

Second half of LDAF open houses begin March 15

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Ag Outreach 2010 sessions that began in early March continue this week with an open house at the Dean Lee Research Center State Emergency Shelter in Alexandria on March 15 from 6 to 8 p.m.

Ag Outreach 2010 March dates are also set for Hammond, Opelousas, Metairie and culminate with a celebration of Ag Day at Baton Rouge LDAF headquarters.

If you've ever been concerned about the qualifications of the pest control man treating your home, business or school you should attend one of these open houses to get the answers to your questions.

The LDAF is tasked with many consumer protection duties. For instance, how do you know that the ten gallons of gas you just pumped into your car is exactly ten gallons? Does the food you purchase at your local supermarket meet all food safety standards?

If you have questions about food safety, forest fire control, the accuracy of produce scales, gas pumps, gasoline octane levels or the price scanner at your local supermarket, Ag Outreach 2010 is for you.

The next open house is scheduled on March 15 at the State Emergency Shelter at the Dean Lee Research Center in Alexandria from 6 to 8 p.m. There is no charge.

Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the LDAF is responsible for a number of regulatory functions that protect the public as well in addition to the agricultural and forestry industries of the state.

Strain and the Assistant Commissioners of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, Agro-Consumer Services, Animal Health and Food Safety, Forestry and Soil and Water Conservation as well as LDAF scientists, technicians and other experts will be on *See Ag Outreach, cont. on page 5*

West Carroll Parish farmer wins 2010 Farmer of the Year

William Stutts put his first crop in the ground when he was a junior in high school. The year was 1977, and that crop comprised some 100 acres. Now, 33 years later, Stutts farms more than 1,300 acres in West Carroll Parish, and he does it exceptionally well. So well, he was named the 2010 Louisiana Farmer of the Year.

Stutts grows corn, soybeans and wheat, but his favorite crop to grow is cotton.

"Down deep in my heart I'm always a cotton farmer. We rotated cotton and rice and then finally just went 100 percent cotton again. But the price of cotton went down and grain prices went up, and we switched to corn and soybeans," Stutts said.

Stutts was one of three finalists recognized for their accomplishments at the Louisiana Farmer of the Year ceremony and banquet at White Oak Plantation in Baton

Rouge. The event is sponsored by the Louisiana Agri-News Network Inc., the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, the LSU AgCenter and the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry. Other finalists recognized were Kevin Berken, of Thornwell in Jefferson Davis Parish, and Larry Fontenot, of Ville Platte, in Evangeline Parish.

West Carroll Parish is well-known for having some of the best farmers in the state. Stutts is the fourth farmer from this area to receive the award. Previous winners were Ralph Oldham, Vandal Fairchild and Fred Bolding.

Stutts gives credit to the work ethic of the local producers because the region is not blessed with the natural resources, roads, rivers and railroads in other parts of the state.

"I think that we know from the start that we have to try harder to compete with other parishes,"

Stutts said.


Stutts believes that farmers take a great risk each year when they plant a crop. Market prices can quickly make a crop unprofitable, and weather events can unexpectedly turn a bumper crop into a disaster.

"We have so many obstacles to overcome. Price changes daily. The weather is just something that you cannot control, and it'll steal you blind overnight. Government policies change daily, regulations they put on us," Stutts said.

Berken is a fourth-generation farmer. Last year, he grew nearly 1,500 acres of rice. This year he plans to include approximately 500 acres of soybeans.

Berken was not always a farmer. He was involved in a highly successful real estate business in San Diego, but the allure *See Farmer of the Year, continued on page 5*

LDAF forestry investigators make two February arrests

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said forestry enforcement officers arrested three men in two separate February felony timber theft incidents.

Strain said two brothers, Ricky Whitaker, 42, of 3212 Quinlen Blvd., Shreveport, and Michael Whitaker, 48, 777 Blunt Mill Road, Grand Cane, were arrested Feb. 23 at the DeSoto Parish Sheriff's Office in Mansfield and charged with stealing 20 acres of timber.

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry enforcement officers determined that the Whitakers were authorized to cut a 200-acre tract located off Friendship Road near Frierson.

20-acres of timber owned by

family members Charles Lowman, Robert Lowman and Juanita Neal, all of Michigan, and adjacent to the 200-acre tract, were allegedly cut by the Whitakers without authorization, Strain said.

Forestry Enforcement Manager Jim Baldwin said the Whitakers were told the Lowman's 20-acre tract was not part of the timber to be cut.

"We were able to locate two witnesses that told the Whitakers that the 20 acres were not part of the sale, including the person who sold the 200 acres," Baldwin said. "The lady who sold the 200 acres told the Whitakers that the property they were cutting was not hers and they were going to get in trouble if they continued to cut the timber.

"Our second witness was a member of the Desoto Parish Sheriff's office who lived near the property. In addition, there was a fence separating the two properties."

The logging took place in August 2009 but the Lowman family did not know their timber was harvested illegally until December 2009 when the forester they hired to do timber management work discovered the plot had been cut.

In the second case, Strain said Salvatore M. Arnone, 1074 State Line Road West, of Osyka, Mississippi, was arrested at the Tangipahoa Parish Jail in Amite on felony timber theft charges February 22.

LDAF enforcement officer Brock Vosburg said Arnone con-

tracted with a Tangipahoa landowner to cut 10 acres of timber.

Mill tickets showed Arnone cut 14 loads of timber but only paid the landowner for 10. Arnone is accused of pocketing \$2500, the value of four loads.

Vosburg and fellow LDAF enforcement officer Roy St. Pierre conducted the investigation and made the arrest, Strain said.

"I urge everyone who suspects they may be a victim of illegal timber operations to call our Forestry office at 225-925-4500 and make a report," Strain said. "It's our job to protect the forestry landowners who live in the state and the absentee landowners as well. Timber theft is a crime and will be investigated thoroughly."

of the land brought him back to Louisiana.

"There's nothing like smelling that soil whenever you first turn it over or when you first put a combine in the field. It's very rewarding and a great place to raise a family," Berken said.

Last year, Berken conceived the idea of hosting an event recognizing the yellow rail bird that lives in rice fields and called it the "Yellow Rails and Rice Festival." The festival called attention to the role rice farming plays in wildlife habitat.

"We had 150 people from all over the country and as far away as Canada and Norway. I was able to have a captive audience, one that had never been on a combine or on a rice farm," Berken said. "We were able to talk to them about rice farming and what it means to the habitat for different wildlife species in this area."

Although Fontenot grows milo and soybeans and raises beef cattle, most of his attention goes to his sweet potato operation.

"Sweet potatoes are the bread and butter of our operation," Fontenot said.

Fontenot is swift to adapt to changes he believes will improve his bottom line. When new varieties became available, he was quick to plant them in his fields and saw immediate results.

"We've brought in some new varieties from the LSU AgCenter breeding program and that has helped us a lot. The yield potential is much higher than what it was 20 years ago- yield and quality. And we need that to stay in business," Fontenot said.

For being selected Farmer of the Year, Stutts receives \$1,000. For being named finalists, Berken and Fontenot each receive \$500.

GLOBAL WILDLIFE CENTER DELIVERS A WILD EDUCATIONAL SAFARI



The Global Wildlife Center in Robert has long been known by Southeast Louisiana teachers as a learning safari for their students.

Every year, the Global Wildlife Center hosts hundreds of open-air tours for students to learn more about animals from other continents and countries.

Children can touch a camel's hump, rub a giraffe and feel the wooly fur of a bison.

Betty DuPont, a teacher from Baton Rouge's University Terrace

Primary, makes sure she schedules a field trip to the Global Wildlife Center every year for her Pre-K class.

"It's a great way to introduce children to the vocabulary of the animals and a wonderful learning experience," DuPont said.

The tour, experienced in a covered wagon train, takes about 90 minutes. On the tour, you're likely to see more than 4,000 animals roaming free on the 900-acre facility.

But the tour has plenty of appeal for all age groups and Christine Cooper, Global's education and development director, said the owners (who prefer to remain anonymous) wanted to create a place that entire families could enjoy together.

Global Wildlife Center features more than 30 species of animals. Most of them are herbivores (animals that only eat plants).

Included in the menagerie are zebras, a family of six giraffes,

camels, kangaroos and a variety of sleek deer and antelopes.

The animals often come right up to the tour wagons and extend their tongues begging for feed that can be purchased beforehand.

Global Wildlife Center offers public and private tours seven days a week. Visitors can make an admission donation for the tour of \$17 for adults, \$13 for seniors and \$10 for children.
