

Instructions:

Brown beef bones on broil in the oven until golden. Place bones in a large stock pot and cover with a generous amount of water. Bring to a simmer, not a rolling boil. Skim the top of the pot with a strainer. Add apple cider vinegar and vegetables. Simmer for 24 hours or longer (can also use a crockpot). Filter by pouring over a cheesecloth and strainer. Cook down for an additional 12 to 24 hours, adding no water to make a strong concentrate. Can be stored in the freezer until ready for use.

BAKED BRIE

Submitted by Robin's Rockin' Cajun Pepper Jelly

Ingredients:

6 14 x 18 sheets phyllo dough 1 stick butter, melted 1 pound round brie 1 jar of Robin's Rockin' Cajun Pepper Jelly, any flavor Crackers for serving

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Before opening the phyllo dough, have a clean, dry cloth on hand to cover the phyllo that you are not working with. Unroll the phyllo dough and lay one sheet onto a large cutting board. With a pastry brush, brush the dough with melted butter. It's okay if it tears a bit – as you use more layers of phyllo dough, the tears will be covered. Wrap phyllo around the brie (you can use more butter to get the folds to stick to the brie). Take the next sheet and brush it with melted butter. Place the wrapped brie fold side down in the center of the phyllo sheet and wrap around the brie. Repeat until you have wrapped 5 sheets around the cheese, always turning the cheese over each time so that the folds are on the bottom. Brush a generous amount of butter on your 6th sheet of phyllo dough, then spread the Robin's Rockin' Cajun Pepper Jelly across the top of the wheel. Gently place the phyllo over the Pepper Jelly, butter side down, being careful not to tear the dough. Finish wrapping the brie with the dough, folding the edges underneath the brie and using additional butter as needed to smooth the phyllo folds around the cheese. Brush additional butter over the top. Place in a round baking pan or on a cookie sheet. Bake 15 minutes in 425 degree F oven or until lightly brown. Let sit for 5 minutes before serving with crackers.

The tour group wrapped up their first day with a visit to Neal Ranch in picturesque St. Francisville. This family-owned operation began raising cattle over 5 decades ago, and today, their herd is predominantly a Brangus herd. The Neal family operates roughly 1800 head of commercial cattle and 150 head of registered cattle under the trade names of Craig Neal and Sons, C & B Cattle, Bayou State Cattle, and Midsouth Cattle. The love of Brangus cattle is truly a family affair with Craig Neal and sons Jarrod and Michael operating these businesses with their wives, children, and now grandchildren. The second stop of the day took the group to Four Oaks Farm in beautiful Morganza. Four Oaks










Day Two

Day two consisted of a lot of time on the road as the group traveled to northeast Louisiana. The group traveled to Newellton in Tensas Parish to visit Hardwick's Planting Company.

Hardwick Planting Company farms approximately 9,000 acres of cotton, corn, soybeans, wheat, and sorghum. The Hardwicks firmly believe it is crucial to combine productive agricultural operations with maximum natural resource protection and a comprehensive conservation plan for the farm. With that philosophy in mind, almost 500 acres have been removed from agriculture production and restored to their natural existence along with the continued preservation of 3,000 more acres. They also maintain approximately 6,000 acres of hardwood timberland which provide habitat for the Louisiana black bear which the group had the pleasure of a sighting while there.

Most recently, Hardwick Planting Company became the first cotton farm in the United States to be certified by regenagri, an international agriculture initiative, and the first to join Citizens of Humanity Group's regenerative farming program. They will supply cotton for the brand's premium denim labels using regenerative practices. These practices include minimum tillage, cover cropping, crop rotation, afforestation, and natural buffer zones, which are known to boost carbon sequestration, increase biodiversity, and improve soil health. Hardwick Planting Company will also work closely with Citizens of Humanity Group and regenagri to ensure continuous improvement of its regenerative approach.

Day Three

The U.S. Sustainability Alliance Media Tour group kicked off their last day of the tour with a visit to Schexnayder Farms in Erwinville. R. Schexnayder & Sons is a grain farm that grows soybeans, corn, wheat, and oats. They also sell specialty wildlife feed and plot seed including soybeans, corn, wheat, oats, rye, triticale, winter peas, chicory, and clover.

Don and Ray Schexnayder spoke to the group about sustainable agricultural practices that help them reduce input costs, maximize yields, and efficiently manage nutrients such as crop rotation, cover crops, and conservation farming methods. They also spoke about the role technology plays in their operation and the value of the relationships with local universities.

From there the group was lucky enough to have lunch at the Port of Baton Rouge. The Port of Greater Baton Rouge is situated on the Mississippi River, 230 miles from the Gulf of Mexico at the junction of the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway at its northernmost point. This places it

on one of the largest port systems in the world—the lower Mississippi River port system (from Baton Rouge to the mouth of the Mississippi River).

It handles a variety of bulk and breakbulk cargoes for domestic and international markets including asphalt, barite, aggregates, limestone, carbon black, coal, coffee, coke, grain, forest products, biomass products, plastics, liquid bulk chemicals, molasses, oats, ores, pipe, steel, and sugar.

The group then finished out their tour in Rayne with a visit to the LSU H. Rousse Caffey Rice Research Station and G F & P Zaunbrecher Farm, followed by a delicious meal at Certified Louisiana's newest restaurant, Crawfish Town USA.

Since 1908, the LSU H. Rousse Caffey Rice Research Station has been conducting research and developing new rice varieties that benefit the rice industry in Louisiana. The station covers about 1,000 acres near Crowley and includes more than 30 acres devoted to research on crawfish. Some rice varieties are developed for crawfish forage for those farmers who double-crop. The station is vital to maintaining the viability of the rice industry for the future. Their research and variety development See TOUR, page 19







allows farmers to adapt their agricultural practices so that Louisiana can produce rice for generations to come. Their annual field day has become known as the largest of its type in the state, welcoming hundreds of rice growers, consultants, and rice industry professionals from in state, out of state, and other countries

Next stop was G F & P Zaunbrecher Farm. G F & P Zaunbrecher

Farm has over 3,500 acres of rice, soybeans, and crawfish. The farm is operated by four brothers, Fred, Philip, Paul, and Bill. Paul and Fred spoke our group about crawfish and the crawfish-rice double cropping system. Did you know that flooded crawfish ponds have a positive



effect on the environment? These ponds greatly benefit and improve the quality of water entering and exiting the field. Crawfish ponds also provide more than 120,000 acres of manmade wildlife habitat. Additionally, many crawfish farmers use the same farm equipment, tractors, and irrigation systems that are used in rice production. Keeping this equipment on a year-round maintenance program keeps this equipment in working order and reduces environmental contamina-

After learning all about rice and crawfish farming, the group made a stop at Crawfish Town USA in Henderson, the "town that crawfish built." Henderson is the site of the first commercial crawfish pond ever built in Louisiana and is where crawfish were first served in a restaurant. Today, you can crawfish and other seafood dishes at Crawfish Town USA. Thank you to Chef Johnnie Gale for an amazing meal!

LDAF's newest storytelling video series, LOUISIANA CROP TALK with Commissioner Strain, spotlights Louisiana's unique specialty crops and the amazing people dedicated to bringing us locally grown produce and horticultural products. One of those outstanding specialty crops is fresh, Louisiana-grown Christmas trees.

According to Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., the holidays *start* with a fresh-cut Christmas tree. "We've always gotten our Christmas tree from a local farm. I love the smell. Plus.

grew Virginia pine, which was one of the first Christmas tree varieties recommended for growing in the South. Since that time, they've evolved to the Leyland Cypress, which is the number one selling tree in the South.

One of the reasons the Leyland Cypress is so popular is that it holds up so well at home. Even though it has dense foliage, Steele, Sr., notes the lack of shedding, saying, "The beautiful thing is the frond doesn't cast; it's not like a needle." In addition to not making a mess in your house, Leyland Cypress is also considered a hy-





poallergenic variety that doesn't typically cause any problems for allergy sufferers.

Leyland Cypress trees last a tremendous amount of time, which is another great reason to buy your tree from a local farmer. Believe it or not, Steele, Sr., had a customer recently tell him that her mother decorates her Leyland Cypress for Mardi Gras. And that's not an uncommon sentiment expressed by repeat customers.

In addition to the Leighton Green and Ovince varieties of Leyland Cypress, Steele's Farm also grows Carolina Sapphire and Blue Ice,

which are favorites with those who prefer a stronger aroma from their Christmas tree. However, both varieties have a shorter shelf life than the Leighton Green Leyland Cypress. If you want one of them, the Steeles recommend bringing it home later in the season.

Some people are surprised to learn that Louisiana has such a booming Christmas tree industry, but Commissioner Strain says it makes sense. "We have the perfect environment, we have a beautiful climate with plenty of rainfall, and we have close proximity to suburban and urban areas," said

Steele's farm has won enough awards to come full circle; now, his brothers come out and buy their trees from him.

There's a bit of a real-life Charlie Brown to that story, and Steele's kids didn't fall far from the tree. Kevin, Jr., says, "When I pick the tree for my house, I look for the tree that nobody else is gonna buy. We bring it home and make it our own. Yes, on our farm, we aim for those perfect attributes, like a straight trunk. But you can't change some things, and sometimes that's the best characteristic."



Strain. "It all works out together. And you're not going to get a fresher Christmas tree than right here'

But they don't just sell Christmas trees at Steele's. They've turned this traditional family outing into an experience by adding a jump pillow, sleigh, hay mountain, and many other activities for children to enjoy when they visit. Steele, Sr., says "We want people to make a memory here. That's what we're all about."

Speaking of Christmas tree memories, Steele, Sr., recalls a trip he and his father took to Mississippi when he was just a youngster. The friend they were visiting had a pine top as his Christmas tree. Mr. Steele recalls, "I just thought that was the neatest thing. I asked my dad if we could bring one home, and we did. It was the ugliest tree that you have ever seen! My brothers were crying and calling it the 'freak of the forest.'" These days,

ple, trees have their own personalities. But growing beautiful Christrequires passion and hard work is typically into a tree's second year. Then, says Steele, Sr., "We

shear 2-4 times all through the 5-year cycle." That shearing process is incredibly labor intensive, made a little less so by their Sage machine, which is basically an 8-foot hedge trimmer. Steele, Sr., savs his son

can shear 260 trees an hour. It takes them about a week to shear all 8,000 trees on the farm.

That's dedication, and it seems to be in the Steeles' blood. In fact, the farm suffered a devastating fire in the 90s. Although Steele was able to save the crop for that year, everything else was burned up. Steele, Sr., says "I told my wife, 'I'm done.' That was in November. By January, I was ready to do it again. So, we planted, and it took us three years to get back into the rotation, but we've been going strong ever since."

That dedication and passion come through when both men talk about the farm. Says Steele, Jr., "It's good to work with Dad. We stay at each other all day, giving each other a hard time and making each other better. I wouldn't have it any other way." Steele, Sr., agrees, "Next to raising my family, this is the proudest thing I've accomplished. And it means a lot to me to share it with others."
