Livestock Brand Commission Warns Against Livestock Sales Scams

Inspectors with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Livestock Brand Commission (LSBC) have noticed an uptick in the number of scams related to livestock sales and want to make the public aware so that they can make smart business decisions. The Livestock Brand Commission has conducted several investigations where farmers have encountered scams relating to livestock sales over the past few weeks.

"Farmers should use caution when dealing with people who make offers that seem too good to be true," says LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM. "It is unfortunate that there are people that take advantage of others for financial gain, but there are ways to stay alert and tips to practice to hopefully avoid falling victim to scammers."

To protect yourself from potential scams, it is recommended that you:

- Avoid providing personal or financial information to unknown parties.
- Beware of intentional overpayments. Never accept a check or cashier's check for more than the value of the sale. When the original check turns out to be fraudulent, the seller is the one who comes up short after having refunded them.
- Confirm checks are valid by contacting your bank or the issuing bank.
- When buying items, never issue payment until the items are received unless you have complete trust in the seller.



man, dedicated to his family and his job. "I owe a lot to my in-laws," says Johnny. "They were like parents to me, and it's God that brought me and my wife together."

By the end of his 43-year LDAF career, Johnny had served under four different commissioners in many different capacities, but the one that stuck was as a pesticide inspector. In that role, Johnny investigated damage complaints, including oversprays from pest control and crop dusters, health complaints, and damages, including trees and people's yards and gardens.

Many of the lessons he passed on to his son were reinforced on the job as an LDAF inspector.

Don't give up

Johnny says he enjoyed solving problems and would only let go once he'd solved them. "My nickname was Columbo. A lot of times, you have to wait for the product to work and look at weather data and other factors in order to determine a pattern and put the puzzle together."

You have to let it take its course.

Johnny says one part of the job he loved was learning and teaching others. "When you work with the pesticide division, there's a lot to learn, and you can't find it

all in a book," he says. "They can show you pictures of what things look like, but when you get in the field, you're not sure what you're looking at. Because things blend in, more than one product can show the same damage."

You have to learn how to work with people.

Johnny often encountered tense situations on the job and explained that people tend to be mad, especially whenever there's a damage complaint. "So, the ones with the damage are mad. And then when you contact the people that did the damage, they're mad. So you're stuck right in the middle."

The job was such a good fit for Johnny that he didn't want to retire. But when he was trying to make the decision, he heard his father-in-law's voice in his head, saying to "give his grandson a chance."

Jason began working for LDAF after graduating from ULL with a degree in biology. Although he's in a different position from his dad and grandfather, it seems that he's taken the lessons they've passed on and run with them. "I'm glad he's doing better than me," jokes Johnny. "Maybe I was doing something wrong. No... I'm happy he's following in my footsteps."

Jason says he didn't know much about what

his grandfather did because he retired around the same time Jason was born. But he does remember his dad and grandfather talking about work a lot, perhaps where he went that week or what he was researching.

"I also remember when I was young, 4 or 5 years old, in the grocery store with my mom and seeing the Department of Agriculture stickers on the scales," says Jason. "I asked her what they were for, and now I'm the one putting the stickers on those scales. I also remember seeing the big trucks with tanks in the back like we have now. Now I'm the one driving around with those tanks. I didn't know it at the time, but I was asking about my future job."

Jason is mindful that what he does is important, and protecting Louisiana consumers motivates him to do his job well.Whether it's investigating complaints about contaminated fuel, ensuring products ring up at the right price, or verifying

that scales weigh properly, he's always on the go, and his tasks are constantly changing. But he likes it that way. "You never really know how your day is going to go. You can have a plan, but you might get a complaint call and have to change gears," says Jason. "So, it's interesting... you never know what you're going to do, and I enjoy it"

Jason is 12 years in, and says he plans to stay with the department until he retires, just like his dad and grandfather before him. "Who knows, maybe we'll have more generations working at LDAF," he says, laughing. "I have two sons, so maybe one of them might keep it going."

Jason says that even his bad days on the job are better than most days at other jobs he's had. And Johnny can attest that putting in hours of hard work offers meaningful rewards beyond blood, sweat, and tears.

Interesting... some might say fatherhood is like that, too.

- Watch out for social media listings that offer items at a price that seems too good to be true. These scams rely on impulsive actions, so always think before you click.
- Verify that listings are legitimate before taking action.
- Check out a seller before you buy. Search online for the company's name plus words like "review," "scam," or "complaint."
- Consider how you're asked to pay. Don't deal with a seller who requires payment by wire transfer, cryptocurrency, or gift card. That's sure to be a scam.
- Go slow. Avoid high-pressure sales pitches that require you to "lock in" prices by paying for all or part of your order before getting delivery, particularly if you don't know the seller.
- Talk with someone you trust. Before you pay, tell someone — a friend, family member, or neighbor about the deal. Talking about it could help you realize it's a scam.

Should a farmer encounter what they believe to be a scam, report the matter to local law enforcement and/or the Livestock Brand Commission at (800) 558-9741.

July 10 Deadline to Sign Up for New Rice Production Program

The USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) began sending prefilled applications to rice producers the week of May 8 for the new Rice Production Program (RPP), which will provide up to \$250 million in assistance to rice farmers based on 2022 planted and prevented planted acres.

In December 2022, President Biden signed into law the 2023 Consolidated Appropriations Act which provided the authority and funding for USDA to make payments to rice producers based on data already on file with USDA, including planted acres and acres prevented from being planted.

FSA will make an initial payment to eligible producers at a reduced payment rate of one cent per pound. If funds remain at the end of the application period, a second payment, not to exceed one cent per pound may be issued to eligible producers. To be eligible, a producer must

have reported to FSA a share interest in eligible rice.

Payments are calculated as directed in the legislation by multiplying the following:

- · Payment rate;
- Individual average actual production history (APH) as reported to RMA or the FSA-established yield; and
- Amount of certified rice acres determined by the number of planted acres and acres that were prevented from being planted.

If applicable, a prevented planted factor of 60% will be applied. The payment limitation for the program is set by statute and is higher if the farmer's average adjusted gross farm income (income from activities related to farming, ranching or forestry) is more than 75% of their average adjusted gross income (AGI). Specifically, a person or legal entity with an

average adjusted gross farm income of less than 75% of their average AGI cannot receive, directly or indirectly, more than \$125,000 in payments.

Farmers who derive 75% or more of their average AGI from farming qualify for a \$250,000 payment limit. AGI is based on the three taxable years preceding the most immediately preceding complete tax year.

Rice farmers can visit their local county office to submit the appropriate form and certification (FSA-510, Request for an Exception to the \$125,000 Payment Limitation for Certain Programs), if they qualify for and want to seek the higher payment limit.

FSA is mailing pre-filled applications to producers using information on file with USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA) or FSA, as reported by rice producers through their crop insurance agents or FSA county offices.

To apply for assistance through the RPP, producers must return their completed FSA-174, Rice Production Program Application, to their recording FSA county office by close of business on Monday, July 10, 2023. Applications may be submitted either in person, by mail, email, or facsimile.

Producers who reported eligible rice to FSA by the acreage reporting deadline but do not receive a pre-filled application may still apply by visiting their local FSA office and completing the application by Monday, July 10, 2023. Producers who filed late or modified 2022 rice acreage reports will not be eligible for RPP.

Iberia Parish Man Arrested for Theft of Livestock in St. Landry Parish

An Iberia Parish man was arrested on June 5 by inspectors with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Livestock Brand Commission regarding an investigation involving theft of livestock in St. Landry Parish.

Sixty-six-year-old Orlando Williams was arrested in St. Landry Parish on a warrant for theft of livestock. Williams turned himself in to brand inspectors at the St Landry Parish Jail. During the brand inspector's investigation, it was determined that Williams received two horses on one occasion and failed to render proper payment to a local livestock market as required by law. The acquisition of the livestock and failure to render proper payment is a violation of R.S.14:67.1 (Theft of Livestock). The alleged theft occurred in February 2023.

"Louisiana law is clear when referring to the purchase of livestock and protects livestock owners from persons not complying with proper payment," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. "If determined guilty, the suspect will be in violation of the theft of livestock statute and held responsible for his crime."

The Livestock Brand Commission was assisted with this investigation by the Iberia Parish Sheriff's Department. At this time, a bond amount has not been set, and the livestock has not been recovered.



Feeding Kids, Fighting Food Insecurity


The term "food security" means that all people at all times have access to enough food for an active, healthy life. On the flip side, food *insecurity* means there are times (whether due to financial or other reasons) when households are unable to acquire enough food to meet their needs.

Based on USDA data, 10.2% of all U.S. households were affected by food insecurity at some time in 2021. That's 13.5

million people, some of whom are children. The rate is higher, at 12.5%, for households with children. For many of these families, summer is a time of food insecurity. That's because many children in Louisiana receive free or reduced breakfast and lunch during the school year. However, that access is often lost when schools let out for the summer.

The good news is that the USDA-funded Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) helps to ensure that children continue to receive nutritious meals when school is not in session. In Louisiana, more than 100 sponsoring organizations participate in the SFSP, including schools, local government agencies, camps, and faith-based and other non-profit community organizations. These sponsors operate Summer Meal sites all over the state for eligible children in their communities. And LDAF participates in this effort through the storage and distribution of USDA food allocated for this program.

Louisiana has hundreds of summer meal sites where children receive meals and snacks. Sites are located in a variety of safe and supervised settings, including schools, parks, community centers, churches, camps, and migrant centers. In fact, more than 45 summer meal sites are at public libraries in Louisiana. Meals and snacks can be eaten at local sites or on-the-go.

RCPP improvements & funding availability

The USDA's Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) uses a voluntary approach to conservation that expands the reach of conservation efforts and climate-smart agriculture through public-private partnerships.

Increased funding for fiscal year 2023 is made possible by the Inflation Reduction Act, and this year's funding opportunity reflects a concerted effort to streamline and simplify the program. Program improvements will enable USDA to efficiently implement the \$4.95 billion in Inflation Reduction Act funding for the program while improving the experience for partners, agricultural producers, and employees.

The application period is now open for RCPP Classic and RCPP Alternative Funding Arrangements (AFA). RCPP Classic projects are implemented using NRCS contracts and easements with producers, landowners and communities, in collaboration with project partners. Through RCPP AFA, the lead partner must work directly with agricultural producers to support the development of new conservation structures and approaches that would not otherwise be available under RCPP Classic.

The RCPP's latest Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) showcases a number of program improvements arrived at through partner listening sessions and employee and partner surveys that are part of an ongoing effort to streamline NRCS conservation programs and efficiently implement the Inflation Reduction Act.

The RCPP improvement effort the increase of project funding ceilings, the

simplification of financial assistance and technical assistance structures, a stronger emphasis on locally led conservation, and easement deed flexibilities.

Up to \$500 million will be available through the RCPP for fiscal year 2023, of which up to \$50 million will prioritize AFAs with Indian Tribes.

Projects selected under this NOFO may be awarded funding through either the Inflation Reduction Act or Farm Bill 2018. Applications for RCPP climate-related projects will receive priority consideration for Inflation Reduction Act funding. The 2023 RCPP priorities are climate-smart agriculture, urban agriculture and projects and, as a Justice40 covered program, projects that serve underserved farmers and ranchers.

The application period is now open for the Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP). RCPP leverages a voluntary approach to conservation that expands the reach of conservation efforts and climate-smart agriculture through public-private partnerships. In addition to the funding opportunity, NRCS has embarked on a concerted effort to streamline and simplify RCPP and improve the experience for partners, producers and employees.

NRCS will accept applications now through Aug. 18, 2023 via the RCPP portal.

USDA Accepting Applications to Help Cover Costs of Organic Producers

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will cover up to 75% of the costs associated with organic certification, up to \$750 per category, through the Organic Certification Cost Share Program (OCCSP). Louisiana Farm Service Agency (FSA) encourages organic agricultural producers and handlers to apply for OCCSP by Oct. 31, 2023, for expenses incurred from Oct. 1, 2022, through Sept. 30, 2023.

As part of USDA's broader effort to support organic producers and in response to stakeholder feedback, this year FSA increased the cost share to the maximum amount allowed by statute.

"We're taking steps to better support Louisiana organic producers," said Ronald Guidry, Jr., State Executive Director for FSA in Louisiana. "I'm pleased that we're able to increase and restore the cost share to the statutory limit this year. Organic certification costs have long been identified as a barrier to certification, and this assistance, at its full levels, will help Louisiana organic producers participate in new markets while supporting and growing our local and regional food systems."

The cost share provides financial assistance for organic certification, and producers and handlers are eligible to receive 75% of the costs, up to \$750, for crops, wild crops, livestock, processing/handling and state organic program fees (California only).

Louisiana producers have until Oct. 31, 2023, to file applications, and FSA will make payments as applications are received.

To apply, Louisiana producers and handlers should contact their local FSA office USDA Service Center. As part of completing the OCCSP application, producers and handlers will need to provide documentation of their organic certification and eligible expenses.

Organic producers and handlers may also apply for OCCSP through participating state departments of agriculture. Additional details can be found on the OCCSP webpage at www.fsa.usda.gov/programs-and-services/occsp/index.

USACE to Begin Largest Study on Mississippi River

Things are flowing smoothly along the Mississippi River and the United States Army Corps of Engineers is hoping to keep it that way.

"It is a vital source of economic power for us. It counts for \$130 billion in commerce annually to the tune of 500 million tons of commodities moving on it," Col. Cullen Jones, 65th Commander of New Orleans District. said.

Recently, the USACE announced its largest study ever focused on the river.

"There may be modifications to structures that we currently have on the systems,

everything from ranging old river control structure, Morganza control structure, all the way to our locks and flood gates we have throughout," Jones said.

In just one year, people have seen two extremes along the major commerce highway: last October, historic low levels - in April, homes flooded in the Midwest.

"Part of the lower Mississippi River comprehensive study will have us look at when we have these extreme conditions, is the river set up and are our structures in place to best deal with them," Jones said.

The \$25 million study will take place over the next five years.


"We can maintain navigation, make sure we have water supplies, reduce flood risk across the board. It's exciting. We get to look at the river now to see how we can improve it for the future," Jones said.

Researchers will start in Cape Girardeau, Mo., and make their way to the Gulf of Mexico, looking at all kinds of things along the way.

"We're going to be able to provide some actionable recommendations to congress so that we can ensure this river is liable for the next 100 years," Jones said.

The first step Jones says, is to meet with officials in all seven states.






The study area, from Cape Girardeau, MO, down to the Gulf of Mexico.

LSU AgCenter Showcasing 114 Years of Innovation at Annual Rice Field Day

LSU AgCenter rice researchers are inviting producers and industry professionals to the H. Rouse Caffey Rice Research Station for its annual field day to be held here on Wednesday, June 28.

"We welcome all rice industry stakeholders to the Rice Research Station where for more than a century Louisiana's eminent rice researchers have improved upon the sustainability, the nutritional value, the quality and therefore, the profitability of the state's top grain crop," Kurt Guidry, H. Rouse Caffey Rice Research Station resident coordinator, said. "This year, our researchers have worked diligently to continue the LSU AgCenter's longstanding tradition of exploring new rice varieties and testing best management practices that makes the rice industry stand out among the state's agricultural enterprises."

As in past years, the program will begin with field tours from 7:15 to 9 AM, with a poster session and trade show running concurrently.



Topics will include rice agronomy research, hybrid rice & specialty rice breeding, new rice variety developments, rice entomology & pathology research, and weed management.

The indoor program will feature updates from rice industry professionals and government officials, and will begin at 10:30 AM. Speakers will include John Dennison, chairman of the Louisiana Rice Research Board; Jim Harper, president of the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation; Dr. Mike Strain, commissioner of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry; Betsy Ward, chief executive officer for the USA Rice Federation; and Peter Bachmann, USA Rice Federation vice president of Policy & Governmental Affairs.

Other speakers will include Matt Lee, vice president for agriculture and dean of the College of Agriculture; and Mike Salassi, executive associate vice president. and director of the LAES.
