A trip to a sugarcane field in St. James Parish proved to be a soggy one. “We’ve had 15 inches of rain in the past seven days,” said sugarcane farmer Ricky “Possum” Roussel. “We can handle some rain, but we can’t handle the backwater.”

After months of dry weather, consistently stormy weather dumped enough rain on the state to cancel a burn ban that was in place. But the kind of challenges some sugarcane farmers are dealing with are the high tides and the water that is seeping onto their sugarcane fields sometimes days after a heavy rain.

“The issue is there seems to be an increase in flooding after the storm. Water is flowing from somewhere else. We need to know where this water is coming from and get it moved,” said Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., who made a visit to a sugarcane field to assess the damage from excessive rain in recent weeks.

Roussel estimates he has approximately 450 acres currently under water. “I don’t know if I’m ultimately going to lose this, but it’s the start of a huge mess,” he added.

Senior agronomist for the American Sugarcane League, Herman Waguespack, said, “Anytime you have these flooded conditions, the root system is

compromised. It fills the air pores in the soil with water causing damage to the roots. A healthy root system is what’s needed to get multiple cuttings.” Waguespack added, “If the root survives, there could be a level of injury which could mean fewer cuttings.”

The economic impact could be great. Waguespack estimated it costs approximately \$1,000 per acre to plant sugarcane.

Pumping the water out to drain the flooded acres of land is also costly. “What I’m most worried about is the cane dying. That’s what happened during Hurricane Isaac in 2012,” said Roussel. Sugarcane is a five year crop which means if the crop is damaged, it will reduce its yield and there will not be as many years to harvest.

While sugarcane is a resilient crop, farmers must manage how much they plant in preparation for unforeseen circumstances such as excessive rainfall.

“In the last 10 years, it seems like there’s more and more flooding but mostly as a result of backwater,” said Roussel. Strain added, “Looks like our next step is to work with parish officials and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to find a better solution for water management issues in an effort to protect the sugarcane crop.”

Sugarcane harvest started in late September.

Bienville Parish Man Arrested in Connection with Arson

Baton Rouge, La. (October 23, 2015) – A joint investigation by the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF), the Louisiana State Fire Marshal's Office and the Bienville Parish Sheriff's Office has resulted in the arrest of a Castor man on three counts of aggravated arson, said Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

Larry Eugene Page, 35, of 1464 Pukin Center Road, was arrested Friday afternoon and charged

with allegedly setting two woods fires and a structure fire during the early morning hours of Wednesday, Oct. 21.

Investigators said witnesses were key in solving this case. One witness reported seeing a white male wearing a white t-shirt running from behind the trailer that was burning. A short time later Page was observed driving past the scene in a white car and identified by three witnesses.

"It is our job to help bring to justice people who put lives

in danger and property at risk of being destroyed by acting irresponsibly," Strain said. "Our team of investigators did an outstanding job solving this arson case and we greatly appreciate the assistance from the public."

Page was arrested and booked into the Bienville Parish Sheriff's Office Jail. His bail was set at \$90,000.

Strain added, agents are continuing their investigations into numerous fires in the Bienville and Jackson parish areas

which occurred on Oct. 13, 2015.

Strain and State Fire Marshal Butch Browning are asking individuals to report any information they may have regarding these fires.

The Louisiana Forestry Association is offering up to a \$2,000 reward for information that leads to an arrest and conviction. If you have information about who may be responsible for these fires, please call 225-925-4500.

Mom's Buttermilk Pie

2 cups sugar	1 cup buttermilk
¼ cup flour	1 teaspoon vanilla extract
3 eggs	1 teaspoon nutmeg
½ cup melted butter	1 (9 inch) pie shell

Combine sugar, flour, eggs and butter in a small bowl; mix well. Add buttermilk, vanilla and nutmeg, beat until smooth. Pour into pie shell. Bake at 400 degrees for 10 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 325 degrees. Bake for 1 hour longer.

A Honey of a Pecan Pie

Brown 1 stick salted butter in medium saucepan -- do not burn!!!
(Swirl in saucepan on medium high heat until golden brown)
Add the following:

½ cup light Karo corn syrup with vanilla flavoring	½ teaspoon lemon juice*
½ cup honey	½ teaspoon salt
1 cup sugar	3 cups pecans, lightly parched (about 1½ to 2 min. in microwave) and halved or chopped
3 large eggs, beaten	

Mix well and pour into two 8" pie crusts. Bake 10 minutes at 425 degrees, then 40 minutes at 325 degrees. (During baking, cover pie crusts with strips of aluminum foil when they become golden brown.)

*In place of lemon juice, I use one packet of True Lemon granules.

Honey Pecan Squares

1¼ lbs. butter, unsalted, room temp.	1 cup Louisiana honey
¾ cup sugar	3 cups light brown sugar
3 eggs (extra-large)	1 tsp. vanilla
1 tsp. vanilla	1 tsp. lemon zest (grated)
4½ cups flour	1 tsp. orange zest (grated)
½ tsp. baking powder	¼ cup heavy cream
¼ tsp. salt	2 lbs. Louisiana pecans, coarsely chopped
1 lb. butter, unsalted, room temp.	

Preheat oven to 350 degrees .

Crust: beat butter and granulated sugar in electric mixer bowl with paddle attachment, until light, approximately 3 minutes. Add eggs and vanilla and mix well. Sift flour, baking powder, and salt together. Mix dry ingredients into batter with mixer on low speed until just combined. Press dough evenly into two ungreased 18X12 X1-inch baking sheets, making an edge around the outside. It will be very sticky; sprinkle dough and hands lightly with flour. Bake 15 minutes, until crust is set but not browned. Cool.

Topping: combine butter, honey, brown sugar, vanilla, and zests in a large heavy-bottomed saucepan. Cook over low heat until butter is melted, using a wooden spoon to stir. Raise heat and boil 3 minutes. Remove from heat. Stir in heavy cream and pecans. Pour over crusts (avoid getting filling between crust and pan). Bake 25 minutes, until filling sets. Remove from oven and cool. Wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate until cold. Cut into bars and serve.

No--Bake Chocolate Cheesecake

1 ½ cups semi-sweet chocolate chips	¼ cup butter or margarine, softened
1 (8 oz.) pkg. cream cheese, softened	2 cups Cool Whip, thawed
1 (3 oz.) pkg. cream cheese, softened	8 inch package graham cracker crust
½ cup sugar	

Microwave directions: in a small bowl, place chocolate chips and microwave at high (100%) power 1-1½ minutes or until chips are melted and mixture is smooth when stirred. Set aside to cool. In large mixer bowl, beat cream cheese, sugar and butter until smooth. On low speed blend in melted chocolate. Fold in Cool Whip until blended; spoon into crust. Cover, chill until firm. Stumpage prices paid for pine sawtimber during the second quarter of 2015 averaged \$262.96 per thousand board feet Doyle. This average represents a

6.89 percent increase from the previous quarter and 1.76 percent increase compared to a year ago. Prices paid for mixed hardwood sawtimber during

the second quarter of 2015 averaged \$321.95 per thousand board feet Doyle which is a 6.46 percent decrease from the previous quarter and 25.89 percent

lower than a year ago. Pulpwood stumpage prices averaged \$27.27 per standard cord for pine and \$27.67 per standard cord for hardwood.

Strain receives Civil Service Award

On Oct. 16, Louisiana Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., was the recipient of the highest civil service award for administrators and unclassified employees by the Louisiana Civil Service League.

The Monte M. Lemann Award, presented by the Louisiana Civil Service League, honors men and women who have supported the civil service system through exceptional leadership, but who are not civil service employees.

“It is an honor to be recognized by your peers, but it’s an even greater honor to be recognized by those you command and lead,” said Strain. “These employees want to do so much good.

In public life, it’s the employees who implement the laws and the public will. They deserve peace of mind that that they will have money to pay their bills and that their careers won’t be in jeopardy by political figures who just want to gain votes. It recognizes the merit system and that people should be rewarded based on their abilities and their character,” added Strain.

The award is given annually. The Monte M. Lemann Award is granted as recognition of chosen leaders and citizens (not in the classified service) who have fought for the firm principles of the Merit System of Public Employment throughout Louisiana and to build a good image of this state’s civil servants.

Strain Responds to Federal Court Ruling

Baton Rouge (October 12, 2015) – Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., responded to Friday’s federal appeals court ruling that temporarily blocked implementation of a new EPA regulation that would negatively impact Louisiana’s agricultural industry.

The “Waters of the United States” (WOTUS) rule would increase the EPA and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineer’s jurisdiction over Louisiana waters and authority to enforce the Clean Water Act.

“We have heard from thousands of agriculture producers in Louisiana on how the WOTUS could require them to get government permits for activities that have been considered a normal part of farming. Louisiana farmers typically follow “best management

practices” and are stewards of the land. They earn their living by working their land and want to protect it. This rule, which is intended to keep streams and wetlands clean, is unnecessary and over burdensome,” said Strain.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit issued the stay halting implementation of the ruling nationwide. Louisiana Attorney General Buddy Caldwell and eighteen other states filed suit against the EPA. In the lawsuit, Attorney General Caldwell contends that the proposal is unconstitutional and that it violates the federal Administrative Procedures Act.

This issue can be appealed up to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Rose rosette disease confirmed in Louisiana

BOSSIER CITY, La. —A devastating disease of roses called rose rosette disease caused by Rose rosette virus has been confirmed for the first time in Louisiana by LSU AgCenter horticulturist Allen Owings and AgCenter “Plant Doctor” Raj Singh.

Rose rosette was found on landscape shrub roses growing in a commercial landscape in Bossier City, Singh said.

“Modern roses, which include our hybrid tea, grandiflora, floribunda and landscape shrub cultivars along with antique old garden roses are equally susceptible to the disease,” Owings said. “Naturalized plantings of the wild species of rose called multiflora are serving as host plants around the country.”

Rose rosette disease produces a variety of symptoms, depending on the variety or species of the rose and the plant’s age.

Several different types of symptoms have been reported on infected roses, but some of the more recognizable symptoms of rose rosette disease include “witch’s broom”, ex-

cessive thorniness, thickened new canes and abnormal discoloration or excessive reddening of new foliage.

Infected roses produce a cluster of new shoots from a single point on the parent canes. The new shoots elongate rapidly and appear like a witch’s broom.

Infected canes produce excessive thorns that are green or red and soft in the beginning but later harden off as the disease progresses. Presence of excessive thorns, especially on newly infected canes, is one of the most reliable symptoms to help with diagnosing rose rosette disease.

Another symptom that may be used to diagnose the disease is that infected canes are thicker than parent canes. Reddening of new foliage and shoots also is related.

“Remember, however, that these symptoms can be used to potentially recognize rose rosette disease but that positive confirmation of the disease requires molecular testing,” Singh said.

Although rose rosette disease produces unique symptoms on roses, those symptoms can be easily confused with symptoms caused by other diseases, pests, stresses and other factors.

Improper use of herbicides such as glyphosate may result in distortion and clustering of new growth that looks like witch’s broom.

Abnormal discoloration and distortion of new foliage have been associated with rose rosette disease, but feeding injury from chilli thrips, which is a very significant rose-growing issue in Louisiana, also cause similar symptoms.

Similarly, excessive reddening of new growth is a normal characteristic of some rose varieties.

Rose rosette disease is transmitted by a tiny eriophyid mite, or by grafting, Singh said.

The eriophyid mites crawl from plant to plant or move long distances with the wind. The virus is systemic and can persist in the live roots of infected rose bushes, but it is not

soil-borne, he said.

Grafting of virus-infected scions on healthy root stock and vice versa may also result in virus transmission.

“Management of rose rosette disease in infected roses is not possible. Once a rose is infected, there is no cure,” Singh said. “Several precautions can be taken, however, to avoid introduction of the disease or to reduce its spread from infected to healthy roses. Check out the LSU AgCenter Publication 3355 for steps to avoid and reduce the spread of rose rosette disease.”

Roses continue to be very popular landscape plants in Louisiana and the South, and this should continue, Owings said.

“It is important to be aware of this disease now affecting our plantings, and rose enthusiasts should attempt to make themselves aware of the symptoms,” Owings said.
