## As drought conditions continue, statewide burn ban remains in effect

LDAF wildland firefighters Jeff Anders and Larry Moore survey a wildfire in the Bodcau Wildlife Management Area in Bossier Parish. The fire burned a little more than an acre. A cypress tree in Lake Bistineau burns from the inside. The Lake Bistineau fire has been smoldering for more than a month.

The weather is always a double-edged sword. In 2009, Louisiana farmers suffered from one of the wettest Octobers ever. Sweet potatoes rotted in fields. Cotton was left unpicked because fields were too wet to harvest. Disaster assistance was needed.

How things change. The Aug.-Sept. 2010 period has become one of the state's driest ever with rainfall 12 inches below average in some parts of the state.

While dry days may create good harvesting weather, the arid conditions are creating a tinderbox for wildfires.

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. and State Fire Marshall Butch Browning declared a statewide outdoor burn ban Oct. 2.

The burn ban was justified by the numbers.

LDAF Forest Protection officials reported a 726 percent spike in fire numbers for the Aug.-Sept. 2010 peri-

od over the 2009 figure (407 wildland fires burned more than 3,458 acres vs. 56 fires burning 152 acres in Aug. Sept 2009). That's also a 2,270 percent increase in acreage burned. To put it in perspective, the acreage lost is more than twice the size of LSU's Baton Rouge campus.

Jeff Anders, an LDAF District 1 forest parish supervisor, said the wildfire situation is among the worst he's ever seen.

"We're very busy," Anders said. "We're chasing fires from daylight to dark."

District 1 is comprised of Caddo, Bossier, Webster, Claiborne, Bienville, Lincoln, Union and Jackson parishes.

"I feel like this year is probably worse in this area than in 2000," Anders said.

In 2000, the state suffered from several large wildfires. One fire in southwestern Louisiana burned more *See burn ban, continued on page 20*

# Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

## \$20 million available to aquaculture producers

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) is providing \$20 million in grant money for farm-raised aquaculture producers who need assistance due to 2009's high feed input costs.

The grant covers eligible pro-

ducers throughout Louisiana. "Aquaculture producers have been hurt by the continual increase in feed costs over the last several years," Strain said. "I urge all aquaculture producers to apply for this critical program."

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) will administer the program

through LDAF's financial arm, the Louisiana Agricultural Finance Authority (LAFA), Strain added.

To be eligible, a producer must have raised an aquaculture species in a controlled environment in 2009. The producer's 2009 feed costs must be at least 25 percent of his total input costs for the aquaculture operation.

The producer must also have incurred at least a 25 percent price increase of 2009 feed costs above the state's 2003-2007 five-year average feed price.



## LSU AgCenter to host Biodiesel workshop

The LSU AgCenter will conduct a comprehensive workshop on how to make biodiesel from used vegetable oil on Oct. 30 at the W. A. Callegari Environmental Center in Baton Rouge.

“This is an advanced workshop and different from the workshops we offered in the summer of 2008,” said Bill Carney, LSU AgCenter environmental educator and director of the Callegari Center.

The workshop will begin at 9 a.m. and conclude at 4:00, with a break for lunch, Carney said.

“It will be very hands-on. We’ll actually make biodiesel

during the workshop and demonstrate the three phases of the process – reaction, washing and drying,” he said. “The participants will be taught how to turn a waste product into quality biodiesel.”

In addition to learning the chemistry of making biodiesel, the class will see the different types of equipment required to make used vegetable oil into quality biodiesel. The equipment will be on display.

“People can make biodiesel in their backyards for as little as a \$1,000 investment,” Carney said. “Or they can spend up to \$10,000. The average is about

\$2,000-\$3,000. But they shouldn’t invest in any equipment if they don’t have a reliable source of used vegetable oil.”

Participants also will learn how to troubleshoot if they run into problems making their own biodiesel, Carney said.

Cost for the workshop is \$50, and participation is limited to 15 people. To register, call Sondra Rodriguez at 225-578-6998.

## Melville ferry to remain open throughout harvest season

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the Melville ferry service will remain in place until Dec. 31.

The Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development (DOTD) planned to close the Melville ferry Oct. 9.

Strain said his office received urgent requests from area producers and state Sen. Eric LaFleur to keep the ferry service operating through harvest season.

“Area producers use the ferry to transport farm equipment across the Atchafalaya River, saving time and fuel,” Strain said.

LaFleur said closing the ferry now would be a tough blow to the Melville area agricultural producers.

“Closing the ferry in Melville is the equivalent to closing I-49 in Lafayette,” LaFleur

said. “The ferry is the connection for the economic vitality of Melville and that area of St. Landry Parish, particularly for agriculture.”

Strain said he and LaFleur brought these concerns to DOTD Secretary Sherri LeBas for assistance in the matter.

“Sen. LaFleur and I feel it is in the best interest of the area’s agricultural community to continue the Melville ferry service at least until harvesting is completed and Secretary LeBas agreed,” Strain said.

“I thank Sen. LaFleur and Secretary LeBas for taking the necessary steps to help the Melville area farmers.”

Melville is situated in St. Landry Parish. Among the crops grown in the parish, soybeans and sweet potatoes are currently being harvested.



In a large bowl, combine 1 cup cheese, water and taco seasoning. Crumble beef over mixture and mix well. Shape into 16 balls. Place meatballs on a greased rack in a shallow baking pan. Bake, uncovered, at 400 degrees for 12 minutes or until meat is no longer pink. Drain meatballs on paper towels. Reduce heat to 375 degrees. Arrange crescent rolls on a greased 15 inch pizza pan, forming a ring with pointed ends facing the outer edge of the pan and wide ends overlapping. Place a meatball on each roll, fold point over meatball and tuck under wide end of roll (meatball will be visible). Repeat. Bake for 15-20 minutes or until rolls are golden brown. Transfer to a serving platter. Fill the center of the ring with lettuce, tomato, onions, olives, jalapenos, remaining cheese & sour cream and salsa if desired.

3 med. onions, finely chopped	2 ½ cups water
2 med. bell peppers, finely chopped	season-all (your favorite)
1 (4 oz.) can tomato sauce	2 tsp. ketchup
1 (10.5 oz.) can cream of celery soup	2 lbs. Louisiana crawfish tails
	4 cups cooked white rice

Sauté onions and bell pepper in butter for 2 hours. Season to your taste. Add tomato sauce, sauté for 30 minutes. Add cream of celery and cream of mushroom soups, with 2 ½ cups water. Add ketchup and bring to boil. Add crawfish tails, cook on low heat for 30 minutes. Serve over rice.

than 40,000 acres that year.

It's bad for home and camp-owners along the shore of Lake Bistineau near Shreveport. A wildfire flamed in the Lake Bistineau lakebed over the Labor Day weekend and is still smoldering and burning in mid-October.

The fire was created by an ecological perfect storm. The lakebed was infested with giant salvinia. A water drawdown was in process to help get rid of the noxious waterweed. The salvinia residue and years of organic accumulation dried out and somehow a fire got started. Forty-five days later (and counting), the dry lakebed is still smoldering and occasionally flaming. The smoldering wildfire site is also keeping the Bossier City Fire Departments on alert and expending valuable parish and state resources.

The fire numbers for October continue to rise and test the limits of LDAF firefighting crews. As of Oct. 13, 304 fires have burned more than 4,108 acres of woods. That's an area larger than 12 Audubon Parks.

Even though thunderstorms passed through the state on Oct. 11-12, the rainfall was barely a drop in the proverbial bucket to quench the dry conditions. The burn ban will remain in effect until significant rainfall changes the weather conditions.

"The rainfall barely touched the forest floor," said Bret Lane, an LDAF Forest Protection official.

The current burn ban does not apply to producers like sugarcane farmers who regularly burn their fields during harvest time.

"Sugarcane field burning is an accepted cultural production practice and is exempted from the current burn ban," Strain said. "But those farmers are still responsible for controlling their own field fires."

How do wildfires get started? Lane said many wildfires can be blamed on negligence, hence the burn ban.

"It doesn't take very much for a trash fire to get out of hand," Lane said. "The conditions are very conducive to create wildfires."

A Holden man was cited for criminal negligence Oct. 7 in connection with a wildland fire in Livingston Parish. While early media reports indicated the Livingston fire was more than 6,000 acres, LDAF Forest Protection officials determined the fire was only 450 acres.

Charlie Sibley, 52, of 23697 Stafford Cemetery Road, was eventually issued a summons by LDAF enforcement investigators for violating Revised Statute 14:204 (Fire Raising on Lands of Another by Criminal Negligence).

Sibley allegedly burned a debris pile at his house on the evening of Oct. 1 and doused it with water. On the morning of Oct. 2, Sibley left the premises, but the thought-to-be-extinguished fire rekindled and burned Weyerhaeuser Company timber valued at \$500,000.

If convicted, Sibley faces a maximum fine of \$300 or 30 days imprisonment, or both.

Arsonists set other wildfires deliberately, Lane said.

Jesse Dale Miller, 30, 1087 Lone Star Road of Many was arrested Oct. 6 and accused of setting four separate woodland fires near the Belmont community in Sabine Parish.

Units from LDAF Forest Protection and Belmont Volunteer Fire Department suppressed the fires. Only one acre of timberland was burned.

LDAF Enforcement Manager Jim Baldwin said investigators determined Miller was allegedly at the scene of the fire.

"Our investigation found that there were two fires set on each side of Lone Star Road Oct. 4," Baldwin said. "On Tuesday (Oct. 5), LDAF crews went back and put out a

fire in the morning and another fire in the afternoon. During our interview with Mr. Miller, he admitted responsibility for the fires."

During the course of the investigation, Miller led firefighters to a fourth fire they had overlooked, Baldwin said. That fire was quickly suppressed.

Budget cuts to the Forestry Office have resulted in larger fire districts and fewer firefighters, Strain said.

The LDAF extends wildfire detection and suppression services for 18.9 million acres," Strain said. "Of those 18.9 million acres, the LDAF receives wildfire detection

and suppression funding from landowners for only 53 percent of the protected area."

Detecting and suppressing wildfire is a serious issue, Strain said.

"In addition to destroying timber land, a small fire can easily flame out of control and threaten life and property," Strain said. "Woods arson is a serious crime and my department will investigate all cases fully and press for the maximum punishment."

"Forestry is Louisiana's largest agricultural industry and everyone - hunters, wildlife preservationists, landowners and recreational users - has a responsibility to protect and preserve our forest."

## Ag groups to discuss new rules proposed by GIPSA

The National Agricultural Law Center at the University of Arkansas and the Louisiana Farm Bureau Poultry Committee is hosting a workshop in Dubach for poultry and livestock producers to discuss the new rules proposed by the Grain Inspection, Packers and Stockyards Administration (GIPSA).

The meeting will be held Oct. 28 at Lincoln Hall, 149 Fairgrounds Road in Dubach from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.

GIPSA is the federal agency responsible for issuing regulations that govern contracting, buying and selling of livestock and poultry.

The proposed rules could change the way producers, packers, dealers and contractors

raise, buy and sell livestock and poultry.

The workshop will be presented by the National Agricultural Law Center of the University of Arkansas.

The Law Center will provide and overview of the GIPSA proposed rule changes for poultry and livestock, review the USDA rule making process, explain how to submit comments on the proposed rules and include a question and answer session for participants.

The Law Center was established by Congress in 1987 to conduct legal research into issues facing agriculture and food law.

## \$60 million lost poultry contract assistance program available

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said four educational workshops to help Louisiana poultry producers apply for the Poultry Loss Contract Grant Assistance Program will be held Nov. 1 and 2.

The \$60 million grant program was set up by the United States Department of Agriculture to aid poultry producers who lost contracts due to the 2008 bankruptcy of Pilgrim's Pride. The grant covers eligible producers throughout Louisiana.

To be eligible, poultry producers must have lost their contract with the bankrupt poultry supplier between May 1, 2008 and July 1, 2010 and have suffered a financial loss.

Strain said the program will allow growers to recoup losses due to the Pilgrim's Pride bankruptcy.

"Poultry farmers rely on their contracts with their integrators," Strain said. "No doubt chicken farmers were hurt when Pilgrim's Pride went into bankruptcy. Not all growers signed new agreements with Foster Farms, but this program is designed to help all the growers who lost their contracts."

The Louisiana Agricultural Finance Authority within the LDAF will administer the program and will begin holding a series of informational meetings in the affected areas in early November.
