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New rice farming blogs debut; available 24/7

Two new LSU AgCenter blogs related to rice farming have made debuts this season on the Web.

Natalie Hummel, entomologist, documents her work with rice insects, and Johnny Saichuk, rice specialist, has turned his Field Notes newsletter

into a blog. Paul Coreil, LSU AgCenter vice chancellor for extension, said the blogs are good examples of using technology to distribute research-based information to producers.

"Innovations such as these blogs are cheaper than mailing material to farmers and accessible 24 hours a day to anyone," Coreil said.

Hummel said she started the blog in January, and so far she has

had 4,124 hits, including readers from other countries as far away as India and Colombia. She also posts the entries on her Facebook page. Her blog is <http://louisianariceinsects.wordpress.com/>.

Because the entries are brief, she leaves out some explanatory information.

"The target audience is expected to know about rice insects," she said.

Hummel said she got the idea from the LSU AgCenter Rice Research Station blog, which is at

<http://lsuagcenter-rice.blogspot.com/>.

She said the blog is easy to find, even if the address is unknown, if you search for Louisiana rice. *See blog, continued on page 4*

USDA to help landowners expand habitat for migrating birds

State Conservationist Kevin Norton announced in late June that USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) will work with farmers, ranchers and other landowners to develop and enhance habitat for birds making their annual migration south towards the Gulf of Mexico.

Under the Migratory Bird Habitat Initiative, NRCS will partner with producers to manage portions of their land to provide additional food and habitat for migrating birds.

Norton estimates more than \$1 million in funding for the initiative will be available for Louisiana.

"More than 50 million migratory birds traveling south in coming months will instinctively head toward the marshes and coastlands of the northern

Gulf of Mexico," said Norton. "With some marshes and shorelines already degraded and the potential for larger-scale oil impacts in the coming months, it is essential that we provide inland and coastal food, water, and cover for migratory birds before they reach the oil-impacted areas."

The initiative encompasses portions of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, and Texas. NRCS, in cooperation with its conservation partners, has identified priority areas that offer the greatest habitat potential for migrating bird populations.

NRCS anticipates improving habitat on up to 100,000 to 150,000 acres throughout the eight states, based on expected producer participation. Based on prior experience, NRCS hopes to see millions of birds coming to rest and feed in the priority areas.

Priority areas in Louisiana are in Acadia, Allen,

Avoyelles, Beauregard, Calcasieu, Caldwell, Cameron, Catahoula, Concordia, East Carroll, Evangeline, Franklin, Iberia, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, Madison, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Pointe Coupee, Rapides, Richland, St. Landry, St. Martin, St. Mary, Tensas, Vermilion, and West Carroll Parishes.

"We expect there will be great interest from our farmers and ranchers who want to do something positive to help the migrating birds-not only this fall, but next spring and in subsequent years as well," said Norton.

USDA will use conservation programs administered by NRCS and will work with partners, both public and private, to provide a variety of habitats to meet the needs of different species. Emphasis will be on creating or

enhancing habitat for shorebirds and waterfowl, including shallow water, mudflat, and sandflat habitats. Of special interest are agricultural lands that contain wetlands farmed under natural conditions and prior converted croplands. Rice fields are particularly well-suited for this initiative, as are catfish and crawfish farms.

USDA will deliver this initiative with the support from partners in Louisiana including Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, Gulf Coast Joint Venture, Ducks Unlimited, LSU AgCenter, USA Rice Federation, The Nature Conservancy, National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and Louisiana's Soil and Water Conservation Districts.

The signup for the initiative is scheduled to end August 1.

Rabies confirmed in Jeff Davis Parish horse

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said a Jeff Davis Parish horse was confirmed with rabies on June 28.

The horse, a six-year-old thoroughbred mare domiciled in the Jennings area, was brought to the LSU School of Veterinary Medicine in Baton Rouge on June 27, 2010, after exhibiting abnormal facial

twitching symptoms.

The neurologic symptoms worsened and the horse was euthanized. A subsequent necropsy verified rabies.

“Rabies symptoms are often neurological and very similar to other disease symptoms like eastern equine encephalitis (EEE) and West Nile virus,” Strain said. “All of those diseases affect the brain.”

Strain added that relatively few people vaccinate their horses for rabies.

“Horses are mammals and all mammals can contract rabies. If you’re going to vaccinate your livestock for EEE and West Nile, the cost of adding a rabies vaccination is minimal. It’s a disease that can easily be prevented.”

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

insects.

Saichuk's regular dispatches from Field Notes are the basis for his blog, which is at <http://lariceman.wordpress.com>. He said the first day it went live on the Web, it received 400 hits.

He writes about what he sees every week in the rice fields that are in the LSU AgCenter rice verification program, everything from the planting of a crop to the harvest.

A condensed version of Field Notes is used for the blog. "What I write for Field Notes is too much text for the blog format," Saichuk said.

He has been writing Field Notes and sending it out by e-mail since 2005. In addition to the blog, which he started this

year, he still e-mails Field Notes to more than 120 recipients, and it is passed along to others across the U.S. rice-growing areas.

"County agents distribute it to their farmers, and so from there it multiplies," he said.

LSU AgCenter launches Market Maker online service

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain said the new LSU AgCenter Market Maker service is a great way for Louisiana producers to sell their harvest, not only to the local market, but to the national and international market as well.

"This is a great idea and I urge Louisiana producers to take advantage of the service," Strain said. "Small

and large

producers

can use

the service

to help

negotiate

prices,

take

orders and

arrange

deliveries to consumers in a much larger arena."

Strain said U-pick farms, crawfish producers, shrimpers, small growers and agritourism venues are only a few of the agricultural services that could increase their market presence by using Market Maker.

"There is a lot of potential here for the enterprising producer," Strain said.

The LSU AgCenter launched the new online service in June to help agricultural businesses market their products.

The Market Maker service is offered via a website so anyone in the world with Internet access may search for agricultural products to purchase 24 hours a day.

"This will be a boon for our seafood industry," LSU AgCenter Chancellor Bill Richardson told an audience at the 88th annual Louisiana Farm Bureau Convention in New Orleans, where he made the announcement of the new service. "This will provide another way for them to promote their products and get the word out that Louisiana seafood is safe to eat despite the oil spill."

Anybody in Louisiana with a product to sell – seafood, pecans, crawfish, strawberries, etc. – can establish an account on Market Maker for free.

"It's like a matchmaker service bringing together buyers and sellers," said Dwight Landreneau, LSU AgCenter associate vice chancellor.

Market Maker originates out of the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, and 17 states including Louisiana are members.

Louisiana joined the national effort last fall with a federal grant of \$125,000 provided through the Louisiana Recovery Authority, Landreneau said. The fund covers the initial startup of the Louisiana Market Maker website and its maintenance for the first three years.

Ben Clark, the LSU AgCenter extension associate

system. The individuals

in charge of these operations

can go into the system, change the passwords and update the sites.

"It's easy to register," Clark said. "And if people have any questions, they can e-mail us." The e-mail address is MarketMaker@agcenter.lsu.edu.

Individuals who want to register are to go to LA.FoodMarketMaker.com and follow the instructions, which include a series of drop-down menus. If they want, they can add images of their business and a link to their website, if they have one. They can add a narrative with more details about their business.

Louisiana Market Maker is not restricted to food products, but the business has to be agriculture-related, Landreneau said.

"People with an agritourism business could benefit from this service, for example," Landreneau said. "This is all about economic development for Louisiana."

Consumers don't have to register to find products on the national Market Maker. They can go to <http://national.marketmaker.uiuc.edu> and find products in the 14 states online so far. The Louisiana Market Maker should be searchable by Aug. 15, Clark said.

"Right now the site is only open for registration," Clark said.

Supporters of Louisiana Market Maker include the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Farm Bureau.

ULL student, father serve together in Iraq

When University of Louisiana at Lafayette student Jarred Degeyter enlisted in the Louisiana National Guard four years ago, he was still in high school. He didn't know he would eventually be serving in Iraq along with his father.

"I really believe everyone

should serve their country. Both of my grandfathers served, as well as my father. So, I always viewed it as something you were supposed to do," he said.

A combat medic, Degeyter, 22, is stationed at Camp Slayer. His dad, Capt. Curt Degeyter, 43, is a division veterinarian and an agri-

cultural and veterinary advisor at Camp Victory. Both camps are within the Victory Base Complex in Baghdad.

"My son's enlistment inspired me to return to service," said Curt Degeyter. After serving in the Louisiana National Guard from 1985 to 1992, he joined the U.S. Army Reserve in 2008. He volunteered to go to Baghdad when he learned there was a shortage of veterinary officers there. Both men were deployed in January.

As an advisor, Curt Degeyter helps the Iraqi people establish sustainable livestock and agricultural practices. "I do a lot of teaching. The U.S. Army is applying research and technology in a number of areas, including the artificial insemination of dairy cattle. We're teaching the technicians in the field how to improve their breeding stock and increase milk production," he said.

"The majority of people that I work with are really no different than the people that I associate with back home in South Louisiana. They are hard workers that want the best for their families. They, however, don't have all the luxuries that we have available and they don't take the few luxuries they do have for granted, such as security, clean fresh water and electricity."

Curt Degeyter was a combat medic during his previous military service, so he understands his son's work in a way most people do not. "Jarred has been trained to perform techniques in the field that combat medics were not allowed to perform back in the '80s, such as inserting chest tubes and performing tracheotomies. The combat medics we have in the Army today are better trained than any other mil-

itary force in the world. They know their job and because of that, thousands of soldiers have gone home alive."

When Jarred Degeyter signed up to become a combat medic, he had just completed his junior year at Catholic High School in New Iberia. At the time, he was considering a career in medicine. But he changed his mind. Now a junior at UL Lafayette, he is majoring in industrial technology.

Father and son get together about once a week for some down time. Jarred Degeyter is part of the 256th Infantry Brigade, which has its headquarters in Lafayette. Most weekends, its members relax a bit and cook some Cajun food.

Curt Degeyter is usually invited. "There are maybe 20 or so guys and some of them are from South Louisiana. When you're hearing the accents and enjoying the food, you can almost forget you're in Baghdad," he said.

In addition to easing the stress that comes with deployment, serving together has changed the Degeyters' relationship.

"I've always had a very close relationship with my son. He's very mature and a squared-away soldier. However, I would say that I see him more grown up and it kind of puts things in perspective. I have come to respect him as a grown man and not like a young child anymore," Curt Degeyter said.

Jarred Degeyter agreed. "I believe if anything has changed, it's that we have even more of a mutual respect for each other."

Curt Degeyter is slated to return home to St. Martinville this summer and his son will return in November.

"When I redeploy this summer, a part of me will be left here. I'm

more concerned about my son's safety than my own," he said. "I've actually thought about extending my deployment until the end of the year but my wife said it was time for me to come home."

While it will be difficult to leave Iraq knowing that his son will remain there for several months, Curt Degeyter looks forward to spending time with his wife, Jamie, and returning to running his family business, a general construction firm.

"I grew up in the general contracting business. My father, Larry Degeyter, is a design-build general contractor. I've worked for him since I was 10." After graduating from veterinary school in 1994, Curt Degeyter moved to Texas and started an equine practice. In 2000, he sold the practice and returned to Louisiana. He took over the family construction business in 2006. Curt and Jaime Degeyter have three other children: Jacob, 20, Jill Katherine, 16, and Jaden Elizabeth, 10.

Jacob Degeyter is a student at South Louisiana Community College in New Iberia. "He has done a superior job of taking care of his mother, his sisters and the home while I'm away. He has definitely made it much easier for me to keep my mind on my job here in Iraq," Curt Degeyter said.

Jarred Degeyter is also looking forward to returning home. "I was married two weeks prior to my deployment," he said. He and his wife, Lyndsay Judice Degeyter, are planning a long-delayed honeymoon. Lyndsay Degeyter is also a UL Lafayette student. She is majoring in fashion merchandising.

"After that, I will continue with school and get my degree," he said.

New strawberry labeling law enacted

Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said and it passed unanimously."

Governor Bobby Jindal recently signed House Bill 430 that will require all strawberries sold in the state to have a "farm of origin" label affixed to the packaging. Our Louisiana strawberry growers produce the best berries in the country," Strain said. "The labeling will let consumers know they are getting the freshest product possible."


The bill was initiated by Rep. Stephen E. Pugh of Ponchatoula and signed by Jindal on May 26.

"The strawberry growers saw this as a way to protect the integrity of their industry," Pugh said. "The Legislature thought so too

Strain said the measure also provides a useful reference in case food safety or other health issues arise.

"Consumers are concerned about food safety and it's always good to know where the food we eat was grown, produced, processed or prepared," he said.

The LDAF's Food Quality Services staff, along with input from the Louisiana Strawberry Marketing Board, will promulgate the rules and regulation for the enforcement of the law in the coming months, Strain said. The process of creating the new rules will take approximately 120 days.

Peachy Recipes

Peachy Pops

2 peaches
2/3 cup yogurt, lowfat vanilla
2 cups orange juice

6 paper cups
6 spoons

Use a knife to remove the skin from the peaches, and to chop the peaches. Spoon the peaches into each of the 6 paper cups. Place the yogurt in a medium mixing bowl. Slowly pour and stir the orange juice into the yogurt. Mix well. Pour some of the juice and yogurt mix into each cup to cover the peaches. Place a spoon in the center of each cup. Cut 6 squares of aluminum foil big enough to cover the tops of cups. Stab each spoon handle through each piece of foil. The foil will hold the spoon in the center of the cup. Place cups in the freezer for at least 4 hours. Just before serving, peel the paper cups away from the pops to eat.

Quick Peach Cobbler

1 (16 oz.) can sliced peaches,
packed in juice
1 egg
1/3 cup sugar
1/2 cup flour

1/2 tsp. baking powder
1/4 tsp. salt
1 tbsp. softened margarine

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Open the can of peaches. Pour the peaches and their juice into the casserole dish. Heat them on the stove-top until they bubble. Slightly beat 1 egg. In a mixing bowl, mix the egg, sugar, flour, baking powder, salt, and margarine. Drop spoonfuls of this mixture on top of the hot, bubbling peaches. Use pot holders to carefully remove the casserole dish from the stove. Put the casserole dish in the oven. Bake for about 30-40 minutes.

Fruit Dip

8 oz. yogurt, lowfat vanilla
2 tbsps. orange juice,
1 tbsp. lime juice
1/2 tbsp. brown sugar

2 red apples, cored and sliced
1 pear, cored and sliced
1 peach, pitted and sliced

In a small bowl, combine yogurt, orange juice concentrate, lime juice and brown sugar. Mix well. Place bowl containing dip on a large plate and surround with fruit.

Peach Crisp

4 peaches (4 cups sliced)
2 tbsps. margarine
3/4 cup quick-cooking oats
1/2 cup sugar

1/4 cup flour
2 tbsps. cinnamon
1 tsp. lemon juice

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Slice the peaches. Spread the peach slices on the bottom of the baking pan. Melt the margarine in a saucepan. In a small bowl, mix everything but the peaches. Stir until the mix is well blended. Sprinkle the oat mix on top of the peaches. Bake for 20 minutes.

Notes: Serve the peach crisp either hot or cold. To remove the peach fuzz, you can rub the washed peach gently with a paper towel.

Pocket Peach Pies

4 (8 inch) flour tortillas
2 medium peaches
1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon
2 tbsps. brown sugar

1/8 tsp. ground nutmeg
2 tbsps. milk
sugar (optional)

Warm tortillas in microwave or oven to make them easier to handle. Peel and chop fruit into pieces. Place 1/4 of the fruit on half of each tortilla. In a small bowl, stir together brown sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg. Sprinkle over fruit. Roll up the tortillas, starting at the end with the fruit. Place on an un-greased baking sheet and make small slashes to allow steam to escape. Brush with milk and sprinkle with additional sugar, if desired. Back at 350 degree in oven for 8-12 minutes or until lightly brown. Serve warm or cool.

Peach Ice Cream

4 cups sliced, peeled peaches
1 tbsp. lemon juice
1/2 tsp. unflavored gelatin

1 cup heavy cream, whipped
sugar substitute to taste

Place peaches in a medium size bowl. Mix sugar substitutes and lemon juice in a small bowl and pour over peaches. Cover and set aside for 2 hours. Drain fruit, saving 3/4 cup of juice. In a small saucepan combine reserved juice with gelatin and cook over low heat until gelatin is dissolved. Place peaches in a blender and blend at medium speed until peaches are pureed. Refrigerate until mixture begins to thicken then fold in whipped cream. Place in ice cream maker and process until thick and creamy. Makes 1 quart.
