



Farewell
Michael Danna 1960-2015

Ag journalist, TV host, dies at 54

Michael Danna, director of public relations for the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation and host of the organization's long-running agricultural television program "This Week in Louisiana Agriculture" died Friday, March 6, 2015, in Baton Rouge. He was 54.

Mike is survived by his loving wife Rene'e Hafford Danna of Port Allen; two children, Chase Michael Danna and Taylor Lynn Danna, both of St. Francisville; his mother,

Amelia Danna of Baker; one sister, Tammy Danna of Zachary; his "Nannie," aunt Rose Marie Danna of Baker and two step sons, Nicholas LaCour of Port Allen and Dillon Couvillon of Astoria, NY. He is preceded in death by his father, Nicky Danna of Baker and his maternal and paternal grandparents, Nicholas and Lelia Soulier of Rougon and Tony and Katie Danna of Baker.

Thousands of years. That's how long Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., says mankind has been farming. Earlier this month, three distinguished individuals, one posthumously, were inducted into the Louisiana Agriculture Hall of Distinction in Baton Rouge, La.

"Tonight, we are here to honor three men of distinction, to reflect on their lives and accomplishments. These are men who are committed to their families, their communities and to agriculture," said Strain.

For 97 year old **Lucien Laborde** of Hamburg, La., this isn't the first time he has been recognized for farming. He was first honored in 1933 as Outstanding Future Farmer of Louisiana. Laborde, however, has served his country in many ways. While in the U.S. Army during World War II, he landed on Omaha Beach on D-Day and earned a Bronze Star and French Rois De Guerre citation for his brave service. He completed his Army service as Lieutenant Colonel and served in the National Guard after returning to Louisiana, as well as continuing his work as an agriculture producer.

"It's been my privilege to take part in this over the years and I've tried to instill this in my family," Laborde tearfully said when he received his award at the Hall of Distinction banquet.

Laborde is committed to soil, water and wildlife

conservation. The cattle and seed farmer is also a supporter of higher education, having served as director of the LSU Foundation and as the first president of the LSU-Alexandria Foundation.

Another inductee, longtime rice grower **Jimmy Hoppe** of Iowa, La. told those in attendance, "The best part of agriculture is working side by side with others in agriculture and being able to provide for the consumer." Upon receiving his award, Hoppe also said, "We're always out there fighting every day for the best production we can do and only God can help that."

Hoppe is a third-generation grower who retired in 2012, although he still runs his specialty rice-packaging business. He learned the value of service and leadership as a state officer in the Future Farmers of America organization in high school.

Hoppe is known for his advocacy of sustainable environmental practices and efficient use of resources. He was named U.S. Rice Farmer of the Year in 1999 and a 2007 International Rice Festival honoree, he is also known for his contributions in cutting-edge agricultural research and working with the LSU AgCenter Rice Research Station.

Hoppe gives back to his community and state in many ways. He organized relief missions to help southwest Louisiana farms affected by hurricanes Katrina and Rita. In addition, he is an active mentor, *See HOD, continued on page 20*

Grant Parish man arrested for arson

A Dry Prong man is accused of burning a debris pile and intentionally allowing the fire to spread to adjacent lands where a residence was burned. The incident happened Feb. 14, 2015 on Gator Hole Road in Dry Prong.

Investigators with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) arrested 50-year-old Ronald

Bonicard on Feb. 27 and charged him with simple arson.

“A pilot in our forestry division was patrolling the area and witnessed someone setting the fire. Our pilots patrol the state daily looking for suspicious activity. Using the information provided by the pilot, the State Fire Marshal’s Office assisted us in identifying Bonicard,” said

LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

Bonicard was booked into the Grant Parish Jail and was released on \$7,500 bond. Investigators say while Bonicard was in custody, he admitted starting the fire and watching without taking any action as the fire spread and consumed a nearby residence. No word yet on the

estimated cost of the damage to the home.

According to L.A.R.S. 14:52 B, whoever commits the crime of simple arson, where the damage done amounts to five hundred dollars or more, shall be fined not more than fifteen thousand dollars and imprisoned at hard labor for not less than two years nor more than fifteen years.



Experts tell cattle producers how to keep herds healthier

JEANERETTE, La. – Cattle producers attending the Acadiana Beef Cattle Producers Field Day at the LSU AgCenter Iberia Research Station on March 7 heard about practices that could result in healthier and more profitable herds.

Jacques Fuselier, LSU School of Veterinary Medicine professor, said administering certain vaccines to a calf can be done too soon. He said the minimum age is 4 months, and boosters will be needed after at least 21 days. The producer's herd veterinarian will be able to design a protocol that best fits a specific herd, he said.

Fuselier also said needles should be changed for each animal.

Parasites are becoming resistant to dewormers, he said, and giving cattle dewormers too often or at the wrong time of the year will only increase resistance.

Guillermo Scaglia, LSU AgCenter beef cattle researcher, said overfeeding bulls can decrease their semen production.

Scaglia said bulls can gain 1-1.5 pounds per day on good hay and 2-2.5 pounds per day on winter annual grass. However, 700- to 900-pound bulls will need to be supplemented if grazing summer perennial grasses.

Mineral needs should not be overlooked, he said.

"You can't be cheap when feeding minerals to bulls. There are too many things that can go wrong if they have any mineral deficiency," he said.

He said that the 60-day period before breeding season is the most important time. Bulls at this time should get well adapted to the environment. "If they were on a high concentrate diet – gaining 3-4 pounds per day – make sure you switch their diet gradually, tapering their corn-based feed by 20 percent each week, so they 'harden up' for breeding," he said.

Scaglia also discussed the use of EPD (Expected Progeny Difference), which is the expected difference in the performance of the calves from a bull compared to another bull's calves. It is a tool to aid in bull selection.

"It is OK to visually select your bulls, but EPDs will help you make an even better decision," he said.

Scaglia is conducting a research project comparing two purebred Brangus herds – one with a low input cost with a stocking rate at 0.5 cows per acre (breeding season of 90 days) and another with a higher input expense at a greater stocking rate of 0.75 cows per acre (breeding season of 60 days). However, all of the animals are under the same health protocol receiving the same vaccines and deworming treatments, he said.

The expense of the high-input group is \$346 per cow, compared to \$307 for the low-input group, he said. But so far, the high-input group is providing an increased return on the investment. He said the study, in its first year, will be continued for several years.

LSU AgCenter county agents Stan Dutile and Andrew Granger demonstrated cattle handling techniques that emphasize a calm, gentle manner. An electric cattle prod should be avoided as much as possible, Dutile said. "We should always avoid handling cattle when we are in a rush."

Moving cattle into a pen is easier if a gate is located in a corner, he said.

Pushing cattle from behind is more difficult because the animals want to turn and see what is approaching them. "You need to stay out to the side where they can see you," he said.

Dutile demonstrated using a four-wheeler to move cattle by driving the vehicle side to side in sweeping passes to push a herd.

Granger said the four-wheeler mimics the action of a predator, and moving to the outside of the herd allows the animals to get a view of what is approaching them.

Ed Twidwell, LSU AgCenter forage specialist, showed the results of a test of 35 ryegrass varieties. He said varieties with twice the amount of chromosomes, called tetraploids, are being advertised as having potentially higher yields than normal diploid varieties. But research results from several states have shown only minor yield differences between the two types. Producers should evaluate ryegrass varieties on yield performance, disease resistance and maturity.

Blair Hebert, LSU AgCenter county

agent, demonstrated calibrating small spray rigs for herbicide applications. He said calibration can save money, and it should be done regularly. "It's a good idea throughout the year."

He also said spray tips should be cleaned or changed regularly.

Phil Elzer, LSU AgCenter associate vice chancellor for animal programs, said this year's state budget problems facing the LSU AgCenter are daunting.

"This is the scariest I've seen," he said, adding that legislators should be informed of the potential effects the proposed cuts could have. "This is your AgCenter. Do not let the budget take it away."

Elzer said the LSU AgCenter Master Cattleman Program has been updated, expanded and strengthened and will be offered in places across the state where the classes have not been held previously.

Granger said a new Master Cattleman course will be held this summer for the Acadiana area at a cost of \$120 per person.

Donna Morgan of the Louisiana Master Farmer Program said a new Master Farmer class will be offered in southwest Louisiana in late June. She also said a Master Farmer University for the first two phases of the program will be offered in July in conjunction with the Sugarcane Field Day on July 15 at the LSU AgCenter Sugar Research Station near St. Gabriel.

ARC/PLC deadline approaching

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Louisiana Farm Service Agency (FSA) State Executive Director, Craig A. McCain, reminds producers that the deadline to update yields and reallocate base acres and choosing between ARC and PLC is fast approaching.

"This is an important decision for producers, because these programs provide financial protection against unexpected changes in the marketplace. Producers are working to make the best decision they can. And we're working to ensure that they've got the time, the information, and the opportunities to have those final conversations, review their data,

and to visit the Farm Service Agency to make those decisions," said McCain.

If no changes are made to yield history or base acres by March 31, 2015, the farm's current yield and base will be used. A program choice of ARC or PLC coverage also must be made by March 31, 2015, or there will be no 2014 payments for the farm and the farm will default to PLC coverage through the 2018 crop year.

Speaking on behalf of the late **Edwards Barham** of Oak Ridge, La. was his brother, Robert, who currently serves as Secretary of the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. "Edwards was a fantastic big brother. His family was always his motivation," said Robert Barham.

Barham was honored posthumously for his contributions to cotton, rice, corn and soybean farming, as well as agricultural aviation and higher education.

As a farmer, Barham was a certified flight instructor with a vision of improving crop dusting. He formed an agricultural aerial application business that used a variety of aircraft for pest management. Working with NASA

and the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Barham helped develop and deliver the first prescription pesticide applied by aircraft in the United States. He also played a key role in research that led to eradicating the boll weevil in Louisiana cotton farming.

"He endeavored to live a worthwhile life," said Barham's son, Erle West.

Barham founded Flying Tiger Aviation, one of the country's top agricultural flying schools that train's pilots in safety protocols and proper pesticide application procedures.

Barham also served on the State Board of Regents, the board of supervisors for the University of Louisiana System, the board of supervisors for the Louisiana Community and Technical College System, and he served as a state senator.

Barham passed away in October 2014, but his legacy lives on with the establishment of the Louisiana Aerial Application Center of Excellence that will continue providing outstanding training with manned and unmanned application systems.

Reflecting on the achievements of these individuals, Commissioner Strain said, "Before any nation can be great, we must be great in agriculture. However, the future of agriculture is at risk and therefore, we must care for the Earth, plants, crops, animals and livestock."

Strain added that it's farmers like Lucien Laborde, Jimmy Hoppe and Edwards Barham who are passing their skills down to the younger generation of farmers. Farming is an important commitment to both feed the world and protect the environment.

La. takes precautionary measures against avian flu

New case confirmed in Arkansas

Baton Rouge, La. (March 12, 2015) – Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said, "In an effort to safeguard our commercial producers and backyard poultry enthusiasts, we've increased our surveillance of poultry in the state. We are also enforcing all Louisiana Board of Animal Health entry regulations."

Louisiana is taking precautionary measures following the recent confirmed presence of the highly pathogenic H5N2 avian influenza (AI) in commercial turkey flocks in these six states: Idaho, Minnesota, Missouri, Oregon, Washington and most recently Arkansas.

All poultry entering Louisiana from a state affected with AI must meet the following entry requirements:

No live poultry or poultry products may enter Louisiana from an area designated as a Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) infected zone until the official quarantine has been released.

Poultry includes chickens, turkeys, quail, pheasants, peafowl, guineas, chukars and other partridge, grouse, ratites and domestic ducks.

Poultry products include hatching eggs, chicks, poults, table eggs, litter, and offal, but do not include processed poultry meat for human consumption.

All poultry entering Louisiana must originate from a National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) AI clean flock or must be tested negative for AI within 7 days of entry (by antibody or antigen capture methodologies recognized by NPIP).

All poultry shipments into Louisiana must be accompanied by an Interstate Certificate

of Veterinary Inspection (ICVI) and proof of NPIP certification for Salmonella Pullorum/Typhoid (P/T) clean status with NPIP Form 9-2 or NPIP negative testing within 30 days of entry

ICVI must state origin of shipment

Late Wednesday, the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission confirmed the infection of H5N2 AI in a commercial turkey flock in northern Arkansas. The flock is currently quarantined. The Arkansas Livestock & Poultry Commission will follow strict U.S. Department of Agriculture protocols to depopulate the affected flock so that no affected birds will enter the food supply. Additionally, surveillance and testing procedures will be implemented at properties near the affected facility to insure that the virus has not spread. The virus is not known to cause disease in humans.

These virus strains can travel in wild birds without them appearing sick. People should avoid contact with sick/dead poultry or wildlife. If contact occurs, wash your hands with soap and water and change clothing before having any contact with healthy domestic poultry and birds.

All bird owners, whether commercial producers or backyard poultry enthusiasts, should continue to practice good biosecurity, prevent contact between their birds and wild birds, and to report sick birds or unusual bird deaths to state/federal officials, either through your state veterinarian or through USDA's toll-free number at 1-866-536-7593. 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Although he never smoked, Mike was diagnosed with esophageal cancer in June of 2012, followed by a leukemia diagnosis in May 2014. Danna continued to work through much of his illness, traveling to Costa Rica, Colombia and Panama in early 2014 to cover the LSU AgCenter's AgLeadership Development Program's international tour there. In January of 2015 Mike and the TWILA Team of reporters kicked off the TV program's new season by broadcasting from the San Diego Zoo. San Diego was the site of the most recent annual meeting of the American Farm Bureau Federation.

Born May 26, 1960, Mike was raised in Baker and was a 1978 graduate of Baker High. During his college years he wrote for his hometown newspaper, "The Observer," as well as the LSU student newspaper, "The Daily Reveille." He also free-lanced for "The Advocate."

In 1983 he graduated from LSU's Manship School of Mass Communication and was hired by Gannett as a governmental reporter and political writer for "The News-Star-World" in Monroe. In June 1985 he left the newspaper to become the editor of "The Louisiana Farm Bureau News," the official publication of the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation in Baton Rouge.

It was there Mike was introduced to the organization's long-running TV program "This Week in Louisiana Agriculture," or TWILA as it was known, created by Regnal Wallace. Mike would report for the show for the next 12 years, after which he was named PR director for the Farm Bureau and anchor of TWILA following Wallace's retirement in 1997.

During Mike's tenure the TWILA Team of reporters would cover agricultural news from 15 countries on four continents and broadcast or report farm news stories from 27 U.S. states. TWILA is watched each week by more than 400,000 viewers on 19 affiliate stations across Louisiana. It is seen across the nation via satellite on the farm news network "RFD-TV" in Nashville.

Over his career Mike and the TWILA Team would garner six Telly Awards for excellence in television

reporting. Mike was particularly proud of the October 2011 show produced over 10 days from Turkey, and of TWILA's coverage of the devastation wrought by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita on Louisiana's farmers and ranchers in 2005. In 2010 Mike's report, "Katrina: Five Years Later," won him a Telly Award for best news reporting by an independent television program.

In addition to his television reporting, Mike was a contributing writer to numerous news and farm publications, including The Advocate, Mid-South Farmer and Progressive Farmer magazines. In 2001 the Baton Rouge Advertising Federation named Mike "Communications Manager of the Year." In 2008, he was named "Marketer of the Year" by the Baton Rouge chapter of Sales and Marketing Executives International. In 2011, the Public Relations Association of Louisiana named Danna "Communicator of the Year." Mike will be inducted into the LSU Manship School of Mass Communications Hall of Fame this fall. Mike is a 2004 graduate of the LSU AgCenter's "Agricultural Leadership Development Program."

Mike and the entire Danna family would like to thank Dr. Gerald Miletello and the physicians and staff of the Hematology/Oncology Clinic for their love, care and compassion over the last two-and-a-half years. Thanks also to the physicians and staff of the Pennington Cancer Center.
