Learn what the LDAF can do for you

Have you ever been concerned about the qualifications of the pest control man treating your home, business or school? How do you know that the ten gallons of gas you just pumped into your car is exactly ten gallons? Does the food you purchase at your local supermarket meet all food safety standards?

If you have ever had a question about food safety, forest fire control, the accuracy of produce scales, gas pumps, gasoline octane levels or the price scanner at your local supermarket, you would be wise to attend the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's Ag Outreach 2010 open house sessions scheduled across the state during the month of March.

The LDAF Monroe District Office will host the first of nine Ag Outreach sessions on March 1 from 6 to 8 p.m. The public is invited.

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the LDAF is responsible for a number of regulatory functions that

protect the public as well in addition to the agricultural and forestry industries of the state.

"The LDAF monitors the accuracy of gas pumps, food scales and the supermarket scanner," Strain said. "We are also responsible for animal health, food safety, the proper handling of pesticides and conservation of our forestry, soil and water resources."

"The March 19 open house in Baton Rouge at our Florida Boulevard headquarters coincides with our annual Ag Day celebration and we'll have plenty of refreshments for that event," Strain said. "But if you don't make that one, we are having eight other open houses in the northern, southern and central parts of the state."

Other locations and dates for the Ag Outreach open houses are March 3, Haughton; March 8, Welsh; March 10, Thibodaux; March 15, Alexandria, March 16, Hammond;

Albino gators

There are fanciful legends about white unicorns. The "Unicorn Song," a 1968 hit by the Irish Rovers singing group, told us the unicorns were "hiding, playing silly games, kicking and splashing while the rain was falling," and missed the last boarding call for Noah's ark.

Then there is the story of Moby Dick, the great white whale, as rare as "unobtainium." Legends of the Himalayan Yeti—the "Abominable Snowman" conjure up images of a giant white furred creature.

The unicorn, the great white whale and the abominable snowman share one thing in common: they are all myths—stories, fables, fantasies.

It's interesting that there are no tall tales of a Louisiana white alligator. If there were it might be called the Swamp Ghost.

Fact: white alligators are real. They do exist, just not in the wild, and for good reason.

The swamp and marsh are hostile environments. A tiny white hatchling born in the natural nest has no natural camouflage. The sun beats down mercilessly

on it, broiling its tender albino skin.

But that's not what dooms a vulnerable colorless hatchling. The swamp, like real life, is a "dog eat dog" world, but worse. It's an alligator eat alligator world. Big alligators like to eat little alligators, and dozens of wild critters think juvenile alligator meat, albino or not, is very tasty.

At one point in time, all Louisiana alligators were going the way of the unicorn, not because they were playing alligator games, but because they were hunted.


Alligator skin was a high-dollar commodity and the skins were used to make high quality leather. By the early 1960s, trying to find an alligator in the wild was like looking for an Indianapolis Colts fan in New Orleans.


Louisiana state officials declared a moratorium on alligator hunts from 1962 to 1971. Closely monitored hunts were allowed in coastal parishes until 1981 when a 30-day statewide hunting season was resumed

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said two south Louisiana men were arrested on felony theft charges for allegedly stealing a two-horse trailer valued at \$800.

Charles Ross Rene, 124 Rene St. of Bunkie, and Jacoby Deshawn Joubert, 337 Carriere St. of Washington, were arrested

on Jan. 19.

Investigating Brand Commission Inspector Johnny Steib arrested the pair in Opelousas with the assistance of the St. Landry Parish Sheriff's Office

The trailer was reported stolen to the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's Brand

Commission office on Nov. 23, 2009. The Hale brand trailer was recovered and returned to the rightful owner on Jan. 20.

The Louisiana Brand Commission is empowered to investigate all crimes relating to agriculture.

"Agricultural equipment is expensive and difficult to

replace," Strain said. "Farmers have a lot invested in their equipment and all crimes committed against farmers and producers will be thoroughly investigated."

Louisiana alligator hunters can now take more than 33,000 wild alligators annually, but it's the farming program that has been a spectacular success.

Hope Savoie of Savoie's Alligator Farm in Cut Off said alligators usually start laying eggs in mid-May. Her brother, Gerald "Jerry" Savoie, is the owner of Savoie's Alligator Farm and has contracts with landowners from St. Bernard to Cameron Parish. He is allowed to harvest alligator eggs laid on these coastal properties.

Using aerial and airboat reconnaissance, spotters employ global positioning devices to mark the locations of gator nests in the wild. Egg collectors gather the eggs and bring them to the Cut Off farm where they are incubated and hatched under optimum conditions.

Farm owners are required to return a certain percentage of yearling alligators to the wild to maintain the natural balance of alligators.

More than 280,000 alligators are currently grown to market size annually at Louisiana alligator farms, and while 2009 was a down year for the alligator trade, raw meat and hide values have been estimated at more than \$10 million for the wild harvest and \$33 million for the farm harvest. And that's before tanning and product manufacturing and values associated with jobs, tourism and eggs are factored in.

What's missing from the alligator value totals is the market for white alligators.

When 18 white male gator hatchlings were found in a wild nest in the Terrebonne Parish marsh in 1987 and brought to New Orleans' Audubon Institute at Audubon Zoo in 1987, only then did the world know the legend of the Swamp Ghost white alligator could begin.

The white alligators quickly became the zoo's star attraction. Later, two of the white gators became superstars at the Aquarium of the Americas when it opened in 1990.

Zoo managers across the country took note. They became envious and coveted the crowds the white alligators attracted.

Savoie said a small white alligator trade has developed since 1990 and right now two albino alligators raised at Savoie's Alligator Farm are currently residing at La Ferme aux Crocodiles, an aquarium in Paris, France.

Savoie's Alligator Farm, featured recently on the TV show "Dirty Jobs" and "Food Tech," hatched nine albino alligators in 2008, Savoie said.

"We have sent them to Cleveland, Topeka and Pittsburgh," she said. "This is the first time we have shipped to Paris."

Savoie said her alligators are true albinos with pink eyes and not leucistic like the ones at the Audubon Institute that have blue eye color.

According to Urban Albino Web site, leucism is the absence of pigmentation throughout the reptile's body with the exception of the animal's iris, which usually is blue or black.

Sarah Burnette, public relations director for the Audubon Institute, said it is not known for sure how rare leucistic alligators are.

"As far as we know, the Audubon Institute has the only leucistic alligators in the world," Burnette said.

The Audubon Institute raised the first 18 leucistic gators brought to them in 1987 and have recently acquired two more that are about one year old.

Savoie said Savoie's Alligator Farm collected 81,000 eggs and hatched 70,563 in 2008. Of those that hatched, only nine were albinos.

"We monitor the eggs as they incubate," Savoie said. "When alligators hatch they are dark, but when you get a batch of white ones they look like something from another planet."

The albinos grow like any other alligator to about four feet in a year's time. In order

to expedite the shipping of the albino alligators to France, Savoie brought five of her albino reptiles to Baton Rouge on Jan. 29 for an examination by LSU School of Veterinary Medicine Veterinarian Javier Navarez. She brought the five to ensure that at least two of them would meet the health requirements.

Once the health certificates were issued, Savoie ferried the gators to Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry headquarters to have the certificates endorsed by Richard Cambre, the area veterinarian in charge of the United States Department of Agriculture's Animal Plant and Health Inspection Service.

Cambre, the former head veterinarian of the Smithsonian National Zoo in Washington, D.C., okayed the shipment of the animals.

"It's amazing that there is a trade in white alligators at all," Cambre said. "But zoos like to have them in their collections."

The next day, Savoie had the two chosen gators packed up in specially-constructed wooden boxes for the trip overseas. The animals were accompanied by Veterinarian Samuel Martin of La Ferme aux Crocodiles.

The Cajun alligators are doing well at their new French home, Savoie said.

It can be assumed that without the Louisiana alligator management program the Swamp Ghost would have entered the realm of legend—a scary story we tell children. But white alligators exist and are here to stay.

Whether they are leucistic or albino, white alligators are a rare treat to observe.

"We believe they are a gift to us from the universe," Burnette said.

4th annual Louisiana Equine Council 2010 Horse Expo

The 2010 Horse Expo is being held March 12-14 at the Ike Hamilton Expo Center in Monroe, Louisiana. The Expo is focused on providing education and entertainment for all horse enthusiasts whether they are young, old, beginners, professionals or otherwise.

The Louisiana Equine Council (LEC) works as a unified voice for the horse industry, representing all breeds and disciplines. From beginners to advanced experts, the LEC is working to grow and develop the Louisiana equine industry.

According to Howard Cormier, LSU AgCenter Regional Equine Agent who also serves as Secretary of the La. Equine Council, the 2010 Horse Expo is a perfect way to educate new and advanced horse owners and entertain horse lovers of all ages and skill levels. The LSU AgCenter and The American Horse Council estimate the horse industry has an impact on the state's economy of nearly \$2.5 billion per year through direct and indirect expenditures. The Expo is a great way to showcase the horse industry. There will be clinicians, speakers, experts, youth riders, educational areas for both adults and children, and many demonstrations and lectures. There will also be vendors present.

A new event this year that is drawing much attention and creating enthusiasm is the La. Colt Starting Challenge. Three horse trainers will work with three unbroken colts over a five hour period to gentle them to the point where they can be ridden over a basic obstacle course and judged on how well they handle the tasks. This event is sweeping the country, but this is the first time that it is held in Louisiana. The trainers will compete for a saddle, bridle, spurs, and the title of La. Colt Starting Champion.

The trainers are Dr. David Carter of Natchez; Cory Bourque of Abbeville; and Ethan Lee of Baton Rouge.

David Carter resides and trains horses at the Double C Ranch in Natchez, MS where he also serves as Adams County Director for the Mississippi State University Extension Service. He has been training horses for six years, specializing in colt starting and performance horses. In college at LSU, David had the opportunity to travel to LeCiba, Honduras where he learned many unique skills and methods of starting horses from Central American horseman Gustavo Valdivia. He further developed his skills by spending numerous hours riding with advanced horsemen such as Dr. Clint Depew. In 2008, after 100 days of training, he entered the Extreme Mustang Makeover in Fort Worth, Texas, placing 4th in the nation on his mustang, Silverado.

His methods involve using the horse's natural curiosity to build confidence, which will evolve into courage. David uses four stages of colt starting: establish trust, develop feel, gain respect, and build control. This process requires a commitment to mold a solid foundation of training that will emerge into higher levels of control. Once this solid foundation is laid, the average horse should have the mental ability to be trained in a wide array of disciplines. Carter says that when training young horses, a trainer will accomplish more if they learn to focus more on the concept of training the young horses' mind to learn. Carter believes that starting colts can be summarized in two simple words "mind control".

Cory Bourque is from Youngsville, La. and currently living in Abbeville. He has worked on a couple of ranches with a rodeo background. He was Chute Dogging cham-

pion in 1997, and Reserve Champion in 1998. He became a professional firefighter in 2000 and continues to train horses on his ranch. He has started hundreds of horses in his 20 years of training. However in the 5 years he has used the natural horsemanship technique, he has noticed a huge difference in the colts he has started. He is certified under Dennis Reis of Penngrove, Ca. and is currently sponsored by Tractor Supply to do horse demonstrations for the grand opening of their stores in 2010. He just finished filming in the movie Secretariat, and will also be filming in the month of January at Reis Ranch for the Dennis Reis Shows on RFD TV.

Ethan Lee is from Baton Rouge, La., and says that since childhood, he has learned to have a deep appreciation for good horsemanship. Memories of growing up riding weren't always pleasant for Ethan, as it seemed he was always being run away with, or getting thrown off. As he started to get older he took advantage of any chance he had to learn better horsemanship, from anyone who was willing to share their knowledge. For the last twenty years, he has dedicated himself to a lot of hard work and study of the horse. He feels fortunate to have ridden with some great horseman. After years of starting colts for the public, he decided to put his skill to the test by entering the Extreme Mustang Makeover. In his first year of competition in 2008, he finished 7th in the "Idols" division out of 76 horses. He entered again in 2009, finishing 5th in the Idols division out of 50 horses. Ethan feels that there is always room for learning and improvement. He plans to enter the Extreme Mustang Makeover again in 2010, with the goal of finishing in the top 3.

The public will be able to watch the demonstrations from 10-12 and 6-8 Saturday, and again from 10-12 Sunday.
