

## Jazzman to be available for foundation seed in 2009

The LSU AgCenter has approved a new variety of aromatic rice to compete with foreign imports.

The variety, named Jazzman, will be an alternative to jasmine rice imported from Thailand, LSU AgCenter officials said.

"This specialty rice will give U.S. rice producers another growing option," said Dr. David Boethel, LSU AgCenter vice chancellor for research. "It is the result of a lot of hard work by the rice breeding staff of the AgCenter."

Rice varieties developed by the LSU AgCenter dominate the southern U.S. rice-growing region. Rice breeding by AgCenter scientists is funded in part by the Louisiana Rice Research Board's allocation of checkoff funds.

Dr. Xueyan Sha, an LSU AgCenter rice breeder who developed the variety, said the project required 12 years of work to obtain a long-grain variety with good milling quality, high yield and the correct aroma and taste.

"For several years, individuals taste tested several different experimental lines before we obtained this variety," Sha said. "This variety should be very appealing to Asian restaurants."

Before its approval, the variety was known as LA2125.

"Jazzman will be available as foundation seed in 2009," said Dr. Steve Linscombe, director of the LSU AgCenter's Rice Research Station.

Linscombe said the variety could be a good option for organic growers who need a specialty variety with added value. Linscombe said Jazzman began with germplasm from China, and it is superior to a previous aromatic variety,

Jasmine 85, which lacked the white luster and flavor of Thai jasmine.

Clarence Berken, chairman of the USA Rice Council and a rice farmer from Jefferson Davis Parish, said Jazzman could be a boost for Louisiana rice farmers.

"It's a huge step forward," Berken said. "In the last two years, we have lost market share to imports."

Berken said Jazzman will be identified as domestically grown rice because of the "Grown in the USA" logo being licensed by the USA Rice Federation for packaging and advertising.

Specialty-rice grower Jimmy Hoppe of Fenton has grown Jazzman in test plots. He said it grows well, with high yields and good milling quality, comparable to some of the best long-grain varieties, such as CL161 and Cypress.

Hoppe said a New Orleans company is ready to sell Jazzman as soon as it's available. "They have nothing but good to say about it," he said.

Hoppe said of the 400,000 tons of rice imported into the United States, 350,000 tons were the Thai Jasmine variety.

"With Jazzman, I think there's a great opportunity to hold off the continued increase in Thai imports," Hoppe said.

Louisiana Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the introduction of the new variety will help state farmers be more competitive.

"It's the type of innovation Louisiana farmers need to help them compete on the world market," Strain said. "I am hopeful Jazzman will help the profit margin."

### Strain recommends crop replanting loan program

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., told the Louisiana Recovery Authority Board of Directors in December that he is planning to use community development block grants (CDBGs) to fund low-interest loans to help farmers affected by the 2008 hurricanes replant their crops.

The money will be administered through the Louisiana Agriculture Finance Authority.

"We cannot allow our agriculture industries to plant markedly less acreage or cease to exist because we can't get them some loans or assistance in a timely fashion," Strain said. "Farmers were at harvest time and hit with a perfect three-storm system over a month's time with continual rain. Tropical Storm Faye and hurricanes Gustav and Ike hit us

with a billion dollar loss at the farm level."

Strain said he expected \$30 million to be available for the program in March 2009 if the plan is approved by the State Legislature and the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The money will come from CDBG funding the U.S. Congress approved for Louisiana and other states hit with natural disasters in 2008, Strain said.

HUD recently approved more than \$2 billion in CDBGs to all states affected by the 2008 droughts, wildfires, tropical storms and hurricanes in October. Louisiana is expected to receive \$438.2 million of the \$2 billion.

More than 65 percent of the cotton crop, 12 to 15 percent of sugarcane crop and 75 percent of the sweet

potato crop was lost due to the storms, Strain said.

"Farmers put every nickel they had or could borrow into their crops only to lose half their investment," Strain said.

The majority of grain crops were pre-contracted to grain elevators but farmers will have trouble meeting obligations to their buyers, Strain explained.

"If you make a contract and can't deliver, you have to pay the difference," Strain said. "Farmers could be looking at owing \$5 to \$8 a bushel to the grain elevators for grain they cannot deliver."


Strain said farmers would not be able to take advantage of any aid programs provided by the Farm Bill until October of 2009 because the disaster claim rules have yet to be written for the program.

"If we don't get some funds available to the farmer, our entire agricultural infrastructure is at risk," Strain said. "We're trying to get money in the farmers' hands immediately."

"We're asking to use CDBG money to set up a loan program that can be borrowed by the farmer and agribusiness professional at a very low interest rate so we may get some capital into the system to try to keep our infrastructure in place."

Strain said his plan, which is endorsed by the LRA, would only be used for 2009 crop replanting and would not interfere with Farm Bill provisions that prohibit duplicate aid programs.

Strain credited Governor Bobby Jindal, LRA Director Paul Rainwater and LRA Infrastructure Policy Director Kris Van Orsdel for supporting the plan.

"This is the first time the LRA has assigned a contact person to help us with our plan to get money to the farmers," Strain said. "Kris Van Orsdel has been our go-to guy."

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# Snow damages nursery industry

Although the exact costs aren't in yet, the unexpected snowfall on December 11 caused more damage to Louisiana's commercial ornamental horticulture industry than hurricanes Gustav and Ike, which struck earlier this year.

"Wholesale growers in the Forest Hill area and the Florida parishes saw the most damage, and these areas represent the two major nursery production areas in the state," said Allen Owings, LSU AgCenter horticulture specialist at the Hammond Research Station.

The Florida parishes include Tangipahoa, Washington and St. Tammany. Forest Hill, which is in the southern part of Rapides Parish, has 250 wholesale growers, while the Florida parish area has a smaller number of producers but several of the larger producers in the state, Owings said.

Areas around the state where the most nursery structural damage occurred saw snowfall accumulations ranging from 2-8 inches. This resulted in large deposits of snow on greenhouse and shade structure roofs.

The 2-3 inches of snowfall in the Forest Hill area resulted in the partial or total collapse of at least 300 greenhouses and related structures, Owings said.

Growers in the Florida parishes saw snow accumulation of 8 inches. This resulted in similar damage to greenhouses and damaged plants growing in

the greenhouses.

"Some plant material can be salvaged but will have lost quality while other plant material was damaged to the point that it will have to be discarded. Some trees and shrubs in field and container production settings lost limbs from the weight of snow accumulation," Owings said.

Wholesale growers use varying types of greenhouses and similar structures for growing plants, over-wintering plants and providing shade to shrubs that would generally not be produced as well as if they were growing in full sun. Most of these type of houses at nurseries are covered with plastic or a woven fabric material.

In scattered damaged elsewhere, retailers in several areas saw damage similar to what the wholesale growers saw to greenhouse structures at their garden centers.

Wholesale ornamental plant sales annually in Louisiana are estimated at about \$150-170 million with another \$100-150 million in plant inventory. Louisiana's total commercial ornamental horticulture industry, which includes wholesale nursery growers, landscape contracting and maintenance along with retail garden centers, contributes more than \$2.2 billion annually to Louisiana's economy and employs 57,000 individuals. -LSU AgCenter Report-
