Thankfully, there's no reason for anyone to suffer in silence or struggle alone. Although some still experience the stigma of talking about mental health, times are changing for the better.

LDAF is proud to stand with a network of partners around the state and country who are helping America's farming families by alleviating their stressors and helping them find help and hope through ever-growing resources.

Earlier this month, LDAF attended Rural Mental Health Day at the Louisiana Capitol, where we connected with and learned from many of the agencies and organizations devoted to this cause. We're spotlighting some of them and their services in this issue.

LDAF's mental health awareness program, Stay Rooted Louisiana, offers several helpful resources, including QPR training and the Geaux Book.

QPR stands for Question, Persuade, and Refer. Just as people trained in CPR and the Heimlich Maneuver help save lives, those trained in QPR learn how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade, and refer someone to help.

You can take the free QPR training course online in less than an hour. Just go to QPRtraining.com/setup and enter the organization code "LDAF." After a quick registration to generate a username and password, you can begin the course at your own pace and repeat it as often as you need.





Avoid Scams Related to USDA Financial Assistance for Farmers Facing Discrimination

Part of the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) provides \$2.2 billion in financial assistance for farmers, ranchers, and forest landowners who experienced discrimination in USDA's farm lending programs prior to January 1, 2021.

USDA is aware of some lawyers and groups spreading misleading information about this process, pressuring people to sign retainer agreements, and asking people to fill out forms with private and sensitive information. Note that application forms



for this program are **<u>not</u>** yet available and the application filing period has **<u>not</u>** started.

1. When in doubt, check it out.

- Avoid providing personal or financial information to unknown parties.
- Beware of solicitations by mail, email, or phone calls from individuals claiming to be connected to USDA. USDA will not solicit you for information.
- There is **NO FEE** to apply for this financial assistance.
- The most current information on the process and timeline of this program can be found at farmers. gov/22007. Before the application process opens, the National Administrator of this program will provide a webpage for helpful information.
- 2. Beware of organizations seeking to file your application for a fee.
 - You will <u>not</u> need a lawyer to file an application for financial assistance under Section 22007 of the IRA. If

- you feel the need for legal advice, seek the assistance of a trusted, licensed attorney.
- be Before the application process opens, USDA will publish a list of trusted community organizations located across the country; these organizations will provide **FREE** help completing applications.
- Filing an application will be <u>FREE</u>.
- Beware of advance-fee scams or solicitations that promise a significant share of a large sum of money.

3. Report scams to the USDA Office of the Inspector General.

- Beware of scams involving fake settlement or cashier's checks followed by requests to wire part of the payment to an individual disguised as an attorney.
- If you believe there is an organization conducting a scam related to this process, please contact the USDA Office of the Inspector General (OIG) or any other appropriate authorities. Not sure how to start the conversation? Visit seizetheawkward.org for tips to push past discomfort and learn suggestions for before, during, and after what can be a difficult conversation.

According to the National Institute of Mental Health, helping someone in emotional pain can be as simple as these five steps:

- **ASK:** "Are you thinking about killing yourself?" It's not easy, but studies show that asking at-risk individuals if they are suicidal does not increase suicides or suicidal thoughts.
- **KEEP THEM SAFE:** Reducing a suicidal person's access to highly lethal items or places is important to suicide prevention. While this is not always easy, asking if the at-risk person has a plan and removing or disabling the lethal means can make a difference.
- **BE THERE:** Listen carefully and learn what the individual is thinking and feeling. Research suggests acknowledging and talking about suicide may, in fact, reduce rather than increase suicidal thoughts.
- **HELP THEM CONNECT:** Save the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline number (call or text 988) and the Crisis Text Line number (741741) in your phone so they're there if you need them. You can also help make a connection with a trusted individual like a family member, friend, spiritual advisor, or mental health professional.
- **STAY CONNECTED:** Staying in touch after a crisis or after being discharged from care can make a difference. Studies have shown the number of suicide deaths goes down when someone follows up with the at-risk person.

LDAF to Host Saddle Microchipping Event May 26 in St. Francisville

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Livestock Brand Commission will host its next saddle microchipping event Friday, May 26, from 10 A.M. to 3 P.M. It will be held at the LSU AgCenter's West Feliciana office located at 10032 West Feliciana Parkway in St. Francisville, Louisiana.

LDAF's microchip identification program provides all saddle owners in the state of Louisiana the opportunity to have their saddles registered and identified with a microchip implant. If microchipped saddles are ever stolen, the program allows brand officers to confirm ownership and return the property. This service is provided free to the public.

"Saddles are expensive and typically do not have identifiable marks or serial numbers," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. "This program offers our equine community a solution to that potential problem. It not only assists with the return of saddles in the event they are stolen, it deters saddle theft altogether."

This effort is a joint venture of the Livestock Brand Commission, parish sheriff's offices, other law enforcement agencies, parish cattlemen's associations, and riding clubs.

LDAF Seeks Public's Help in Grant Parish Pesticide Vandalism Case

Agents with the Livestock Brand Commission of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF), in conjunction with the Grant Parish Sheriff's Office, are asking for the public's assistance in an agricultural pesticides vandalism case in Grant Parish.

On April 18, in an agricultural field on the east side of the 700 block of Hwy 158 in Colfax, LA, property workers discovered that someone had tampered with valves on two large pesticide containers on a trailer and spilled the pesticides Glufosinate and Glyphosate on the ground. Some of the pesticides may have been stolen.

The Grant Parish Sheriff's Office requested the assistance of the LDAF Livestock Brand Commission with the investigation into criminal trespass and damage to property which resulted in the loss of pesticides with an estimated value of \$17,000. Also, the LDAF Pesticide and Environmental Programs Division is assisting with the cleanup of the spilled pesticides.

"The LDAF's Livestock Brand Commission is committed to holding perpetrators responsible for this kind of senseless vandalism," said Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry Mike Strain, D.V.M. "Not only can their actions create hazards for the environment, but they also contribute to the loss of money, time, and energy for the affected landowner."

St. Mary Woman Arrested for Forgery

On May 4, 2023, a St. Mary Parish woman was arrested for forgery charges resulting from an investigation conducted by brand inspectors with the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) Livestock Brand Commission and an arrest warrant issued by St. Mary Parish.

Forty-one-year-old Shanna L. Bryan of Berwick was arrested on a warrant for three counts of forgery. The LDAF's Livestock Brand Commission investigation determined that Bryan allegedly illegally forged and modified three Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) tests, commonly referred

to as "Coggins tests," for the purposes of boarding three horses at a St. Mary Parish boarding facility. As a result of the investigation, the horses were tested and found "negative" for Equine Infectious Anemia.

Bryan turned herself in at the St. Mary Parish Sheriff's Department without incident and was booked on the warrant. At this time, a \$5,000 bond has been set

"There is a reason that EIA tests are required by law; forging their results is a serious crime," said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, DVM. "Any duplicitous efforts to jeopardize

accurate and honest testing could have a detrimental impact on Louisiana's equine industry, and that's not a chance we are willing to take."

The Livestock Brand Commission was assisted in this investigation by the St. Mary Parish Sheriff's Department.

FFA is a dynamic, student-led organization for young men and women enrolled in agricultural education courses in middle and high schools. Through participation in FFA, members practice skills in animal and plant sciences, mechanics, business, environmental conservation, and leadership. The Louisiana FFA Association is made up of 11,316 members in 212 chapters in 53 parishes. The association is led by an elected group of student officers and adult advisors.

FFA's three major goals include growing leaders through real-world opportunities, building communities through civic-minded involvement, and strengthening agriculture by providing cutting-edge training to students.

As the keynote speaker for the day's luncheon, I reminded these students that they are our most valuable resource. And as a proud FFA alum, I can honestly say that the skills a young person learns in the program — skills like leadership and camaraderie — will serve them well no matter what they go on to do. We'll

undoubtedly need those skills in future generations in order to feed the world.

FFA is an integral part of the agricultural education program. To join the FFA, a student must be enrolled in an agricultural education course in their local school. Students between the ages of 12 and 21 who are enrolled in a systematic course of instruction in agricultural education are eligible for membership. Your local school system must offer agriscience instruction and have an active FFA chapter for you to join.

If your school doesn't have an agricultural education program, there are steps you can take to open a program in your school. If this is something you're interested in, FFA leadership recommends that you contact your state agricultural education staff to express your interest and ask for assistance on regulations, requirements, and resources for planning the new program.

Cercospora leaf blight is a disease that continues to be a problem for soybean farmers in the mid-South, with cost to the industry at more than \$250 million over the past five years.

Thomas-Sharma was recently awarded a \$300,000, two-year grant that will allow her to look at ways of controlling the disease. She is studying the underlying mechanisms of toxin production and sequestration by the fungus.

Cercospora is more widespread in the South than it is in the Midwest or other larger soybean-producing regions of the U.S.

While Thomas-Sharma's research currently focuses on mid-South growers, Cercospora could become a bigger problem for northern regions in the future, she said.

She plans to answer questions for growers on how to manage Cercospora to better protect their bottom lines.

Thomas-Sharma's AgCenter career began in 2018 after earning her doctorate at the University of Georgia and completing postdoctoral training at Kansas State University and the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Thomas-Sharma's research focuses on ways to improve the management of diseases in field crops, especially soybeans. She is based in Baton Rouge, where she also teaches a general plant pathology course.

LDAF Urges Vigilance During Termite Season

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., reminds property owners to remain vigilant for termites during late spring and into the coming summer months.

With Louisiana's warm and wet climate this time of year, termites can get especially active as they constantly seek out new food sources.

"Turning off outside lights at night or using yellow bulbs can help you avoid attracting swarming termites," says Commissioner Strain. "However, there are also other proactive measures you can take on a regular basis to protect your property from the destruction of termites."

- Fix any leaks in the roof, pipes, and outside faucets on your home.
- Repair rotting wood on the fascia, soffit, and exterior wood surfaces.
- Remove any wood lying under or around your home, and store firewood away from your home.

- Examine your home's slab line and the base of piers for signs of termites
- Clean the gutters on your home and repair sections that may be damaged.
- Trim tree limbs and vines that may be growing on your home.
- Drain water away from the slab or under your home; do not let it pool.

Treatments and annual inspections by a licensed, insured, and bonded pest control company are a good termite preventative. Between professional inspections, property owners can also look for mud tubes on slabs, piers, or walls; pinholes in wallboards; softness in flooring; or blisters in paint or wallpaper.
