6th Annual Pardoning of the Crawfish and a Look at the 2022 Crawfish Season

Every Tuesday after Mardi Gras, just before Lent begins, the Annual Pardoning of the Crawfish is held.

Lieutenant Governor Billy Nungesser and the Louisiana Seafood Promotion and Marketing Board hosted the 6th Annual Pardoning of the Crawfish at Perkins Rowe on March 8. The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry was there to help commemorate the event, which is designed to celebrate crawfish season in Louisiana.

For the event, a lucky crawfish is pulled from the ponds and allowed to live out his life in a

According to LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, more than 1,600 farmers in Louisiana produce crawfish, and more than 800 commercial fishermen harvest crawfish from natural wetlands such as the Atchafalaya Basin. Additionally, Louisiana leads the nation in crawfish production, supplying 100 to 120 million pounds per year. As a result, Louisiana's crawfish industry contributes more than \$300 million to the state's economy annually,

and more than 7,000 local Louisianians make a living working in the crawfish industry.

And as for the 2022 season, insiders say this year's crawfish harvest will be plentiful thanks to a warm fall. The mild temperatures we saw across south Louisiana in October, November, and December helped hatchlings to grow quickly on regional crawfish farms. "They had a good head start on growth," says Mark Shirley, an aquaculture agent for the LSU AgCenter and Louisiana Sea Grant.

USDA Introduces Market News Mobile App Providing Instant Access to Market Information

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced a new USDA Market News Mobile Application, providing producers and everyone else in the supply chain with instant access to current and historical market information. The initial version of the free app includes nearly 800 livestock, poultry, and grain market reports, with additional commodities added throughout the coming year.

“USDA is focused on building more resilient and transparent markets and is taking steps to promote competition and fairer prices from farmers to consumers,” said Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack. “This new Market News app helps create a more level playing field for small and medium producers by delivering critical market information to them where they are, when they need it.”

Producers and other users can search for markets based on their location, by state, or by commodity. They also can add market reports to their favorites for easier access, share reports via text or email, subscribe to reports, and receive real-time notifications when a new report is published. For additional data analysis, the app lets you share the source

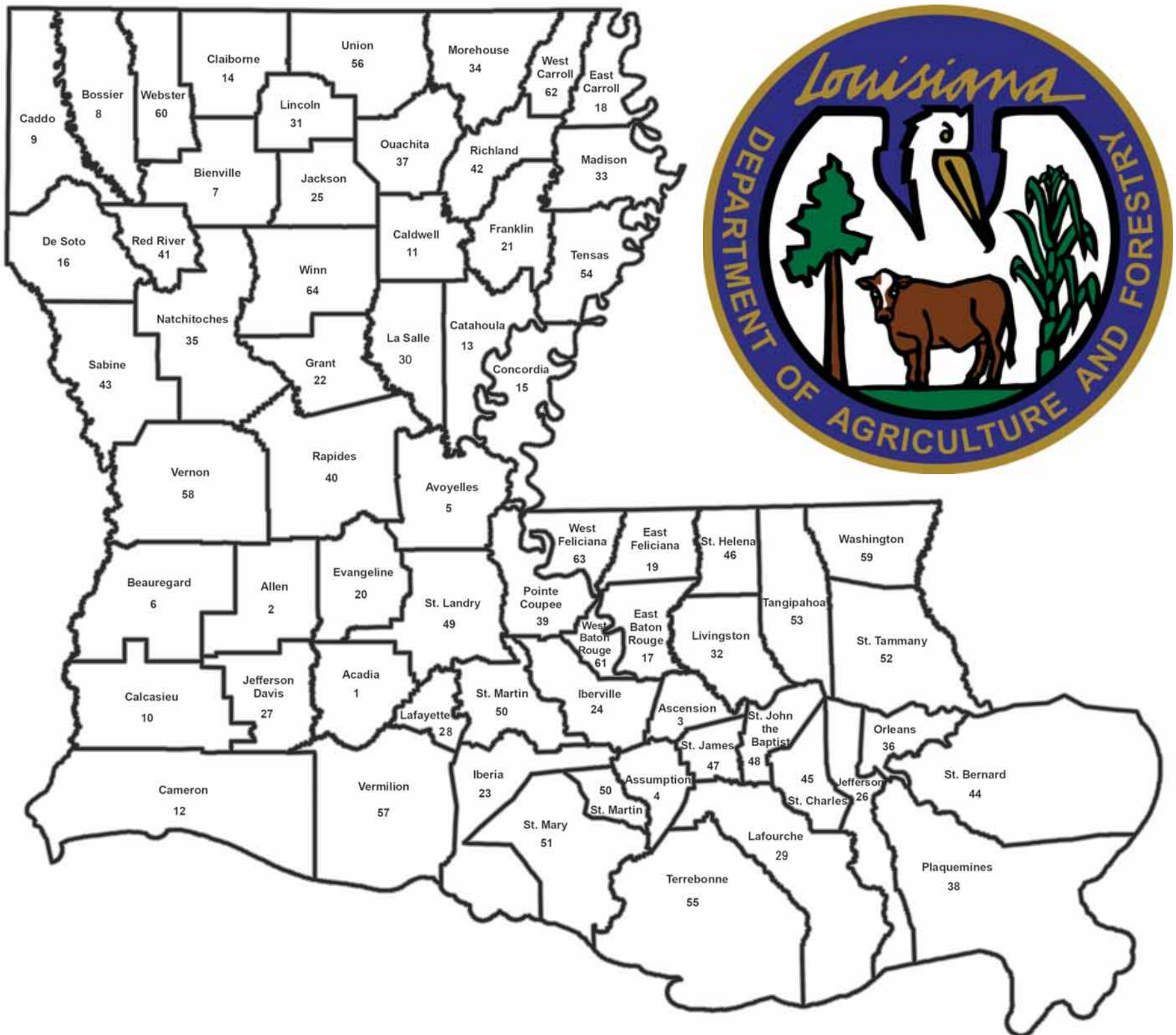

USDA Announces Plans for \$250 Million Investment to Support Innovative American-made Fertilizer to give US Farmers more choices in the Marketplace

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is announcing it will support additional fertilizer production for American farmers to address rising costs, including the impact of Putin's price hike on farmers, and spur competition. USDA will make available \$250 million through a new grant program this summer to support independent, innovative and sustainable American fertilizer production to supply American farmers. Additionally, to address growing competition concerns in the agricultural supply chain, USDA will launch a public inquiry seeking information regarding seeds and agricultural inputs, fertilizer, and retail markets.

"Recent supply chain disruptions from the global pandemic to Putin's unprovoked war against Ukraine have shown just how important it is to invest in this crucial link in the agricultural supply chain here at home," said Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack, "The planned investment is one example of many Biden-Harris Administration initiatives to bring production and jobs back to the United States, promote competition, and support American goods and services. As the President said [at the State of the Union], we are working to rebuild the economy towards resilience, security, and sustainability, and this support to provide domestic, sustainable and independent choices for fertilizer supplies is part of that effort. In addition to the jobs, lower costs and more reliable supply, in-

creased investment in the domestic fertilizer industry will help address climate change by reducing the greenhouse gas emissions associated with transportation, while also fostering more sustainable production methods and more precise application."

Fertilizer prices have more than doubled since last year due to many factors including Putin's price hike, a limited supply of the relevant minerals and high energy costs, high global demand and agricultural commodity prices, reliance on fertilizer imports, and lack of competition in the fertilizer industry.

The United States is a major importer and dependent on foreign fertilizer and is the second or third top importer for each of the three major components of fertilizer. The top producers of the major components of fertilizer include China, Russia, Canada and Morocco, with Belarus also providing a significant share of potash.

USDA will use funds from the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) set aside in September for market disruptions to develop a grant program that provides 'gap' financing to bring new, independent domestic production capacity on-line—similar to the recently announced meat and poultry grants that are designed to promote competition and resilience in that sector.

The new program will support fertilizer production that is:

- Independent - outside the

dominant fertilizer suppliers, increasing competition in a concentrated market;

- Made in America - produced in the United States by domestic companies, creating good-paying jobs at home and reducing the reliance on potentially unstable or inconsistent foreign supplies;
- Innovative - improve upon fertilizer production methods to jump start the next generation of fertilizers;
- Sustainable - reduces the greenhouse gas impact of transportation, production, and use through renewable energy sources, feedstocks, formulations, and incentivizing greater precision in fertilizer use;
- Farmer-focused - like other Commodity Credit Corporation investments, a driving factor will be providing support and opportunities for U.S. agriculture commodity producers.

Details on the application process will be announced in the summer of 2022, with the first awards expected before the end of 2022.

Under the Biden-Harris Administration, USDA is engaged in a whole-of-government effort to combat the climate crisis and conserve and protect our nation's lands, biodiversity and natural resources including our soil, air and water. Successfully meeting these challenges will require coordination and partnerships with stakeholders throughout the supply chain such as the planned investment in innovative domestic fertilizer production.

This effort is also part of the Biden-Harris Administration's whole-of-government effort to promote competition, including in agricultural markets. As part of its efforts to enhance fair and competitive markets, USDA is requesting comments and information from the public about the impacts of concentration and market power in fertilizer, seeds and other agricultural inputs, and retail. With these RFIs, USDA is also seeking information on competition and market access

for farmers and ranchers, new and growing market competitors, especially small and medium-sized enterprises, and more about the context for these markets for farmers. The inquiry stems from the July 9, 2021, Executive Order on "Promoting Competition in the American Economy," which created a White House Competition Council and directed federal agency actions to enhance fairness and competition across America's economy.

"Concentrated market structures and potentially anticompetitive practices leave America's farmers, businesses, and consumers facing higher costs, fewer choices and less control about where to buy and sell, and reduced innovation—ultimately making it harder for those who grow our food to survive," said Secretary Vilsack. "As I talk to farmers, ranchers and agriculture and food companies about the recent market challenges, I hear significant concerns about whether large companies along the supply chain are taking advantage of the situation by increasing profits—not just responding to supply and demand or passing along the costs."

USDA will seek information specifically on:

- Fertilizer.
- Seed and agricultural inputs, in particular as they relate to the intellectual property system.
- Retail, including access to retail through wholesale and distribution markets.

The comment period will be open for 60 days once the requests for information are published in the Federal Register, and upon which time comments can be submitted to www.regulations.gov. In the interim, the requests for information will be made available at www.ams.usda.gov/about-ams/fair-competitive/rfi.

USDA will use the comments received to develop reports mandated under the Competition E.O., and to develop policies relating to fair and competitive markets, supply chain resiliency, pandemic response, local and regional food systems, and other areas. Subsequent actions may range from new grant and loan programs to additional rules and regulations under the Packers and Stockyards Act of 1921 and other relevant laws to increase fairness and competition in American agricultural markets.

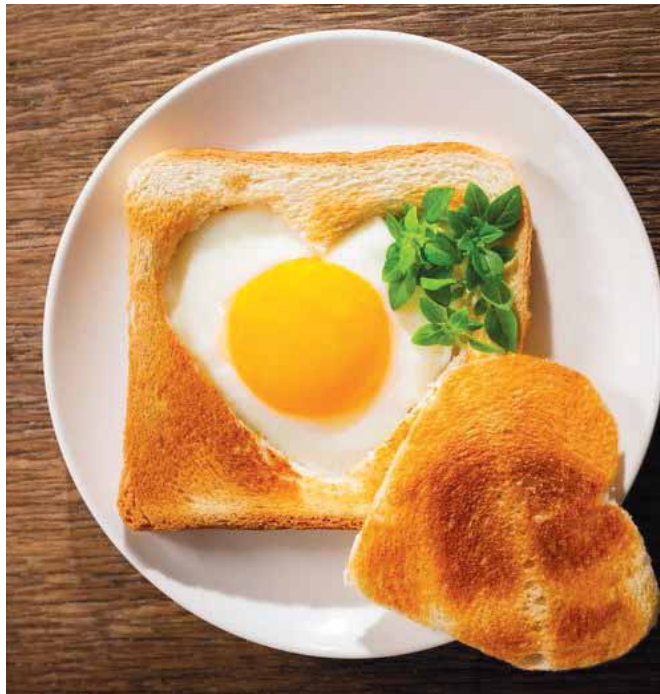

The group helped sort their haul and searched for the lucky crawfish to be pardoned.

Despite the early start, seafood suppliers warn we may see higher costs this season, but as those price tags increase, local crawfish farmers say they are still struggling to break even. This is a result of the increase in prices of fertilizer, gas, labor, and everything it takes to stay in the crawfish business. Even the thousands of gallons of water it takes to man the crawfish ponds cost more. So, while we typically see a drop in the price of crawfish as the season progresses, we can't guarantee that this year. Shirley added, "Don't begrudge the farmers. It's still reasonable and important to eat local."

However, these factors haven't appeared to affect the demand for the time being. Suppliers are seeing encouraging signs that this season's buying patterns will return to normal after two disruptive seasons. As temperatures rise and COVID-19 restrictions lessen, they are seeing more requests for corporate events once again. This is a promising sign of the return of the big crawfish boils.

Additionally, USDA just announced they've finalized decisions to include "fish raised for

food" in the Emergency Livestock Assistance Program (ELAP). This disaster assistance is for those who suffered severe production losses as a result of the February 2021 Winter Storm Event. Thankfully, this program will now include crawfish farmers. However, crawfish producers are encouraged to remain patient. There is still work left to do at USDA before we see the assistance distributed to farmers.

Overall, Louisiana is expected to have nearly 260,000 acres of crawfish ponds across the state producing nearly 150 million pounds of crawfish. Minus the one crawfish, Arrigeaux, harvested by farmer Barry Toups from Kaplan and taken to Tickfaw State Park in Springfield to live out his pardoned life.

If you recall, LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, recently spent a day in the crawfish ponds with Mr. Toups for the first episode of LDAF's Crawfish Tales with Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM. Commissioner Strain was able to get first-hand experience of a day in the life of a crawfish fisherman, and you can too. GOOD AGRICULTURAL PRACTICES (GAP) ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Southern University Agricultural Research Center (SUAREC) is able to provide training, technical assistance, and monetary support to Louisiana Produce Growers that are pursuing their first USDA GHP/GAP audit. First priority will be given to growers that have attended a SUAREC GAP Workshop or participate in an upcoming workshop. There are two program options: 1) up to a 75% reimbursement for passing your first USDA GAP Audit, not to exceed \$1000.00 or 2) complete the three tier program with \$1000.00 being the maximum amount awarded to a grower/operation.

Tier 1: \$500

In order to qualify for tier one you must attend two one-on-one technical assistance sessions and submit a completed Farm Food Safety Plan. [Must be completed by June 30th]

Tier 2: \$250

In order to qualify for tier two you must have completed tier 1 and have a mock audit at your operation conducted by SUAREC. [Must be completed by June 30th]

Tier 3: \$250

In order to qualify for tier three you must have completed tiers 1 & 2 and pass a USDA GAP/GHP audit. [Must be completed by June 30th]

LSU AgCenter sweet potato researcher receives national recognition

For more than 30 years, LSU AgCenter researcher Don La Bonte has worked tirelessly on behalf of producers to further the science and sustainability of the sweet potato industry. His efforts were recently rewarded when he received this year's National Impact Award from the National Sweet Potato Collaborators Group.

The LSU AgCenter has one of only three active sweet potato breeding programs in the United States. La Bonte has been an integral part of those efforts since 1988, shortly after the AgCenter's release of the wildly popular Beauregard variety.

In the decades that have followed, La Bonte has overseen the releases of Evangeline, Orleans, Bayou Belle, Vermillion, Murasaki-29, Bonita, and many other varieties, with Orleans becoming dominant across the Gulf South.

La Bonte currently holds nine patents on varieties released since 2006, helping to create a revenue stream that will ensure sweet potato variety development will continue at the AgCenter for years to come. He believes firmly in the power of teamwork.

"I believe the sweet potato team has been greatly enhanced in part because of Don's leadership and willingness to promote the efforts of the team without concern for who gets credit or who is in charge," said Chris Clark, an AgCenter plant pathologist who has worked closely with La Bonte.

La Bonte's selfless idea of teamwork extends to producers, with whom he collaborates closely in the field to develop both short- and long-term solutions for issues that may arise. This includes continuing to breed disease-resistant

cultivars.

"His sweet potato breeding work frequently takes him to producers' fields, where he regularly interacts with growers," said agronomist Arthur Villordon of the AgCenter Sweet Potato Research Station. "This interaction helps provide the necessary feedback in enhancing his breeding program. Dr. La Bonte has used this feedback effectively to adjust to changing needs in the industry."

Tara Smith, Sweet Potato Research Station coordinator and director of the AgCenter Central Region, considers La Bonte a bit of a rock star in the field of sweet potato research, a crop that contributes more than \$85 million to Louisiana's economy each year.

"Dr. La Bonte embodies the qualities you hope to see in a researcher," Smith said. "He has never lost sight of the reason we are conducting research, and that is to help farmers and to help sustain an industry we all serve."

While Smith said La Bonte has made his mark in the academic world, it is his in-field work that affects people's everyday lives — and that impact extends well beyond Louisiana's borders. Sweet potatoes are an important crop in many countries.

"His real impact is seen in producers' fields in Louisiana and throughout the world," Smith said. "One hundred percent of Louisiana's sweet potato acreage is devoted to varieties developed in the AgCenter breeding program."
