Rougaroux Rum - named for the Cajun werewolf



"The story is so mysterious, just like our rum!"

Louisiana folklore is the inspiration behind Donner Peltier Distillers (DPD) Rougaroux Rum – named for the Cajun werewolf.

"People love hearing the story about the Loup Garoux which is the French word for werewolf. They get all into it," said Danielle Stein, acting distillery manager. "The story is so mysterious, just like our rum!"

The legend –and there are many versions- is that the mythical creature has the body of a man, the face of a wolf and six fingers on both hands. He lives in the swamp or a cane field and only comes out at night. The distillery sits in the middle of a sugar cane field.

With three variations of rum - dark, clear and praline -- all are made with Louisiana ingredients. "We use local, raw sugar and black strap molasses from Lafourche Sugar Mill which is located about two miles from our distillery here in Thibodaux." Stein says they only use the freshest ingredients which also includes Louisiana pecans from Alexandria in the praline rum.

The company is owned by Dr. Tom and Beth Donner and Dr. Henry and Jennifer Peltier. Peltier's family was in the sugarcane business. As Stein explains, one evening, the two doctors tossed around the idea of why no one in Thibodaux has created rum.

That discussion turned into reality in 2012 when they opened the doors to their new business. Now, they're distributing in 12 states and Canada. "Of course, we have a strong presence at restaurants in the New Orleans area. It's something you strive for – to be on menus in New Orleans," said Stein.

These days, rum is not the only drink on the menu. DPD also uses Louisiana rice to create a vodka, gin

and whiskey named LA-1 referencing the first legally made whiskey in Louisiana since prohibition. DPD is the only distillery in North America to use long grain rice to make vodka which is typically potato based. The rice comes from Acadia Rice Mill in Rayne, La.

The gin boasts citrus notes from Louisiana satsumas and other citrus. "As a small business, you don't want to do anything that's already been done. You want to do something that stands out." And stand out it does. "We've won several awards at spirit competitions. We only participate in competitions where we are up against well known vodkas and rums," said Stein.

But despite that success, Stein says DPD struggles with competing with larger brands which have loyal consumers. "Until I started working here, I never really understood the importance of buying local and having that support. Many people don't understand the importance of it and what it means to a local economy. Also, when you support local, you often get better service."

Stein says they often cross promote with other Louisiana companies. The television show NCIS New Orleans has also used their whiskey bottles as props on their show.

Stein says they are not working on new products at this time. Right now, DPD is concentrating on consistency and the state's where they are currently supported.

The Distillery is open for tours, tastings and special events. The distillery provides cocktail suggestions and recipes to their customers.

Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

Two Washington Parish teens arrested for theft

Baton Rouge, La. (January 4, 2018) – The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Livestock Brand Commission arrested two teenagers for allegedly shooting and taking a farm raised deer in Washington Parish. Investigators said the deer was described as a two-and-a half year old, white-tailed deer, 23 point buck, weighing approximately 200 pounds and measuring 181 points on the Boone and Crocket Scale.

According to the owner, the estimated value of the deer was \$8,500.

LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said, “Farm raised deer and exotics in Louisiana are considered ‘alternative livestock’ which are regulated by the LDAF. Our alternative livestock industry consists of more than 300 licensed farms creating both a multi-million dollar annual economic impact and recreational opportunities in the ‘Sportman’s Paradise’ in which

we live.”

On December 30, 2017, LDAF brand investigators determined that Drake Barber, 19, of Franklinton, La. and Justin Miller, 17, of Franklinton, La., shot and removed the deer from the owner’s property on the night of December 26, 2017. Both Barber and Miller were booked into the Washington Parish Jail on December 30, 2017, for theft LA.R.S. 14:67 B 2 of property valued over \$5,000 but less than \$25,000. If convicted, the

suspects face a fine and/or possible jail time.

“Investigators said after the suspects illegally shot and killed the deer, it appears they posted a photo with the deer in question on a Facebook page. Going to someone’s private property and stealing their livestock is a crime,” added Strain.

The Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and the Washington Parish Sheriff’s Office also assisted with these arrests.

Very Strawberry

Fresh Strawberry Pie

1 - 9 inch pie shell, baked	2 tablespoons butter
3/4 cup sugar	1 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup flour	1 cup whipping cream
1/4 teaspoon salt	1.5 tablespoons powdered sugar
3 cups - milk	2.5 cups fresh strawberries, stemmed
3 egg yolks, beaten slightly	1 cup fresh or frozen, thawed, blueberries

Cool and set aside pie shell. In 3-quart saucepan combine sugar, flour and salt. Whisk in milk until smooth. Cook and stir over medium-low heat until mixture is thickened, 8 to 10 minutes, being careful not to scorch. Beat the egg yolks slightly. Add a couple of tablespoons of the hot milk mixture to them, stirring, then pour the yolk mixture back into the hot milk. Cook and stir 3 minutes. Remove the pan from the heat and stir in the butter and vanilla. Let cool for 20 minutes, then pour into the prepared pie shell. Chill for several hours until firm. In bowl of electric mixer, combine whipping cream and powdered sugar. Beat until soft peaks form. Set aside. Remove pie from refrigerator. Arrange strawberries and blueberries on filling. Serve with whipped cream. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

Strawberry Banana-Nut Bread

1 cup butter or margarine	4 medium bananas, enough for 1
1/2 cup sugar	1/4 cups mashed
2 eggs lightly beaten	8-12 large strawberries stemmed
1.5 cups plain (or strawberry)	and mashed, enough for 3/4 cup
yogurt	1 1/2 cup finely chopped walnuts
1 teaspoon vanilla extract	2 cups of flour

Sift Together

1 teaspoon baking soda, 1 teaspoon corn starch, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 2 cups of flour

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and lightly flour 6-6" x 4" bread pans or 2-9" x 9" cake pans. In large bowl, beat butter at high speed until smooth. Add sugar and beat at high speed until fluffy. Lower speed and add the eggs, vanilla and yogurt one at a time. Allow the ingredients to completely blend. Add bananas and strawberries until evenly blended. Add all sifted ingredients to mixture 1/2 cup at a time until completely blended. Do not over mix! Add the walnuts and stir to mix. Pour the finished batter into the prepared pans and bake for 35-55 minutes. Bread will be browned on top and pull away from side of pan when ready. Place pans on cooling rack for 10 minutes before inverting them. Wrap in aluminum foil to store in refrigerator.

Strawberry Split Pie

Filling

8 ounces softened cream cheese
2 eggs, beaten
1 1/2 cups confectioners' sugar
1 stick melted butter

Topping

4 or 5 large sliced bananas
1 - 16 oz can drained, crushed
pineapple
4 cups of sliced strawberries
3 small cartons of Cool Whip

Mix filling ingredients together and pour into 3 graham cracker pie shells (DIVIDE EVENLY AMONG THE 3 PIE SHELLS) Layer each ingredient listed under topping section into pie shells. Spread Cool Whip over topping layers. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

Note: This dessert can be made ahead of time and kept in the refrigerator and if any left over it can be frozen and eaten as an ice cream dessert.

Turkey Sandwiches with Blue Cheese, Strawberries

1/4 cup mayonnaise	8 slices sourdough bread
1 tablespoon finely minced chives	4 ounces blue cheese, crumbled
1/2 teaspoon sugar	4 to 6 large strawberries, thinly sliced
1/4 teaspoon freshly ground pepper	12 ounces sliced cooked turkey

In small bowl, stir together mayonnaise, chives, sugar and pepper. Evenly sprinkle 4 slices of bread with cheese; arrange strawberries over cheese. Top each sandwich with one-fourth of the turkey. Spread each of the 4 remaining bread slices with one-fourth of the chive mayonnaise; place over turkey. Cut sandwiches in half.

LDAF Assistant Commissioner presented with 2017 Cox Conserves Hero Award



Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Assistant Commissioner John Walther is the recipient of the 2017 Cox Conserves Hero Award presented by Cox Communications. Walther was awarded \$10,000 for his work to build artificial reefs along Louisiana's coast. The reefs promote marine life and help control erosion. So far, Walther and the Coastal Conservation Association (CCA), for which he is a long-time volunteer, have built 21 reefs.

Walther was among three finalists who were nominated for the title of Louisiana's Cox Conserves Hero. Walther initiated the reef program in 2000 and pioneered the use of recycled concrete material in

artificial reef projects.

Walther says the money will be put toward restoration equipment for future CCA projects.

Walther is the assistant commissioner for the LDAF's animal health division. He also serves as the department's emergency manager during crisis situations. Walther has worked at the LDAF for 25 years.

The Cox Conserves Heroes awards program was created through a partnership with The Trust for Public Land and Cox Enterprises, the parent company of Cox Communications. The program has donated nearly \$800,000 to environmental nonprofits, and nearly 200 volunteers have been honored.

Wild hog damage featured at turfgrass conference

Turfgrass professionals heard about a wide range of topics at the 2018 Louisiana Turfgrass Association conference on Jan. 9 at Tiger Stadium on the LSU campus.

Even LSU head baseball coach Paul Mainieri explained the importance of good turf as he welcomed attendees to the LSU campus.

"We have some of the most loyal and dedicated staff working on our turf, and it shows in how good our field looks," Mainieri said.

The conference, which normally covers issues specific to the industry, was expanded this year to include topics with a wider range of appeal, said Ron Strahan, LSU AgCenter weed scientist who coordinates the annual event.

Since the feral hog problem has gained attention, the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry presented information on the damage hogs are causing to golf courses, sod farms and other turf sites.

LDAF feral swine program coordinator, Gene Cavalier said the goal of his department is to partner with other groups in a combined effort to manage feral hogs.

"In order to get the needed 75 percent control rate, we need to confront the problem from a team approach," he said. "We want to

help identify the problem so we can develop an effective strategy for control."

During the presentation, Cavalier showed a variety of trapping systems that are being effectively used to capture feral hogs.

Mississippi State University turfgrass breeder Eric Reasor presented information on how to manage off-type grasses in ultradwarf putting greens.

"We're currently looking at ways of dampening the growth of these grasses," he said. "We don't really have a way to kill these grasses right now, but we are using some techniques to keep them under control, such as the use of growth regulators."

Strahan's presentation dealt with ways of controlling Virginia buttonweed, doveweed, dollarweed and lespedeza in turfgrass.

"A lot of the problems that I see in turf is a lack of aeration," he said. "If when you walk across the lawn and it sounds like you're walking on a hardwood floor that probably means that you need to get in there and allow some airflow."

Bobby Soileau, director of Ag Leadership for the AgCenter, discussed ways of handling stress on the job. He included some statistics on what causes the most stress on the job and how to

minimize it.

"Many people think that money, or the lack thereof, is the main cause of stress, but that is not the main problem," he said. "Research shows the main cause of workplace stress is workload."

More than 1 million people are absent from work each day due to stress, with the most common psychological symptom being fatigue, he said.

Turfgrass is a huge, multi-level industry that includes golf courses, sod farmers, parks and recreation, Strahan said. "So it's a huge industry that provides a lot of jobs in the state."

AgCenter plant scientist Jeff Beasley discussed best management practices for controlling thatch.

"We normally think of our lawns as being grass in touch with the soil, but thatch is also a major part of the lawn," he said.

Thatch is the buildup of dead material, which is a major problem in Louisiana because of the long growing season.

"The best way to control thatch is with verticutting, which is cutting the grass vertically, instead of horizontal," Beasley said. "It looks ugly, but it will do the job of managing your thatch problem."

education coordinator Kim Pope outlined the importance of following the directions on herbicide and pesticide labels.

"You will notice that years ago the average label was just a few paragraphs, but now labels can be multiple pages," she said. "That's because it's so important to use the chemicals as intended."

Attendees of the conference are recertified as pesticide applicators through the Department of

Agriculture for the next three years, she said.

Strahan said the money generated from the conference goes toward education for members and scholarships for students interested in the turfgrass industry.

This year, Kacie Martin, a freshman at LSU from Franklinton, was awarded a \$500 scholarship during the Louisiana Turfgrass Association business meeting.
