Re: Animal Plans

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry reminds you that Revised Statute 29:729 requires that animal shelters, humane societies, veterinary offices, boarding kennels, breeders, grooming facilities, hospitals, schools, animal testing facilities, and any other businesses or not-for-profit agencies that normally house household pets or service animals, create evacuation plans for such animals. Such plans shall be made available to the public upon request and shall be filed annually with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry, Office of Animal Health and Food Safety and with their respective Parish Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness Agency.


The Statute names the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry as the repository for the facilities pet plan and this plan is due in our office by March 1<sup>st</sup> each year. A copy of your plan is also required at your parish homeland security and emergency preparedness agency. We need to prepare for hurricane season, so submission of your pet emergency plan cannot be delayed.

There are many guidelines for safely transporting and housing pets and there are also readily available resources to help facilities develop a workable plan.
