## BULL RIDERS NEVER DIE

Old bull riders never die, they just go to work for the USDA Market News.

Not exactly, but that's what Keith Williams did before he joined the USDA.

Williams is the new Market News Officer in Charge of USDA Market News for Louisiana and Mississippi. Williams replaced Taylor Cox who took another position with the Market News in Iowa.

"I was a pro cowboy," Williams said. "I had my Professional Rodeo Cowboy Association card and enjoyed my time as a bull rider. I didn't travel real extensively but my brother did and he competed in the National Finals Rodeo as a bull rider a few times."


Williams' dad raised cattle and horses and owned

a construction firm. His mother was a city girl. Their farm acreage was not far from their Tulsa, Oklahoma home.

The excitement of riding and mastering a large and dangerous animal in the arena finally lost its appeal and Williams, armed with an Animal Science degree from Oklahoma State University, left a position with his father's construction firm in 1988 and went to work for the Market News.

Williams said the Market News compiles feed and slaughter cow price information so area producers can better determine the value of their cattle.

"Brokers use the information to base their prices," Williams said. "Cattle producers also need *See Market News, continued on page 4*

## LDAF press secretary named ag communicator of the year

Sam Irwin, press secretary for the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF), was named the "Regnal Wallace Ag Communicator of the Year" by the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, Inc., LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said.

Irwin received the award in New Orleans as part of the 88th annual Farm Bureau Federation's meeting in June. This is the 13th year the award has been presented to a farm journalist or ag public relations professional for work in reporting on farm issues.

"I'm very proud of Sam and all the hard work he does," Strain said. "He handles all of the

department's press work, maintains our Web page and is also the editor of the Market Bulletin. The recognition is well-deserved."

"Sam's one of the hardest working farm journalists in the state," Michael Danna, director of public relations for the Farm Bureau said. "Be it a field day, or traveling the state covering farm news for the Market Bulletin, Sam knows a good ag story when he sees one."

The award is named after former Farm Bureau PR Director Regnal Wallace who retired in 1997. For 28 years, Wallace told the story of agriculture by creating the Louisiana Farm Bureau Radio Network and Farm Bureau's weekly television program "This

Week in Louisiana Agriculture." TWILA is seen each week by 400,000 viewers across the country and across Louisiana. The LFB Radio Network has 24 affiliates airing 50 farm radio broadcasts a day.

Wallace is currently farm director for KMAR Radio in Winnsboro. A native of Crowville, Wallace's program, "Round Franklin," is heard each day beginning at 11 a.m.

"Sam and I talk quite frequently," Wallace said. "I know farmers appreciate the work he does."

Prior to being named press secretary, Irwin served as a public information officer for the LDAF. In addition to his press secretary

duties, he is also editor and primary photojournalist for the department's Market Bulletin. In the course of his work for the Market Bulletin, Irwin has traveled the state reporting on everything from cotton, corn and cloned goats, hurricanes and hailstorms, and shot thousands of photographs of Louisiana agriculture, its rural life, its people and its culture.

A native of Breaux Bridge, Irwin holds a B.A. and M.A. in history from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette. He is a member of the Public Relations Association of Louisiana, Baton Rouge Area Mountain Bike Association and the Baton Rouge

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

this information. For instance, if the cattle owner knows hay and grass are short, he may use the information from the Market News to decide to buy or sell.

"By looking at Market News reports, they can estimate a value of their cattle at any given time and make decisions to buy more hay or sell their herd."

Williams said there are many different scenarios at play in making decisions whether or not to invest in hay or feed or more cattle, but the main purpose of the Market News is to provide cattle buyers and sellers with unbiased information on prices.

"A sale barn could create their own market report, but it wouldn't be unbiased because the barn

would have a vested interest in the report," Williams said. "Our job is to gather the information and disseminate it in an unbiased manner."

Williams said Market News reporters are present at every auction and trained to grade the cattle in an impartial manner.

"The reporters grade the cattle and put them in a small, medium or large order," Williams said. "The cattle are also graded by muscle thickness scale on a scale of 1-5."

The prices are recorded for each cow sold, then averaged and reported.

Reports on other livestock types, grains and hay are also available.

In addition to his Market News responsibility, Williams also helps producers by providing marketing information and educational tools to enhance their knowledge of the global market.

"I'm going to continue promoting the Calf to Carcass program that was in place when I got here," Williams said. "I'm also very open to hearing about new ideas from area producers."

## USDA program to aid water quality

Two northeastern Louisiana watersheds are included in an \$80 million, 12-state initiative to improve water quality in the Mississippi River Basin by managing fertilizer and sediment runoff from agricultural land.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service is investing more than \$1.5 million during the next five years in a 20,000-acre tract in East Carroll Parish along Upper Joe's Bayou and a 53,000-acre tract in Ouachita and Richland parishes along Bayou Lafourche.

USDA Louisiana state conservationist Kevin Norton was in Rayville and Lake Providence in late June to kick off the program.

"Cropland production is important to the very fabric of our country, so this is an important opportunity to show we can conduct production agriculture in a manner that contributes less runoff and improves the health of our whole ecosystem," Norton said.

The voluntary program will help farmers pay for practices that will either reduce or filter the runoff of nitrogen and phosphorous, as well as sediment, into the basin's waters.

That runoff travels down the Mississippi River and increases the hypoxic zone, or dead zone, in the Gulf of Mexico that is almost void of oxygen.

Among the initiatives

landowners can take are planting buffer strips of grass between fields and ditches that naturally filter the runoff and other conservation practices in the fields.

A third Louisiana watershed, Mermentau in southern Louisiana, also is included in the Mississippi River Basin Healthy Watersheds Initiative, which Norton said gives the state a chance to make a substantial impact.

Donna Remides of the North Delta Resource Conservation and Development Area, the local agency responsible for the Upper Joe's Bayou watershed, said the agency has begun an outreach program to producers.

"The local producers have shown a lot of enthusiasm over the program," she said.

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry is the local agency for the Bayou Lafourche watershed.

"Producers want to enhance their conservation practices, and this gives them the help they need," said Michael Schooler of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry.

Norton said the USDA provides 50 percent to 75 percent of the funding for participating producers.

# LSU AgCenter will hold Field Day in August

The LSU AgCenter Dean Lee Field Day will be held Aug. 5 with field tours starting at 9 a.m. Experts will give overviews on their work with corn, cotton, soybeans and cattle.

The event in years past had been held in the afternoon.

“This year we decided to alter the schedule to avoid the heat of the day,” said Allen Nipper, director of the LSU AgCenter’s Central Region. “This will allow for a more comfortable event and give participants more time with researchers after the tour.”

The Dean Lee Research Station is adjacent to the LSU-Alexandria campus on U.S. Highway 71 south of Alexandria. Registration will begin at 8:30 a.m. at the DeWitt Livestock Facility followed by a field tour, which will include:

- Weed management in row crops, including applying herbicides for early-season weed control.
- Soybean and cotton variety adaptation.
- A corn-breeding project to

develop lines with resistance to aflatoxin production.

- Soybean seed quality, variety differences and fungicide applications.

- The effects of plant growth regulators on recently released cotton varieties.

- Weed management with Liberty Link soybeans.

- An update on the Louisiana Master Farmer Program.

- Wheat stubble management.

- Crop fertility issues and salt toxicity problems in soybeans.

- The influence of genetics on disease resistance and susceptibility in beef cattle along with an assessment of various breeds’ reproductive potential and calf survival.

- How genetic markers are being used to analyze cattle populations.

- The relationship between beef productivity and hair coat luster and length.

- Insect and disease management in soybeans.

The program will conclude with a lunch at 12:30 p.m.

# EEE, WNV confirmed in St. James Parish

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said Eastern equine encephalitis (EEE) and West Nile virus was found in a three-year-old mare in St. James Parish on July 12.

Strain said the Louisiana Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory in Baton Rouge confirmed EEE and West Nile virus in the horse. The horse was euthanized.

“Eastern equine encephalitis and West Nile virus are very preventable diseases,” Strain said. “All horse owners should keep their equine vaccinations up to date and consult a veterinarian if their animals are displaying any unusual neurological symptoms.”

Strain said horse owners, at a minimum, should vaccinate against tetanus, EEE, Western equine encephalitis, West Nile

virus and rabies.


These maladies affect the brain and symptoms could include depression, lack of coordination, walking in circles, facial twitching and other neurologic anomalies.

An infected horse eventually collapses to the ground.

Equine owners with horses displaying any of these symptoms should contact their local veterinarian.

Veterinarians should also report all suspected equine encephalitic cases to the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry’s Veterinary Health Office.

The LDAF is working with local veterinarians, horse owner groups, health officials and local mosquito abatement programs to monitor the spread of the mosquito-borne diseases.

## “Rice Cooker Meals” offers classic Louisiana recipes with a twist

There is no better food than the slow-simmered rice and gravies of Cajun Country, but the deep, brown, roux-flavored stews take hours of standing over a stove, far too much time for the average, busy person. Cookbook author Neal Bertrand has come up with a quick-cooking technique that combines those slow-cooked étouffées and gumbos with the ease and practicality of a familiar friend in the kitchen, the rice cooker.

Bertrand discovered he could combine browned meat, vegetables, broth, seasoning, and rice in his rice cooker, stir, press the “cook” button, and let his rice

cooker take care of dinner. His first attempt, a jambalaya made with black-eyed peas, sausage, and Louisiana long-grained rice was such a success, he began experimenting with *everything* in his Cajun kitchen.

Classics like red beans and rice, sausage sauce piquante, shrimp creole, stuffed roast, crawfish stew, chicken and sausage gumbo, smothered potatoes with sausage and tasso, and even can-

died yams with marshmallows are simple to prepare using a rice cooker. No longer tied to the stove, busy people can put together their favorite recipes in minutes, set the automatic timer, and go on with their lives, while meals are cooked to perfection without any attention from the cook.



# “Rice Cooker Meals”

### *Cajun Pepper Steak*

1 lb. boneless round steak, cut into bite-size pieces	½ bell pepper, chopped
1 (.87-oz.) envelope brown gravy mix	5 garlic cloves, minced
1 (10.5-oz.) can beef broth	2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
1 (10-oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chilies	1/8 tsp. dried bay leaf flakes
½ large onion, chopped	½ tsp. dried basil
	½ tsp. Cajun or Creole seasoning
	Hot sauce, to taste
	Hot, cooked rice

Brown the meat in skillet and keep the gravy. Make one cup of the Gravy Mix in a separate small saucepan according to package directions. Add all ingredients to rice cooker except rice, stir, cover and press down COOK switch. Once meal is cooked, and the COOK switch pops up to WARM mode, serve immediately. Cooked for 40 minutes and made up to the 2-cup level of rice cooker.

### *Black-Eyed Pea and Sausage Jambalaya*

1 lb. smoked link beef or pork sausage, sliced and browned	1 stick butter, chopped
1 (15.5-oz.) can black-eyed peas with jalapenos	1 small onion, chopped
1 (10.5-oz.) can beef broth	1 small bell pepper, chopped
1¼ cups (10 oz.) uncooked medium-grain white rice	3 cloves garlic, minced
	½ cup chopped green onions

Drain browned sausage of grease; add with all remaining ingredients to rice cooker, stir, cover and press down COOK switch. Once meal is cooked, and the COOK switch pops up to WARM mode, let it stand covered 10 minutes before serving. Cooked for 18 minutes and made up to the 5-cup level.

### *Chicken and Pasta*

1½ cups water	1 (8-oz.) can tomato sauce
1 tbsp. olive oil	1 stick butter, chopped
2 cups large uncooked elbow macaroni	½ large bell pepper, chopped
1 lb. chicken breast, cut in bite-size pieces	1 onion, chopped
1 (10-oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chilies	3 cloves garlic, chopped
	Salt and pepper, to taste
	¼ lb. block of processed cheese cut in pieces

Add water and oil to bowl and stir. Add macaroni to liquid and coat well to avoid clumping. Season chicken pieces well. Add chicken and all remaining ingredients, except cheese, to rice cooker, stir, cover and press down COOK switch. Once meal is cooked, and the COOK switch pops up to WARM mode, add cheese, stir well to mix, and then serve. Cooked for 24 minutes and made up to the 4.5-cup level.

### *Catfish Sauce Piquante*

1 lb. catfish fillets, cut into bite-size pieces	1 onion, chopped
2 tsp. Cajun or Creole seasoning, or to taste	1 medium bell pepper, chopped
Hot sauce to taste	7 cloves garlic, minced
1 (10-oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chilies	3 green onion tops, chopped
1 (6-oz.) can tomato paste	½ to 1 stick butter, chopped
	½ tsp. sugar
	2 cups water
	Hot, fluffy rice

Put the catfish pieces in a bowl and season well with Cajun or Creole seasoning. Add remaining ingredients to rice cooker except rice, stir, cover and press down COOK switch. Once meal is cooked, and the COOK switch pops up to WARM mode, let it stand covered 10 minutes before serving over hot rice. Cooked for 32 minutes and made up to the 5-cup level. Don't let it cook longer than 40 minutes.

### *Taco Soup*

1 lb. ground meat, browned	1 (15.5-oz.) can chili beans, undrained
Salt and pepper, to taste	1 (10-oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chilies, undrained
½ tsp. chili powder	1 medium onion, chopped
½ tsp. garlic powder	4 cups tomato juice
½ tsp. onion powder	1 (1.5-oz.) envelope taco seasoning
1 (15.25-oz.) can whole kernel corn, undrained	1 cup water

Drain meat of any grease; add to rice cooker with remaining ingredients, stir, cover and press down COOK switch. Cook soup for 45 minutes then stop. Serve hot. Cook for 45 minutes; it made up to the 7-cup level.

### *Chicken Fajita Stuffed Potato*

1 lb. boneless, skinless chicken breast cut in thin strips or small pieces	1 medium onion, chopped fine
Salt, red & black pepper, to taste	½ red bell pepper, chopped fine
1 envelope chicken fajita mix	½ stick butter, chopped
6 oz. water	1 (10.5-oz.) can chicken broth
1 (2-lb.) bag frozen, crinkle-cut French-fried potatoes, defrosted	

Season chicken with salt and peppers and stir. Dissolve fajita mix in bowl of water. Add all ingredients to rice cooker, stir, cover and press down COOK switch. Once meal is cooked, and the COOK switch pops up to WARM mode, stir well to mash the potatoes and serve. Cooked for 41 minutes and made up to the 5-cup level.

*Time saving tip: by using the frozen, crinkle-cut, French-fried potatoes, you can eliminate peeling and cutting of the potatoes!*

## Plan designed to improve the health of Louisiana's longleaf pine forests

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) initiative to improve the health of longleaf pine forests in nine southeastern states includes Louisiana.

"The longleaf pine was the native pine species in Louisiana," Strain said. "The state had more than seven million acres of longleaf pine at one time. Today, less than 250,000 acres remain and the majority of that is located in National Forests."

"The longleaf is still an important part of our ecosystem and this plan supplies an incentive to landowners to set aside new plots of the tree."

Longleaf pine forests in the southeastern United States covered 90 million acres of New World soil at the beginning of European settlement. About 3.5 million acres remain today, providing critical habitat for 29 threatened or endangered species. With the Longleaf Pine Restoration Initiative, NRCS will collaborate with other federal agencies as well as state, local and nongovernmental conservation partners to address conservation needs across the longleaf pine range.

Louisiana will receive about \$352,000 in financial assistance through this

initiative. The other participating states are Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Texas and Virginia.

The initiative will be offered within Louisiana's historical longleaf pine range including portions of Bienville, Jackson, Caldwell, Winn, Catahoula, LaSalle, Grant, Sabine, Natchitoches, Rapides, Avoyelles, Evangeline, Calcasieu, Jefferson Davis, Acadia, West Feliciana, East Feliciana, Livingston, Tangipahoa, St. Tammany and East Baton Rouge Parishes. The initiative will also be offered within

all of Vernon, Beauregard, Allen, St. Helena and Washington Parishes.

"This initiative will provide a good opportunity for forest landowners who wish to add longleaf pine to their forest land holdings," said Buck Vandersteen, Executive Director of the Louisiana Forestry Association.

Using an integrated landscape approach, the initiative will help restore the dramatic acres of longleaf pine forest ecosystems that were lost on private land and will also improve plant and animal habitat.

"This collaborative, all-lands approach to conservation will result in cleaner water, improved essential habitat for sensitive species, and an economic resource for the future," State Conservationist Kevin Norton said. "Protecting and restoring this important ecosystem will benefit communities and resources across the nation."

The initiative is funded through NRCS's Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program. Participants agree to carry out a wildlife habitat development plan and NRCS provides cost-share assistance to voluntarily implement conservation practices that maintain, improve or restore longleaf pine ecosystems.

"Longleaf forests are a true forest with so many important values that benefit mankind. This initiative presents landowners with a golden opportunity to improve such a unique and diverse ecosystem that is on a drastic decline," said Louisiana landowner and conservationist, David Daigle. "Through this initiative, landowners can improve the health of our plant community and wildlife habitat."
