State inspected meat processors help local producers

Shannon Gonsoulin's family has been in the cattle business in Louisiana since 1767.

"In 2005, we decided to pursue the niche market of grass fed beef. We originally expected to sell two to three calves a month to local stores and use custom slaughtering, but now we process more than 40 animals per week using the state inspected Meat and Poultry Inspection Program (MPIP)." Gonsoulin added, "Over the past several years, consumers have demanded fresh, local and healthy food choices. Gonsoulin Land and Cattle Company would not have been able to meet the consumer demand if we did not have access to a locally inspected slaughter facility."

Throughout the United States,

consumer preferences are driving an ever-increasing demand for locally raised livestock, poultry and other locally sourced produce and protein products. However, in many areas of the country, small-scale producers of livestock and poultry face a major challenge in getting these products from their farm to the consumer's table with convenient access to a local inspected meat processor.

While some people prefer the anonymity of their favorite dishes, a growing number of consumers want to know that the restaurants and stores they frequent are providing the best quality products while helping their local economy. The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) is helping make that happen.

Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry Mike Strain, D.V.M. said, the LDAF MPIP ensures the wholesomeness and safety of meat and poultry harvested and processed in 69 state inspected facilities throughout Louisiana. In addition, the program's compliance officers conduct investigations of consumer complaints and suspected violations of the Meat and Poultry Inspection Law.

There are approximately 800 livestock slaughter plants in the United States operating under federal inspection and more than 2,000 non-federally inspected (state-inspected or custom-exempt) slaughter plants, according to the 2012 Livestock Slaughter Summary by the USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service.

State inspected meat processors are the only viable option for many small local producers. These facilities take pride in being able to accommodate the smaller, local producers that add so much personality and variety to this growing industry.

"Local is huge to the consumer, just look at all of the regained interest in the local farmers markets throughout the state. It has been our experience that consumers will pay more for a product that is made locally because they want their money to stay in the community and want to know who is producing their food," Gonsoulin said. "In addition, our direct marketing program has been very successful, but it would not be if it weren't for the local slaughter facilities. From

Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

Strain urges support for agcenters

Once again, Louisiana has set a new record for agricultural production. Total values for agriculture, forestry and aquaculture rose by over \$900 million or 7.6 percent to an all-time high of \$12.7 billion, according to the LSU AgCenter. These gains were led by substantial increases in soybeans, timber and livestock. I congratulate all of the farmers, foresters, and fishers as well as their families and the entire team of research/development scientists, extension agents, consultants and industry professionals on this remarkable achievement.

Since 2007, agricultural production has risen from \$5.9 billion to \$12.7 billion. If we continue on this track, I

am confident we will reach \$25 billion in production within the next decade. We will continue to see a worldwide increase in the demand for food and fiber.

This future hinges on our ability to continue to advance productivity, efficiency, overall profitability and sustainability. A key to our success lies in public and private research, development, and extension. Without this, we will advance but not to the level that we could achieve, nor in the shortest time frame possible. As great as our advances are, the future is now dependent on our collective action to demand sustainable funding of our universities and ag centers.

For every public dollar invested in

our agricultural research institutions we receive and astounding \$32 return on investment. These returns are both immediate and long term. The state has proposed a number of cuts in order to balance next year's budget including a \$35 million cut to the LSU AgCenter, which would deal a devastating blow to our economy as new varieties will be developed slower, if at all, and we will not benefit from cutting edge science in the prevention and diagnosis of crop pests and diseases.

These cuts will also negatively impact our 4-H and FFA programs which currently serve more than 250 thousand children a year. These programs foster leadership, responsibili-

ty, accountability, and teach our young people not only about agriculture, forestry and aquaculture, but also develop self-esteem and pride. Losing or diminishing these programs is simply unacceptable.

I am asking for your help. As community leaders it is imperative that we speak loudly and with one voice and demand that our tax dollars be spent in such a manner that will enhance the lives and futures of our children and advance the largest and fastest growing industries in this state. Please contact your legislators and first explain to them the critical nature of this issue and then ask for their commitment to advance this matter. The benefits are clear and

producing, transporting, processing, packaging and delivery, our grass fed business would be non-existent without these facilities."

Charlie Munford of Two Run Farms is a producer, processor, and purveyor of local meats.

"We provide a critical link between the livestock on the farm and the chefs in the kitchen. Restaurants and grocery stores can call on us to get them fresh free-range meats with no antibiotics or hormones," Munford said. "Also, they don't have to buy the whole animal, just the cuts they want. Because of the LDAF MPIP program at our Springfield Slaughter House in Louisiana, we are able to sell our products to more than 75 local businesses per week."

Under custom processing rules, farmers cannot sell to the public, but state inspections allow the farmer to market what they produce.

"State inspection gives us a way to make local meat available to many more people, helping us grow our business and be a resource to the community," Munford said.

Over in Southwest Louisiana, Kirk Martin, proprietor of Kirk Martin Slaughterhouse in Carencro also supports the MPIP program.

"The Louisiana MPIP program ensures that the consumer receives a wholesome locally produced product and gives me the ability to compete with larger packers on a smaller scale. It also helps create jobs as well as makes sure we keep up with food

safety standards," Martin said.

Dickie Brennan of Dickie Brennan and Company headquartered in New Orleans supports the farm to table local initiative.

"Local ingredients have much less to travel than your commercial ingredients, thereby they're fresher and of a higher quality. When you buy local, you're supporting the local economy, which makes sense on so many levels," Brennan said. "Farm to table isn't a trend anymore, it's a mainstream idea. Guests expect quality restaurants to use quality local ingredients."

Brennan added that the goal is to exceed customers' expectations by using those ingredients to create a memorable dining experience.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Office of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (AES) at the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry is comprised of the Agricultural Chemistry Programs Division, Horticulture and Quarantine Programs Division, Pesticide and Environmental Programs Division and Seed Programs Division.

AES employees ensure animal feeds, pet foods, fertilizers, agricultural liming materials and pesticides meet all requirements of law. They monitor and provide for the prevention, control and eradication of plant pests and diseases that threaten Louisiana's agriculture, environment and economy. They facilitate agricultural exports through certification of products; oversee the qualifications and practices of persons engaged in the green industry; protect human health and the environment by ensuring the proper labeling, distribution, storage, use, application and disposal of pesticides through enforcement of all pesticide laws. They also ensure that seed sold for planting meets label guarantees and quality standards; and they ensure a safe, abundant supply of food and fiber. Their

work benefits the state and agricultural community by maintaining and protecting Louisiana's environment and natural resources through aggressive monitoring and management.

Last year, the LDAF Seed Programs Division staff continued a strong regulatory seed sampling and testing program. 6,591 samples were obtained and tested, and 79 of these samples required regulatory action. These 6,591 samples required more than 16,000 purity and germination seed analyses.

The Agricultural Chemistry Laboratory is a member of the Food Emergency Response Network (FERN). The laboratory is one of only two FERN member labs in Louisiana. The FERN system, a network of federal, state and local food-testing labs, was created to enable officials to quickly respond to emergencies involving biological, chemical, or radiological contamination of

food.

Last year, the Agricultural Chemistry Programs Division continued to fulfill its statutory mandate to monitor the quality and safety of agricultural inputs. The lab analyzed more than 3,091 regulatory samples and more than 3,033 research and service samples.

Last year, the Horticulture and Quarantine Programs Division licensed and permitted 8,603 persons/businesses in horticultural professions and occupations. Additionally, 631 nursery grower operations were issued permits to ship or sell plants. License and permit requirements benefit the general public and the environment by ensuring that individuals who perform horticultural services are competent in their respective professions. Additionally, these requirements ensure use of high-quality, pest-free materials in the land-

scape, helping to preserve healthy environments. The Division's activities serve as a first line of defense in protecting Louisiana's resources through early detection of and rapid response to pest issues threatening the state's agriculture. The desired result is early pest detection allowing for efficient problem management to reduce negative impacts. If feasible, eradication of a pest may also be considered. The overall goal is to ensure economically viable plant industries; to maintain natural habitats and the diversity of organisms that populate them; to safeguard against introduction and spread of unwanted pests; and to facilitate trade.

Last year, the Pesticide and Environmental Programs Division (PEPD) conducted 3,204 inspections. The timely and efficient inspections provide for strong enforcement actions, which result in fewer threats to human health and the environment. The PEPD annually registers over 12,600 pesticides that are sold or distributed within Louisiana. Each product label and Safety Data Sheet (SDS) is on record with the division.
