Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
Caseload Reduction

The Department of Children and Family Services, hereby gives notice that, in accordance with federal regulations at 45 CFR 261.40, the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Caseload Reduction Report for Louisiana is now available to the public for review and comment.

In order to receive a caseload reduction credit for minimum participation rates, the agency must submit a report based on data from the Family Independence Temporary Assistance Program (FITAP) and the Strategies to Empower People Program (STEP) containing the following information:

- 1. a listing of, and implementation dates for, all state and federal eligibility changes, as defined at §261.42, made by the state after FY 2005;
- 2. a numerical estimate of the positive or negative impact on the applicable caseload of each eligibility change (based, as appropriate, on application denials, case closures, or other analyses);
- 3. an overall estimate of the total net positive or negative impact on the applicable caseload as a result of all such eligibility changes;
 - 4. an estimate of the state's caseload reduction credit;
- 5. a description of the methodology and the supporting data that it used to calculate its caseload reduction estimates:
- 6. a certification that it has provided the public an appropriate opportunity to comment on the estimates and methodology, considered their comments, and incorporated all net reductions resulting from Federal and State eligibility changes; and
 - 7. a summary of all public comments.

The following are substantive changes to proposed amendments to the administrative rules of the Board of Tax Appeals for the state of Louisiana originally noticed in the July 2019 edition of the Louisiana Register at pages 974-977. The Board of Tax Appeals proposes incorporate substantive changes to amendments to Title 69, part I to provide for: the presentation or waiver of defenses; the transmittal of invoices for filing fees and the recovery thereof by the Office of Debt Recovery; and Board operations.

Title 69

TAX APPEALS (REVENUE DEPARTMENT AND LOCAL SALES TAX DISPUTES)

Part I. Procedure and Practice before the Louisiana Board of Tax Appeals

Chapter 3. Rules Relating to Tax Matters §309. The Answer

C. If no responsive pleading is timely filed, any party may file a motion to compel the filing of responsive pleadings. Any order mandating the filing of a responsive pleading may provide that default judgment may be rendered against any party who fails to comply with such order within the deadline stated in the order. A case may be set for a trial on the merits following the filing of an answer or following a status conference with the parties. No party, without leave of the board, may present a defense at trial if that party's answer has not been filed with the board and transmitted to the petitioner at least 15 days prior to trial or if it is otherwise untimely under the applicable deadline in the case's scheduling order.

§321. Memoranda

A. A memoranda or other brief is due on the date set by the board by via minute entry in open hearing or by order. In the event that no deadline is set by the board, the parties shall comply with the deadlines provided for in Rule 9.9 of the Louisiana Uniform Rules of Districts Courts.
