program. The voluntary program provides financial assistance to participating farmers when the margin - the difference between the price of milk and feed costs - falls below the coverage level selected by the farmer.

"Enrollment far exceeded our expectations in the first year,"

said Vilsack. "We're pleased that so many dairy producers are taking advantage of the expanded protection. USDA conducted a lot of outreach to get the word out. When you compare the initial enrollment rate for the Margin Protection Program to the long-standing federal crop insurance program, where participation ranges from 30 percent to 80 percent depending on the crop, it's clear that these outreach efforts made a difference."

During the three months of the enrollment period, USDA conducted a robust education and outreach effort to the nation's

dairy producers. The department held over 500 public meetings, sent out nearly 60,000 direct mailings, and conducted more than 400 demonstrations of the Web-based tool designed to help applicants to calculate their specific coverage needs.

Unlike earlier dairy programs, the Margin Protection Program offers dairy producers a range of choices of protection that are best suited for their operation. Starting with basic coverage for an administrative fee of \$100, producers can select higher levels of coverage at affordable incremental premiums. More than half of appli-

cants selected higher coverage beyond the basic level.

Louisiana has 61% of dairies currently enrolled in the Margin Protection Program.

Dairy producers interested in enrolling in the Margin Protection Program for calendar year 2016 can register between July 1, 2015 and Sept. 30, 2015.

GAPs and GHPs Workshops offered February 2015

Fresh produce food safety has emerged as a critical agricultural issue and often presents a significant financial threat to specialty crop producers. The adoption of on-farm food safety practices will assist producers in managing risk and regulatory changes. The LSU AgCenter is hosting a series of FREE Good Agricultural Practices (GAPs) and Good Handling Practices (GHPs) workshops to assist growers with implementing and adopting GAPs.

Who should attend? Fresh produce growers, and processors and extension agents are encouraged attend these workshops. Financial assistance in the form of a cost reimbursement program will be established and will support 75 percent (up to \$1000) of the auditing fees associated with GAPs certification for a minimum of 25 producers. Producers attending both workshops will be eligible for the cost reimbursement program on a first come first served basis.

Why attend? These workshops will help fresh produce growers understand food safety risks on the farm and to develop an on-farm food safety plan. Topics include water quality and management, manure management, harvesting and storage, worker health and hygiene and recordkeeping systems. Attendees will receive a certificate of attendance of GAPs/GHPs workshop.

put them in clear cups so they can watch them root and grow. It makes them feel needed," said Hillshire.

Another benefit from the program includes practical skills the women learn such as how to work with one another and even how to supervise a group to get a job done. For inmates such as Jeanne Ray, she knows she and the rest of the women she works beside look forward to living productive lives. "This program has changed my perspective on a lot of things. You can start out knowing nothing and end up knowing a lot. I want to change someone's life one day," she added.

The women plan to give back to the community, such as food

banks, by donating what they grow in their gardens. They also use what they produce in the garden in the culinary school at the prison. Eventually, they say they want to farm weed grass to use toward the state's coastal erosion efforts.

In addition to horticulture, LCIW offers job training in upholstery, welding, drafting and design and culinary arts accredited through Baton Rouge Community College.

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry has provided continuous support for the program for more than 25 years through commercial pesticide applicator and horticulture professional examination administration.

USDA selects first projects of new, innovative program

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack announced Jan. 14, 2015, 100 high-impact projects across all 50 states, including Louisiana, will receive more than \$370 million as part of the new Regional conservation Partnership Program.

RCPP's focus on public-private partnership enables private companies, local communities and other non-govern-

ment partners a way to invest in efforts to keep our land resilient and water clean, and promote tremendous economic growth in agriculture, construction, tourism and outdoor recreation, and other industries.

This year's projects in Louisiana will accomplish a wide diversity of agriculture and natural resource goals from improving soil health and water quality on working lands across the state to providing quality wildlife habitat for migratory birds and at-risk species in the longleaf pine areas of the state.

"Partners are seeing the value of conservation and investing in their future," Vilsack said. "These partnerships are forging a new path for getting conservation on the ground and are providing opportunities for communities to have a voice and ownership in protecting and improving our natural resources. The Regional Conservation Partnership Program ushers in a new era of conservation, and we're excited about the down-the-road benefits from this new Farm Bill program."

This year's projects will engage hundreds of partners with wide-ranging interests, including communities, conservation districts, agribusiness, non-government organizations, for-profit and non-profit organizations, state and federal agencies and Tribal governments. In addition to USDA funds, partners will contribute an estimated \$400 million, more than doubling USDA's investment.

"RCPP puts our partners in the driver's seat for advancing conservation with private lands agriculture producers," said Kevin Norton, USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service state conservationist in Louisiana. "Projects are led locally and demonstrate the value of strong public-private partnerships working hand in hand with agriculture and forest producers that deliver solutions to tough natural resource challenges."

A project sponsored by the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Office of Soil and Water Conservation and its partners will conduct on-farm assessments in targeted watersheds to help producers identify concerns and potential solutions through resource management plans developed to conserve and sustain soil health, water quality and water quantity on working lands. "This is a good example of state and federal agencies working together, combining limited resources to provide additional opportunities for Louisiana agriculture," said LDAF Commissioner

Mike Strain. "By pooling our financial and technical resources, we are increasing the capacity to deliver the services that the Louisiana farmers and ranchers have told us they want and need to increase their stewardship and ensure the longevity of their operations."

A second project sponsored by Ducks Unlimited, Inc. and other collaborating partners will expand the Rice Stewardship Program that is assisting rice growers with water quality improvements on working rice farms. "Rice growers have long recognized and celebrated the relationship between productive ag lands and quality migratory bird habitat," said Jeffery Sylvester, Evangeline Parish rice producer and president of the Louisiana Rice Growers Association. "The Rice Stewardship Program provides growers additional resources to improve the sustainability of their farms."

Alicia Wiseman, Rice Stewardship Program coordinator with DU said "RCPP provides an ideal opportunity for Ducks Unlimited and our partners to accelerate delivery of conservation on working lands through the Rice Stewardship Program in southwest Louisiana. This project will improve water quality and as a result, wetland habitat on more than 11,000 acres, all while keeping working rice lands in production. It is a win for the producers, the community, the environment, and of course, for the ducks."

More than 600 pre-proposals were submitted for RCPP in 2014. Of those, more than 200 were invited to submit full proposals. "With so many strong project proposals, the project selection process was extremely competitive. RCPP is a 5-year \$1.2 billion USDA commitment; projects not selected in this first year may be eligible in subsequent years," Norton said.
