It's early on a Saturday morning and while many teenagers are sleeping in, one group of teens is digging in the mud.

"My favorite thing to do is plant, learn about the different types of soil and when it the best time to

plant certain vegetables," said Archbishop Shaw High School 10th grader Jhaylin Adams. The garden also serves another purpose for this student. He gets school credit. "I would pass by the garden every day and look out the window

and say, "That's where I want to do my service hours."

For State Representative Patrick Connick (R-Harvey), this community garden located along busy Barataria Boulevard in Marrero, La., is a labor of love. Connick, an attorney, along with local farmer Elvay Chauvin, began working the land five years ago. The Archdiocese of New Orleans owns the property where the garden sits. Prior to this project, the property was nothing but an overgrown field next to Hope Haven/Madonna Manor, a former orphanage built in 1920 which is no longer in operation.

"Agriculture has always been a part of my life. My grandfather on my mother's side immigrated from Holland when he was 18 years old. He was known as 'the Dutchman' and was the ex-officio veterinarian for the Westbank. He operated a dairy and grew corn to feed his cows," said Connick. "As a child, I had a small garden where I grew tomatoes and peppers. To this day, I enjoy being in the garden. I'd rather do this than be on the golf course." Connick added, "I wish I could do this all the time. People come out here and they are

amazed. They love it."

Arugula, beans, broccoli, carrots, corn, eggplant, herbs, parsley, potatoes, strawberries, tomatoes, soft-red winter wheat, you name it and it grows on the approximate two acre piece of land. Connick and Chauvin work the garden to support Café Hope – a farm to table culinary program and restaurant designed to help at-risk youth who cannot make it in traditional schools.

About 25 percent of the produce grown is donated to Café Hope's restaurant which has recently taken over the kitchen at Timberlane Country Club located in Gretna, La. The rest is sold at the Gretna Farmer's Market and to restaurants in New Orleans such as Irene's Cuisine and Herbsaint. Currently, there is a small plot of wheat being grown specifically for Grasion Gill, the owner of Bellegarde Bakery in New Orleans. "Bellegarde specializes in creating incredible artesian breads," Connick said. "Grasion has given us organic corn and wheat to plant. He understands and appreciates the work we do here."

Connick says the money goes right back into the garden and

word is spreading about the garden and its goals. "The chef's love our fresh produce. They can't get enough of what we grow."

Connick's ultimate goal is to bring attention to the work being done at Café Hope and to save several historical buildings that sit on the 52-acre property. "I feel I have an obligation to grow healthy food, help bring attention to this campus, and find a way to bring economic life back into these magnificent structures," Connick said.

Connick used personal money to buy a 25 Hp New Holland tractor. And to allow for more productivity, under Chauvin's guidance, they installed an irrigation and drainage system. The student volunteers helped with these projects, so in addition to learning about growing produce, the kids also learned about what it takes to make a small community farm grow and thrive.

"I did not know this was here. My aunt knew about it. I now have a greater appreciation for where food comes from and the work that goes into it," said New Orleans Military and Maritime Academy (NOMMA) 12th grader Trevor Chatelain.

Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

Only hire licensed horticulture professionals

Baton Rouge, La. (April 6, 2017) – It’s that time of year when people are ready to spruce up their yards. Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., is urging Louisiana homeowners to hire only licensed landscape horticulturists, arborists and landscape irrigation contractors when doing major landscaping work at their homes or businesses.

Strain advised that homeowners ask to see a license issued by the LDAF before allowing any work to be done on their property.

Homeowners should also ask arborists, landscape horticulturists and landscape irrigation contractors for references before engaging their services and should follow up by checking those references.

“Be wary of people claiming to be ‘yard specialists’ when, in reality, they may not be true landscape professionals. Many have little or no training and it shows in their work,” said Strain.

Licensed arborists and landscape irrigation contractors must also have current liability insurance before a license is issued by the

LDAF. “Hurricane season is right around the corner. Again, for major jobs cutting back or cutting down trees before or after a storm, it’s always best to enlist the help of someone who is licensed and insured to handle those jobs,” said Strain.

Oversight of these professionals is through the LDAF’s Horticulture and Quarantine Programs division.

Strain said horticulture professionals must pass an exam to ensure that they have the training necessary to do the work. Arborists and landscape irrigation

contractors are required to attend continuing education training to renew their licenses. In addition, licensed horticultural professionals are required to display their LDAF license number on their vehicles.

Call the Horticulture and Quarantine Programs division at 225-952-8100 if there are any questions about whether a landscape horticulturist, landscape irrigation contractor or arborist is properly licensed.

Pasture care, cattle health highlighted at field day

LSU AgCenter scientists are trying to find ways to control two of the most common and troublesome weeds in Louisiana pastures: Chinese privet and broomsedge.

Cattle producers heard about those and several other research projects at a field day held March 30 at the Bob R. Jones-Idlewild Research Station in Clinton.

Chinese privet, which mostly grows along fencerows, is a prolific seed producer, making it easy for birds to spread the invasive plant.

"It's a hard plant to control," said AgCenter weed scientist Ron Strahan.

Only one herbicide, Arsenal, controls privet 100 percent. But it also kills desirable trees that may be nearby.

Strahan has been looking at other options, including the herbicides metsulfuron, Grazon Next and Remedy, all of which offer good control of privet if used with a surfactant and sprayed thoroughly. He said metsulfuron appears to be most promising, while privet treated with the more-expensive Remedy is more likely to grow back.

Applications made during the growing season — May to September — are most effective because that's when leaves are more easily penetrated by the herbicide, Strahan said. January applications still provide some benefits.

Controlling broomsedge, another weed that produces numerous seed, is a complex undertaking. The weed is an "indicator plant" in that it typically shows up in pastures with low pH or that have not been grazed enough, said AgCenter forage specialist Ed Twidwell.

No "magic bullet" herbicides or management practices have been identified yet. Research has revealed little additional information on broomsedge control since the 1930s, when scientists in Tennessee concluded periodically clipping the weed is the best way to control it, Twidwell said.

Clipping every 30 days, along with applying lime and fertilizer, is the best treatment Twidwell said he has found so far. It's also important to maintain a vigorous forage stand, which helps reduce the number of broomsedge plants by creating competition, he said.

Producers should ensure they apply herbicides and other farm chemicals properly. "Improper calibration is sometimes the reason why people do not achieve the results that they want," said Kenny Sharpe, AgCenter agent in Livingston Parish.

He demonstrated how to calibrate sprayers using the "1/128 calibration method," which involves adjusting nozzle pressure so that one gallon is sprayed per 1/128 acre. He also recommended using GPS to calculate exact acreage so that appropriate amounts of inputs are applied.

Jeff Gurie, who manages the livestock farm at the AgCenter Dean Lee Research Station in Alexandria, told about an ongoing study of "environmentally smart," or controlled-release, nitrogen fertilizer. It is a urea product that is coated with polymers. Controlled-release nitrogen may require fewer applications, he said, because it is less susceptible to volatilization and more can be put out at one time.

In the winter ryegrass season, Gurie was able to graze plots treated with the controlled-release fertilizer six times compared to only five times on plots treated with urea alone and urea with the Agrotain nitrogen stabilizer.

Data collected so far show no significant differences between controlled-release and regular fertilizers in terms of the amount of nitrate runoff they cause or the level of protein and dry matter in ryegrass, he said.

Jonathan Roberts, a Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry veterinarian, advised field day attendees to take

precautions against parasites, diseases and stress, especially as the hot summer approaches. Herds should be vaccinated according to farm-specific needs, and good handling practices should be used to avoid stressing animals.

Nutrition is another important consideration. Cattle that aren't fed adequately will not perform well during breeding season, which will be reflected in their calves, Roberts said. "Whatever you feed your cow while she's pregnant can actually determine how that calf produces," he said.

Cattle producers should be familiar with the different stages of calving and know when they should intervene or call for professional assistance, said Glen Gentry, resident coordinator of the Idlewild station.

"You can do everything right ... but still, from time to time, you're going to have issues," he said.

Heifers tend to have more difficulties than cows, for example. And large calves can cause labor to last too long, a situation in which the producer must know how to take action safely and quickly.

AgCenter agent Donna Morgan encouraged attendees to join the Louisiana Master Farmer and Master Cattleman programs, which teach about good management practices and conservation.

Phil Elzer, AgCenter associate vice president and director of the School of Animal Sciences, said state budget cuts continue to cause uncertainty about the future of higher education. Still, the undergraduate animal science program at LSU has remained strong, with more than 400 students enrolled.

The School of Animal Sciences recently hired three new faculty members, who will focus their work on beef cattle.

"We have a commitment to the cattle industry," Elzer said.

Update on gas pump skimming devices

Baton Rouge, La. (March 28, 2017) – Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the department's Weights and Measures division is seeing an increase in skimming devices at gasoline pumps.

“Our inspectors seem to be finding one or two skimmers on a weekly basis. Consumers are also alerting our office more often which helps us track down these devices,” said Strain.

The LDAF continues to work with the United States Secret Service, state and local law enforcement as they continue their investigations into skimming devices.

In the past month, the LDAF confiscated at least 15 skimming devices throughout the state. These devices contained approximately 4,000 credit/debit card numbers, according to the Secret Service.

The skimmers were found in Avoyelles, Calcasieu, Jefferson, Lafayette, Rapides, St. Landry, St. Tammany, and Washington parishes.

“Unfortunately, thieves are always looking for ways to stay one step ahead of authorities. Our inspectors continue to look for anything suspect and we remind convenience store employees to stay alert and try to monitor what is actually taking place at a gas pump,” said Strain. “Ask yourself, is it someone purchasing gasoline or someone manipulating the cabinet on the pump? As for the consumer, if you do not pay cash, we urge you to be vigilant in monitoring your



credit card statements weekly, if not daily, for unauthorized purchases.”

Strain said skimming devices used to be easily recognized when the gas pump credit card machines were opened because they were crudely put together and often had a homemade look, but the new skimmers are smaller and easier to hide. Some of the newer devices also have Bluetooth capability which allows them to transmit the financial information that they steal. This means that the perpetrators do not have to remove the devices to obtain the information they have skimmed.

Some tips to protect your personal information:

- Whenever possible, do not use the debit card function at the gas pump. Use it as a credit card in order to protect your pin number.
- Monitor your debit/credit card activity online and contact your bank to report unrecognized charges.
- Whenever using a credit card, try to use a pump that is easily seen by gas station employees. Pumps that are less visible are commonly targeted because crooks can easily install a skimmer which normally takes very little time.
- Check the pump card reader for signs of forced entry like bent panels or broken security tape.

Once the skimming devices are analyzed, all financial institutions affected are contacted by the Secret Service.
