*"Life is amazing when you can grow your own food."*

*Warren Hoag*

Lunch at the Hoag residence in Jennings, La. comes straight from the farm. "We're eating grass fed steak, brown rice grown with no pesticides or herbicides cooked in homemade beef broth and coleslaw made with raw cream and other stuff from our garden, deviled eggs from our chickens and a glass of raw milk," said Warren Hoag.

Hoag, who is a former firefighter and coroner, made a life changing decision at the age of 50. "I know how to do everything except get rich. But after you tour my farm, you'll realize how rich I am. Life is amazing when you can grow your own food."

Hoag calls his food natural, rather than organic. He adds that his farm is set up to follow nature's lead. "The key to having a successful farm to feed my family is making sure it is diverse with both animals and plant life."

Hoag did not grow up on a farm. In fact, his interest in sustainable farming began when his wife, Martha, who is a medical doctor by profession, was diagnosed with cancer. Martha wanted to minimize the chance of her cancer recurring. Research indicated that she needed more pasture based meats as well as a diet of rich fruits and vegetables loaded with antioxidants with limited soy products.

And so it began. Hoag started researching farming methods by both reading about and visiting farms. "I looked at some of these gardens and would never touch their food because they use too many pesticides," said Hoag. He uses no chemical herbicides or pesticides in growing his food which is the way he likes it. He also does not till his soil. "When you till, you're killing much of the enzymes and bacteria as well as destroying the worm castings that are rich for the soil and you need for your food. We make and use our own compost." Hoag says as a result, his food is much more nutrient dense than fruits and vegetables bought in the store.

On five acres, Hoag has pastured cattle, goats, chick-

ens, and rabbits, along with fruit and vegetables. "I'm not totally sustainable. I wish I was, but I still have to buy dog food, soap and shampoo, detergent, toilet paper, paper towels and the women in my family like their cosmetics." He adds that they occasionally get some fruits and vegetables from the store that they don't grow.

Hoag says he has noticed some health benefits since he started farming and creating his own food. "I don't have a lot of health issues but I did have allergies. I learned that local raw honey was good for allergies and since I started eating honey, I haven't used my allergy medicine in nine years." Hoag is also a bee keeper.

Hoag believes in "management intensive grazing" on his moveable farm which he says forces his animals to eat what is in front of them. "On my grass fed operation, I grow as many types of grass in each pasture as I can because they need a variety in their diets just like we do. Grass is most nutritious in late evening after a day of sunshine." Hoag uses his goats for weed control and for manure.

Hoag also utilizes solar power to operate his portable, movable electric fence. That same solar power also opens the chicken coop in the morning and closes it at night to protect his chickens from predators.

While Hoag acknowledges his farm is a lot of work, he describes it as a "hobby" compared to many operations. "When you live like this, your quality of life is so much better."

As a steward of the land, Hoag says his job is to leave the land in much better condition for the next generation. Hoag says what he does is not unique, it's just the way he's decided to live his life with his family. "There are a lot of farms like mine. They used to be called the small family farm. We have just taken the old proven ways of natural farming and married it with modern technology.

And on that small family farm is exactly where he wants to be.

# Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

## Strain's Senate Committee on Small Business and Entrepreneurship testimony

I am testifying today on behalf the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF). State departments of agriculture are responsible for a wide range of programs including food safety, combating the introduction and spread of plant and animal diseases, and fostering the economic vitality of our rural communities. My department also oversees all agricultural activities within the state, including the markets for products produced by our farmers. The activities of the crawfish industry also fall under my purview.

The ability of seasonal businesses to keep their doors open and retain their full-time U.S. employees relies upon having successful peak seasons to offset the rest of the year when their business is slow. During their busy seasons, companies must supplement their permanent staff with temporary seasonal employees. Employers spend thousands of dollars and hundreds of hours in their efforts to fill these positions. Unfortunately, even in today's tough economic climate, there are not

enough local workers available to fill all the temporary seasonal positions, and efforts to obtain U.S. workers to relocate for temporary and seasonal employment have not been successful. As a result, businesses often must utilize the H-2B guest worker program to find seasonal workers and workers for their peak workforce needs.

The H-2B program is vitally important for many industries including forestry, nursery, landscaping, outdoor amusement, restaurant and hospitality, tourism, livestock and horse training, sugar and many others. In Louisiana, the seafood industry, which includes crawfish, shrimp, crabs, oysters and catfish, is in a critical situation because seafood processors traditionally cannot fill their temporary or seasonal job vacancies with U.S. workers. Many of these businesses are located in rural areas that simply do not have sufficient populations to supply their extra workforce needs. Additionally, many who are willing to work want full time, year round jobs. Indeed, many of the jobs in those locales that are year round and full time depend on the various food processors operations for their own jobs and business operations to be able to operate. In 2014, Louisiana hired 5,546 H-2B workers. For each H-2B worker it is estimated that 4.64 American jobs are created and sustained.

The H-2B regulations, released on April 29, 2015, by the U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, could impact an already fragile industry's economic competitiveness.

The seasonal industries have had to weather several years of regulatory instability. The H-2B wage rule that the Department of Labor adopted on January 19, 2011 imposed a new untested wage determination methodology that would significantly increase costs for small and seasonal small businesses. After being blocked by Congress, in

April 2013, the DOL issued an interim final rule that included the same methodology for setting wages, but recognized the importance of state wage surveys. Unfortunately, the new rule, released two weeks ago, is virtually identical to the rule that was blocked by Congress causing additional obstacles for employers in the program.

In December of 2014, the DOL announced that it would no longer allow Private Wage Rate (PWR) surveys that were developed by many state departments of agriculture, including the LDAF. My staff has spent countless hours gathering information to accurately depict the current wages that the industry is paying in our geographic locations. This action forced employers into accepting higher prevailing wages that are not representative of the wages that are being paid domestically.

To make matters worse, the H-2B worker caps have already been exceeded and many seafood processor applications have been delayed even with early submissions. Seafood processing already began in the early spring and with the worker caps reached, this will trickle down to other agriculture industries that utilize the program.

These actions will have a negative impact on the seafood industry and the related commerce sectors such as restaurants, etc.

Two months ago, the LSU AgCenter conducted a rapid economic analysis of recent H-2B policy changes from the U.S. DOL for the Louisiana seafood industry. The assessment was conducted in response to potential changes in the cost and availability of labor stemming from a mid-year cap on H-2B permits and the DOL announcement that it would no longer allow Private Wage Rate (PWR) surveys. Results indicate that for every dollar of employee compensation created by the seafood preparation and packaging industry in Louisiana, employee compensation increased by \$2.06 across all sectors of the Louisiana economy. This includes the original \$1 of employee compensation created by the seafood preparation and packaging industry plus an additional \$1.06 of induced multiplier effects across all sectors of the state

economy. Total income generated by H-2B visa workers in Louisiana seafood industry is substantial and ranges from \$36 million to \$43 million in the State of Louisiana.

Our markets are subject to particularly fierce competition from abroad. If our producers are put at a further competitive price disadvantage, or are put out of business, as a result of the DOL H-2B rules.

Without temporary H-2B guest seasonal workers to process seafood, Louisiana's seafood processors would shut down, eliminating the primary market for our fishermen and farmers to sell their catch. As a result, cheaper foreign seafood would gain a stronger foothold in the U.S. market and our fishermen and farmers who produce and harvest crawfish, shrimp, crabs, oysters and catfish would be devastated and a key segment of the Louisiana economy would be crippled—lost to our economy. Once we lose the processors, we would not be able to depend on them coming back in future years. Therefore, losses because processors scale back or do not operate at all this season will have irreparable and bad repercussions now and in the future.

The short term consequence of an immediate expulsion of this vital segment of the workforce would cause a production crisis in a wide range of seafood processing, field and nursery crops, sugar processing, forestry, livestock and the restaurant industry, to name a few. This would leave the United States and our State of Louisiana no alternative but to import many food products from countries that have surplus farm labor. This is unacceptable and we must do everything in our power to grow and support America's jobs and economy.

We are asking for your help. We must streamline and expedite the H-B process. We need a working system without overly burdensome rules, unrealistic timetables, and outright roadblocks. Neglecting the labor needs of agriculture will raise the cost of production in a way that harms fisherman, farmers and industries throughout America.





### ***Italian Vegetable Custard***

4 EGGS	1 tsp. dried basil leaves
1/2 cup all-purpose flour	1/2 tsp. garlic salt
2 cups coarsely shredded yellow summer squash	6 very thin tomato slices
1 cup coarsely shredded zucchini	1 small onion, thinly sliced, separated into rings
1 can (2.25 oz.) sliced ripe olives, drained, divided	1/2 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese (2 oz.)
2 tbsp. grated Parmesan cheese	

Heat oven to 450 degrees. Beat eggs and flour in medium bowl until smooth. Add yellow squash, zucchini and 1/4 cup olives; mix well. Spread in greased 8-inch square baking pan. Bake in center of 450 degree oven just until custard is set, about 10 minutes. Mix Parmesan cheese, basil and garlic salt; sprinkle over custard. Top evenly with tomato, remaining olives, onion and cheese. Bake until cheese is melted.

### ***Broccoli Quiche in Colorful Peppers***

4 medium red, yellow OR green bell peppers (4 oz. each)	1/2 cup milk
1 cup frozen broccoli florets, defrosted	1/2 tsp. garlic powder
4 EGGS	1/4 tsp. dried Italian seasoning

Heat oven to 325 degrees. Cut about 1/2 inch off tops of peppers; remove seeds. Place peppers upright in custard cups; place cups in baking pan. Spoon 1/4 cup broccoli into each pepper. Beat eggs, milk, garlic powder and Italian seasoning in medium bowl until blended. Pour evenly over broccoli. Bake in center of 325 degree oven until knife inserted near center comes out clean, 60 to 70 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes.

### ***Blueberry Clafouti***

2/3 cup sugar	1 tsp. vanilla
1 stick butter, room temperature	1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg
4 EGGS	1/8 tsp. salt
1 cup all-purpose flour	2 cups blueberries
1 tbsp. fresh lemon juice	

Heat oven to 375 degrees. Beat sugar and butter in mixing bowl until light and fluffy. Beat in eggs until well blended. Add flour, lemon juice, vanilla, nutmeg and salt; beat until smooth. Fold blueberries into batter, reserving 8 for garnish, if desired. Spread in lightly greased 9-inch quiche dish or cake pan. Bake in center of 375 degree oven until top is lightly browned and knife inserted in center comes out clean, 40 to 50 minutes. Cool on wire rack.

### ***Mini Muffin Tin Stratas***

1Tbsp. butter	1 cup (4 oz.) shredded Italian cheese blend
1-1/2 cups small broccoli florets	5 EGGS
1 cup chopped red bell pepper	1 cup half-and-half
1/3 cup chopped onion	1/2 sp. salt
5 cups French or Italian bread pieces (3/4-inch)	1/4 tsp. pepper

Generously spray 12 muffin cups with cooking spray. Heat butter in large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add broccoli, red pepper and onion, cook 3 to 4 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove to medium bowl.

Add bread and cheese; toss to mix. Beat eggs, half-and-half, salt and pepper in small bowl until blended. Pour over bread mixture; toss gently to coat. Place about 1/2 cup bread mixture into each muffin cup.

Cover and refrigerate 1 hour or overnight. Heat oven to 350 degrees. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes or until puffed, golden and knife inserted near center comes out clean. Loosen stratas from sides of pans with thin knife.

### ***Chocolate Zucchini Bundt Cake***

2-1/4 cups all-purpose flour	1/2 cup butter, softened
1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa	3/4 cup applesauce
2-1/2 tsp. baking powder	4 EGGS
1-1/2 tsp. baking soda	1 tbsp. vanilla
1 tsp. ground cinnamon	2 cups shredded zucchini (about 2 small, 10 oz.)
1 tsp. salt	Powdered sugar
1 cup sugar	

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Coat bottom and sides of 9-12-cup fluted tube pan with cooking spray. Combine flour, cocoa, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon and salt into medium bowl. Beat sugar and butter in mixer bowl on medium speed until light and fluffy. Beat in applesauce, eggs and vanilla. Reduce speed to low. Add dry ingredients; beat until blended. Gently stir in zucchini. Pour batter into prepared pan. Bake in 350 degree oven until wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean, 60 to 70 minutes.

Cool on wire rack for 10 minutes. Loosen cake from sides of pans with thin knife. Gently shake cake from pan onto serving plate. Dust with powdered sugar.

# Beef producers hear management strategies

BOSSIER CITY, La. – With cattle prices at or near historic levels, it seems to be a good time to be a cattle producer. According to an economist and beef researchers presenting at the Northwest Beef and Forage Day at the LSU AgCenter Red River Research Station, it is a good time, but producers need to plan and manage their cattle to maximize their investments.

“It is just as hard, for some even harder, to manage in the good times as it is the bad,” Ross Pruitt, an LSU AgCenter economist, said. “It’s OK to make purchases for your operation, but you may want to put a larger down payment to reduce the amount of risk you are taking on because these good times are not going to last forever.”

Pruitt said now would be a good time for producers who are interested in experimenting with different management strategies because high prices have reduced the margin of error. He suggested trying different pasture management techniques, attempting to improve the genetics of the herd or keeping cattle instead of selling them after they are weaned.

Pruitt also said producers should prepare for interest rates to start increasing as early as this fall based on comments by the Federal Reserve.

“If and when the rates are raised, it would certainly influence their borrowing costs,” he said.

With cattle prices high, producers

may want to consider keeping their heifer calves.

“There are some advantages in keeping your heifers. It can make your herd younger and allow you to sell some of your older cows

scarce and costly.

“The bigger cows are obviously consuming more. It is costing producers more when they have to provide hay or supplements, and they are not producing any more

that may be less productive. It also would allow your herd to grow,” Pruitt said.

Ryon Walker, animal science researcher at the LSU AgCenter Hill Farm Research Station in Homer, said research has found that bigger cows can be a liability, especially in times when feed is

in terms of production outputs or weaning weights,” Walker said.

When producers are in the market to buy replacement heifers, Walker said, cattle buyers should consider three traits – age, weight and breed.

Walker said heifers should reach puberty by 12-14 months in order

to calve as a two-year-old. The target breeding weight should be 65 percent of the weight the cow is expected to be at full maturity. Breeds that have a more Brahm-influence will take longer to reach maturity, he said.

Lee Faulk, assistant AgCenter extension agent in Claiborne Parish, said buyers and sellers of hay should know the weights of their hay bales.

“It pays to weigh your hay whether you are buying or selling. If you are buying hay you want to make sure you are getting what you pay for. And if you are selling, you want to make sure you are not short selling yourself,” he said.

Faulk also said size is not always a good indicator of weight because smaller bales are sometimes equal to or slightly heavier than larger bales.

Wink Alison, an AgCenter forage specialist, said producers should not only know the weight of the bale, but they should know other characteristics, such as nutritional value and moisture content.

“Knowing the nutrient quality of the hay can increase the efficiency of feeding that animal, especially over the winter when hay is fed to cattle. If the hay has the necessary nutrition, then producers don’t have the added costs of supplements,” Alison said.

Alison said it costs \$15 for a hay sample test, but it is a good investment.

Hay should have a moisture content of 20 percent or less,

he said. If moisture levels are higher, the hay will deteriorate more quickly and have more mold growth.

Buddy Pittman, an AgCenter forage researcher at the Hill Farm Research Station, said weeds are generally a problem in every pasture. “You may not see them, but they are almost always there.”

Pittman told producers controlling for the weeds in the field he was standing in would be too costly and too late. Weeds should be controlled as early in the hay season as possible.

Some operations could benefit by using a pasture management system that incorporated summer legumes, he said.

“First-calf heifers can benefit because this gives them a little bit extra nutrition late in the season when summer grasses have less quality,” Pittman said.

Texas A & M AgriLife Extension beef cattle specialist Jason Banta said a producer should have three goals when looking for a replacement heifer.

“She should be able to calve unassisted, raise a good calf and raise good calves for at least the next 10 years,” Banta said.

A replacement heifer should have a good disposition and not easily spooked, Banta said. Producers should not select the largest heifer or keep their biggest heifer because the difference may be related to the age of the animal. Size is not a good indicator of how productive that heifer may become, he said.
