# Convales mative champion steer wrestler

While some kids join the wrestling team and compete against each other, Gonzales native Tyler Waguespack took wrestling to a whole new level when he decided to take on a 500-pound steer.

"I grew up with steer wrestling. My dad competed in rodeos, but it was more of a hobby for him," said Waguespack.

At a young age, Waguespack not only showed interest in the sport, but started working toward developing his skills by mastering the "ground work" at a young age. By the age of 13, he was old enough to start practicing on a horse.

"I'd come home from school and practice. I never went to high school football games and I never went to prom. My goal was to compete." And compete he did – from junior competitions to high school rodeos, Waguespack or "Wag" as he's called on the rodeo circuit did them all.

Today, the 26-year old is one of the best steer wrestlers ranking second in the world. In 2016, he took home the grand prize at the national Finals Rodeo (NFR) in Las Vegas, NV. NFR is considered the Super Bowl in the rodeo world. That's where the top 15 competitors square off.

"I always wanted to be one of the best. My dad used to tell me, 'If you do something then do it all the way or not at all'."

At approximately 6'1" and 190 pounds, Waguespack is considered smaller than the average steer wrestler who takes on a 500 pound steer. "My dad always told me, 'Don't let that be a limitation, just outwork the guy next to you'."

Waguespack has been fortunate that he has not suffered a lot of injuries, but in practicing to be the

best, his dad says it's all about timing and balance and having a feel for the strength of the steer for which his son is up against. "While it is about size and strength, it's also about timing and technique which Tyler has mastered. He developed that through practice and more practice," said Mike Waguespack. "I'd tell him, if you want something, no one is going to give it to you."

Last year, Waguespack participated in 89 rodeos around the country. If you ask him if he still gets nervous, he says not anymore. His mom, Vicki, added, "Do I get nervous? Absolutely. I never dreamed it would get this big, but he has worked so hard."

Waguespack plans to compete in Las Vegas again this year. He travels with current number one steer wrestler in the world Ty Erickson out of Montana and Clayton Hass of Texas who also ranks in the top 10. While Waguespack rides some of his own horses in competition, he also rides top rodeo horses from around the country such as Cadillac which is owned by Mark Wallace of Justin, Texas. He says horses like Cadillac have tremendous horse power from start to finish.

For Waguespack, it is important for him to remember how he has made it so far. "My parents have done so much for me. My dad would come home from work and go straight to the arena to help me practice."

Waguespack's sponsors are top of the line, too. They include: Bayou West Co. Saddle Pads, Elite Custom Saddle, Nutrena Horse Feed, Panhandle Western Wear, Resistol Hats, Rock & Roll Denim Jeans, RCI Oil Supply and The Mirage Las Vegas.

Waguespack competes across the U.S. and in Canada. When he comes home to Gonzales, he often coaches and conducts clinics to help those interested in perfecting their craft.

# Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

### Farm Recovery Grant Program application deadline approaching

Baton Rouge, La. (August 10, 2017) – The deadline for agricultural producers to apply for recovery grant money is August 30, 2017. To date, there are a little more than 100 applicants.

"It is not often that the ag industry receives grant money following a disaster. Typically, ag producer assistance comes in the form of a low interest loan. Losing your livelihood during a disaster and then taking out a loan to recover can be debilitating for many of our smaller producers and their families," said Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

This \$10 million recovery grant money will go toward eligible farmers and ranchers in 51 parishes who suffered losses as a result of disastrous flooding in March and August of 2016. Eligible recipients can receive up to \$100,000. However, if farmers do not apply for the grant, Louisiana will lose the money that is left over.

"We know many of our farmers are in the middle of harvest season, but we are here to help them fill out the application, if necessary. Even if you have crop insurance, you may still be eligible for some grant money," added Strain.

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) is offering assistance for the application process. Ag producers can call 866-295-0081 or 225-922-1277 with questions. Appointments can also be scheduled to come to the LDAF Headquarters in Baton Rouge for application assistance.

The grant is funded through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (as Community Development Block Disaster Recovery Program {CDBG} grant funds). The Louisiana Office of Community Development, Disaster Recovery Unit, receives the CDBG

disaster recovery grant funds from HUD. The Louisiana Department of Agriculture of Forestry will then administer the program. The funding is part of the \$1.6 billion congressional appropriation for Restore Louisiana. Producers with pre-storm annual gross farm revenue of \$25,000 in the years 2014, 2015 or 2016 are eligible to apply.

Crop loss must amount to a minimum of \$10,000 as calculated by the crop loss calculator. Eligible crops include: cotton, corn, crawfish, grain sorghum, rice, hay, soybeans, sweet potatoes, sugarcane, strawberries, wheat and cattle.



# Attention producers, sellers, buyers, shippers of baled hay

The USDAAnimal and Plant Health Inspection Service regulates the movement of hay out of areas under quarantine for the imported fire ant quarantine zone which includes most of the southeastern United States including Louisiana.

In quarantine areas like Louisiana, USDA only regulates baled hay and baled straw that are stored in direct contact with the ground since it poses a risk for harboring imported fire ants. This hay can move anywhere within the quarantine area but can only move outside of the quarantine area when certain conditions are met.

Baled hay that meets any requirements below is not regulated and has no movement restrictions.

- •For baled hay that is stacked, all bales except the bottom layer that is in direct contact with the ground.
- •Hay that is cut, baled, loaded, and shipped without storage.
- •Baled hay that is stored on an impervious surface such as hard pan (highly compressed soil), asphalt, concrete, etc.
- •Baled hay that is stored elevated above the soil on pallets or tires or stored on landscaping cloth placed over the soil.

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry officials recommend hay producers, sellers and shippers to contact agriculture officials in the state where hay will be shipped before transporting.

# Weather slows promising corn harvest

Louisiana corn farmers are harvesting what could be a record corn crop — when the weather allows them to run their combines through the fields.

Rain showers, particularly in the afternoon, have been plaguing farmers recently. Still, many farmers are saying this year's crop could be their best one, said Dan Fromme, LSU AgCenter corn specialist.

The state record average yield is approximately 184 bushels per acre. Fromme has reports of non-irrigated fields producing well above 200 bushels. Non-irrigated fields typically have lower averages than

irrigated fields, but Fromme does not expect to see much difference between the two because of ample and timely rainfall.

"Central Louisiana and on south doesn't have much irrigation, and when that yield monitor is well over 200 bushels and not being irrigated, you get excited pretty quick," Fromme said.

Kyle Lemoine, who grows corn in Avoyelles Parish near Moreauville, said favorable conditions have led to one of his better corn crops.

"The corn was planted early, got adequate rainfall throughout the season, and the yields look like some of our better yields than we have ever cut before." Lemoine said.

A key to a successful corn crop is getting an early start, and this year's mild winter allowed farmers to begin planting as early as late February. Unlike last year, there were no major flooding events in the spring caused significant replanting.

The crop was well established before heavier spring rains began to fall, but Lemoine said those rains, along with the ability to plant early, helped his crop.

"You have a chance to catch some of the better rainfall that happens in the early spring, and the cooler temperatures give you a better pollination of the corn crop. And also, you kind of beat the insect pressure," Lemoine said.

Because of plentiful rains, many growers did not have to heavily irrigate their corn fields. In fact, some did not irrigate at all, reducing the cost of producing the crop by saving on fuel and electricity to operate the pumps.

"Many didn't have to roll that pipe out," Fromme said. "You don't have to pump that water and avoid pumping costs. It's always a good feeling when you don't have to spend that money on water." The U.S. Department of Agriculture Louisiana Crop Progress and Condition Report said nearly 30 percent of the state corn crop had harvested as of August 7, which is ahead of last year's pace.

Louisiana farmers are expected to harvest about 420,000 acres of corn, about 100,000 acres fewer acres than last year. The primary reason for the lower acreage is low corn prices. Many farmers are storing their corn and taking a wait-and-see approach.

"I think I'm going to sit on my corn awhile to see if we can get a better price on it as the season progresses," Lemoine said.

### Louisiana takes first place at seafood cook-off

Three Pointe Coupee Parish 4-H chefs showed the judges and the competition how seafood is done with their shrimp dish at the Great American Seafood Cook-Off: 4-H Edition on August 6.

The competition, held at the Morial Convention Center, is celebrating eight years of allowing high school 4-H'ers to show off their culinary skills and to take home some exciting prizes.

LSU AgCenter 4-H agent Monica Laborde, the team's adviser, said the group has been working on their recipe since May.

"Once we decided to use the recipe, we went to work to make sure we had it right," she said.

The team consisted of Sarah Cline, Caroline Benedict and Sophie Elliott, all seniors at Pointe Coupee High School.

"Our recipe was grilled shrimp with citrus salad along with candied pecans and grilled corn on top," Elliott said.

A Georgia 4-H team took second place with their "Seasons of Savannah" dish. The Mississippi team placed third with their seafood-stuffed catfish with Mississippi caviar (black-eyed peas).

AgCenter 4-H Youth Development director Janet Fox said the Great American Seafood Cook-off is an opportunity for youth to get exposed to both preparation and the nutrition of well-designed dishes.

"But also this is an opportunity for the students to link to the food service industry," she said. "They are mentored by chefs who give them feedback and truly gives them a glimpse into the food service industry and the culinary arts."

AgCenter area nutrition agent Quincy Vidrine, coordinator for the competition, said the event started in 2010 following the Deepwater Horizon oil spill to highlight the safety of seafood.

"At that time, we only had Louisiana teams," she said. "But after the great success we had the first year, we decided to invite other states from the Southern region."

This year, competing teams were from Louisiana, Texas, Georgia, South Carolina and Mississippi, but the competition is open to all states, she said.

Each team was given one hour to prepare their dish using American seafood.

Vidrine said the competition rules require each dish to be less than 750 calories per serving, which is in keeping with the 4-H Healthy Living Initiative.

"The purpose of this cook-off is to bring 4-H youth from all over together to compete and to learn more about seafood and its sustainability," Vidrine said. "It also allows teams to show off agricultural products from their states."

The competition also has a workforce component because the participants are high school students who may be in search of possible careers, she said.

The 4-H competition is patterned after and conducted in the same venue as the Great American Seafood Cook-Off, which pits professional chefs from across the United States against one another to prepare their best dish using domestic seafood products.

In addition to cooking, each 4-H team was required to present their plates to the judges and describe the ingredients and the preparation techniques.

The winning team received a \$1,000 cash award from the Louisiana 4-H Foundation, and each team was given \$500 by the Louisiana Seafood Promotion and Marketing Board to cover expenses of participating in the competition.
