LaHouse features hurricane protection

September is National Preparedness Month and the peak of the Atlantic/Gulf hurricane season. This month, the Louisiana House Resource Center, called LaHouse, features exhibits and information on many topics to help make your home and landscape more resistant to hurricanes.

When building or remodeling a home in south Louisiana, you need to be aware of flood and wind zones, according to Pat Skinner, disaster specialist with the LSU AgCenter. You can find wind- and flood-risk information for any location in Louisiana using the flood and wind speed maps at www.LSUAgCenter.com/flood-maps.

Several things can be done to make your home safer in the face of these threats, according to Claudette Reichel, LSU AgCenter housing specialist.

The LSU AgCenter and collaborators designed LaHouse facilities as an educational, sustainable housing and landscape exhibit on the LSU campus in Baton Rouge to demonstrate building features that show what works in meeting the challenges of Louisiana's climate and hazard exposure. Although it is in the 100 to 110

mph wind-speed zone and in a special flood hazard area, it is built to resist 130-mph winds and 3 feet above the 100 year flood elevation.

"LaHouse is a showcase for best practices and code-plus construction," Reichel said. "Its flood- and wind-resistance features meet or exceed the criteria of the Fortified for Safer Living program of the Institute for Business and Home Safety."

Construction began in 2004, and the house was at mid-construction when hurricanes Katrina and Rita struck south Louisiana in 2005.

The design, building systems, materials and installations were selected to withstand storms, rain, floods and termite hazards while also providing energy efficiency, environmental protection and healthy home benefits. Cut-aways and an exhibit room reveal key features and techniques – including hurricane connectors and structural components.

Hurricane hardware and structural sheathing at the LaHouse contribute to wind resistance by tying the *See LaHouse, continued on page 4*

Local sustainable food policy council created

The newly created Louisiana Sustainable Food Policy Council met for first time Sept. 8 at the Louisiana State Capitol.

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the State Legislature created the policy group to involve all state agriculture stakeholders and recommend a sustainable local food policy that can be applied to school lunch systems, government assistance programs and other public services.

The measure, sponsored by Rep. Scott M. Simon of Abita Springs, established the group.

“The council will help identify opportunities to build a sustainable local food economy that we believe will help stimulate job creation, economic development, preserve open spaces and increase consumer access to fresh, locally grown food,” Strain said. “Our local agricultural econo-

my is very important to the state and we want to explore possibilities that will allow more sustainable local food to be available for public assistance programs, the National School Lunch Program, Schools Breakfast Program and other services.”

In addition to Commissioner Strain and Rep. Scott, the council is comprised of representatives from various government agencies and delegates from the Louisiana Farm

Bureau, the LSU and Southern University AgCenters, the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, Louisiana Dietetics Association, Louisiana Meat Processors Association, a commercial fisherman and a farmers markets representative.

“Our goal for the council is to forge partnerships throughout our entire Louisiana food system and open doors for all facets of agriculture,” Simon said.

Strain cited that most of the recent economic development projects that have located in the state are agricultural based.

Restaurateur Dickie Brennan of Commander’s Palace spoke before the panel and said future generations will be relying on the recommendations the council makes.

“I’ve always had the philosophy to leave thing better than the way you

found it,” Brennan said. “This council will get all the players together and be able to create a vibrant, sustainable food economy for Louisiana and create opportunities for the next generation whether they’re in farming or distribution.”

Strain noted that many of the newer large economic development projects in Louisiana have centered on agriculture.

“ConAgra Foods Lamb Weston is opening a \$210 million sweet potato processing plant near Delhi. The Zagis USA cotton spinning plant in Lacassine is using Louisiana cotton and is the first major cotton project in Louisiana in decades. Foster Farms took over the Pilgrim’s Pride poultry operation in Farmerville and will have a payroll of more than \$24 million and we’ve just signed the contracts to build a new \$30 million New Orleans Cold Storage facility to

support our poultry industry,” Strain said. “We’re also developing plans to improve port facilities in Lake Charles for rice exportation and a rough rice loading facility to move rough rice by rail in Lacassine.”

The council will ultimately file its report to Commissioner Strain and the Legislature by January 2012.



You can plant vegetables in September in La.

Seed companies around the country report an uptick in the sales of vegetable seeds this year. An increased interest in home vegetable gardening generally occurs whenever we experience economic downturns. If you planted a spring/summer vegetable garden, don't forget to keep your garden productive with fall/winter plants. Some of the most popular and delicious vegetables are grown in Louisiana during the cool season from October to May.

Novice gardeners have a steep learning curve as they first get started. Common mistakes include inadequate bed preparation, planting at the wrong time, crowding plants too close together and improper harvesting. It's important to understand that a vegetable garden needs frequent, regular care to be successful. Even when the gardener does everything right, pest problems can damage or destroy a crop after all the effort. Fortunately, successes generally outweigh disappointments, and learning how to grow vegetables successfully is within everyone's ability.

As we move into the cool season, root crops such as carrot, radish and turnip are an important part of the garden. Root crops are always directly seeded into the soil – never transplanted. The tiny root first produced by the seed eventually develops into the edible root. It is easily damaged when the seedling is young, and this damage will cause a deformed, poor quality final product. When thinning root crops, don't be tempted to transplant extra seedlings to other spots – you'll be disappointed with the results.

Plant bush snap beans and lima beans now so they'll have time to produce a good crop before cold weather. Bush varieties produce faster and concentrate their harvest in a shorter period of time than pole beans, making them preferred for fall planting.

Plant seeds of bulbing onions, bunching onions and leeks this month. Sets – or small bulbs – of bunching onions and

shallots may also be planted this month, but don't plant sets of bulbing onions until early December. Select short-day varieties when choosing seeds or sets for bulbing onions. Onion seeds are slow to germinate and need a constant supply of water during the process. The seedlings grow slowly at first, so be patient. Onions, shallots, leeks and garlic,



which should be planted in October, are long-term residents in the cool-season vegetable garden. Bulbing onions, shallot bulbs, leeks and garlic will not be ready to harvest until late May or early June next year.

Work also needs to be done in the herb garden. Regularly remove the flower spikes of basil to encourage plants to continue to produce leaves. Ultimately, the plants will begin to wind down. Basil transplants could still be planted into the garden now for a late crop.

If herbs such as sage, lavender, thyme and catnip managed to make it through the summer, they should begin to revive as the weather gets cooler. Remove any dead parts and fertilize them lightly to encourage new growth. Many

herbs will have grown vigorously during the summer, particularly if not regularly harvested. Cut them back about half way to get them in to shape. Dry or freeze the extra harvest or share it with friends.

This month can be hot and dry, and with new plantings going in you should pay careful attention to the water needs of the garden. Newly planted transplants and seed beds are especially vulnerable to drought conditions and may need frequent – even daily – irrigation. As seeds come up and transplants become established, water deeply and less frequently to encourage a deep root system.

High populations of insects are around now, so be vigilant and treat problems promptly. If a crop is about to finish up, such as okra is now, you generally should not be as concerned about controlling pests on it as on a vegetable crop that has been planted more recently.

Caterpillars can be particularly troublesome in the fall garden. Regular applications of Bt, Spinosad or Sevin insecticides will keep their damage to a minimum. Spinosad will also control leaf miners. Control white flies and aphids with a light horticultural oil.

Vegetables to plant in September

Transplants or seeds of beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, Chinese cabbage, collards, English and snow peas, Irish potatoes (plant small, whole potatoes saved from the spring crop), kale, kohlrabi, leek, lettuce, mustard, onion, radish, rutabagas, shallots (plant sets), snap beans, Swiss chard and turnips.

Herbs to plant in September

Transplants of basil, sage, rosemary, thyme, oregano, chives, lavender, Mexican tarragon and mints. Seeds or transplants of dill, parsley, fennel, cilantro, arugula, borage, chamomile and chervil.

roof to the walls and the walls to foundation, Skinner said.

"You want your walls to do more than hold up the ceiling," she said. "Extra bracing of the walls may be needed to keep walls in place when the home is exposed to the high winds of a hurricane or tornado."

"Roofing materials are installed to high-wind specifications and have high-performance underlayments for an added line of defense against water damage. There is a model in the exhibit room layered to show the correct installation of shingle roofings for wind and water resistance," Reichel said. "Windows and doors are protected with a wide variety of wind-borne debris protections, ranging from impact-rated window units to impact-resistant shutters, panels and screens that could be added to existing homes."

The LaHouse landscape includes trails through its seven acres of exhibits, including storm-resistant trees, storm water-management features and horticul-

ture practices.

Visitors will also find a wide assortment of research-based publications on topics such as hurricane-resistant construction, storm recovery, elevating an existing home, preparing your landscape for hurricane season and mold removal.

LaHouse is open for the public to tour and ask questions about the many different building systems involved in its construction.

"LaHouse is open Monday-Friday 8 a.m.- 4:30 p.m. and walk-ins are always welcome," Matthew Keppinger, LaHouse coordinator said.

Groups of 10 or more are encouraged to call 225-578-7913 and schedule a tour.

"We have a meeting room that includes wireless internet and audiovisual capabilities," Keppinger said.

Thai Chicken and Rice Lettuce Wraps

1 tbsp. oil	1 cup julienne red bell pepper strips
3 cups cooked brown rice	Salt and pepper to taste
1 cup bottled peanut sauce plus extra for dipping	12 whole large leaves
3 cups cubed, grilled chicken breasts	Boston or iceberg lettuce
1 1/2 cups diced, peeled mango	

Heat oil in large nonstick skillet over medium heat; add cooked rice. Lightly saute rice, stirring frequently about 3 minutes. In large bowl, combine rice, peanut sauce, chicken, mango and bell pepper; toss to coat. Season with salt and pepper. Arrange lettuce leaves on large platter. Spoon rice mixture into center of each lettuce leaf and roll around filling to eat. Serve with additional peanut sauce for dipping, if desired.

Gorgonzola Lemon Rice

2 tbsps. olive oil	2 tbsps. fresh lemon juice
2 cups coarsely chopped fresh mushrooms	Salt & pepper to taste
1 (4 oz.) package Gorgonzola cheese crumbles	3 cups cooked rice
1/2 cup heavy cream	2 cups lightly-packed torn fresh spinach leaves
	2 tpsps. lemon zest

Heat oil in large saucepan over medium heat. Add mushrooms and cook until soft, about 4 minutes. Reduce heat to medium-low; stir in cheese and continue to stir frequently until cheese melts, about 3 minutes. Stir in cream, lemon juice, salt and pepper. Stir in rice and heat until hot, about 5 minutes. Toss in spinach just before serving. Garnish with lemon zest.

Indian-spiced Shrimp & Coconut-Pineapple Rice

1/2 cup water	1 tsp. pepper
1 (14 oz.) can light coconut milk	1 1/2 lbs. medium shrimp, peeled and deveined
1 (8 oz.) can pineapple tidbits, drained, juice reserved	2 tbsps. olive oil
1 1/2 tpsps. salt, divided	1/2 cup plus 2 tbsps. chopped green onions, divided
1 cup uncooked long grain white rice	
1 tbsp. garam masala*	

Bring water, coconut milk, 1/4 cup reserved pineapple juice, and 1/2 teaspoon salt to a boil in medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Stir in rice; cover and reduce heat to simmer. Cook 15 minutes, or until liquid is absorbed. Stir in pineapple and 1/2 cup green onions. Meanwhile, in large bowl, combine remaining 1 teaspoon salt, garam masala and pepper. Add shrimp and saute just until cooked through, about 4 to 5 minutes. Spoon rice onto platter; top with shrimp and remaining 2 tablespoons green onions.

*Garam masala is an Indian spice blend found in most supermarkets. If unavailable, substitute curry powder.

Grilled Corn Salad with Black Beans & Rice

2/3 cup short grain brown rice	1/2 cup hot tomato salsa, preferably chipotle
1 (15 oz.) can black beans, rinsed	1/2 cup orange juice
3 large ears corn, husked	1/3 cup lime juice
2 med. red onions, cut into 3/8" slices	3 tbsps. chopped fresh cilantro
1 green bell pepper, cored & quartered lengthwise	1 tbsp. canola oil
1 small ripe avocado	3/4 tsp. ground cumin
	Salt & pepper to taste

Cook rice in a large pot of boiling salted water, until al dente, 25 to 30 minutes. Drain and rinse. Place in a large bowl, toss with beans and set aside. Meanwhile, preheat grill. Oil the grill rack (see Tip). Grill corn, onions and bell pepper, turning frequently, until tender and charred, 10 to 12 minutes. Cut kernels from cobs and add to reserved rice and beans. Dice the bell pepper and half the onions; add to the rice mixture. Place the remaining onions in a mixing bowl. Peel and dice avocado; add half to rice mixture and half to the bowl with sliced onions. Whisk salsa, orange juice, lime juice, cilantro, oil and cumin in a small bowl. Season with salt and pepper. Toss 3 tablespoons of the salsa mixture with sliced onions and avocado. Toss the rest with rice mixture. Spoon rice mixture onto a serving dish and top with onion-avocado mixture. Serve with chips, if desired.

South-of-the-border Lasagna

1 1/2 cups sour cream	1 (15 to 16 oz.) can black beans, drained and rinsed
1 1/2 cups salsa	3 cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided
Vegetable cooking spray	2 cups crushed tortilla chips
6 cups cooked rice, divided	

In medium bowl, combine sour cream and salsa; set aside. Coat a 13x9-inch baking dish with cooking spray. Layer bottom of dish with 3 cups rice. Top with half of the sour cream mixture, then with 1-1/2 cups cheese. Add layer of beans, remaining rice, and remaining sour cream mixture. Bake at 350 degrees 15 minutes; remove from oven. Mix remaining cheese with chips and sprinkle on lasagna. Return to oven and bake 5 minutes, or until cheese melts.

Mango-lime Pudding

3 cups cooked white rice	1 (14 oz.) can sweetened condensed milk
3 cups milk	2 ripe mangos, peeled and finely chopped
1/8 teaspoon salt	3 tbsps. fresh lime juice

Combine rice, milk and salt in a large saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring frequently, until thick and creamy, about 15 to 18 minutes. Stir in condensed milk, mangoes and lime juice. Spoon into bowls and serve at room temperature or slightly chilled.

Annual LFA convention held in Bossier City

Tina Meiners of Lake Charles was named to the Louisiana Forestry Commission (LFC) at the August meeting of the LFC. The appointment was later announced to the forestry community at the Sept. 1 Louisiana Forestry Association (LFA) annual convention in Bossier City. She is the first woman to serve on the commission.

In addition to Meiners' appointment, Richard P. "Dick" Meaux of Lafayette was awarded the 2010 Louisiana Outstanding Tree Farmer prize and Kenneth Morgan of G.W. Morgan Logging honored as the 2010 Louisiana Outstanding Logger.

Meiners is a forester serving as the East Division General Manager for Forest Capital Partners, LLC.

Meiners has her B.S. from the University of Kentucky and her M.S. from Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

She formerly worked for Boise Cascade and has 27 years experience as a forester.

Richard P. "Dick" Meaux of Lafayette was named Outstanding Tree Farmer for his forestland located in five parishes. Meaux and his wife, Bobbye, have 728 acres of forestland in Beauregard, Rapides, DeSoto, Acadia and Union parishes.

"Mr. Meaux uses his property as a personal and family retreat," said Steve

Templin, consulting forester who nominated him. "He has demonstrated an organized approach with the goal of annual harvests and sustainability. He has restored longleaf pine on 120 acres and has long sustained efforts to manage the property for his family's benefit."

Meaux is a retired superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Lafayette. He also served for 23 years in the U.S. Navy ending his career as a captain.

The forestland located in Beauregard Parish is both a working tree farm and a getaway for the family. The location features a cabin, pond and dog trot house built from lumber milled on the site.

A portion of the property dates back to Meaux's father who enrolled the property in the Tree Farm program in 1960.

His father influenced Meaux in other ways. "My dad was a county agent in Allen Parish during the 1930s," he said. "I went with him throughout the parish and I remember there was a lot of cutover land."

When they visited an old Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) camp near the Reeves community, his father was intrigued with the reforestation work.

Meaux has continued that reforestation on his own property. Since 1996, he has planted 615 acres of loblolly, longleaf and

slash pine on various tracts. He has a forest management plan in place and his tree farm certification dates back to 1973.

Recreation is a big part of the Meaux family's attachment to the land. Fishing tournaments, family hunts with their friends and popular gatherings have drawn the couple and their two children to the place. "It's lived up to every dream we had," said Bobbye. Daughter Jean-Marie echoed the thought. "I would love to think that 20 years from now we would still be getting together here," she said.

"Forestry is a \$2.5 billion industry in Louisiana," said C.A. "Buck" Vandersteen, LFA executive director. "Family forests are the lifeblood of our state where 81 percent of the forestland is owned by private non-industrial landowners like the Meaux family."

The LFA and the Louisiana Logging Council also named Kenneth Morgan of G.W. Morgan Logging as the Outstanding Logger of the year at the convention.

Judging for the award was lead by a team headed by Mark Gibson and Clyde Vidrine of Louisiana Tech University School of Forestry. Other judges were Mike Dawson of the U.S. Forest Service and Mark Martinez, the 2009 Outstanding Logger.

Morgan is a third generation logger and

his office in Saline is the original home of his grandfather, Homer. Kenneth and his sister, Sherry, co-own the business once run by their father, Jerry. Morgan's father also won the award in 1995.

Morgan was nominated for the award by Brent Deen and Scott Bertrand of Roy O. Martin Lumber Company.

"Kenneth's forestry degree gives him a unique perspective," said Deen. "He helps us to get out in front of issues before they become problems."

Morgan has two crews and 10 men in the woods along with eight truck drivers. He also uses two contract trucks.

"One good thing has come of this recession," said Morgan. "The men value their jobs more and I value them more."

Foremen for the crews are Stephen Brown and J.R. Conlay. Others on the crew are Junior Branch, Seth Garlington, Murray "Bull" Toms, Randall Quick, David Caldwell, Earnest Lee Lard and Thomas Holland. Truck drivers are Fred Holland, Sonny Fredieu, Kerrick Lard, Darryl Choate, Audry Jemerson, David Lovell, Tony Patterson and Reuben Redding.

Morgan and his wife, Rebecca, have two children—Preston, 18, and Sidney, 14. Sherry has one daughter, Kaitlyn.
