LDAF launches agriculture recovery program

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., and Louisiana Recovery Authority Executive Director Paul Rainwater unveiled the details of the \$44.5 million Louisiana Farm and Agribusiness Recovery Grant and Loan Program at the annual Farm Bureau convention in New Orleans in late June.

Strain said the funds are earmarked for eligible Louisiana farmers, ranchers and agribusinesses that suffered damages from hurricanes Gustav and Ike.

"Louisiana agriculture producers suffered tremendous losses following hurricanes Gustav and Ike and these programs will provide a much needed boost," Strain said. "No parish or commodity was spared by these storms."

The application period for the program is July 13 through August 21. Completed applications must be postmarked or hand delivered and date stamped to an LDAF district office no later than 5 p.m., August 21.

Strain said the LDAF partnered with the LRA to develop the programs.

"The LDAF has been working for months with expert assistance from the LRA to develop these programs. Our goal is to get aid into the hands of Louisiana's producers and agribusinesses as fast as

possible."

Strain said the grant and loan plan is essentially two programs.

The Farm Recovery Program is designed to help farmers and ranchers affected by the 2008 hurricanes with their 2009 production costs through a 20 percent grant and 80 percent low-interest loan process.

The Agribusiness Recovery Program provides low-interest loans for agribusinesses like aerial applicators, cotton gins and elevators.

"All together there is \$34.5 million available to producers and \$10 million available to agribusinesses," Strain said.

The funds will be administered through the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's Louisiana Agricultural Finance Authority office (LAFA).

"Many farmers put every nickel they had or could borrow into their crops only to lose up to three-fourths of their investment," Strain said. "We cannot allow our farmers to be faced with the choice of being forced to plant a significantly smaller crop or going out of business."


More than 76 percent of the cotton, 73 percent of the sweet potato crop and 10 percent of sugarcane




A grain storage facility located in Batchelor, Point Coupee Parish, was destroyed by Hurricane Gustav's high winds.

Bastrop woman arrested for timber theft

Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry enforcement officers arrested a Morehouse Parish woman for allegedly stealing more than \$30,000 worth of timber.

Linda Hampton, 57, 12963 Crossett Hwy., Bastrop, was

arrested at the Morehouse Parish Sheriff's Office on June 3.

"The Department of Agriculture and Forestry takes timber theft seriously and works diligently to see to it that justice is served," Strain said.

Strain said the arrest was the result of a complaint filed by Hampton's brother, Roy Lawson

of Bremerton, Washington.

LDAF Forestry Enforcement Officer Jason Watts said Hampton allegedly sold the timber on 43 acres of land of which she and her brother were co-owners without her brother's permission and kept the money from the sale.

"We recovered records showing that Ms. Hampton received just

over \$30,000 and never forwarded any of the proceeds to her brother," Watts said.

Hampton's arraignment is scheduled for July 7.

were lost due to the storms, Strain said. Other commodities suffered significant losses as well.

The two programs are funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) through community development block grants (CDBG), Strain said.

"After suffering tremendous losses following hurricanes Gustav and Ike, pushing down recovery funds directly to the agricultural community is extremely important," said Paul Rainwater, executive director of the Louisiana Recovery Authority. "We are thankful that HUD understands the challenges farmers faced after being hit by four storms since 2005. This is the first time Community Development Block Grant funds will be spent on agricultural programs, and we look forward to working with the state Department of Agriculture and Forestry in delivering millions of dollars to farmers to aid their recovery."

Louisiana Farm Bureau President Ronnie Anderson said his organization welcomed the announcement of the loan program. Anderson, along with Strain, LSU AgCenter Chancellor William Richardson and Lt. Gov. Mitch Landrieu, traveled to Washington in the

weeks after Hurricane Gustav to seek federal assistance for farmers hard hit by the storm.

"Many Louisiana producers thought they were going to get nothing," Anderson said. "The hurricane last year brought a lot of financial hardships to many of our farmers and ranchers. We hope this program will help them as we approach harvest this year."

The funds are divided between eight disaster relief regions based on the agricultural losses from the 2008 hurricanes.

Application packets may be picked up at LDAF regional and Louisiana Farm Bureau parish offices as well as LSU AgCenter county agent offices. The applications are also available online at www.ldaf.la.gov.

and water. You'll also want to have them tagged with identifying information – such as collars, brands, tags or microchips – that can help you reunite if separated from your animals.

Barns, fences and even homes can be damaged in disasters, so pets or livestock may escape from the place where you left them, and the possibility that your pet will escape when you travel is always there.

Plan on obtaining suitable pet carriers, leashes, halters, ropes and livestock trailers. A variety of other supplies also are

necessities if you plan to evacuate pets or livestock.

Although it may be impossible to evacuate all animals if you must leave, Littlefield says you should provide the animals with as much protection as possible if they are left behind. In those cases, pets and livestock require somewhat different treatment.

Most cattlemen and other livestock owners let their livestock loose in the fields and free to move to the safest ground possible rather than leaving them in a barn, but that won't work for pets, Littlefield said.

"Don't turn your pets loose and expect them to survive," Littlefield said. "Not only will they be exposed to the elements, they could become victims of exposure, starvation, predators, contaminated food or water or accidents."

"And don't leave dogs tied or chained outside in a disaster since that usually results in death."

Strain said 1,604 pets whose owners had critical transportation needs were evacuated from the coastal parishes during the Gustav event. Most were from Orleans and Jefferson parishes, but they also came from Terrebonne, Lafourche, St. Bernard, Calcasieu and St. Mary.

The breakdown was 200 cats, 1,400 dogs, a rabbit, bird, guinea pig and a hermit crab.

The State Fair of Louisiana facilities housed 1,539 pets while a location set up at LSU at Alexandria had 65.

Forty percent of the animals traveled with their owners on buses.

The larger animals were put in crates assembled by the inmates of Dixon Correctional Institute in Jackson and trainees of Forcht Wade Correctional Center in Keithville. The animals not traveling with their owners were transported to Shreveport and Alexandria pet shelters in climate-controlled tractor-trailer rigs. The pet transport was followed by a vet-med team of volunteers and LDAF and LSU AgCenter employees in a trailing van.

The pet truck stopped every two hours to allow for a quick health check of the ani-

mals by the vet-med team.

When the animals arrived in Shreveport they found a well-prepared shelter with proper security. Pet owners were expected to care for their pets as much as possible, Littlefield said.

"These were not drop-off centers," Littlefield said. "Yes, there were volunteers but pet owners watered, fed and walked their pets."

After the storm, most animals and their owners returned home quickly.

For the 2009 hurricane season, which runs from June 1 through November 30, the LDAF will again partner with Louisiana State Animal Response Team (LSART) and other volunteer groups.

The LDAF will be responsible for setting up pet shelters in the northern portions of the state to help evacuees with critical transportation needs and their pets.

National groups like American Humane Association, American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, Emergency Animal Rescue Service-United Animal Nations, Noah's Wish, Animal Rescue Service-United Animal Nations, International Fund for Animal Welfare, Humane Society of the United States, and numerous local humane organizations will also provide vital support throughout the 2009 hurricane event.

Keep your pet s vaccinations current

Pets are like American Express cards: Don't leave home without them. If you are planning on evacuating, you should:

Vaccinate your pet. If you haven't already done so, get those shots now. Infectious diseases can become a big threat after a disaster.

Get your pet an ID tag. If a pet becomes lost or escapes during the confusion of an evacuation, proper identification will increase the chances of a safe return home. Tag should include your cell number and, if space allows, the number of an out-of-town contact. Consider having your pet tattooed or 'microchipped.'

Get a pet carrier. You will need a pet carrier or cage for each dog, cat, bird or small animal. Make sure it is large enough for each pet to stand up and turn around comfortably.

Take clear, color photos (frontal, left and right sides) of your pet, and store these with

your pet's license, medical records and ownership papers in a waterproof carrier to take with you. Include pictures of the pet with you to help with any challenge to your ownership. Take photos with your cell phone so they're stored there as well.

Create a pet disaster kit that includes:

- Medications and medical records (in a waterproof container)
- A leash
- A collar or harness for each pet
- Non-spill food and water dishes
- 14-day supply of food, water in nonbreakable containers
- A manual can opener
- Grooming supplies
- Your pet's blanket and a favorite toy
- Cleanser and disinfectant to handle wastes
- Newspapers or litter, paper towels and plastic bags

Best Blueberry Muffins

1 cup fresh or frozen blueberries	1 tsp. nutmeg
1-3/4 cups plus 1 tbsp. flour, divided	3/4 tsp. salt
1/2 cup sugar	1 egg
1 tsp. baking powder	1 cup sour cream
1/2 tsp. baking soda	1/3 cup milk

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Grease twelve 2-1/2-inch muffin cups. Toss blueberries with 1 tablespoon of the flour. Combine the remaining 1-3/4 cup flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, nutmeg and salt; set aside. Beat egg, sour cream and milk; stir into flour mixture until just combined (batter will be lumpy). Stir in blueberries until evenly distributed. Fill muffin cups 2/3 full with batter. Bake about 20 minutes until golden.

When using frozen blueberries, stir unthawed blueberries lightly dusted with flour into batters.

Blueberry French Toast Sandwich

1 package (3 oz.) cream cheese, softened	1 package (about 12 oz.) frozen French Toast (6 slices)
1-1/2 tbsps. confectioners' sugar	3/4 cup fresh blueberries

In bowl, stir together cream cheese and confectioners' sugar. Heat French toast as package directs. Spread cream cheese mixture on French toast slices. Spoon blueberries over cream cheese on 3 slices; cover with remaining slices. To serve: Place sandwiches on plates; cut diagonally. Garnish with additional blueberries and confectioners' sugar.

Blueberry-Watermelon Frosty

1 container (6 oz.) frozen lemonade or limeade concentrate, unthawed	2 cups watermelon cubes, seeds removed
2 cups fresh blueberries	1 cup ice cubes

In a blender container, combine lemonade concentrate, blueberries and watermelon. Purée until very smooth. Add ice cubes; blend until mixture is slushy. Add sugar, if needed.

Blueberry Buckle

3/4 cup sugar	1/2 tsp. ground nutmeg
1/4 cup shortening	1/4 tsp. ground cloves
2 eggs	1-1/2 cups blueberries
1/2 cup milk	1/2 cup sugar
1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour	1/3 cup flour
2 tps. baking powder	1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon
1/2 tsp. salt	1/4 cup soft butter or margarine

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Mix 3/4 cup sugar, shortening, eggs and milk until well blended. Stir in 1-1/2 cups flour, baking powder, salt, nutmeg and cloves. Gently fold in blueberries. Spread batter into a greased 9-inch square pan. Combine remaining ingredients and mix until crumbly. Sprinkle crumbs over batter. Bake for 45 to 50 minutes or until top springs back when lightly touched. Serve warm, cut into squares.

Pink Blueberry Lemonade

1/3 cup sugar
1-1/4 cups fresh blueberries, divided
1/3 cup lemon juice

In 1 quart glass measuring cup, combine sugar, 2 tablespoons of the blueberries and 1/2 cup water. Microwave on high until hot, about 1 minute; stir until sugar dissolves. Add lemon juice and enough water to make 1 quart; chill. Fill tall glasses with ice cubes, add chilled blueberry mixture and remaining berries, dividing equally. Garnish with lemon slices if desired.

To make Blueberry ice cubes: Place 3 berries in each of 12 ice cube cups. Fill with water and freeze. 36 berries equals about 1/4 cup.

Fresh Blueberry and Lemon Parfait

1 package (3.4 oz.) instant lemon pudding	12 gingersnap cookies, coarsely crushed (about 1 cup)
1-1/2 cups milk	1 pint fresh blueberries (2 to 2-1/2 cups)
1 cup heavy (whipping) cream	

Prepare instant lemon pudding according to package directions, using the milk. In a medium-sized bowl, with an electric mixer at medium-high speed, beat cream until soft peaks form. Fold whipped cream into prepared lemon pudding. In 4 or 6 individual serving glasses or a 1-quart bowl, spoon a layer of the pudding mixture; sprinkle lightly with cookies and a layer of blueberries. Repeat layers one more time, ending with the pudding. Refrigerate, covered, for about 30 minutes. Garnish with mint sprigs and blueberries, if desired.

Have an emergency plan before disasters strike

The 2008 storm season was not kind to Louisiana. Hurricane Gustav slammed into the shoreline on September 1 and Ike followed two weeks later.

And while destruction to state agriculture and its infrastructure was severe (more than \$700 million in damages), major disaster was averted by the high evacuation compliance rates in coastal areas.

Part of the reason many evacuees were willing to leave their homes and get out of harm's way was because plans to accommodate the pets of Louisiana had been highly publicized in the wake of Hurricane Katrina.

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain said new pet evacuation plans for pets owners with critical transportation needs were implemented in 2006 and pet-friendly self-evacuating shelters were better publicized.

"We wanted to make sure that no one would have any reason not to evacuate," Strain said. "That meant we had to set up a plan to move pets. Some people didn't

leave New Orleans during Katrina because there were no shelters that would take their pets.

"We believe that lives were saved because we set up this pet evacuation program."

Even though the state will assist pet owners with critical transportation needs evacuate from threatened areas, the best plan for pet evacuations are the ones pet owners make for themselves, said Martha Littlefield, D.V.M., and LDAF Assistant State Veterinarian.

"Your plans for a storm or other disasters should include what you'll do about any pets and livestock you own, as well as all the other measures you take to protect your family and property," Littlefield said. "Pets or livestock owners definitely need to create their own family disaster plans and the sooner the better.

"Right now is the time to revise and fine tune your evacuation plans, but the most important thing to do is not wait until a storm, flood or other disaster threatens

before you plan what you will do with your pets and livestock."

The basic options to consider are whether you'll try to take pets with you or evacuate some or all of your livestock – or whether you'll leave them at home and try to provide as much protection as possible.

"You have more options with smaller pets," Littlefield said. "You generally can bring them into a safe area of the house and keep them with you during a storm if you're staying at home."

Littlefield suggested that pet owners identify motels and hotels that allow pets or contact friends and family along hurricane evacuation routes that will help you care for your animals.

The LDAF has also developed plans for pet shelters located near the shelters for those with critical transportation needs.

Shelters for residents with critical transportation needs and their pets will be opened as disaster needs are assessed, Littlefield said.

"People evacuating with their own trans-

portation can contact the Louisiana State Animal Response Team (www.lsart.org) to find out about other shelters for dogs and cats," Littlefield said.

There are no state-run shelters for livestock, including horses, and livestock owners should develop their own plans for evacuation or sheltering in place.

"For many people, your pet is your best friend and you should plan accordingly," Littlefield said. "For others, livestock may be valuable assets to the family's livelihood and knowing what you'll do with cattle and horses before a storm is the best thing to do."

"Pets are valuable members of the family to many people, and livestock can be valuable assets to the family's livelihood," Littlefield said. "Knowing what you'll do with them when it's time to evacuate helps you to set the plans in motion at the right time."

Whether staying at home or evacuating, your pets or your livestock will need food ***See Plan, continued on page 5***
