Strain pleased USDA helping dairy farmers

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said he is very pleased the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) is taking immediate action to support struggling dairy farmers.

"I met personally with Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack on July 20 at a town hall-style meeting in Reserve and discussed the plight of Louisiana's dairy farmers with him," Strain said. "I am gratified that the USDA has heard the voice of American dairymen and increasing the amount paid for dairy products through the Dairy Product Price Support Program (DPPSP).

"Part of our conversation included a discussion of the establishment of regular dairy compacts across the U.S. and the need for the cost of production to be adequately calculated when setting the base milk price via the federal milk marketing

orders."

The USDA estimates show that the increases, which will be in place from August 2009 through October 2009, will increase dairy farmers' revenue by \$243 million, Strain said.


Louisiana dairy farmers said the support will help their bottom line.

"Anything, really, will be an upswing for the Louisiana dairy farmer," said St. Helena Parish dairyman Eugene Robertson.


Robertson is the chairman of the Farm Bureau Federation Dairy Advisory Committee. Robertson was also present at the

July 20 town hall meeting with Vilsack and posed several tough questions to the Secretary.

Strain warns against scam artists

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the recent announcement of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry-administered \$44.5 million Farm and Agribusiness Recovery Program has brought out a number of con artists making claims that they can help farmers and other consumers get government grants and funds.

"Any organization that sends unsolicited notes claiming they can get you government grant money if a fee is paid is most likely operating a scam," Strain said. "We know that many farming families are feeling the economic crunch right now and

they may be wooed by claims of free money, but I urge them to thoroughly investigate any organization that makes such offers."

Strain said many scam artists use official looking seals and stationery on their mailings which make them appear to have been sent from government offices.

The mailings may ask the consumer to call an 800 number if interested. Once called, the answering operator asks for a debit card number to charge your account in exchange for government publications that can otherwise be obtained for free.

"Do not ever give your credit card or debit card numbers to a phone or mail

solicitor," Strain said.

Strain said the LDAF is administering a \$44.5 million Farm and Agribusiness Recovery grant and loan program to help farmers, ranchers and other agribusiness professionals recover from damage caused by the storms of 2008.

"The LDAF is in the process of sending out information packets free of charge on how to apply for this program," Strain said.

The deadline to apply for the programs is August 21, 2009.

Strain said that anyone who wants to report a scam or thinks they may be a victim of a scam should contact the state Consumer Protection Section at 225-326-

6465 or 800-351-4889 and their local Better Business Bureau. Strain also offered these tips to better protect yourself from consumer fraud:

Be wary of anything that sounds "too good to be true."

- Avoid high pressure sales tactics.
- Ask questions.
- Investigate offers made to you as a contest "winner."

- Check out price claims yourself.
- Ignore "once in a lifetime" offers.

get the administration to recognize the issues in dairy farming," Robertson said. "It's only for three months but we expect to see an increase of \$0.75 to \$1 per hundred weight."

The increase will raise the price paid for nonfat dry milk from \$0.80 per pound to \$0.92 per pound, the price paid for cheddar blocks from \$1.13 per pound to \$1.31 per pound, and the price of cheddar barrels from \$1.10 per pound to \$1.28 per pound. This increase in the support price will have an immediate effect upon dairy farmers' bottom line. Temporarily raising the price of these dairy products increases the price that dairy farmers receive for their milk.

USDA estimates that the policy change is expected to increase all milk prices received by dairy producers. The increase will result in the government purchase of an additional 150 million pounds of non-fat dry milk (NDM) and an additional 75 million pounds of cheese.

Robertson said problems of oversupply remain a serious issue in the dairy market and it's difficult for Louisiana producers to compete, at least during the hot summer months.

"We can compete when our cows do well from November to April but not as well in the

hot summer months," Robertson said. "We feel a lot of pressure from larger dairy states in the summer and oversupply becomes an issue."

"The LDAF has been pursuing all options to help dairy producers," said Strain. "This price increase will bring some much needed relief to dairy farmers in Louisiana and will help keep them in the dairy business."

Robertson said the Louisiana dairy industry has been in a slow decline for more than four decades.

"When I was a young man there were more than 100 dairies just in St. Helena Parish," Robertson said. "Today, there are only 180 in the entire state."

Strain said the USDA is currently reviewing federal dairy policy to determine what changes are needed to reduce price volatility and enhance farmer profitability.

Strain urged state consumers to support Louisiana dairymen and buy milk and other dairy products that are produced from local sources.

"There are a number of Louisiana dairies that are marketing their own milk and dairy products in the grocery stores," Strain said. "Dairy products are natural and very healthy."

Food safety tips for hurricane preparedness

It's not uncommon for hurricanes to enter the Gulf of Mexico in the summer months and threaten Louisiana's coastline. Most coastal residents know the drill: evacuate and head for higher ground.

A severe storm, like a hurricane or tornado, generally knocks out power and sometimes it takes weeks to restore electricity and other basic utility services to stricken areas in the aftermath.

"Food safety issues become paramount in disaster areas," said Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain. "In the hours after a tropical storm or hurricane, food safety can become a critical public health issue."

Strain said it's extremely important for residents in ground zero areas to plan for access to safe food and water in the aftermath of a hurricane, tornado or other natural disaster to minimize potential for foodborne illnesses due to power outages and other problems often associated with severe weather.

Strain suggested several steps residents should follow to prepare for possible weather emergencies:

- Keep an appliance thermometer in the refrigerator and freezer. An appliance thermometer will indicate the temperature inside the refrigerator and freezer in case of a power outage and help determine the safety of the food.

- Make sure the freezer is at 0°F or below and the refrigerator is at 40°F or below.

- Freeze containers of water for ice to help keep food cold in the freezer, refrigerator or coolers after the power is out.

- Freeze refrigerated items such as leftovers, milk and fresh meat and poultry that you may not need immediately - this helps keep them at a safe temperature longer.

- Plan ahead and know where dry ice and block ice can be purchased.

- Have coolers on hand to keep refrigerator food cold if the power will be out for more than 4 hours. Purchase or make ice cubes and store in the freezer for use in the refrigerator or in a cooler. Freeze gel packs ahead of time for use in coolers.

- Group food together in the freezer - this helps the food stay cold longer.

Store food on shelves that will be safely out of the way of contaminated water in case of flooding.

Strain also offered these steps to follow after a weather emergency:

- Keep the refrigerator and freezer doors closed as much as possible to maintain the cold temperature.

- The refrigerator will keep food safely cold for about 4 hours if it is unopened. A full freezer will hold the temperature for approximately 48 hours (24 hours if it is half full) and the door remains closed.

- Discard refrigerated perishable food such as meat, poultry, fish, soft cheeses, milk, eggs, leftovers and deli items after four hours without power.

- Food may be safely refrozen if it still contains ice crystals or is at 40°F or below

when checked with a food thermometer.

- Never taste a food to determine its safety.

- Obtain dry or block ice to keep your refrigerator and freezer as cold as possible if the power is going to be out for a prolonged period of time. Fifty pounds of dry ice should hold an 18-cubic-foot full freezer for two days.

- If the power has been out for several days, check the temperature of the freezer with an appliance thermometer. If the appliance thermometer reads 40°F or below, the food is safe to refreeze.

- If a thermometer has not been kept in the freezer, check each package of food to determine its safety. If the food still contains ice crystals, the food is safe.

- Discard any food that is not in a waterproof container if there is any chance that it has come into contact with flood water. Also, discard wooden cutting boards, plastic utensils, baby bottle nipples and pacifiers.

- Thoroughly wash all metal pans, ceramic dishes and utensils that came in contact with flood water with hot soapy water and sanitize by boiling them in clean water or by immersing them for 15 minutes in a solution of one tablespoon of unscented, liquid chlorine bleach per gallon of drinking water.

- Undamaged, commercially prepared foods in all-metal cans and retort pouches (for example, flexible, shelf-stable juice or seafood pouches) can be saved. Follow the Steps to Salvage All-Metal Cans and Retort Pouches in the United States Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service publication "Keeping Food Safe During an Emergency" at:

- Use bottled water that has not been exposed to flood waters. If bottled water is not available, tap water can be boiled for safety. For more information on drinking water safely during weather emergencies, access the FSIS publication "Keeping Food Safe During an Emergency" at www.fsis.usda.gov/Fact_Sheets/

Strain said if residents have any questions whether or not an item in your refrigerator is safe to eat after the power has been out for an extended period of time that it's best to get rid of the food.

"When in doubt, throw it out," Strain said.

Ag Recovery Grant and Loan Program application deadline looming

Louisiana Farm and Agribusiness Recovery Grant and Loan Program funds are available to eligible Louisiana farmers and agribusinesses who suffered damages from hurricanes Gustav and Ike.

The application period for the program is July 13 through August 21. Completed applications must be postmarked or hand delivered and date stamped to an LDAF district office no later than 5 p.m., August 21.

The Farm Recovery Program is designed to help farmers and ranchers affected by the 2008 hurricanes with their 2009 production costs through a 20 percent grant and 80 percent low-interest loan process.

The Agribusiness Recovery Program provides low-interest loans for agribusinesses like aerial applicators, cotton gins and elevators.

The funds will be administered through the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's Louisiana Agricultural Finance

Authority office (LAFA). More than 76 percent of the cotton, 73 percent of the sweet potato crop and 10 percent of sugarcane were lost due to the storms, Strain said. Other commodities suffered significant losses as well.

The two programs are funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) through community development block grants (CDBG).

The funds are divided between eight disaster relief regions based on the agricultural losses from the 2008 hurricanes.

- Region 1** - \$430,605 - Jefferson, Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, St. Tammany.

- Region 2** - \$5,876,363 - Ascension, East Baton Rouge, East Feliciana, Iberville, Livingston, Pointe Coupee, Tangipahoa, St. Helena, Washington, West Baton Rouge, West Feliciana.

- Region 3** - \$3,155,632 - Assumption, Lafourche, St. Charles, St. James, St.

John the Baptist, Terrebonne.

- Region 4** - \$5,954,236 - Acadia, Evangeline, Iberia, Lafayette, St. Landry, St. Martin, St. Mary, Vermilion.

- Region 5** - \$3,385,705 - Allen, Beauregard, Calcasieu, Cameron, Jefferson Davis.

- Region 6** - \$10,901,410 - Avoyelles, Catahoula, Concordia, Grant, LaSalle, Rapides, Vernon, Winn.

- Region 7** - \$227,423 - Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Claiborne, Desoto, Lincoln, Natchitoches, Red River, Sabine, Webster.

- Region 8** - \$14,568,622 - Caldwell, East Carroll, Franklin, Jackson, Madison, Morehouse, Ouachita, Richland, Tensas, Union, West Carroll.

black pepper	1/3 cup orange marmalade

Combine Wowee Sauce ingredients in small bowl. Set aside. Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. 1 jar (12 ounces) mushroom or beef gravy	mashed potatoes, warmed
1-1/2 cups frozen peas	2 tablespoons shredded
	Parmesan cheese (optional)

Preheat oven to 450°F. Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add ground beef and onion; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking into 3/4-inch crumbles and stirring occasionally. Remove from skillet with slotted spoon; pour off drippings. Return beef to skillet; stir in gravy and peas and season with pepper. Spoon beef mixture into 2-quart baking dish. 9 corn tortillas	1-1/2 cups shredded Mexican cheese blend
2 cans (10 oz. each) mild enchilada sauce	Crunchy tortilla strips (optional) (recipe follows)
1 can (15 oz.) black beans, rinsed, drained	1/2 cup chopped tomato
1-1/2 cups frozen corn	2 tbsps. chopped fresh cilantro

Heat oven to 350°F. Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add ground beef; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking into crumbles and stirring occasionally. Remove from skillet with slotted spoon; pour off drippings. Return beef to skillet; stir in 1 can enchilada sauce, black beans, corn and cumin; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Spray 11-3/4 x 7-1/2 inch baking dish with nonstick cooking spray. Arrange 3 tortillas in dish, cutting 1 as needed to cover bottom. Spread 1/4 cup remaining enchilada sauce over tortillas; cover with 1/3 beef mixture, then 1/3 cheese. Repeat layers twice, omitting final cheese layer. Pour remaining enchilada sauce over top. Cover with aluminum foil. Bake in 350°F oven 30 minutes. Remove foil; sprinkle with remaining 1/2 cup cheese. Bake, uncovered, 5 minutes or until cheese is melted. Top with tortilla strips, if desired, tomato and cilantro.

Classic Beef Pot Roast

1 boneless beef chuck shoulder, arm or blade pot roast (2-1/2 to 3 lbs.)	1 large onion, cut into 8 wedges
1 tbsp. vegetable oil	1/2 cup frozen peas
1/2 tsp. salt	2 tbsps. all-purpose flour dissolved in 1/4 cup cold water
1/2 tsp. pepper	Chopped fresh parsley (optional)
1 can (14 to 14-1/2 oz.) ready-to-serve beef broth	Seasoning:
1 lb. small red-skinned potatoes, cut in half	2 cloves garlic, minced
1 lb. carrots, peeled, cut diagonally into 1-1/2-inch pieces	2 teaspoons dried thyme leaves, crushed

Instructions Combine seasoning ingredients; press evenly onto all surfaces of beef pot roast. Heat oil in stockpot over medium heat until hot. Place pot roast in stockpot; brown evenly. Pour off drippings. Season with salt and pepper. Add broth to stockpot; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover tightly and simmer 2-1/4 hours. Add potatoes, carrots and onion to stockpot; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; continue simmering, covered, 25 to 30 minutes or until pot roast and vegetables are fork-tender. Stir in peas; simmer 5 minutes. Remove pot roast and vegetables; keep warm. Skim fat from cooking liquid, if necessary. Measure 1-1/2 cups cooking liquid and return to stockpot; stir in flour mixture. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly; cook and stir 2 to 3 minutes or until thickened. Carve pot roast into thin slices; serve with vegetables and gravy. Garnish with parsley, if desired.

Going against the grain

The colonial era Dauterive Compact established Louisiana as the birthplace of the American cattle business. The early Acadian settlers wanted to trade with the Spanish living west of the Sabine River in Texas and a brisk border commerce was established.

Fast forward to modern times. Most of the cattle industry is centered in Oklahoma, Nebraska and Kansas for obvious reasons. The post-war fast food nation put a tremendous pressure on beef producers for supply. The answer? Large feed lots located in geographic areas with moderate and dry climates and large grain supplies where thousands of cattle could be finished out to market weight. The Midwest proved to be the ideal spot for such an operation.

But the rise of the prairie feed lot didn't mean the end of the cattle industry in Louisiana, after all, Louisiana is a rural state. Thousands of rural families continued to raise cattle for their own personal beef and dairy consumption, but as the traditional rural population dwindled and high paying oil field, manufacturing and information technology jobs came on line, more young people left the farms for urban areas.

Parish slaughterhouses that could service the needs of families began to close and custom beef cutting operations became non-existent.

"A lot of Louisiana cattlemen are in the cat-

tle business as it is a tradition in their family," said USDA cattle expert Taylor Cox. "Their fathers and grandfathers raised cattle so they raise cattle."

Cox said cattlemen are getting older and the younger generation is not taking its place. A recent Gallup poll shows that the average age of a Louisiana cattleman is 61 years old, with 42 percent over 65 years old, and just four percent are 40 years old or younger, Cox said.

In addition to the aging cattlemen population, the recent hurricanes in Louisiana presented problems that many producers could not overcome and elected to get out of the business. The natural disasters as well as high input costs and below average cattle prices have made it difficult if not impossible for cattlemen in Louisiana to stay in business.

Cattleman Fred Rodosta of Opelousas and his Rolling R Ranch is sticking around and he's expanding his cattle operation to include a custom meat operation.

Rodosta scoffs at the naysayers who don't believe Louisiana can sustain a cattle market.

"I'm creating a blueprint for others to emulate so they may stay in business," he said.

The recent downturn in the economy also provided a good reason for Rodosta to take the plunge. He would rather risk his money on his cattle business than to leave the cash in the stock market.

"In 2005 I could see what was coming," the 68-year-old Rodosta said. "We had a runaway train that was going to crash so I decided to invest in the four-legged stock market."

His plan revolves around producing quality beef cattle, (Angus, Charolais and Charlangus) and eliminating the intermediaries.

"There's about ten middlemen who all get a piece before the cattle that you grew in Louisiana gets shipped out and comes back to your dinner table," Rodosta said. "About 80 percent of our calves are shipped out."

Rodosta admitted that an earlier attempt to breed his own cattle and sell them to the Louisiana market failed. He said the reason that venture foundered is because he couldn't produce enough quality cattle on his own to ensure a quality product. Today, he believes he has improved his line through breeding and has made arrangements with neighboring cattlemen to supply him with good stock.

He applied and received a trademark on the Charlangus crossbreed.

Rodosta said studies proved that the Charlangus was the most efficient beef cow, especially for the Louisiana climate.

"We are breeding, farming, raising, slaughtering, selling and consuming all of our beef with 150 miles of production," Rodosta said.

A slaughterhouse in nearby Eunice will cut,

pack and freeze his beef and Rodosta will open his Rolling R Ranch Frozen Beef Market two days a week to the general public. He will also target restaurants and other commercial outlets as customers.

Rodosta says his project is sustainable and will turn a profit.

"It's going to be black ink," Rodosta said. "Not a lot of black ink but it will be profitable."

Rodosta has set up a finishing lot on his back pasture complete with covered shed, concrete feeding pads and open air flowing through.

"The canopy reduces the temperature at least ten degrees and the cattle feed easily," he said. "The cattle will be 90 percent grazed and ten percent finished with hay and grain."

Rodosta, a medical doctor, is used to figuring out things for himself. He has tailored his cattle fences, pens and gates into a one man operation.

"There are experts out there who will tell you what you can't do but they don't tell you what you can do and how to do it," Rodosta said. "But people want to know where there food, including beef, comes from. I can provide local beef to them."
