Louisiana Made, Louisiana Proud at Jack & Jake's Public Market

If you're a fan of Louisiana products or simply want to support local area producers, you will have your chance to do so at a one-stop shop public market set to open this spring.

Located in Uptown New Orleans, Jack and Jake's Public Market's goal is to source local produce from Louisiana farmers and vendors as well as some from Mississippi.

"People get into the trap of what is convenient, but convenient is not

always healthy. Over at Jack and Jake's, you will find convenient and healthy foods," said founder and CEO John Burns who named the market after the two mules on his family's farm. Burns, a restoration ecologist by profession, came from a family of farmers. While he was raised in Chalmette, La., most of his family resides in Washington Parish.

Besides supporting local products, Jack and Jake's is in the mid-

dle of what's considered a "food desert" in the New Orleans area.

"Our mission at Jack and Jake's is to bring affordable, local produce that's fresh to the underserved community," said Brand Director Nina Camacho. A food desert is defined as an area that has limited resources for fresh fruit, vegetables and other healthy foods because of a lack of grocery stores and farmers' markets.

The food hub is located in the former McDonough 38 High School and the former Myrtle Banks Elementary School building at 1307 O.C. Haley Blvd. The 40,000 square foot building was restored after a fire in 2008. The design of the store includes sinker cypress counters, chandeliers and exposed pipes that lend itself to a warehouse feel.

Inside the market, shoppers will find Louisiana fruits, vegetables, seafood, beverages as well as a bakery, oyster bar, cheese section, coffee area, and sections where you can purchase already prepared hot and cold meals.

It plans to offer so much more, too.

"There will be a kitchen and event space for people to rent and hold events, there will be an additional kitchen for teaching and cooking demonstrations and the gardens will be filled with all things edible. We'll even have a section for you to

purchase whatever is needed for outdoor cooking," added Camacho.

"Jack and Jake's has been in the



"more personally gratifying." He added that this new concept will allow him to put healthier food in front of people. "I'm not a dietician, but I know how food works and I know how to prepare it. All you have to do is eat it."

Grocery manager Willye Mae Turner adds that her job entails finding products that are even sugar and gluten free. "We want a range of healthy products to fit everyone's needs," said Turner.

Burns added, "Fresh food does not have to be expensive. I don't know why people label it that way, but you also don't want to undercut the farmer because they work way too hard."

Jack and Jake's is located in an area that seems to be experiencing a resurgence. The Southern Food and Beverage Museum is located nearby and famed New Orleans trumpeter Irvin Mayfield is expected to open the

New Orleans Jazz market, a performing arts venue, across the street from Jack and Jake's in the very near future.

"Don't you want a fresh juice made from Louisiana's fruits and vegetables?" added Thibodeaux. "Our model may look close to what others are doing, but remember, this is local. At least we are figuring it out. The rest of the world is doing this kind of stuff and now we are too."

wholesale business for a few years, but I see this new venture as a one stop shopping place for everything local," said chef Ben Thibodeaux who will prepare the ready-made meals. Thibodeaux is a former executive chef at Palace Café and Tableau restaurants in New Orleans.

Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

Invasive emerald ash borer trap surveys

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the USDA and LDAF are once again conducting trap surveys across Louisiana following detection of Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) in Webster Parish.

The EAB is an invasive beetle that attacks and kills ash trees. Louisiana's native ash trees are primarily located along the Atchafalaya Basin and the Mississippi River Delta. However, there are ash trees in urban areas, as well.

"Over the summer, approximately 300 traps will be placed along high risk areas such as along the interstate, welcome center areas and the

Mississippi River Delta. Please do not remove these traps if you come across one," said Strain.

The traps are large, purple sticky boxes that hang from trees in areas that are being monitored for EAB.

The EAB beetle is a pest to all types of ash trees but does not attack other hardwoods or pines. Ash is one of the predominant trees planted in the Conservation Reserve Program and it is also a tree that is common in urban areas and has aesthetic appeal. "When the trees start dying, it could be costly for residents or city officials to have them removed," added Strain.

The beetle is often transported into an area by infested firewood, but it is

not known how the EAB entered Louisiana. Officials say the best way to prevent the spread of EAB is to not move firewood.

EAB is a native insect of Asia. In 2002, EAB was discovered in Michigan and is now present in 25 states, including Louisiana. EAB is a federally-regulated pest. States survey for EAB and if it is found, quarantine boundaries are established by the state.

The LDAF began drafting an EAB response plan in the fall of 2014 in preparation for the anticipated arrival of EAB in Louisiana. The plan includes survey, outreach and regulatory oversight components and involves multiple federal and state

agencies including U.S. Forest Service (USFS), USDA-APHIS Plant Protection and Quarantine (USDA-PPQ), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), and the LSU AgCenter. Also involved are the Louisiana Forestry Association and the Urban Forestry Council.

LDAF and USDA-PPQ use traps baited with lure scents which are attractive to the beetles. Survey results will help determine the extent of the beetle presence in the state and the potential regulatory actions necessary to reduce the spread of the pest. At this time, there is no EAB quarantine in place. When a quarantine becomes established, then regulated products that include ash nurs-

ery stock, ash logs, lumber and pallets and all hardwood firewood would not be able to move outside of the quarantined area unless treated according to federal protocols.

Foreign persons must report U.S. agricultural land holdings

The County Executive Director for the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) in East/West Feliciana & East Baton Rouge Parishes, Reginald D. Ellis, reminds foreign persons with an interest in agricultural lands in the United States that they are required to report their holdings and any transactions to the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture.

"Any foreign person who acquires, transfers or holds any interest, other than a security interest, including leaseholds of 10 years or more, in agricultural land in the United States is required by law to report the transaction no later than 90 days after the date of the transaction," said Ellis.

Foreign investors must file Agricultural Foreign Investment Disclosure Act (AFIDA) reports with the FSA county office that maintains reports for the county where the land is located.

"Failure to file a report, filing a late report or filing an inaccurate report can result in a penalty with fines up to 25 percent of the fair market value of

the agricultural land," said Ellis.

For AFIDA purposes, agricultural land is defined as any land used for farming, ranching or timber production, if the tracts total 10 acres or more.

Disclosure reports are also required when there are changes in land use. For example, reports are required when land use changes from nonagricultural to agricultural or from agricultural to nonagricultural. Foreign investors must also file a report when there is a change in the status of ownership such as the owner changes from foreign to non-foreign, from non-foreign to foreign or from foreign to foreign.

Data gained from these disclosures is used to prepare an annual report to the President and Congress concerning the effect of such holdings upon family farms and rural communities in the United States.

USDA designates natural disaster areas Contiguous Louisiana Parishes included

Baton Rouge, La. (March 23, 2015) – The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has declared these parishes contiguous natural disaster areas: East Feliciana, St. Helena and Tangipahoa. Washington Parish was also declared a disaster area in three unrelated events. Under these designations, qualified producers in this area are eligible to apply for low interest emergency loans.

East Feliciana, St. Helena and Tangipahoa were declared a natural disaster area effective July 28, 2014 as the result of physical damage and losses caused by high winds and tornadoes that occurred on June 10, 2014. Farmers and ranchers who have suffered severe losses have until March 28, 2015 to apply for emergency assistance with their local FSA Office.

In Washington Parish, these three weather events have

resulted in a disaster declaration:

Effective Jan. 12, 2015 and as the result of damage and losses caused by a tornado that occurred on Dec. 16, 2014, emergency loan applications will be received until Sept. 12, 2015 for qualified ranchers and farmers who suffered severe physical losses only.

Effective Jan. 13, 2015 due to production and physical losses caused by severe storms and a tornado beginning and ending on Dec. 23, 2014, emergency loan applications will be received until Sept. 13, 2015 for qualified ranchers and farmers who suffered severe physical losses only.

Effective Jan. 31, 2015 and as the result of damage and losses caused by a tornado on Dec. 23, 2014, emergency loan applications will be received until Oct. 1, 2015 for qualified ranchers

and farmers who suffered severe physical losses only.

"Unpredictable weather conditions can wreak havoc on the farming community. This assistance is necessary to help sustain the businesses of our agricultural producers," said Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

Emergency loans help producers recover from production and physical losses following a drought, flooding and other natural disasters or quarantine. As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency loan.

ARC/PLC deadline approaching

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Louisiana Farm Service Agency (FSA) State Executive Director, Craig A. McCain, reminds producers that the deadline to update yields and reallocate base acres and choosing between ARC and PLC is fast approaching.

"This is an important decision for producers, because these programs provide financial protection against unexpected changes in the marketplace. Producers are working to make the best decision they can. And we're working to ensure that they've got the time, the information, and the opportunities to have those final conversations, review their data,

and to visit the Farm Service Agency to make those decisions," said McCain.

If no changes are made to yield history or base acres by March 31, 2015, the farm's current yield and base will be used. A program choice of ARC or PLC coverage also must be made by March 31, 2015, or there will be no 2014 payments for the farm and the farm will default to PLC coverage through the 2018 crop year.

Weights and Measures is a part of the agro-consumer division and its main function is consumer protection. That’s something most people do not associate with the LDAF. Our goal is to ensure that consumers are treated fairly.

Here is a list of some of what our inspectors inspect for accuracy:

- Scales used to weigh produce
- Scales used to weigh railroad cars

Point-of-sale scanners used to sell food, clothing, etc.

Taxi meters

Gas pumps

In 2014, the LDAF inspected:


19,887 scales

2,575 taxi meters

66,270 gas pumps

In addition, they monitor fuel quality and inspect packages for the correct weight, content and labeling. They also investigate consumer complaints that can range from the malfunctioning of any of the above devices to poor quality fuel (there were more than 470 complaints on fuel alone in 2014). If there are concerns about fuel quality, consumers can contact the LDAF.

Three individuals recognized as Louisiana Living Legends

BATON ROUGE, La. – Three individuals were recognized as Louisiana Living Legends during the fifth annual Louisiana Small Farmer Conference at the Southern University Agricultural Research and Extension Center on March 20.

They are Bobby R. Phills, program director for the Science Center and professor in the College of Engineering Sciences, Technology and Agriculture at Florida A&M University in Tallahassee; Freddie Johnson, a retired Southern University food and nutrition professor, of Baton Rouge; and Elvadás Fields, former county agent and farm management specialist at Southern, now retired, of St. Joseph.

These three join 15 others who have been honored with this distinction since 2005.

“The Louisiana Living Legends Award is an opportunity to honor heroes with ties to the Southern University Agricultural Research and Extension Center for their years of selfless service,” said Dawn Mellion-Patin, agricultural specialist and organizer of the small farmer conference.

Dr. Phills is the former dean and research director of the College of Agricultural, Family and Consumer Sciences at Southern. In this role he created

the Beginning Agricultural Youth Opportunities Unlimited (BAYOU) Summer Enrichment Program, which exposed hundreds of high school students across Louisiana to the broad array of careers in the agricultural sciences.

“This program was responsible for placing hundreds of student interns at major research universities, in private industry and with the USDA,” Mellion-Patin said.

Ms. Johnson served for 36 years in the Department of Human Nutrition and Food at Southern. Before that she was supervisor of food service for the state Department of Education. Her activities included sensory evaluation and establishing a staff sensory panel, design of a food research sensory evaluation area and a home economics space utilization study. Her research included the palatability of “rabbit nuggets” and other alternative food products for limited resource families.

Mr. Fields was a county agent for the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service for 32 years and then became a farm management specialist for Southern. He has been a supporter of the SU Livestock Show and was responsible for bringing more than 150 youth to show animals for

more than 50 years. He was a founding member of the Delta Livestock Enterprise and Northeast Louisiana Black Farmers and Landowners Association.

During this year’s small farmer conference, the 125th anniversary of the establishment of the 1890 land-grant universities was also celebrated, said Gina E. Eubanks, vice chancellor for extension at the Southern Ag Center and program leader for nutrition and food sciences at the LSU AgCenter.

Southern University is one of 19 universities across the country with 1890 land-grant status.

In 1890, Congress passed the Second Morrill Act with the stipulation that African Americans were to be included in the land-grant university system. The first Morrill Act was signed into law by Pres. Abraham Lincoln in 1862. There is an 1862 land-grant university in every state including LSU in Louisiana.

The other 15 Living Legends include Bernestine McGee, Floyd Jenkins, Elsie Cyrus, Samuel Donald, Alonzo Chappell, Sara Sims, Pecola Scott, Willie T. Sensley, Owusu Bandede, Leodrey Williams, James McNitt, James Archie, Solon Marshall, Kirkland Mellad and Wesley Crawford.
