

The Importance of Seed Testing and LDAF's Seed Program's Role

Any experienced farmer will tell you planting high-quality seeds is the first step to growing a successful crop. You may not be able to control Mother Nature, but you can control the quality of the seed you plant. The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Seed Program provides assurances to the Louisiana agricultural community that the seed planted is of the highest quality.

Unfortunately, even the most seasoned producers can't always tell what they will get when purchasing seed. Will the seed grow? If it does grow, what will it grow into? Do the seeds contain a disease that will hurt the crop? Will the package contain other unwanted weeds that will reduce yields, hurt animals, or destroy land? The worst part is that the outcome of a purchase may not be known for months after buying and "trying" to grow them. Seed testing is the only reliable way to predict what will emerge post-planting. The primary responsibilities of LDAF's

File samples are kept in the freezer for up to a year in case a crop fails, and the seed needs to be revisited.

Seed Program are (1) Enforcement of the Louisiana Seed Law and Regulations; (2) Administration of the Seed Certification Program; (3) Management of the State Seed Testing Laboratory; and (4) Regulation of Louisiana's Industrial Hemp Industry.

The State Seed Testing Laboratory performs tests on three types of seed samples.

 Regulatory or "Official" Samples -Samples are taken by LDAF inspectors from unopened, labeled lots of seed being offered for sale. Laws and regulations set requirements and standards for the sale of seed for planting purposes, and statewide enforcement is accomplished by inspecting random samples of seed

those occurred along the Gulf Coast, five of which -three hurricanes and two tropical storms -- made landfall in Louisiana.

Another busy hurricane season appears likely, with an above-average number of storms predicted this year, according to a forecast issued by Colorado State University. The forecast called for nine hurricanes, where an average season has seven. Of these, the forecast says to expect four to be major hurricanes,

which means storms with winds of at least 111 mph, or Category 3 or higher. An average season produces three major hurricanes.

Hurricane season begins June 1 and lasts through November. Now is the time for residents to make a list of items to replenish hurricane emergency supplies and start thinking about how to prepare for the coming hurricane season.



May is National Wildfire Awareness Month

Month dedicates the entire month of May to wildfire prevention and preparedness.

According to the U.S. Department of the Interior, people cause 90% of wildfires. The National Interagency Fire Center reports that of those human-started fires, 2.8 million acres burn each year. In 2018, 8,767,492 acres burned due to human-started and lightning strikes

Wildfires give very little warning & spread rapidly. There are steps to take to both prevent wildfires and prepare for them. From fire-resistant building materials to following the safety protocols for handling fire when camping, heating your home, or storing fuel, we can all take part in reducing wildfires.

Louisiana forests make up 15 million acres, or more than 50%, of the state's land area. The LDAF wildland firefighters are tasked with protecting 18.9 million acres of Louisiana. This includes Louisiana's forested areas as well as grasslands and other ecosystems susceptible to wildfires. The primary objectives

of the Forest Protection Division are the detection, suppression, and prevention of wildfires in these ecosystems.

The Louisiana Office of Forestry is the only state agency with statewide wildland fire-fighting capabilities. Fires are detected by aircraft or are reported by the public and are then suppressed by trained forestry crews. Today, the state protection system involves approximately 106 wildland firefighters equipped with trucks, tractor-plows, and two-way radios. These trained professional crews are employed year-round.

In addition to the department's detection efforts, a fire-weather forecasting program is utilized. Daily weather reports are relayed to the districts so that fire crews can be alerted to current fire dangers. The daily fire weather forecasts outline the fire danger in an area. Fire danger is the probability of a fire starting, the rate of spread, and the intensity of its burn. Awareness of the following fire danger rating levels will help decrease wildfire ignitions. Citizens can view the

daily fire weather for Louisiana at Annual Operating Plan related to https://www.ldaf.state.la.us/dailyfire-weather/.

The map illustrates the fire danger level in each parish. The different levels include:

- LOW FIRE DANGER Fires do not readily start. Fires that do start spread slowly with a low resistance to control.
- MODERATE FIRE DANGER -Fires can start from most accidental causes, but the number of starts is generally low. Fires burn at moderate intensities; heavy fuel concentrations will burn hot.
- HIGH FIRE DANGER Fires start easily from most causes. Control of fires could become difficult if the initial attack is not initiated promptly, especially in heavy fuels. Most fires are controlled within the first burning period.
- VERY HIGH FIRE DANGER -Fires start readily and spread quickly. Resistance to control is high, as is the potential for large fires. Fire behavior is often erratic, "blow up" potential is high.
- EXTREME FIRE DANGER Severe fire conditions. The potential for fire disaster is high. Direct attack of fires is virtually impossible. Fires often escape the initial attack. Fire behavior is erratic, "blow ups" may be expected. Resistance to control is high. Fires are not usually controlled until burning subsides.

The Forest Protection Division also receives Red Flag Warnings and/or Fire Weather Watches from the National Weather Service (NWS). These warnings and watches alert land management agencies about the onset, or possible onset, of critical weather and fuel moisture conditions that could lead to rapid or dramatic increases in wildfire activity. These conditions can be due to low relative humidity, strong winds, dry fuels, or any combination thereof. Each year, the NWS coordinates with each state to implement a State

fire weather services. Red flag criteria are set in these plans and vary from state to state.

A Red Flag Warning is issued when the above conditions are expected to be met within the next 24 hours. A Fire Weather Watch is issued when the above conditions are expected to be met during the next 24 to 48 hours. Typically, these watches and warnings are issued at the same time the routine fire weather forecasts are issued, approximately 3:30 AM and 3:30 PM Local Time.

Even with rain, wildfires continue to threaten rural homeowners, with up to six homes lost each year. Sadly, in most cases, the homeowner started the fire that consumed their home. Even though arson still leads in wildfire ignitions, it is debris burns that destroy homes. When you need to burn around your home, please contact the local LDAF office and fire department for advice on burning conditions and precautions for burning.

Here are other ways you can help prevent wildfires:

- Clear vegetation at least 30 feet around your home and other structures using weed eaters, lawnmowers, chainsaws, and other mechanized equipment.
- Make sure that all machinery is equipped with proper spark arrestors and that you fuel your equipment in areas void of vegetation.
- Practice extra caution when fire danger is high.
- Rake all the leaves or needles that are within 30 feet of a structure.
- Thin tree stands and brush to eliminate continuous vegetation, which can promote wildfire spread.

pulled by the LDAF inspectors. These samples are sent to the State Seed Testing Laboratory for analysis to ensure they are of the highest quality and not mislabeled.

- 2. Certified Samples Samples are taken from seed lots that have passed seed certification field inspection standards, specific for the crop kind and variety. These samples are also taken by LDAF inspectors. The Louisiana Seed Certification Program provides a wide range of services that help our clients in the production, identification, distribution, and promotion of certified classes of seed. Program components include verification of planting stock origin, field inspections, laboratory analysis, auditing, official labeling, and approval of certified seed storage, handling, and processing facilities.
- 3. Service Samples Samples are sent in by seedsmen, farmers, and individuals requesting a seed test. These samples are not required to be taken by LDAF inspectors. However, test results from these samples may be used to provide information for the official labeling of seed. Requests can be made for a variety of seed tests, including, but not limited to, a complete analysis (purity and germination), germination only, purity only, vigor test, red rice exam, and tetrazolium test.

Fortunately, the main function of LDAF's Seed Program, located in Baton Rouge, LA, is to inspect, sample, and test seed being offered for sale in the state. The Program's field inspectors collected 4,717 seed samples, and the laboratory conducted 12,462 tests on those samples in the last year alone. In doing so, the Program is performing critical functions for the state's agricultural industry by ensuring that seed purchased by Louisiana farmers and consumers is true to label claims and meets minimum germination and purity standards.

Throughout the year, LDAF inspectors routinely visit farm supply stores, hardware stores, and other outlets where seeds are sold across the State to inspect and collect samples for testing. The seed package label must list the germination, purity, noxious weed seed, and other information required by Federal and State laws. The results of LDAF's laboratory tests are used to confirm or deny the seed labeling claims. The Program's staff may take enforcement action, such as a STOP-SALE ORDER for the mislabeling of seed lots or on seed lots that are out of tolerance for germination percentages or purity content. The LDAF Seed Program issued 144 seedrelated violations in the last fiscal year.

As stated, the State Seed Testing Lab can provide seed vigor tests in addition to germination testing. Seed germination testing evaluates the seed properties that allow the emergence and development of a seedling under favorable field conditions. Whereas

seed vigor testing is the evaluation of the seed properties that allow rapid field emergence and development of a seedling under a wide range of field conditions.

LDAF recommends that you consider having your seed vigor tested prior to planting. While the germination percentage is stated on the label, a high germination percentage may or may not have good vigor. As mentioned, the germination test is conducted under ideal laboratory conditions and used to predict the germination potential of the seed when planted in FAVORABLE field conditions. As we know all too well in Louisiana, seed is typically not planted under ideal field conditions.

The vigor test, however, is conducted under less-than-optimal growing conditions in a controlled environment under very stressful test conditions. These stressful test conditions typically involve the seeds being exposed to very cool temperatures or very high temperatures with very high relative humidity. Vigor testing is used to determine the percentage of seeds to help identicate that will most likely produce productive plants when these seeds are planted under or

experience non-favorable field conditions.

Low seed vigor often results in poor field emergence, less than ideal plant stands, and subsequent economic loss for farmers. Seed vigor is not required to be stated on seed labels and thus is not part of LDAF's routine seed labeling compliance program. However, seed vigor testing can provide farmers with important information on how well their seed might perform under tough growing conditions.

Vigor testing is typically performed on soybeans and cotton but can be performed on other agricultural crops as well. The LDAF State Seed Testing Laboratory provides vigor testing to farmers and seedsmen upon request for a nominal fee. Vigor testing can also assist with predicting the storability of seeds being carried over for the next year's planting season.

The LDAF Seed Program also investigates seed-related complaints. If you have a seed-related complaint, contact your local seed sales rep. If there is no resolution, contact your local LDAF field office/representative. You will need to provide a statement and information about the complaint. It is important to have a copy or picture of the seed label, a sample of the seed, an invoice, etc. The LDAF field staff will investigate the complaint and determine if there is a violation of the Seed Law or regulations.

To help protect yourself in case of any future seed quality issues...

 Keep a copy or photo of a seed label for EACH seed lot in the shipment.



A bag of seed can contain much more than the seed you think you are purchasing, thus the need for official testing and labeling. The lab keeps a seed collection to help identify seeds that they might find where they don't belong.

 Keep a small (e.g., quart zip loc bag) identifiable/traceable seed sample for EACH seed lot in the shipment and store the sample in a climate-controlled area out of direct sunlight.

If you wish to voluntarily have the LDAF sample and test your seed for a fee...

- DO NOT open or break the manufacturer seal on the seed containers.
- Contact and coordinate an onsite visit by LDAF staff in your area to collect an "official" seed sample to be tested by the LDAF Seed Lab.
- Provide the LDAF inspector with all requested documents pertaining to the seed shipment.

High-quality seeds provide the foundation for meeting our food, medical, and housing needs. Today, virtually all of the world's population depends on seeds or the plants they develop into to carry out functions of daily life. The LDAF Seed Program is committed to making sure only the very highest-quality seeds are available to Louisiana's consumers and agricultural producers. We have a highly trained staff that consists of certified seed analysts, registered seed technologists, and other hard-working personnel with decades of experience. LDAF Forestry Enforcement makes arson related arrest in Tangipahoa Parish

Agents with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Office of Forestry report that one arrest has been made in an arson investigation into a wildfire on Bryce Hyde Road in Roseland, LA.

In February, firefighters responded to the area in reference to a large grass fire. Upon further investigation, it was determined the fire was started on the property without the landowner's consent. The fire spread over several acres and burned over 600 feet of a wooded fence near the roadway.

On April 22, 18-year-old Noah Steptore of Kentwood was booked into the Tangipahoa Parish Jail for charges related to criminal trespass, simple criminal damage to property, and fire-raising on lands of another by criminal negligence. Further arrests are pending at this time, and the investigation is ongoing.

"The LDAF's Forestry Enforcement Division is tasked with protecting life and property throughout the forested areas of the state," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. "The program only works, however, if there are collaborative efforts from victims, local citizens, media, and other law enforcement agencies to help stop, solve, and prevent crime. Please, if you have any information regarding an agriculture or forestry related crime, I urge you to notify LDAF enforcement agents. All tips will remain confidential."

outside the affected area. If authorities advise you to evacuate, be prepared to leave immediately with your evacuation kit and plan in place. It is important to sit down with family and/ or close friends to decide how you plan to communicate with each other, where you will go and what your plans are in the event of an emergency. Write the plan down, make sure everyone has a copy and keep a copy of the plan in your evacuation kit.

Plan now if you will need help leaving or if you have transportation needs. Know who issues evacuation orders for your area, determine locations on where you will ride out the storm, and start to get your supplies now. Ask friends or relatives outside your area if you would be able to stay with them in the event of an evacuation. Plan a meeting place to reconnect in the event you are separated from your family.

By law, the LDAF is designated by the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act to assist in evacuating and sheltering household pets for evacuated citizens going to shelters during declared emergencies. The LDAF has two mobile pet shelters to assist in keeping family pets in close proximity to their owners when an evacuation is necessary. Those pet trailers and LDAF employees are ready to be mobilized, if necessary.

Important pet items to take during an evacuation:

- · Health records
- Food and food bowls
- Special medications
- Pet carriers
- Collars/leashes

PREPARE YOUR OPERATION

In addition to ensuring your household and employees know your hurricane plan, now is the time to remove debris and secure large objects around your operation.

 Clean out culverts, ditches, and other drainage areas, especially before and during peak hurricane season to reduce water damage. Most injuries to animals, people, or structures during a hurricane are caused by flying objects. To lessen the risk, minimize the presence of equipment, supplies, and debris that may become airborne during high winds or encountered in floodwaters.

- Inspect all barns, outbuildings, paddocks, and other structures for broken or weak components: look for loose metal roofing, siding, and weak walls that could potentially blow off, fall over, or otherwise fail in high winds. Make all necessary repairs, such as interior and exterior braces and re-nail metal roofing and siding.
- Check that rafters are secured to the wall studding with hurricane-rated straps or 2" x 6" knee braces.
- Stock up on nails, screws, and plywood to board up windows and to nail doors and windows shut.
- Plan to turn off electricity at the switch and unplug electrical equipment right before storms strike.
- Move heavy, expensive machinery to sturdy buildings. It's not recommended to use such equipment to anchor structures.

This is also a good time to mitigate potential damage to your property by removing dead trees or cutting back tree limbs hanging over homes or businesses

"It is best to use a licensed arborist to cut trees around your property because they are trained and must maintain liability insurance. Hiring a licensed arborist protects you. Ask to see a license issued by LDAF before allowing any work to be done on your property. Also, be sure to get a written estimate and never pay for the job up front," said Commissioner Strain.

Refer to the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) website or LDAF Business App for mobile devices to verify the current license status of an arborist. The app, called LDAF Business Search, may be downloaded for free at the iTunes and Google Play stores.

Agricultural operations with livestock have additional considerations. For those with large animals like dairy cows or beef cattle, it is usually recommended to turn them loose in a field. However, ensure that the fields are not in low-lying areas that might flood. Build dirt mounds for animals to stand on if flood plains are the only option. Smaller animals, like chickens, should be penned indoors in a building that's safe from flooding and has adequate ventilation.

Tips on preparing livestock trailers:

- Check tire pressure and rubber for wear
- Test brake and running lights
- Inspect the overall condition of the trailer

Proper identification for livestock that are evacuated is crucial during a natural disaster. Important livestock items to take during an evacuation:

- Health records (especially proof of EIA testing for horses)
- Food
- Special medications
- Bridles or leads

All Ag operations with livestock should consider the following:

- Purchasing a gas-powered generator, especially if the operation uses vent fans, water pumps, milking machines, or other critical electrical equipment.
- Store enough feed out of flood zones for livestock.
- Ensure a source of clean water; letting livestock drink flood water is generally not recommended.
- Store fertilizers, pesticides, treated seeds, and other such com-







Food/Water - Get supplies well in advance, enough for each person for at least one week.





Medicine/First-aid - Have 30 days worth of medicines and medical supplies. Fill prescriptions before the storm.





Communications - Have extra batteries or portable chargers for your cell phones and batteries for your radios.





Gas - Fill up your car or a gas can beforehand. If the power goes out, you will be unable to pump gas.





Money - Have cash on hand. With no electricity, ATMs and credit cards will not work.

pounds up high and away from flood waters and animals.

 Cover sharp parts or cutting edges of machinery and equipment that could come pose a danger to animals.

Livestock owners who need assistance should call their local Office of Emergency Preparedness (OEP).

SECURE IMPORTANT RE-CORDS AND DOCUMENTS

Pre- and post-hurricane documentation is extremely important for insurance compensation and recovery assistance. You'll want to have thorough records of damages and losses sustained on your farm as well as documentation of your cleanup and recovery efforts.

It is critical to document inventory of farm buildings, vehicles, equipment, and livestock before a disaster occurs. Take photos, videos, or make written lists with descriptions. Keep copies of this inventory in multiple places: computer, off-site in a safe location, and on a cloud-based server where information is transmitted and saved weekly.

Remember, standard homeowners' insurance doesn't cover flooding. Regularly review your insurance policies with your agent to be sure you have adequate coverage, including flood insurance, for your facilities, vehicles, farm buildings, crops, and livestock. Note, there are limitations on how soon insurance coverage will take effect. Generally, insurance policies will not cover damage if the policy was not in place before a disaster.

China Wood Species Inbound Mission to Maryland, Georgia & Louisiana

Maryland, Georgia & Louisiana August 15-20, 2022

China's planted forest area is the largest in the world. However, a ban on commercial logging of natural forests limits the supply of high-quality timber and pushes China to import large volumes of wood, since planted timber is not easily substituted for natural timber. China's overall wood product imports are expected to increase slightly in 2021 compared to the previous year due to robust demand and low domestic inventory, with a larger volume of softwood imports making up for reduced hardwood imports. China's overall softwood imports are projected to mark a year-on-year increase in 2021 based on ample supply and favorable prices. Softwood log imports are forecast at 54 million m3 in 2021, up about 15 percent compared to 2020. SUSTA will be bringing key buyers from China to Maryland, Georgia and Louisiana to meet with our Southern US Suppliers.
