State unveils Farm Recovery Grant Program

Damage Caused by March and August 2016 floods



Baton Rouge, La. (June 30, 2017) – Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said farmers and ranchers in 51 Louisiana parishes could be eligible for recovery grant money as a result of the flood events in March and August of 2016.

“Informational meetings will be held across the state to assist producers with the application process,” Strain said. “Our agricultural producers must meet certain requirements for eligibility. Meeting times and locations will be released at a later date.”

This \$10 million grant is funded through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (as Community Development Block Disaster Recovery Program {CDBG} grant funds). The Office of Community Development, Disaster Recovery Unit, receives the CDBG disaster recovery grant funds from HUD. The Louisiana Department

of Agriculture of Forestry will then administer the program. The funding is part of the \$1.6 billion congressional appropriation for Restore Louisiana.

“Conventional disaster programs like low-interest disaster loans and crop insurance are often inadequate when our farmers are impacted by major disasters like the flooding of 2016,” Strain said. “We worked to secure this funding to help fill gaps to ensure our farmers can get back on their feet and continue producing high quality agricultural food and fiber for years to come.”

Producers with pre-storm annual gross farm revenue of \$25,000 in the years 2014, 2015 or 2016 are eligible to apply.

Crop loss must amount to a minimum of \$10,000 as calculated by the crop loss calculator. Eligible crops include: cotton, corn, crawfish, grain sorghum, rice,

hay, soybeans, sweet potatoes, sugarcane, strawberries, wheat and cattle.

Eligible parishes include: Acadia, Allen, Ascension, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Calcasieu, Caldwell, Catahoula, Claiborne, DeSoto, East Baton Rouge, East Carroll, East Feliciana, Evangeline, Franklin, Grant, Iberia, Iberville, Jackson, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, LaSalle, Lincoln, Livingston, Madison, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Point Coupee, Rapides, Red River, Richland, Sabine, St. Helena, St. James, St. Landry, St. Martin, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, Union, Vermilion, Vernon, Washington, Webster, West Baton Rouge, West Carroll, West Feliciana and Winn.

USDA Designates Natural Disaster Areas

Baton Rouge, La. (June 23, 2017) – The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) designated Evangeline Parish in Louisiana as a primary natural disaster area as the result of losses and damages caused by heavy and excessive rain that occurred from April 4, 2017 through May 23, 2017.

Acadia, Allen, Avoyelles, Jefferson Davis, Rapides and St. Landry parishes also qualify for natural disaster assistance because these parishes are contiguous to Evangeline.

“Our farmers and ranchers

continue to face hardships as the result of weather conditions that are beyond their control. We will work with the federal government to get whatever assistance we can to help them sustain their businesses,” said Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

All parishes listed above were designated natural disaster areas on June 21, 2017, making all qualified farm operators in the designated areas eligible for Farm Service Agency’s (FSA’s) emergency (EM) loans, provided

eligibility requirements are met. Farmers in eligible parishes have eight months from the date of the declaration to apply for loans to help cover part of their actual losses. FSA will consider each loan application on its own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability. FSA has a variety of programs, in addition to the EM loan program, to help eligible farmers recover from adversity.

Other FSA programs that can provide assistance, but do not

require a disaster declaration, include Operating and Farm Ownership Loans; the Emergency Conservation Program; Livestock Forage Disaster Program; Livestock Indemnity Program; Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees and Farm-Raised Fish Program; and the Tree Assistance Program.

Summer Corn and Squash Salad

1 zucchini	3 tbsps. Peach White Balsamic
1 yellow squash	Vinegar, Red Stick Spice Co.
1 green onion, thinly sliced	Salt and Pepper to taste
1 ear of corn	1/4 cup pecan pieces
1/4 cup Basil Olive Oil,	Crumbled Feta

Cut the zucchini and squash into matchsticks or thin ribbons. A mandolin or spiralizer works well for this. Combine the zucchini, squash, green onion and corn in a large bowl. Combine the Basil Extra Virgin Olive Oil, Peach White Balsamic in a separate bowl. Pour over the vegetables and toss to combine. Taste and adjust with salt and pepper. Top with pecan pieces and crumbled feta.

Blueberry Basil Salad

1 cup of blueberries	1/2 tbsp. olive oil
1 cup of spinach or romaine	1 tsp. honey
1/2 cup of cherry tomatoes	1/2 tsp. sea salt
1/2 cup of cucumber	1/2 tsp. coarse black pepper
1/8 cup feta cheese	1 tbsp. chopped basil
2 tbsp. balsamic vinegar	

Add balsamic vinegar and honey into a medium bowl and mix until honey is dissolved. Add oil and mix until combined. Rinse leafy greens and fruit and vegetables. Add blueberries to dressing. Peel cucumber if desired before cutting it in half lengthwise and then thinly slice it before adding to the bowl. Cut cherry tomatoes in half and add to bowl. Chop spinach or romaine before adding it and the feta to the bowl. Rinse and chop basil and add to the bowl. Add seasonings then mix well with a spoon.

Louisiana Collard Greens

2 pounds of fresh Louisiana collard greens	1 tsp. crushed red pepper
1 ham hock or 6 slices of cooked bacon	2 to 3 tps. salt or sea salt
1 medium onion, chopped	

Wash greens and remove any tough stems. Cut up, and put greens and onion in a deep pot. Rinse ham hock and add it to the pot along with salt and red pepper. Add just enough water to cover greens, then cook until tender (about an hour). Season to taste. Goes great with corn bread and a sliced Louisiana tomato. Serves 4-6.

Louisiana Seafood Pasta

2 lbs. pasta, cooked, drained, rinsed and cooled	4 each zucchini, cut into ribbons with a vegetable peeler
8 oz butter	12 oz cooked shrimp or any combination
1 small onion, minced	4 oz cooked crawfish
2 red bell peppers, small cubes	16 oz cooked crab meat
2 orange, yellow or green bell peppers, small cubes	Parmesan cheese and green onions as garnish
4 cloves of garlic, minced	
12 oz cherry tomatoes, cut in half	

Sauté the peppers and onions in butter until tender in a large dutch oven. Add the garlic and sauté for 1 minute until fragrant. Add the heavy cream and pasta and cook until the pasta is heated. Add the cooked seafood and zucchini ribbons to heat. While peppers are cooking, heat the tomatoes in a separate sauté pan until just blistered 2- to 3 minutes. These will be added last. Adjust the seasoning with salt, pepper Cajun seasoning, and parmesan cheese

Red Stick Ratatouille

1 slender zucchini	1 orange bell pepper
1 slender yellow squash	1 jar Davey's Treasures Salsa (or your favorite salsa)
1 slender eggplant	1 tbsp. olive oil

Slice zucchini, squash, and eggplant 1/16 of an inch thick. Core bell pepper, and then slice into rings. Spread salsa onto bottom of a large round or oval baking dish. Arrange alternate slices on top of each other in a circular pattern, overlapping so a bit can be seen of each. Drizzle olive oil over all with a dash of fresh ground pepper and fresh thyme to top it off. Cover with parchment paper cut to fit dish. Bake at 375F for 30 to 40 minutes, so that vegetables are tender yet will hold their shape when served.

Serves 6-8.

Tip: Buy all vegetables as close as possible to the same diameter to make a pretty layered pattern for the dish.

Attention producers, sellers, buyers and shippers of baled hay

Moving Baled Hay From Areas Under Quarantine for Imported Fire Ant?

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) regulates the movement of hay out of areas under quarantine for the imported fire ant quarantine zone which includes most of the southeastern United States including Louisiana.

In quarantine areas like Louisiana, USDA only regulates baled hay and baled straw that are stored in direct contact with the ground since it poses a risk for harboring imported fire ants. This hay can move anywhere within the quarantine area but can only move outside of the quarantine area when certain conditions are met.

Baled hay that meets any requirements below is not regulated and has no movement restrictions.

For baled hay that is stacked, all bales except the bottom layer that is in direct contact with the ground.

Hay that is cut, baled, loaded, and shipped without storage. Baled hay that is stored on an impervious surface such as hard pan (highly compressed soil), asphalt, concrete, etc. Baled hay that is stored elevated above the soil on pallets or tires or stored on landscaping cloth placed over the soil.

LDAF officials recommend hay producers, sellers and shippers to contact agriculture officials in the state where hay will be shipped before transporting hay. LDAF accepting organic cost-share rebate applications

Louisiana Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said Louisiana agricultural producers and handlers who have either obtained or renewed USDA organic certification may qualify for reimbursement for their certification costs through a cost share rebate program.

The program will reimburse up to 75 percent of certification costs, or up to \$750 per year per certification category.

The rebates are available to cover certification expenses incurred between October 1, 2016 and September 30, 2017.

"Earning the USDA Organic certification for an agricultural product has a number of benefits like adding value and consumer confidence;



however, the certification can be a costly and lengthy process," Strain said.

Applications must be received by close of business (4:30

p.m.) Oct. 2, 2017.

The program is funded through USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA).

The 2017 cost-share

application is available at www.LDAF.la.gov. Reimbursements will be on a first-come, first-served basis, based on receipt of the completed application packet, until available funding is exhausted.

Did you know?

Package Inspections; they help protect Louisiana consumers

When you make your way down the grocery aisle and grab that box of cereal, what are you really paying for? Your child's temporary happiness, the utility bills of the grocery store, the factory worker's salary, the supply truck's diesel, and the company's latest advertising campaign? Probably all of that and more, but what you should not be paying for is the packaging. That's why there is a "net weight" statement on all packaged goods. Net weight is the actual amount of the product being offered for

sale. In this case, it should only include the weight of the cereal. The packaging, labels, and the toy surprise at the bottom of the box should not be included.

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Division of Weights and Measures inspects packages to ensure that the net weight shown on the box matches the weight of the cereal in the box. Our inspectors determine this by subtracting the tare weight from the total weight. The tare weight is the weight of all of the box, prize

or other packaging associated with the product. Some examples of tare material are: the package or container that holds the product, ice on frozen shrimp, pop-up thermometers and gravy packets that come with a turkey, soaker pads in trays of meat, the container at the salad bar, sauce packets, promotional labels, and anything else that is not the product being offered for sale.

Most commonly this type of inspection is conducted at the retailer, but inspections can be done at the packer, distributor

or warehouse. The purpose of checking packages for net quantity is to ensure Louisiana's consumers get what they pay for.

Each year Weights and Measures inspectors conduct over 100,000 commercial weighing, measuring, metering, and scanning device inspections. If you have questions or concerns about package weights, please contact our Weights and Measures Division at 225-952-1341.

LSU AgCenter researchers receive USDA grant to study pollinator health

LSU AgCenter entomologists Kristen Healy and Daniel Swale received nearly a million dollars from the U.S. Department of Agriculture National Institute of Food and Agriculture to study honeybee health.

The LSU AgCenter is one of seven universities to receive part of \$6.8 million the USDA is investing in pollinators. The AgCenter portion is \$935,000.

Healy and Swale are conducting research on how stress factors affect honeybees. They are working with researchers at the USDA Honey Bee Breeding, Genetics and Physiology Research Unit in Baton Rouge and the largest beekeeper in the country to do a two-year study following 400 hives.

Healy's work focuses on mites and the pathogens they transmit.

"We will divide the hives into cohort groups. One group will be treated for mites with a mite control product and the other will receive no treatment," Healy said.

The bees also will be divided by location. Some bees will be moved to different locations for pollination services. The population the researchers are working with is currently in South Dakota, but some hives will move to California in the fall for almond pollination and then to Mississippi in late winter.

"We also want to see if it is a stress factor to move them," Healy said.

Swale is studying the physiology of bees, which could suffer from the

relocations.

"The transcontinental movement of the bees may force them to spend more energy and deplete their storage of nutrient-rich lipids, or fats," Swale said. "We are interested in determining if the bees have reduced amount of fat after each relocation event. If they do, we then want to ask if we can enhance the amount of fat in each bee."

Reduced fat storage can decrease the bees' chances of survival, Swale said. He will also study oxidative stress levels and see if there is a way to mitigate the development of the damaging reactive oxygen species in the bees' systems.

The researchers also are interested in deformed wing virus, which is present in

many colonies, and trying to understand its transmission.

Healy said they will be sampling pollen, nectar and bees from hives during and at the end of the study.

"We can look at which colonies failed and which ones didn't and quantify which stress variables were more important to the relative health of the bees," Healy said.

The grant also includes an extension component so the researchers can determine the best methods to get bee health information to beekeepers and the public.

The USDA estimates honeybees pollinate \$15 billion worth of crops. U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue declared June 19-25 as National Pollinator Week.
