Algiers Ag Day brings agriculture to city kids

City kids in New Orleans learn a lot of things. They can tell you when the street car is going to stop at Audubon Park. They know what time the ferry crosses the Mississippi River to Algiers Point. They know how to behave at jazz funerals and have come to expect impromptu second lines in their neighborhoods.

But do they have any idea where their food comes from?

"Most kids watch television and they have ideas on everything," said Cathy Smith, the Curator and Director of the "Ovah Da River" Folklife Village in Algiers. "They have ideas on things far more advanced than farm life and agriculture."


Folks in the agricultural community think that's a problem, Smith said.

"Adults have a responsibility to bring the agricultural experience straight to the children so they can touch and feel it so that when they see agriculture on television they will have had a real experience," Smith said.

Smith figured the best way to bring agriculture to the children was to host the first ever Ag Day at the "Ovah Da River" park. The tiny patch of green, adjacent to the Algiers Ferry, is nestled in the batture between the Mississippi River bank and the protection levee at Algiers Point. The Village serves as a focal point to honor the contributions of Africans, Haitians and Acadians to Louisiana during the French colonial period from 1682 to

1764.

"The point of Ag Day is to share agriculture and farm life so the children can better understand sustainability and how things actually work as opposed to going into a store and buying this and cooking that," Smith said. "They need to understand that all ingredients in a pizza come from things grown on the farm."



Smith said Algiers Point was the location of the colonial French monarchy's plantation.

"The biggest thing on the plantation was agriculture," Smith said.


It's hard for anyone, much less a schoolchild, to imagine the busy city as anything but an urban center congested with apartments, warehouses, business offices and superhighways

wedged together and covering up every available piece of earth. Across the river, the skyline of New Orleans and St. Louis Cathedral is clearly visible. Downriver, the silhouette of the towering twinspan Crescent City Connection Bridge stands as a tribute to modern industrial society. However, 400 years ago, the point was the beginning of King Louis' farm.

"We're hosting the Ag Day and we've been getting calls like 'What's an Ag Day,'" Smith quipped.

Federal program addresses veterinarian shortage

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the United States Department of Agriculture's National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) is accepting applications from veterinarians wishing to participate in the Veterinary Medicine Loan Repayment Program (VMLRP).

The program addresses veterinary shortages in rural America by repaying the student loans of qualified veterinarians in return for their services in areas suffering from a lack of veterinarians. In return for a commitment of three years of veterinary services in a designated veterinary shortage area, NIFA may repay up to

\$25,000 of student loan debt per year.

"I know first hand that there are areas in Louisiana and the country that are underserved when it comes to veterinary care," Strain said. "I think this program will help get trained veterinarians where they are most needed."

USDA Secretary of Agriculture Tom Vilsack announced the program on April 30.

"The lack of adequate veterinary services, especially in the area of food animal medicine, creates hardships for producers and endangers livestock throughout rural America," said Vilsack. "This program will help alleviate the shortage of trained profession-

al veterinarians that serve our producers, improving the health of the livestock industry and helping ensure a safe food supply."

More than 150 U.S. locations were identified as having a critical shortage of food animal veterinarians. Parishes in Louisiana designated with a food animal veterinary care shortage were St. Helena, Tangipahoa, Washington, Jackson, Lincoln, Ouachita, Richland, West Carroll, East Carroll, Terrebonne, Lafourche, Plaquemines, Natchitoches, Sabine and Vernon.

"We need more veterinarians in these areas to help our food animal producers," Strain said. "Veterinary care is essential for

the national food safety and food security infrastructures as well as the health and well-being of animals and humans."

Major studies indicate significant and growing shortage of food supply veterinarians and veterinarians serving in certain other high priority specialty areas. A leading cause for this shortage is the heavy cost of four years of professional veterinary medical training, which can average between \$130,000 and \$140,000. Congress established the VMLRP as a way to remedy this growing need.

The deadline to apply for the VMLRP is June 30. Offers of acceptance will be made by Sept.

Smith invited all the charter schools from Algiers to Ag Day and more than 300 grade school students petted chickens and goats, planted seeds and learned about agriculture from the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry, the New Orleans Food and Farm Network, Southern University AgCenter, Blair School and the LSU School of Entomology.

Anthony Lee of the New Orleans Food and Farm Network directed the children in a seed-planting exercise.

Each child chose a pack of seeds from a large basket of common garden plants and filled a paper cup with soil.

"Make a little hole in the dirt with your finger," Lee instructed. "Only go as deep as the first joint on your finger. And only plant a few seeds. Don't pour the whole pack in there because when they sprout, they'll be overcrowded."

Lee said the New Orleans Food and Farm Network teaches city residents and school teach-

ers how to plant their own gardens.

"We'll come in and bring all the materials needed to start a garden," Lee said. "The biggest thing we're concerned with is the fact that we aren't eating healthy any more. We're eating fast foods that have additives to make them last longer. We are trying to help people build gardens and have sustainable food and teach adults and youth how to eat properly and live a long time."

Christina Tucker, a fourth grade teacher from Alice M. Hart Charter School was glad her children had an opportunity to be exposed to agriculture.

"We're going to look at agriculture and learn a few things," Tucker said. "The children will learn where their food comes from."

Carrie Castille, special advisor to Commissioner Mike Strain of the LDAF, taught the children how agriculture affects every part of their lives.

"When we were younger we'd go to our grand-

parents' and see chickens and cows," Castille said. "We'd tend to the animals, but more and more we've moved away from the farm, and now it's our responsibility to bring the farm to the kids and get them interested in growing home gardens."

Sarah Laborde, an LSU student working in the Southern United States Trade Association International Trade intern program at the LDAF, thought the first Ag Day at the "Ovah Da River" Folklife Village was a success. Laborde assisted Castille at the LDAF exhibit.

"There was a great turnout from local schools," Laborde said. "The students really impressed me, and some have really big dreams for the future. I think Ag Day in Algiers will only grow in the future."

Smith said she is already planning another Ag Day for October.

Braised Beef with Mushrooms & Barley

1 (3 lb.) boneless chuck arm, blade or shoulder roast	1 medium onion, chopped
1 tbsp. vegetable oil	3 large cloves garlic, minced
1 tsp. salt	1-1/4 cups ready-to-serve beef broth
1/4 tsp. pepper	1 bay leaf
1/2 lb. medium cremini or but- ton mushrooms, halved	1/2 cup medium pearl barley
	1 cup frozen peas, defrosted
	1/3 cup dairy sour cream (optional)

Heat oil in Dutch oven over medium heat until hot. Brown roast; remove from heat. Season with salt and pepper. Add mushrooms, onion and garlic to Dutch oven; cook and stir until onion is lightly browned. Add broth and bay leaf. Return roast and bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover tightly and simmer 1-1/2 hours. Stir in barley; continue cooking, covered, 45 to 60 minutes or until pot roast is fork-tender. Remove pot roast; keep warm. Discard bay leaf. Add peas and sour cream to barley. Cook and stir over low heat just until heated through. Carve pot roast. Serve with barley.

Hearty Glazed Tri-Tip Roast with Creamy Gorgonzola Sauce-part 1

1 beef tri-tip roast (1-1/2 to 2 lbs.)	1 tbsp. reduced sodium soy sauce
1 red onion, cut into wedges	3 cloves garlic, minced
4 cups Broccoli or baby broccoli, trimmed	Creamy Gorgonzola Sauce:
Nonstick cooking spray	1/4 cup reduced fat cream cheese, softened
Salt and pepper	1/4 cup plain nonfat yogurt
Marinade:	2 tbsps. crumbled Gorgonzola cheese
1/3 cup balsamic vinegar	1 tbsp. minced onion
2 tbsps. light brown sugar	1/4 tsp. pepper

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Combine marinade ingredients in small bowl. Reserve 2 tablespoons for basting. Place beef roast and remaining marinade in food-safe plastic bag; turn roast to coat. Marinate in refrigerator 30 minutes to 2 hours. Remove roast from marinade and discard marinade. Place roast on rack in shallow roasting pan. Place onion wedges around roast. Do not add water or cover. Roast in a 425 degree oven 30 to 40 minutes for medium rare; 40 to 45 minutes for medium doneness, basting with reserved marinade halfway through roasting time.

Remove roast when instant-read thermometer registers 135 degrees for medium rare; 150 degrees for medium. Transfer to carving board and tent loosely with aluminum foil. Let stand 15 minutes.

Bistro Beef Tapenade

2 beef shoulder top blade (flat iron) steaks (about 8 oz. each)	2 tbsps. chopped fresh oregano
4 large (1/2-inch thick) slices eggplant	4 large (1/4-inch thick) slices tomato
2 tbsps. olive oil, divided	1 small zucchini, shredded
1/2 tsp. pepper	Fresh oregano springs (optional)
1/4 cup olive tapenade	

Brush eggplant with 1 tablespoon oil. Season eggplant and beef steaks with pepper. Place steaks in center of grid over medium, ash-covered coals; arrange eggplant around steaks. Grill steaks, covered, 10 to 14 minutes (over medium heat on preheated gas grill, covered, 12 to 16 minutes) for medium rare (145°F) to medium (160°F) doneness, turning occasionally. Grill eggplant 6 to 8 minutes (gas grill times remain the same) or until tender. Meanwhile, combine tapenade, remaining 1 tablespoon oil and chopped oregano in small bowl; set aside.

Carve steaks into thin slices. Season beef and eggplant with salt, as desired. Place eggplant slices on plates; layer evenly with beef, tomato and zucchini. Spoon tapenade mixture on top. Garnish with oregano sprigs, if desired.

Hearty Glazed Tri-Tip Roast with Creamy Gorgonzola Sauce-part 2

Meanwhile prepare Creamy Gorgonzola Sauce. Combine all sauce ingredients in small bowl; mix well. Set aside. Spray Broccoli with nonstick cooking spray, tossing to coat. Place on metal baking sheet. Roast in 425°F oven 10 to 15 minutes or until crisp-tender and slightly browned. Toss onion wedges with Broccoli.

Season with salt and pepper, as desired. Carve roast across the grain into thin slices. Season with salt and pepper, as desired. Top beef with Creamy Gorgonzola Sauce. Serve with vegetables.



Include pets and livestock in evacuation plans

Louisiana Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said that livestock and companion animal owners should draw on their past hurricane experiences to prepare for the 2010 hurricane season.

“Livestock and pet owners espe-



cially need to be prepared well in advance of the season,” Strain said. “A lack of hurricane awareness, preparation and planning a response to deal with the aftermath of a hurricane can cause real problems for animal owners. You can minimize the effects of a hurricane disaster to you, your property and your animals by planning for as many emergency contingencies as possible.”

The hurricane season began on June 1 and will run through November 30. National hurricane research centers predict 13 or 14 named storms and about eight hurricanes for 2010.

Strain advised that all large and small animal owners should check and double-check their paperwork to make sure they have proper animal ownership, vaccination documentation, health documents and other items for their livestock and pets before any evacuation is ordered.

“Ownership is an individual responsibility,” Strain said. “A prepared owner is one who has taken the proper steps for their ani-

mals’ well being, and that includes an evacuation plan for pets and emergency plan livestock.”

Strain said livestock owners should have plans in place to protect their herds during hurricane emergencies. The LSU AgCenter and local county agents can help livestock owners with their plans, Strain said.

Small animal owners should check and plan early for a travel location that accommodates pets before an evacuation is called. Pet owners may be able to leave their pets at a pre-arranged boarding kennel along their evacuation route. If they are unable to find adequate pet boarding, an Internet search may help evacuees locate pet friendly hotels at evacuation destinations.

Strain said pet and livestock owners should bring their animal documents with them if they need to evacuate.

“Transport your pets in a pet carrier,” Strain said. “It’s their home away from home. In addition, always have at least three to four days worth

of pet food and daily medications and make sure to bring plenty of water for your pets.”

Strain urged animal owners with critical transportation needs who


know beforehand that they will need assistance to evacuate animals to pre-register with their local parish office of emergency preparedness.

“If an emergency of any type should occur, contact your parish emergency preparedness officials first,” Strain said. “Emergency planners have worked hard to develop a quick method to get problems handled, first at the local level and, then, at the state level.”

Strain said the LDAF Animal Evacuation Information Center on the LDAF Web site has information on how best to prepare your animal and yourself for hurricane emergencies.

Emergency Checklist

Emergencies come in many forms and may require anything from a brief absence from your home to permanent evacuation. Each type of disaster requires different measures to keep your pets safe. The best thing you can do for yourself and your pets is to be prepared.

Do not leave your pets behind. If it isn't safe for you, it isn't safe for your pets. Not all disaster shelters accept pets, so it is imperative that you have determined where you will bring your pets ahead of time

- ◆ Contact your veterinarian for a list of preferred boarding kennels and facilities.
- ◆ Ask your local animal shelter if they provide emergency shelter or foster care for pets.
- ◆ Identify hotels or motels outside of your immediate area that accept pets.
- ◆ Ask friends and relatives outside your immediate area if they would be willing to take in your pet.
- ◆ Build your own Evac-Pack and supplies and keep it ready for your pets. Make sure that everyone in the family knows where it is. This kit should be clearly labeled and easy to carry. Items to consider keeping in or near your pack include:
 - ◆ 3-7 days' worth of canned (pop-top) or dry food (be sure to rotate every two months)
 - ◆ Disposable litter trays (aluminum roasting pans are perfect)
 - ◆ Litter or paper toweling
 - ◆ Liquid dish soap and disinfectant
 - ◆ Disposable garbage bags for clean-up
 - ◆ Pet feeding dishes
 - ◆ Extra harness and leash

- ◆ Photocopies of medical records and a waterproof container with a fresh two-week supply of any medicine your pet requires
- ◆ Bottled water, at least 7 days' worth for each person and pet (store in a cool, dry place and replace every two months)
- ◆ A traveling bag, crate or sturdy carrier for each pet
- ◆ Flashlight
- ◆ Blanket (for scooping up a fearful pet)
- ◆ Recent photos of your pets (in case you are separated and need to make "Lost" posters)
- ◆ Especially for cats: Pillowcase or EvackSack, toys, scoopable litter
- ◆ Especially for dogs: Long leash and yard stake, toys and chew toys, a week's worth of cage liner.
- ◆ Store an emergency kit and leashes as close to an exit as possible
- ◆ Make sure all pets wear collars and tags with up-to-date identification. Your pet's ID tag should contain his name, telephone number, and any urgent medical needs. Be sure to write your pet's name, your name and contact information on your pet's carrier.
- ◆ Consider microchipping your pet as a more permanent form of identification. A microchip is implanted in the animal's shoulder area, and can be read by scanner at most animal shelters.
- ◆ Always bring pets indoors at the first sign or warning of a storm or disaster. Pets can become disoriented and wander away from home during a crisis.
- ◆ Consider your evacuation route and call ahead to make arrangements for boarding your pet outside of the danger zone at the first sign of disaster.
