Southern state forestry departments partner to educate citizens about fire

Wildfires that burn out of control can destroy homes and cause untold amounts of property damage.

Louisiana has partnered with the other southern states that make up the wildland firefighting force called the Southern Group of State Foresters to provide a united message to answer homeowners questions about wildfire, wildfire fire protection and prescribed burning.

The "One Message, Many Voices" campaign is designed to educate the public on the benefit of prescribed fire. The campaign begins on Sept. 1 and will consist of public service messages broadcast on television stations.

Natural woods fire has always been a part of Louisiana's landscape, but an out of control fire can pose a serious threat to human life and property. Prescribed fire is one of the most effective tools foresters use to prevent the outbreak and spread of wildfires.

State Forester Wade Dubea said home and landowners can do a lot to protect their property from the destructive threat of wildfire.

"Prescribed burning removes forest fuels, improves wildlife habitat, controls insects and disease and improves forage for grazing," Dubea said. "It also enhances the health of the forest in general."

A large number of Louisiana residents live in rural areas, small

towns, communities or developments. Some communities grew along the edge of the forest, Wildfire protection authorities call this zone the wildland-urban interface, though placed in a bucolic setting, face an ugly danger from forest wildfire.

Every season, Louisiana woods and forests develop a heavy layer of pine needles, leaves and broken branches due to the natural seasons of growth. Timber blow down due to storms and hurricanes add to the woody debris. Unfortunately, the natural debris dries and can become highly flammable, especially in hot, dry months. The debris has the potential to fuel a wildfire sparked by natural or man-made causes.

After the 2005 hurricanes, communities were rebuilt and several areas saw a dramatic increase in new home construction. These newly-built developments, are most often protected from structural fire by local volunteer fire departments. Small towns and rural communities are also protected by volunteer fire departments. The problem? The residents in these areas are often not aware of the risks and hazards posed by wildfire, which require different types of fire suppression equipment than most volunteer forces have available.

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) has documented 352 such communities at risk to wildfire. Towns like Dry Prong, Downsville, Shongaloo, Merryville, Haughton, Bayou Chicot and Holden are squarely set along the wildland-urban interface.

In 2010, LDAF wildland firefighting crews suppressed 1,143 fires that burned more than 11,000 acres of woodlands. Forty structures were damaged by these wildfires. While fire fighting crews protected more than 590 homes from destruction due to wildfire, 27 homes were damaged. These 27 homes could easily have been completely destroyed.

How does a homeowner who lives in the wildland-urban interface ensure that his or her home is best protected against wildfire? Some of the answers may be found at FireWise.org, a new web site sponsored by the United States Department of Agriculture, U.S. Department of the Interior and National Association of State Foresters.

"Life along the wildland-urban interface is a wonderful experience," Dubea said. "I encourage everyone to visit www.goodfires.org and www.visitmyforest.org to learn more the 'good' versus 'bad' fires the occur in the forest."

More training sessions to combat invasive giant salvinia scheduled

An Aug. 14 educational seminar to teach Toledo Bend Louisiana residents techniques to control invasive giant salvinia drew more than 75 participants to the Disabled American Veterans (DAV) building in the Toledo Town community near Many, Agriculture and Forestry commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said.

“Home and camp owners on the Louisiana side of Toledo Bend learned how to treat giant salvinia that infests boat docks, fishing piers and recreational areas,” Strain said. “They asked us for help to learn how to control the aquatic weed around their properties so we set up this special class.

“Last winter’s freeze killed off a lot of giant salvinia, and for lake-side residents, this is a great

opportunity to keep it from reestablishing. The more the individual property owner can control it, the better it will be for the overall health of the lake.”

Strain said the program was designed to teach lakeside residents the basics of controlling giant salvinia but emphasized that the class is a requirement to obtain a giant salvinia herbicide permit.

More classes are scheduled for October.

“We encourage lakeside property owners to take the class and learn how to control giant salvinia, but they have to get a permit to be able to apply the herbicide legally,” Strain said.

To register for the class, call the Sabine River Authority at 318-

256-4112. The teaching session ends at 2 p.m. Lunch will be served to those who register before Aug. 12. Seating is limited.

Instructors from the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry’s Pesticide and Environmental Programs Division, Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and the LSU AgCenter will be conducting the educational seminar.

According to an LSU AgCenter report, giant salvinia (*Salvinia molesta*) does its damage by growing into dense mats that can eventually cover an entire waterbody with vegetation as thick as three feet. These mats smother native plants and phytoplankton by blocking the penetration of sunlight into the water. With no

phytoplankton present and no water surface open to the air, available dissolved oxygen rapidly becomes depleted, killing the fish in the waterbody. The loss of native aquatic plants and open water also destroys the value of an area as a waterfowl habitat.

The Louisiana Sabine River Authority, Toledo Bend Lake Association and the Toledo Bend Citizens Advisory Committee are sponsoring the seminar.

“I’m pleased that the LDAF can support Wildlife and Fisheries, the LSU AgCenter and the Louisiana Sabine River Authority in the fight to control this noxious weed, and I’m extremely glad to help Toledo Bend property owners in their efforts to control this aquatic pest,” Strain said.



Horseman wants to preserve trailriding tradition

Finding open spaces for recreational horseback riding is becoming more and more difficult as urban expansion and automobiles move into traditionally rural areas.

Trailriding groups are likely to run into obstacles from a variety of sources when they want to conduct an organized ride through towns and on highways.

Horseman Harry Latiolais of Carencro has proposed forming a statewide Louisiana trail-riding association to represent the interests of trailriders and the leisure equine industry.

The goal of the group would be to promote education and safety.

"The Louisiana tradition of saddle clubs holding trailrides has been around for a long time," Latiolais said. "I want to help create a group that

will represent that tradition and create guidelines for safe and proper trail-riding procedures that will insure the rights of everyone concerned."

The 68-year-old Latiolais has been riding horses for as long as he can remember.

"Growing up with horses is a wonderful experience and it's a tradition worth preserving," Latiolais said.

With a value of \$579 million, the equine industry is the fourth most valuable commodity in the state, according to the 2009 LSU Ag Summary. There are more than 203,000 horses in the state and 49,000 horse owners.

Louisiana seafood is fit for the grill

Perfectly grilled seafood is moist and flavorful – and it’s also fast and easy, says LSU AgCenter nutritionist Beth Reames.

“Seafood has smaller percentages of bones and connective tissues than equal portions of red meats or poultry,” Reames adds. “It’s an excellent source of protein, is low in fat and saturated fat and contains heart-healthy omega-3 fatty acids.”

Consumers don’t need to worry about the safety of eating Louisiana seafood following the oil spill, she says. All Louisiana seafood sold in retail stores and supermarkets, as well as in restaurants, is safe to eat.

Some Louisiana fishing waters have been closed as precautionary measures. But many areas remain open, and officials are conducting tests on both seafood and the water to ensure consumer safety.

The Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals and the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries along with federal agencies such as the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, FDA and EPA are testing more seafood than ever.

“All the tests are coming back showing that Louisiana seafood is safe to eat,” Reames says.

So if you decide to fire up the grill for your favorite Gulf offering, Reames offers these tips for perfectly grilled seafood:

– Preheat an outdoor gas or electric grill for at least 10 minutes. If you’re using a charcoal grill, start the fire about 30 minutes before cooking, let it burn until white-hot, and then spread the coals out in a single layer. To grill fish, a

moderately hot fire of 375 to 425 degrees is best.

– Make sure that the grill grates are clean, and then light-

grilling by very lightly spraying both sides of it with olive oil or vegetable oil (away from direct flames) and then sprinkling with your favorite seasonings. Avoid brushing or rubbing the seafood with your hands to prevent cross-contaminating other foods.

“Marinating fish an hour before grilling also helps keep it moist,” Reames says. “Shake off excess marinade before grilling to avoid flare-ups. If you’re going to use the marinade as a sauce on top of the cooked fish or seafood, boil the marinade at a rolling boil for 5 minutes to prevent food-borne illness.”

Finfish and large shrimp may be placed directly on the grate. Put smaller varieties in an oiled fish basket, on a small-mesh grilling screen or on perforated aluminum foil for easier handling and to prevent sticking.

Cook small whole or butterflied fish directly over the heat source, and use indirect heat for larger fish. To estimate cooking time, measure the seafood at its thickest part, and grill for 10 minutes per inch of thickness. Fish is done, but still moist, at an internal temperature of 145 degrees and when it turns opaque and just starts to flake when tested with a fork.

“Most seafood needs to be turned halfway through cooking,” Reames says. “Fish fillets thinner than 1 inch don’t need to be turned. Avoid turning fish back and forth because this will break it apart.”

Shrimp and Garlic Kabobs

- 12 to 16 large garlic cloves, peeled
- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 1/4 cup tomato sauce
- 2 tbsps. red wine vinegar
- 2 tbsps. chopped fresh thyme leaves
- 2 tsps. minced garlic
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper
- 1/4 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
- Pinch of sugar
- 2 lbs. Louisiana shrimp, 31-35 count, peeled and deveined (leave the tails on)

Drop the whole garlic cloves into boiling water and boil for about 3 minutes. Drain and set aside. Combine the olive oil, tomato sauce, vinegar, thyme, minced garlic, salt, cayenne, black pepper, and sugar in a large bowl and stir to mix well. Add the shrimp and toss to coat evenly. Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes. Remove the shrimp from the marinade and reserve any of the marinade left in the bowl. Thread the shrimp and whole garlic cloves alternately on skewers. Put the skewers on the grill (if you prefer, the kabobs can be arranged in a wire grill rack or basket). Grill, turning them several times and brushing them with the reserved marinade for 6 to 8 minutes or until the shrimp turn pink. Serve warm.

Chargrilled oysters

- Oysters, freshly shucked (on the half shell) - 24
- Salted butter - 1 lb.
- Green onions, chopped fine - 2 bunches
- Fresh garlic, puree - 20 toas
- Crushed red pepper - 1 tsp.
- Fresh thyme, chopped fine - 3 tbsp.
- fresh oregano, chopped fine 3 tbsp.
- Fresh lemon juice - 2 tbsp.
- Worchestershire sauce - 1 tbsp.
- Creole seasoning - 2 tbsp.
- White wine - 2 oz.
- Romano cheese, grated - 8 oz.
- French bread - 1 loaf

Butter garlic sauce should be prepared just prior to grilling the oysters. In a large saute pan add 2 sticks of butter and melt over medium heat. Add green onions, garlic, red pepper, thyme, oregano, lemon juice, worchestershire sauce and Creole seasoning. Cook for 2 minutes and add white wine. Stir ingredients continuously and cook until green onions are soft. Remove from heat and allow to cool for 3 minutes. In a large mixing bowl (before the mixture is completely cool) add remainng 2 sticks of butter and sauce. Blend until butter is folded into the sauce. Final product should be a creamy consistency.

Grilling Oysters: Pre-heat grill to 350 degrees. Once pre-heated, place freshly shucked oyster on the half shell on the center of the grill. Once the water around the oyster begins to bubble and the oyster begins to rise, ladle 1/2 an ounce of the butter garlic sauce on top of each oyster. Top with a 1/4 ounce of grated romano cheese. Allow cheese to melt. Oysters should brown slightly around the edges. Remove oysters and place on a heat-resistant plate or platter. While still hot add 1/2 ounce of butter sauce to the top of each oyster. Serve immediately with warm french bread for dipping.

Frank's Grill-Pan Curried Shrimp

- The Sauce:**
- 1 cup plain low fat yogurt
- 1/2 cup coarsely chopped fresh mint
- 3 tbsps. lime juice
- zest of 1 lemon
- The Shrimp:**
- 1 lb. 16-20 count Louisiana shrimp, peeled, deveined and butterflied
- 4 tbsps. toasted sesame oil
- 3 tbsps. curry powder, spicy
- 2 tsps. Frank Davis Seafood Seasoning
- Coarse ground black pepper, to taste

Preheat your grill pan over medium-high heat. Make sure it's well cleaned and liberally sprayed with nonstick cooking spray so that the shrimp don't stick to the grating while cooking. Next, make the coating sauce. Whisk together the yogurt, mint, lime juice, and lemon zest. When combined, set it aside so the flavors marry.

In a medium large bowl, toss the shrimp in the sesame oil until they are uniformly covered. Sprinkle on the curry powder and the seafood seasoning. Toss once again to get the shrimp "spicy." Using tongs, place the shrimp onto the hot metal grate (they may be touching but should not be tightly cramped).

When all the shrimp are in place, sprinkle with black pepper to taste and grill them, turning only once, until opaque (3 to 4 minutes per side). Serve with the yogurt sauce right out of the hot pan as an appetizer or on a bed of rice as an entrée. These are so tasty you might want to double the recipe!

LSU AgCenter poultry demonstration houses get chicks



The LSU AgCenter has started receiving birds in two commercial-sized broiler demonstration houses at the Hill Farm Research Station in Homer.

The houses will be used to test and demonstrate different types of heating equipment, said Bill Owens, Hill Farm resident coordinator.

With alternative heating and energy savings as big concerns among poultry growers, one house is equipped with radiant tube heating, and the other is heated by standard radiant brooders, Owens said.

Among production variables to be evaluated will be feed conversion rates and chick growth, along with monitoring ammonia and odor levels and energy and water use.

“We will look at the weight to see if the target is achieved in the proper length of time,” Owens said. “We are proud to be involved with the poultry industry and help the growers of Louisiana learn about equipment and procedures that will help them be more efficient and profitable.”

The LSU AgCenter is contracting with Raeford Farms of Louisiana, whose service technicians will visit the LSU AgCenter facility regularly and evaluate it just as they would do for other growers, to assure the operation is following the company’s management guidelines, Owens said.

Each building currently houses 21,400 birds, which arrived the last week of July.

Owens said a web camera will be installed eventually so people can view the operation.

Poultry production is Louisiana’s largest animal industry and the second largest segment of Louisiana’s agricultural industries. The total value of Louisiana poultry production during 2009 was \$884 million, when 800 million pounds of broiler meat were

produced.

More than 2,000 broiler houses operate in the parishes of Sabine, Natchitoches, Lincoln, Union, Jackson, Claiborne, Winn, Webster, Bienville, Vernon and Ouachita.
