

A BEAUTIFUL BOUNTY AT AMITE'S FAUST FARMS

In the latest episode of CROP TALK with Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, we visited Faust Farms in Amite, LA. Specializing in strawberries, bell peppers, eggplants, and creole tomatoes, Faust Farms grows some of the most beautiful fresh produce you have ever seen using both traditional and non-traditional methods

At Faust Farms, they are growing their beautiful produce with hard work, some best practices, and a genuine passion for feeding their community. Natalie Jones of Faust Farms is among the third generation of family farmers working the 60 acres at Faust Farms, which has been in operation since 1985.

Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM, was interested to learn more about their use of root drip

irrigation — one of the keys to their success. "With root drip irrigation, the drip lines are below the ground," says Strain, "so the plants get exactly what they need, when they need it, in the form that they need it. There's no runoff. There are no wet spots... everything goes to the

these tomato plants, they're just beautiful and perfect," says Strain

Indeed, one of their fields is filled with 1,000s of tomato plants (see below),

and the average yield is over 20 pounds of tomatoes for each plant!

In addition to root drip irrigation, Faust Farms grows a cover crop of iron clay cowpeas for their strawberries. "They'll come up

plants. If you look at as a nice pretty green cover crop through the summer," says Natalie. "When they start breaking down, we'll till them back into the soil. Berries love nitrogen, so it's just a good natural way to get it to them."

> The farm also has two large hydroponic greenhouses. Their biggest holds about 12,000 lettuce plants, where they grow five different varieties. Some of it gets chopped into spring mixes to be sold at local grocery stores, but they also sell to a broker who

Appellate Court Rules in Favor of Agriculture

On Wednesday, April 12, the U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals ruled that Louisiana can enforce the Truth in Labeling of Food Products Act (Act 273 of the 2019 Regular Session).

In a 3-0 decision, the court said the law did not infringe Tofurky's First Amendment commercial free speech rights, reversing a lower court ruling in a case brought by the maker of Tofurky.

"We are pleased with the recent decision by the U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals to uphold the state's Truth in Labeling of Food Products Act, the purpose of which is to protect consumers from the intentional misbranding or misrepresenting of any food product as an agricultural product," remarked

In October 2020, Tofurky filed a suit challenging the constitutionality of the law which prohibits "intentionally misbrand[ing] or mispresent[ing] any food product as an agricultural product," includina:

- Representing a food product as meat or a meat product when the food product is not derived from a harvested beef, pork, poultry, alligator, farm-raised deer, turtle, domestic rabbit, crawfish, or shrimp carcass;
- Representing a food product as beef or a beef





ETOUFFEE

Submitted by FRUGE Seasoning

Ingredients:

1 stick butter

½ cup flour

1 quart chicken broth

6 onions, finely diced

½ cup parsley, finely diced

6-8 stalks green onion, finely diced

5-6 stalks celery, finely diced

4-5 cloves of garlic, finely diced

5 tablespoons Frugé Cajun Seasoning

3 bay leaves

2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce

3-4 lbs. crawfish tails

2 tablespoons onion powder

2 cups rice

4 cups hot water

1 teaspoon white vinegar

1 teaspoon olive/pecan oil

1 tablespoon fresh garlic, minced

2 tablespoons green onion

Bring a large pot to medium-medium high heat and add the stick of butter. Once the butter has melted, use a wooden spoon or metal whisk to slowly fold in 2 Tbsp. of flour. Continue to stir the butter. After a minute or so, add another 2 Tbsp. of flour. Once that is thoroughly mixed, add the remaining flour. Stir for another 6 minutes.

Carefully add in ¼ quart of the chicken stock. Stir/whisk well. Add onions, parsley, green onion, celery, and fresh garlic. Stir well. Add Frugé's Cajun Seasoning, bay leaves, Worchester Sauce, and onion powder. Stir well. Cover the pot and cook on medium heat for 20 minutes. Stir occasionally. Add the remainder of the chicken broth. Stir well and cook for 10 minutes. Add in your crawfish or shrimp, stir well and cook for 30 minutes, stirring occasionally. Prepare your rice while the etouffeé finishes.

In a pot or pan, add the oil on medium heat. Add 1 Tbsp. diced garlic and cook for 1-2 minutes, but do not brown the garlic. Next, add the dry rice. Toast it by bringing the heat up to medium-high, and stir the rice occasionally for 2 minutes. Add 4 cups of hot water, vinegar, and green onion. Stir. Cover the pot. Bring to a boil, then reduce to medium low heat. Cook for 22 minutes, leave covered to cool for 5 minutes.

Serve etouffeé over rice.



product when the food product is not derived from a domesticated bovine; and

Utilizing a term that is the same as or deceptively similar to a term that has been used or defined historically in reference to a specific agricultural product.

Turtle Island Foods, S.P.C., (d/b/a Tofurky Company) markets and sells its products in Louisiana. Tofurky sued Louisiana's Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry, seeking declaratory and injunctive relief in 2020. Tofurky argued that it operates under a constant threat of enforcement. In 2022, the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana ruled in Tofurky's favor. It held that Tofurky had standing to challenge the law and that it was an unconstitutional restriction on Tofurky's right to free speech. The State appealed.

LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., defended the law. The decision on April 12 by the U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals reversed the March 2022 ruling by U.S. District Judge Brian Jackson of the U.S. District Court, Middle District of Louisiana.

The Fifth Circuit found that while Tofurky had standing to challenge the constitutionality of the law, the law itself is not unconstitutional. The higher court concluded that "the Act, when narrowly construed, does not violate the First Amendment's protection of commercial free speech."

The case is Turtle Island Foods S.P.C. v. Strain, U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals, No. 22-30236.

live pitch competition in front of Farm Bureau members, investors and industry representatives at the AFBF Convention in January 2024 in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Each of the semi-finalist teams will be awarded \$10,000 and a chance to compete to advance to the final round where four teams will receive an additional \$5,000 each. The final four teams will compete to win:

Identifying Poison Ivy & Look Alikes

If you're outdoors at all this time of year, an encounter with poison ivy is tough to avoid. Plant identification and gardening pages on social media often present misleading information about how to positively identify poison ivy and distinguish it from both poison oak and poison sumac, so let's look at three itchy troublemakers.

All three species are members of the cashew family. The genus name Toxicodendron literally means "poison tree." All three produce an oil called urushiol that typically causes a mild to severe rash when it contacts skin. Some folks are highly allergic to it, some are only mildly allergic to it and a lucky few are not allergic to it at all. All three species have leaves that are always both alternately arranged and compound, meaning the leaves are divided into leaflets.

Poison ivy is, by far, the most common of the three species. Its leaves are divided into three leaflets, which may be variously lobed or not lobed at all. In sunny situations, the leaflets may have a shiny appearance. Poison ivy is always a vine, but especially robust specimens may appear shrubby. Poison ivy is easily identified in winter by the multitude of hairlike, adventitious roots that hold vines tightly to tree trunks. Even in its dormant condition, poison ivy can still cause a rash. Its flowers are small, greenish-white and white drupes that follow spread by birds.

The adage of "leaves of three, let it be!" doesn't necessarily fly. Numerous other plants have trifoliate or compound leaves and are often misidentified as poison ivy, especially peppervine, trumpet creeper, and Virginia creeper. Peppervine and Virginia creeper are both in the grape family. Young leaves of peppervine mimic poison ivy in that the leaflets may be variously lobed. Pinnately compound leaves, the lack of urushiol production, the presence of tendrils, grapelike clusters of tiny flowers, and dark purple or black fruit make peppervine distinctly different from poison ivy. Virginia creeper has palmately compound leaves that sequester calcium oxalate crystals and may irritate sensitive skin, but this is much less frequent than the dermatitis caused by poison ivy. The attractive, red foliage of Virginia creeper in fall is distinctive and should never be confused with the yellow fall foliage of poison ivy.

Unlike poison ivy, the leaves of trumpet creeper are oppositely arranged and pinnately compound. The showy, bright orange, trumpet-shaped flowers make it immediately distinguishable from poison ivy and its cousins. Box elder, a tree commonly found along streams in our area, is a close look-alike but is distinguished by its oppositely arranged leaves.

Poison oak, a shrub, also has leaves divided into three leaflets. However, poison oak is generally restricted to drier upland sites, whereas poison ivy, a vine, is found in a variety of habitats. Poison sumac is small and less common in Louisiana. The nontoxic sumacs, of the genus Rhus, are much more abundant in our area; their stunning red and orange fall foliage is commonly seen on roadside banks.

What are cover crops?

Planted between cash crops, cover crops are grown for the protection and enrichment of the soil. Often called "green manure," cover crops create a living cover that helps maintain soil health until the next planting cycle. They also act as a living mulch and protect soils from erosion.

Commonly used cover crops include buckwheat, barley, clover, hemp, millet, mustard mixes, oats, radishes, rapeseed, rye, turnips, wheat, and winter peas.

Planting cover crops is a beneficial practice in even the smallest of gardens. They improve soil fertility and the movement of water and air in the soil. They also reduce soil erosion, nutrient leaching, compaction, and weeds.

Cover crops can help increase the activity of earthworms and beneficial microorganisms and provide habitat and food (nectar and pollen) for beneficial insects and pollinators.

Seed mixes are readily available at garden centers, hardware stores, and online retailers. Here in the Sportsman's Paradise, you can find the best selections at hunting and outdoor stores; they're often sold for deer food plots.

Cover crops can be used in any size garden, from a small raised bed to a large farm. Plant them any time of year after harvest and be sure to select season-appropriate varieties.

If you need to replenish nitrogen in your soil, try legumes such as clover, peanuts, and soybeans. Berseem and crimson clover, which grow rapidly in late summer or fall, can be turned into the ground in spring. And hairy vetch can be grown in spring or fall.

If your soil is compacted, you can use cereal grains or barley to improve soil tilth. Many ryes and oats are coolseason crops with fibrous roots that help loosen the soil. Radishes and turnips also help break up deeply compacted soils.

A team of LSU AgCenter scientists is currently studying several aspects of using cover crops on Louisiana farms to supplement existing data from other states.

Economic Perspectives on Best Management Practices & Sustainable Production Strategies

Best management practices are measures that producers can apply to crop rotations, tillage operations, effective input application and other aspects of the management process that minimize - or eliminate altogether - the flow of fertilizers, pesticides, animal waste, and other byproducts of farm operations from entering water resources. These best management practices can include measures related to nutrient management, irrigation management and water resource protection. In nutrient management, producers that are best management practice-minded are actively engaged in determining the nutrient needs of their own respective farms and manage nutrient applications in such a way as to minimize their impact on water resources.

Best management practices can also encourage producers to examine the way they handle irrigation in their operations with the emphasis placed on addressing irrigation needs while simultaneously acting to reduce water loss and minimize nutrient losses to the environment. Water resource protection is another important component of the best management practices space and can be summarily defined as attempts by producers to prevent the introduction of sediment and nutrients into contiguous waterbodies by using buffers. Whether sugarcane, rice, sweet potatoes, poultry, beef cattle, or forestry, researchers at the LSU AgCenter have compiled recommendations on the management of soil and water resources critical to the longterm success of each sector of the state's agricultural economy.

There are economic and environmental benefits related to the adoption of best management practices in production agriculture. Economically, best management practices that are designed to conserve soil nutrients and water resources can assist in the efficient use of farm inputs throughout the production process. In most cases, best management practice implementation can enhance yields, enrich wildlife habitat, improve overall production, sustain soil productivity, and maintain water quality. Oftentimes, best management practices occupy the central spot in the sustainability conversation. Best management practices are voluntary practices that can play a large role in measuring sustainability through quantifying the direct and indirect benefits of practice implementation. With increased

industry efforts designed to enhance the sustainability of production agriculture, the production sector has long been keen to the benefits of conserving natural resources in the production process. The realistic and effective implementation of these measures is critical to the success of conservation or sustainability at the farm level.

Even though commodity prices have risen, profit margins remain thin from increases in fuel, fertilizer, chemical, and machinery costs. Therefore, best management practice implementation — whether it is reducing the number of inputs applied, such as pounds of fertilizer per acre, or taking fewer machinery passes in a field to reduce soil degradation or minimizing nutrient loss via groundwater runoff — can collectively translate into a reduction in production costs while simultaneously benefitting the environment.

One example of a positive secondary benefit of best management practice implementation is reduced soil erosion under conservation tillage. Conservation tillage is defined as any tillage or planting system where 30% or more of the area under cultivation is covered with plant crop residue after planting in order to reduce water-induced soil erosion. Conservation tillage acts to improve soil retention and improve land-use efficiency. Here, land-use efficiency is defined as an estimate of the land area needed for one unit of production.

Another example is advances in irrigation methods. Multiple irrigation practices used to conserve water lead to improved water quality and may also provide wildlife habitat. Research has also demonstrated that new irrigation strategies can improve yields and reduce water usage, improving farm profitability across multiple crops.

Reducing energy use has been achieved through on-farm advancements in precision agriculture that target optimal input applications, requiring fewer passes of machinery throughout a field and reducing the per acre cost to the operation. A secondary aspect of reduced energy use is a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions.

Best management practices play a role in communicating the success that agriculture has imposed on itself to meet consumer demands. It should be noted that best management practices are site specific, economically feasible measures that producers implement voluntarily. They are not meant to be regulatory as each farming operation is unique, and different practices may be required. Best management practices and sustainability awareness measures are truly industry-driven efforts with the aim of maintaining an agricultural sector that is both vibrantly productive in an economic sense and environmentally sensitive with the overarching aim of enhancing agricultural sustainability over the long run.

LDAF Division Adds Safer, More Fuel-Efficient Trucks

Louisiana's Heavy-Duty Device Program currently has over 3,500 active devices under its jurisdiction statewide, many of which must be inspected multiple times per year. Industrial businesses depend on LDAF to keep these scales in compliance, not only for commerce, but also for safety and insurance purposes.

Louisiana livestock scale operators depend on the availability of our inspectors and these specialized test trucks, so that they can maintain official USDA Packer and Stockyard certifications and complete any needed repairs between very tight weekly sale dates.

In fact, to keep up with the growth of the industrial/chemical industry in south Louisiana, we added a fourth HD inspector with a fourth HD truck in 2019.

To help this whole process run smoothly, the Division of Weights and Measures in LDAF's Office of Agro-Consumer Services recently purchased four new heavy duty (HD) trucks. Our current trucks have become more and more unreliable and costly to repair; however, we will keep two as spares and trade in two on the new purchases. The new trucks are 2023 Internationals outfitted with custom designed hydraulic weight movement systems by Kanawha Scales and Systems Inc. in Poca, WV. These will replace 2007-08 model trucks that are more than 15 years old.

Not only are the new trucks safer, but they're also more fuel efficient than our current trucks in use:

- Up to 5% more fuel efficient than the previous model, and with oil change intervals increased to 70,000 miles, these trucks are more efficient and require less maintenance than previous models.
- The new **column gear shifter** allows drivers to keep their hands on the wheel and eyes on the road.
- Air disc brakes, now standard for both front and rear applications, provide shorter, surer stops, better braking feel, and more braking power for improved safety.
- **Electronic stability control** assists in both rollover and vehicle under- and over-steer situations to help maintain a vehicle's lateral stability and steerability.

 These new trucks are all "Certified Clean Idle" vehicles and include Low NOx Idle Engine that complies with California Clean Air Regulations.

By verifying your farm, you provide the Produce Safety Program with up-to-date information about your farm's size, the commodities you grow, and correct contact information. We use this to keep a Farm Inventory and discuss next steps for your operation, whether that is an On-Farm Readiness Review, an inspection, or simply an educational farm visit.

sistance to Enhance Produce Safety

Who should attend this food safety training?

This training is for fruit and vegetable growers and others interested in learning about produce safety, the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) Produce Safety Rule, Good Agricultural Practices (GAPs), and co-management of natural resources and food safety.

This course satisfies the FSMA Produce Safety Rule requirement outlined in Section 112.22(c) that requires 'At least one supervisor or responsible party for your farm must have successfully completed food safety training at least equivalent to that received under standardized curriculum recognized as adequate by the Food and Drug Administration.'

The \$20 registration fee includes: PSA Growers Training Manual, the PSA/AFDO Certificate of Course Completion, USB drive with educational materials, and light refreshments and lunch on both days. Three potable handwashing stations will be given out to three randomly selected farms.

This training is heavily subsidized by the La. Dept. of Agriculture & Forestry's support through FDA Grant PAR-16-137 and the USDA-LDAF Specialty Crop Block Grant Program.
