hydroponic lettuce grows in water mixed with a nutrient solution instead of growing in soil.

Hydroponics may seem like a futuristic type of gardening, but the concepts have been around since the 1500s. In fact, it was thought that the Hanging Gardens of Babylon were grown hydroponically through a series of aqueducts and channeling of water through the tower.

This type of gardening has stood the test of time and provides many benefits. One of the biggest benefits may be the larger yields achieved. Hydroponic lettuce especially grows quickly. This is because they take up nutri-



ents faster unlike those in soil which spend a lot of time and energy extending their roots to find nutrients. It takes close to three weeks to get the

Today, we are seeing more and more women in the industry. According to USDA's 2017 Census of Agriculture, the United States had 1.2 million female producers, accounting for 36 percent of the country's 3.4 million producers. The number of female producers increased by 27 percent between 2012 and 2017. The number of farms with female producers increased by 23 percent.

The report also showed that female producers are slightly younger, more likely to be beginning farmers, and more likely to live on their farms than male producers. More than half of all farms (56 percent) had a female producer in 2017.





tends the harvesting period.

"We just give them a good, nutritional buffet, and they can pick and choose what they want. As a result, they don't grow a tremendous amount of roots," said HydroBest Growers owner Paul Bray. "Another advantage to this type of garden is that as our plants grow, we can slide them across the table and give this next crop some more space. We can progressively space our crops, and that's one of the big secrets of hydroponics and high-density production."

Another benefit of hydroponics is its sustainability. Lettuce is a leafy vegetable that will not get to the flowering stage. Therefore, it has simple nutrient solutions that don't need to be changed over the growing season. Water and fertilizers can also be conserved in a hydroponic system as there's no runoff or leeching. Hydroponics, in general, saves water substantially by reducing evaporations. This efficiency makes hydroponics the ideal way to grow sustainable and healthy lettuce. Best of all, hydroponic systems reuse and recirculate their water minimizing water inputs.

"You have a beautiful setup here. And of course, you can control it - use less water, control your nutrients. Everything is just perfect. And you can see the quality. Extremely fresh," remarked LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., during his visit.

Hydroponic vegetable gardens are also space savers. This is a great advantage to gardeners with limited space or those living in urban areas. Many times, you're also able to grow more plants in a smaller space than you would in a traditional soil garden. This is because plants grown in soil need to extend their roots out to find nutrients and gather water. There's no need for that in a hydroponic system as you're providing everything that the plant needs directly to its roots. Harvesting your vegetables in a hydroponic garden is also easier. Especially for those gardeners with physical and mobility problems because the vegetables are grown at a waisthigh height, and growers do not have to bend so much.

With hydroponics, you also reduce the soil-borne pests and diseases drastically by not introducing soil into the system at all. Also, weeds tend to be much less of an issue in a hydroponic system as there's no soil to maintain a seed bank as like there is with in-ground gardening. Hydroponics eliminates the chances of weeds, pests, and disease attacking your vegetables and other issues like floods, drought, and damages due to storms. This is because in these systems the environmental conditions are controlled.

"We are growing a much healthier, cleaner product. And here again, because it is not rained on, it's away from dirt, and there are no animals, so our e-coli dangers are much lower in greenhouse production lettuce. We also tend to have higher nutritional values mostly because of the freshness," noted Bray.

Another notable benefit is that a hydroponic garden allows you to grow your vegetables throughout the year. These gardens can also be done on a flexible scale. There are



both home and commercial growers.

"We talk about the need to increase food production for everyone. And this is a unique way to do a lot of production in a small amount of space and minimize the inputs," said Commissioner Strain.

Hydroponic gardens are highly versatile, allowing for a wide range of vegetables to be grown. The most common vegetables grown in hydroponic gardens include tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers, and lettuce. Because hydroponic growing uses water and not soil to grow, there are some vegetables you can't grow. For example, any vegetable in the root family, including carrots and potatoes, can't be grown using hydroponics.



Lettuce is one of the easiest plants to grow using this method of gardening. You can grow your hydroponic lettuce from either seedlings or saplings. You'll use a seed starter to sow your lettuce seeds and then transplant the lettuce to the hydroponic system once its roots have developed and it has four to six leaves.

You can grow any of the popular types of lettuce in water. However, growers strongly prefer loose head varieties when it comes to growing lettuce hydroponically. Loose lettuce varieties have the advantage that you can pick their leaves individually. The picked leaves re-grow and replace themselves, enabling this variety of lettuce to prolong its harvest life. Greenleaf, butterhead, and romaine are the most ideal varieties for a hydroponic garden.

Many systems are available to be purchased on the market today, or you can make a trip to your local hardware store and build one relatively simply. A few types to choose from are the wick system, which has a unit of water below the plant and uses a rope or other materials to wick the water up to the plant roots; and the ebb and flow system, which floods the plant for a short amount of time then drains away. The nutrient film technology is a system that most people are familiar with, sometimes called a re-

circulating system. This is the system HydroBest Growers utilize. With this system, a unit of water is pumped to the top of the system. Then through gravity, the water flows back down across the plants' roots and back into the unit. Water culture is another hydroponic system where the plant sits above a bucket of water, and the roots dangle in a nutrient solution. This system typically has an air stone or some sort of device creating air bubbles at the bottom of the system. And lastly, the drip system is very similar to the nutrient film technology, but it just simply drips on the plant roots.

Fortunately, you don't have to commit to a hydroponic garden to enjoy the freshness of its vegetables if you aren't quite ready to dive in. HydroBest Growers sell living lettuce which is sold with the roots still attached. This allows the lettuce to keep fresh longer, even without refrigeration. They can be used as a centerpiece today and a salad tomorrow. To store on the counter, simply remove the lettuce head from the bag and place the roots into a bowl of water. Remember to rinse before consuming it.

"We sell the plant as living lettuce, so the roots are still attached. So, if you take it home and it is a little wilted, just put it in the water. It will pick right up. And because it is living, you can leave it in the bags that we put it in, seal it up, and store it in the refrigerator for three weeks. It will still look like it did when you put it in, except for maybe one yellow leaf," said Bray.

"They certainly look fantastic, and I am glad you are a Certified Farm-to-Table member. It's always really wonderful when we can get freshness straight to our consumers," commented Commissioner Strain.

Firewood Theft Leads to Arson, Arrest Made

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) fire crews responded to a wild-fire on Gitty Up Lane in Leblanc on March 11. The investigation revealed that the fire was an act of arson, and it was set close to where someone had been cutting down hardwood trees for firewood.

As a result of the investigation by the LDAF enforcement agents, it was learned that twenty-four-year-old Bradley Ashworth of Kinder, La., and forty-seven-year-old Lance Templet of Iowa, La., went onto the property without permission and cut timber for firewood to sell at a later date. While Ashworth cut the firewood, Templet set a fire. The fire burned approximately 76 acres of timber.

Ashworth nor Templet owned the property or had permission to be on the property. An arrest warrant was issued for Ashworth for theft of timber and criminal trespass. Ashworth was arrested on March 25 and booked into the Allen Parish Jail on LDAF warrants and other outstanding Allen Parish warrants. His bond is \$20,300.

Not more than \$1,000 in firewood was cut from the property. However, the fire caused approximately \$6,000 in damages to the timber.

"Timber is a valuable, long-term investment. It is imperative for landowners to pay close attention to activity on their property and immediately report a suspected crime," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. "LDAF enforcement agents take agriculture and forestry-related crimes seriously, and they will seek justice when individuals break the law."

A warrant was issued for Templet for arson and criminal trespass. Templet has yet to be located. Anyone with information on the whereabouts of Templet is urged to call the LDAF 24-hr hotline at 1-855-452-5323.

products sales. These farms accounted for 38 percent of total U.S. agriculture sales. They also accounted for 43 percent of U.S. farmland.

Data for the USDA Census of Agriculture is collected every five years. The department is currently developing its 2022 census. The last day to sign up for the 2022 Ag Census is June 30, 2022. Sign up to be counted at https://www. agcounts.usda.gov/static/get-counted.html.



The Inglewood Farm tour spoke to participants about their organic produce and regenerative agriculture practices.

The census results reinforce that women have always played a vital role on the farm. They are farmers and farmworkers, ranchers, agricultural researchers, and educators. They work the fields, birth livestock, do daily chores, keep the books, and take an active role in farm management decisions.

Louisiana has approximately 3,500 farms primarily operated by women. Along with these female farmers, women in all fields of the agriculture industry gathered for the Louisiana Women in Agriculture conference on April 7 and 8 in Alexandria. The conference is an opportunity for women passionate about agriculture to network and learn from experienced speakers and ag-related vendors from across the state and nation.

"It was an honor to speak to the women helping drive one of Louisiana's most important industries," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. "They have a compelling story to tell,

and I want to make sure their voices are heard. Most importantly, I want them to have access to the tools and resources they need to succeed. That's what is so wonderful about the Women in Ag conference. It offers solutions and opens doors for those looking to grow their business."
