Starr Homeplace

You might not think of Oak Ridge, Louisiana, as a mecca of cultural activity in the bayou state, but at Starr Homeplace, owner Joe Rolfe is hoping his family property can be just that for those who want a taste of the past.

"A lot of artists in Northeast Louisiana are working in isolation, in art school or in college. Being around other artists and creative

people helps them feed off each other, network ideas and form friendships. We're trying to provide a place for people to get together and do that," said Rolfe.

For Zac Stephens, who used to volley around video games on the internet which included the art of blacksmithing, Starr Homeplace is a great place to make what he was doing online in the virtual world of

reality.

"I was playing video games doing blacksmithing on the games. I was sitting around the house and I was wondering if I could do this in real life. I went outside and practiced and years later, I'm out here doing demo work for people," said Stephens.

Stephens works as a media guru for a non-profit in West Monroe. In his spare time, he's sweating it out over hot coals with iron and a hammer. He loves sharing this old timey craft at community days at Starr Homeplace in Oak Ridge.

"It's great to come out here and see the old way of doing things. It wasn't so much about making a profit. It's more of the craftsmanship behind things," Stephens added.

Rolfe opened Starr Homeplace on his property in honor of his late wife, Starr, who was an artist. Following her passing, he decided to turn a part of his property, in the middle of a farm field in Morehouse Parish, into a destination for creative types.

"First and foremost it's a memorial to my wife Starr who loved crafts and craftsmen. But what we're really trying to do is build a creative economy in Northeast Louisiana. They teach letters and numbers in school, but they don't teach colors and notes," said Rolfe.

Rolfe opens up 19 old buildings on the family farm to those who want to create: From the artistry of batik, where one uses wax to dye cloth, to those who restore old travel trailers.

You'll even find a falconer training the birds to hunt prey.

"Train it to hunt with you or for you in its natural quarry. We hunt rabbits and squirrels," added Rolfe. "A lot of people see Starr Homeplace as strictly a museum of old stuff, but what we really are is a creative incubator economy is what we're trying to do."

While several in Rolfe's family continued the tradition of farming, he was an interior designer by profession. However, he's very aware that agriculture is an integral part of this community. He's even housing memorabilia from former state Agriculture Commissioner Dave Pearce who was from nearby Oak Grove.

"We have his hat and all his medals and artifacts that were assembled for that collection. He served as commissioner of agriculture under five governors," said Rolfe.

Rolfe's collection of historic buildings, old farm implements, and appliances from long ago are more than just items to be looked at. Rolfe wants them renewed, restored, and reused by those who

value their worth.

"Whereas most non-profits need money, we also need money but what we really lack is people. The money is not good if there's nobody to help us utilize the tools and equipment," said Rolfe.

Rolfe is also hoping the next generation can get a peek into what their forefathers did and how they accomplished it. In many ways, Starr Homeplace is a reflection of how things were done, but it is also a place of renewal. Rolfe believes Starr would love what this place has become.

"I think she would be absolutely in Heaven. It's the community we hope to form. The community includes people from all over and from all professional walks of life. We get potters, painters and poets to engineers and mechanics," he added. He said they love to utilize the unusual location for their hobbies - creating everything from bottle openers to crosses.

"It's inspiring to see these old things and how stuff was made before the internet and google came along. It's nice to carry on the legacy," said Rolfe.

Starr Homeplace is open to the public by appointment or every second Saturday of the month when Rolfe hosts community day. Artists and those who appreciate history are invited to come out.

Cotton harvest equipment moving into state restricted without inspection

Cotton harvest season means used and custom harvest equipment is moving throughout the state.

“Harvest equipment traveling through the state must be properly inspected and certified to indicate there are no boll weevils,” said Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. “The boll weevil was eradicated here in Louisiana in 2012. Used and/or custom cotton harvest equipment from a boll weevil infested area can reintroduce the pest to the state

if the equipment is not inspected properly and given clearance.”

Cotton harvest equipment includes cotton pickers, cotton module builders, cotton module trucks, boll buggies, tractors, trailers, and any other equipment potentially harboring cotton debris or boll weevils.

Equipment entering Louisiana from areas such as Texas, Arizona, and New Mexico, that have restrictions due to pink bollworm, will require that a Fumigation

Certificate or USDA PPQ Inspection Form 540 accompany that equipment. Equipment from all other states should have a phytosanitary certificate or other official document such as a statement on letterhead from a state-of-origin regulatory official certifying that the equipment is free from boll weevil or that the equipment originated in a boll weevil free area.

If the equipment stops anywhere within the state of Louisiana, the

Department of Agriculture and Forestry must be notified to inspect the equipment and review all pertinent documentation.

The boll weevil is an insect native to Mexico. It causes extensive damage to cotton plants.

Moving Baled Hay From Areas Under Quarantine for Imported Fire Ant?

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) regulates the movement of hay out of areas under quarantine for the imported fire ant quarantine zone which includes most of the southeastern United States including Louisiana.

In quarantine areas like Louisiana, USDA only regulates baled hay and baled straw that are stored in direct contact with the ground since it poses a risk for harboring imported fire ants. This hay can move anywhere within the quarantine area but can only move outside of the quarantine area when certain conditions are met.

Baled hay that meets any requirements below is not regulated and has no movement restrictions.

For baled hay that is stacked, all bales except the bottom layer that is in direct contact with the ground.

Hay that is cut, baled, loaded, and shipped without storage. Baled hay that is stored on an impervious surface such as hard pan (highly compressed soil), asphalt, concrete, etc. Baled hay that is stored elevated above the soil on pallets or tires or stored on landscaping cloth placed over the soil.

LDAF officials recommend hay producers, sellers and shippers to contact agriculture officials in the state where hay will be shipped before transporting hay. Set aside half cup of cut-up strawberries and place the other half in small mixing bowl, then mash gently with a fork, set aside. Combine cream and sweetened condensed milk in mixing bowl and whip on high speed until soft peaks form. Add buttermilk and mix on low until well combined. Gently fold in the mashed strawberries and vanilla. Pour mixture into a metal loaf pan, cover tightly with plastic wrap and place in freezer for one hour. Remove the pan, stir in remaining half cup of cut up strawberries and give the ice cream a good thorough mixing. Cover tightly again and place in freezer for at least 6 hours or overnight.

Blueberry Peach Smoothie

8 oz. low-fat vanilla Greek yogurt 1/2 cup low-fat milk
 3/4 cup frozen blueberries 2 tablespoons honey
 3/4 cup frozen peaches 1 cup ice cubes

Combine yogurt, fruit, milk, honey and ice in a blender. Blend until smooth and frothy. Serve in a chilled glass immediately.

Almond Mocha Ice Coffee

1 1/1 cups lactose free chocolate low-fat milk 1/4 teaspoon almond extract
 1/2 cup cold-brewed coffee or regular brewed coffee

Combine all ingredients and stir well. Serve over ice.

LDAF accepting organic cost-share rebate applications

Louisiana Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said Louisiana agricultural producers and handlers who have either obtained or renewed USDA organic certification may qualify for reimbursement for their certification costs through a cost share rebate program.

The program will reimburse up to 75 percent of certification costs, or up to \$750 per year per certification category.

The rebates are available to cover certification expenses incurred between October 1, 2016 and September 30, 2017.

"Earning the USDA Organic certification for an agricultural product has a number of benefits like adding value and consumer



confidence; however, the certification can be a costly and lengthy process," Strain said.

Applications must be received by close of business (4:30 p.m.) Oct. 2, 2017.

The program is funded through USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA).

The 2017 cost-share

application is available at www.LDAF.la.gov. Reimbursements will be on a first-come, first-served basis, based on receipt of the completed application packet, until available funding is exhausted.

Utah man arrested in Louisiana on timber theft-related charges

Baton Rouge, LA (July 14, 2017) – A man from Utah is accused of stealing timber from Louisiana landowners in Ouachita and Union Parishes.

Last month, Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Enforcement Division received a complaint of theft of timber from a Union Parish landowner. Investigators said Scott Smith, a Heber City, Utah resident, operating as Buckwater Timber, Co. in Monticello, Ark., cut timber for the landowner between April and May of 2016.

Investigators said Smith took eight loads of timber from the landowner and never paid the landowner the value of the timber which is estimated at \$8,655.59.

On June 19, 2017, Smith

surrendered to authorities and was booked into the Union Parish Detention Center.

“Timber is a valuable commodity in Louisiana that is policed and monitored by our forestry enforcement division. Like anything of value, it is often the target of thieves,” said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

During the investigation in Union Parish, agents discovered Smith allegedly did not pay a Ouachita Parish landowner for 50 loads of timber cut between the months of April and November 2016. The estimated value of that timber is \$77,819.84.

On June 23, 2017, Smith was booked into the Ouachita Parish Correctional Center. Smith was released on bond.

False ragweed becoming major row-crop pest

An LSU AgCenter weed scientist speaking at a field day on July 13 at the Dean Lee Research and Extension Center warned farmers about ragweed infestations in their fields.

The scientist, Daniel Stephenson, said ragweed parthenium has gone from a nuisance in pastures to a major pest in Louisiana row crops. Ragweed parthenium is also known as false ragweed.

The weed can become a major problem quickly if it is not controlled early. Ragweed parthenium often germinates after spring burndown herbicide applications and is not discovered until after crops have emerged, Stephenson said.

Applications of certain herbicides prior to or at planting can provide control of an existing population, he said.

Current research shows that after crop emergence, control options are limited, but Stephenson recommended sequential applications of either Liberty, Liberty plus Roundup PowerMax, or Roundup PowerMax plus a half pound per acre of dicamba.

Stephenson said it's likely the weed has been spread by equipment.

“Ragweed parthenium is a very troublesome weed that is difficult to control with herbicides,” he said. “If a producer sees it in their field, they need to remove it.”

Dan Fromme, AgCenter corn, cotton and grain sorghum specialist, said the Louisiana corn crop got off to a good start and looks promising. Rain was not excessive early in the season, which had been a problem in the past few years, he said.

Acreage, which Fromme estimated to be between 400,000 and 425,000, is down from last

year's 525,000 acres. But he expects yields to be higher this year.

Cotton has had a more challenging year. Fromme said some fields look good, and others do not.

“It's not very consistent this year,” he said. One of the most common calls he has received this year is about cotton cutting out too early, which often is the result of frequent rains compacting the soil and preventing plants from fully developing root systems.

Cotton acreage, estimated to be 180,000, is up from last year, Fromme said.

He said grain sorghum acreage has fallen to 10,000 to 15,000, continuing a downward trend that began in 2013.

Most of Louisiana's estimated 1.3 million acres of soybeans are rated good or excellent in quality so far, interim AgCenter soybean specialist Boyd Padgett said.

“I'm very impressed at what our soybean crop looks like given what it's been through,” he said, referring to frequent rains that normally would encourage disease problems.

Aerial blight has not been much of a concern yet, although farmers should scout their fields for it, looking deep into the plant canopy for symptoms. “This disease can be very deceiving” because it tends to flare up quickly, Padgett said.

Some nematode issues have surfaced recently, he said. The type of nematode — root knot or reniform — determines control options, which include nematicides and crop rotation.

Padgett also introduced Todd Spivey, who recently graduated with a doctorate from North Carolina State University, as the new AgCenter soybean specialist.

AgCenter entomologist Jeff Davis said redbanded stinkbugs are not as much of a problem in soybeans as he expected this year. The warm winter should have given the insect pest a boost, he said, but farmers should remain vigilant at monitoring fields. “Scout early and scout often.”

Redbanded stinkbugs feed on legume cover crops, such as winter peas and crimson clover, so they should be avoided in fields where soybeans will be planted, he said.

AgCenter entomologist Sebe Brown said insect pressure in cotton is inconsistent across the state. Farmers who planted cotton late should watch for boll worms, which have begun moving from corn into cotton in the past couple of weeks.

Brown also told about a project investigating whether farmers can afford to lose some cotton squares to insect injury. He has found that plants that lose up to 60 percent of squares in the first week of bloom “overcompensate” and will do well for the rest of the season.

“We may not have to be so overaggressive in the early season,” Brown said, noting that multiple pesticide applications are usually needed to protect all squares, which is expensive.

AgCenter plant pathologist Trey Price said northern corn leaf blight has been an issue in some fields where corn was the previous crop and reduced tillage and susceptible hybrids were used. The overall corn crop looks good, but some late-planted fields required treatment for southern rust, he said.

Cotton farmers should scout for target spot low in the canopy, Price said.

Frogeye leaf spot in soybeans has been light so far, but Cercospora continues to be a problem. “Unfortunately, we do not have any fungicides that are consistently effective,” he said.

Breeding for variety resistance to Cercospora is underway, but it is complicated because multiple fungal species cause the disease. Target spot can be found in most soybean fields, but it rarely is a significant problem, Price said.

Jimmy Flanagan, AgCenter county agent in St. Mary Parish, talked about drone use in agriculture. Technology has evolved that will allow farmers to find out a crop's needs before a consultant can visually identify problems on the ground, he said.

“It lets us be proactive instead of just reactive,” but the data gathered in a flight have to be analyzed by an expert before any decisions can be made, he said.

Rogers Leonard, AgCenter associate vice president for plants, soils and water resources, said higher education, including the LSU AgCenter, was spared budget cuts during the recent legislative session. But more fiscal problems face the legislature in 2018, he said.

The AgCenter will no longer have county agents for each parish. Agents will instead specialize in commodities and work in multiple parishes, Leonard said.

AgCenter economist Naveen Adusumilli urged farmers to advise members of Congress that support of federal conservation programs is crucial to production. Cuts are being proposed by the administration and Congress.

The AgCenter is assessing how the new Waters of the U.S. regulations would affect Louisiana agriculture, he said.
