## Strain Says Farmers Must Flex Political Muscle

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain said the state's farmers need to protect and strengthen their position if they are to take advantage of the increasing worldwide demand for food, clothing and shelter.

"Here in Louisiana, agriculture can control its own destiny," Strain said. "The Farm Bill is under attack by people who don't know any better. We have to educate them."

Strain and other ag officials spoke July 8 to the 89th annual convention of the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation. About 1,000 farmers and their families were in the Crescent City July 7-10. Strain, Farm Bureau President Ronnie Anderson and Bill Richardson, chancellor of the LSU AgCenter spoke to the general session of the convention Friday.

Strain, who told the group he plans to run for reelection in the fall, said farmers must urge Congress to fully fund farm programs which are part of the 2012 Farm Bill.

"Agriculture makes up less than one-half of one percent of the (federal) budget and yet it's the largest industry in the United States," Strain said. "Agriculture is the foundation of our entire economy and we must work together to protect it. We must begin to flex our muscles at all levels."

Strain said "Mom and Pop America" is under duress because of higher food prices, but contended those stresses are partly caused by undue government restriction. He used the regulation of the nation's federal guest worker program as an example.

"There are more and more restrictions on H2A and H2B workers," Strain said. "Restrictions cost money in the pocketbook of the average American."

Strain urged the convention attendees to contact their state and national political leaders and tell them to protect agriculture, forestry and aquaculture.

"It's political season," Strain said. "Visit with everybody running. Go see your legislators. They must understand who we are, what we do and what we produce."

Farm Bureau President Ronnie Anderson echoed Strain's comments. Anderson, who recently returned from a meeting with the state's congressional delegation in Washington, D.C., said a fully-funded Farm Bill helps all Americans.

"When you consider the bulk of federal spending in the Farm Bill is for food and nutrition programs, it's really low income and working families who benefit," Anderson said. "Farm program spending offers farmers a safety net when commodity prices fall. It's a way to keep farmers producing the food that keeps our nation secure."

LSU AgCenter Chancellor Bill Richardson told farmers he would go before the LSU Board of Supervisors July 15 requesting permission to declare of state of financial emergency for the AgCenter.

"Since 2008 we've lost 20 percent of our budget," Richardson said. "We've closed three of our research stations and we're looking at closing more."

Over the past few months, the AgCenter has closed three of its 20 research stations, the Coastal Area in Plaquemines Parish, the Rosepine Station in Vernon Parish and the Calhoun Research Station in Ouachita Parish.

Richardson said the AgCenter has eliminated 328 positions, more than a quarter of its workforce, since 2008. Despite these losses the chancellor he still faces a \$3.1 million deficit over last year's budget. If the emergency status is approved, he would be able to eliminate more jobs, which is the only way he will be able to sustain core programs, he said.

## Caddo Parish man arrested in 250-acre wildfire

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said state forestry agents arrested a north Caddo Parish man July 11 for negligence in a wildland fire that burned 250 acres of timber near the Trees community.

James D. Cook, 5236 Hwy. 2, Hosston, was arrested at the Caddo Correctional Center in Shreveport and charged with "Fire Raising on Lands of Another." Cook posted a \$2,658 bond and was released July 14.

The fire also destroyed a fishing camp, motorhome, bass boat and storage building.

Forestry Enforcement Manager Jim Baldwin said the estimated timber damage was \$300,000. No loss estimate has been determined

for the property.

Baldwin said Cook allegedly allowed a wildland fire to get out of control as he was using a cutting torch to dismantle a large air compressor off Section 22 Road and Frog Island Road.

"On the morning of June 18th, Mr. Cook was using a cutting torch, and according to witnesses, a fire started from the torch and hot metal slag," Baldwin said. "The two witnesses had 10 gallons of water in their truck and thought the fire was extinguished, but Mr. Cook allegedly left the scene without ensuring that the fire was out."

A local resident reported the fire burning under and around the compressor at noon and called 911, Baldwin said.

A dozen units from Caddo Parish Fire District Seven, mutual aid units from Texas, and four dozer crews from the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry responded to the fire.

Strain said the drought conditions in the northwestern part of the state have made the area extremely vulnerable to wildfire.

"It's difficult to comprehend how dry it is across the state right now and how easily a fire can start and get out of control," Strain said. "Because of flare-ups, it took LDAF firefighting crews three days before this particular fire was fully contained."

"The LDAF and the State Fire Marshal issued a state-wide burn ban on outdoor fires June 1 and we

will continue to strictly enforce it to protect life, property and our forest resources."

There are a few exceptions to the burn ban, Strain said.

"The current burn ban does not apply to prescribed burns conducted by the LDAF or those performed by persons trained and certified by the LDAF," Strain said. "Prescribed burning that is considered a generally accepted agricultural practice as defined by the Louisiana Right to Farm Law (R.S. 3:3601 et seq.) is also allowed, but not recommended at this time."

The LDAF extends wildfire detection and suppression services to 18.9 million acres of developed and undeveloped land across the state. Of the 18.9 million acres, the



## Congressional hearing focuses on giant salvinia

A Brazilian weevil that feeds on giant salvinia is a biological control for the invasive species that has been taking over water bodies in Louisiana since it was first discovered in the state in the Toledo Bend reservoir in 1999.

Dearl Sanders, an invasive species specialist for the LSU AgCenter, explained how the weevil works at a Congressional Natural Resources Subcommittee hearing at LSU-Shreveport June 27.

Sanders, who has reared weevils that have been used to control giant salvinia on local water bodies, and other witnesses were invited to offer their ideas for control or eradication strategies of the invasive species and costs involved.

Giant salvinia is native to Brazil and spread to many areas of the world in the 1950s and 1960s. Experts have employed several control measures, including herbicide sprays, mechanical control, booms, drawdowns, educating the general public and weevils.

The larvae of the weevils ease some of the problem by burrowing into the rhizomes of salvinia, Sanders explained. Adults eat leaves and buds, inhibiting plant growth. Larval feeding causes the leaves to first darken and then drop off. The combined feeding by larvae and adults kills the plant.

In partnership with the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, the LSU AgCenter helped collect and transport more than 30 tons of weevil-infested giant salvinia with approximately one million weevils to Lake Bistineau near Bossier City and four other north Louisiana lakes in 2009.

Sanders said the weevils have reduced salvinia 90 percent in some areas in south Louisiana, but they have not survived the cold winters in the Shreveport area. He said research needs to be directed on finding a strain that can accommodate low winter temperatures.

The LSU AgCenter has helped establish weevil nurseries in Lafourche, Terrebonne and St. Charles parishes.

Sanders also has conducted an extensive grass carp biological control study that confirmed that grass carp will not eat giant salvinia even when it is the only plant available. "Grass carp only eating giant salvinia died," Sanders said. "Giant salvinia contains a metabolic toxin."

Various panel members explained that giant salvinia grows in thick mats and blocks sunlight, deoxygenates the water and leads to fish kills. It clings to boat motors and trailers and doubles surface area covered every day and a half.

One treatment chemical costs \$1,851 a gallon, according to Robert Barham, secretary of the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries.

He called giant salvinia a "science fiction challenge" and named Lake Bistineau the poster location.

"All the help you can give us we can use," Barham said.

Damon Waitt, senior director and botanist at the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center at the University of Texas at Austin, said he camped, caught his first fish, skied and met girls at Lake Bistineau. "Nature deficit disorder did not exist at Bistineau. It is sad to think these kinds of experiences are no longer available to the 11-year-olds of 2011," Waitt said.

"You have in this room all the ingredients to address the threat of giant salvinia - research, biocontrol, herbicide programs, volunteer support, a management plan. What seems to be lacking is the recipe that combines these ingredients into a coordinated effort that will solve the giant salvinia problem," Waitt said.

He recommended integrated management resources across jurisdictional boundaries.

## New seed directories available on LDAF website

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry is now issuing a certified seed directory for sugarcane and a separate one for other commodities.

"Based on industry demand and the usefulness of the publications, our seed laboratory has decided to separate seed sugarcane growers into one certified directory and turfgrass, rice, small grains and sweet potatoes into another," Strain said.

The directories list the approved certified seed conditioner facilities, the acreage for certification and general seed certification information.

Strain said farmers rely on the certified seed directories because the directories enable producers to determine what varieties of seed are available and the seed quantities available for sale for the current growing season.

Currently there are 62 certified seed vendors in the state for rice, sweet potatoes, turfgrass, oats, wheat and sugarcane. The yield from approximately 13,500 acres of certified seed grown annually in Louisiana allows the production of 1.2 million acres of certified seed crops.

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's seed program compiles the directories each year.

## LSU Dairy Store still cool almost 40 years later

From its humble beginnings in 1973 as a project between the student government association and the Dairy Science Department, the popularity of the LSU Dairy Store remains strong.

For many, grabbing an ice cream cone from the dairy store is one of the highlights of their visit to the LSU Baton Rouge campus.

But ice cream is but one of the many items now available from the store, according to LSU dairy science professor Chuck Boeneke.

"We now have meats such as lamb, beef, pork and goat," he said. "We also have sandwiches, different cheeses and coffee drinks in addition to ice cream."

The store recently began selling boudin and hot sausage poboy, Boeneke said.

In addition to products at the South Stadium Drive location, the store also provides ice cream to cafeterias across the campus and has sold ice cream at home football games.

Funded by the LSU main campus and the LSU AgCenter, the dairy store's ice cream and cheese are made from milk supplied by the campus dairy farm and brought to the creamery which is a research and teaching facility.

The creamery is the manufacturing facility that allows students to learn the process of making ice cream and cheese

which are sold in the dairy store.

"We do a lot of teaching and a lot of research, and we use the creamery to accomplish both of those functions,"

Boeneke said

Most of the work at the store is done by students who can be from any major.

"When we are really busy, we probably

are selling somewhere between 250 and 300 gallons of ice cream per week," Boeneke said.

In addition to cones and cups of ice cream, customers also can buy three gallon buckets.

"Our ice cream is made with non-fat dry milk, cream and pure cane sugar," he said.

Several departments on campus conduct research at the creamery as well as people from private industry who come to learn from the work there.

"We had a joint project with Southern University and the University of Liberia. Where we did a mentoring program, and one of the ladies from Africa was in the ice cream business," Boeneke said. "She came and spent a few months here, and I mentored her; showing her how the store works. So it's a very diverse operation."

The dairy science program at LSU is growing, and Boeneke said almost all of the students have jobs when they graduate.

"Most of our students begin their careers with salaries around \$50,000 per year with a bachelor's degree," he said.

LSU dairy science students are being placed in management trainee positions at Kroger, Leprino Foods, Pizza Hut and other large food companies.



### Poppy Seed & Chicken Salad

3-4 cooked chicken breasts (cut into bite size pieces)	4 tbsp. vinegar
3 green onions, sliced thin	2 tsp salt
1 small pkg. sliced almonds	½ tsp. pepper
½ cup poppy seeds	½ cup salad oil
4 tbsp. sugar	

Mix all together well & chill one hour. Add one can Chinese noodles before serving so noodles stay crisp.

2 cup diced, cooked chicken	2 hard cooked eggs, chilled and chopped
2 tbsp. lemon juice	½ cup mayonnaise
½ tsp. salt	¼ cup pecans
1 cup celery, diced	salt & pepper, to taste
1 cup seedless white grapes	

Sprinkle chicken with lemon juice & salt, chill several hours. Add chopped chicken, celery, grapes, chopped eggs, mayonnaise & nuts, toss lightly. Add salt & pepper to taste. Place salad on serving plate.

### Crawfish Maquechoux Salad

1 (29 oz) can whole kernel corn, drained	<b>Dressing ingredients:</b>
1 lb. cooked Louisiana crawfish tail meat	½ cup olive oil
1 stalk celery, chopped	6 tbsp. sugar
3 plum tomatoes, seeded & chopped	4 tbsps. cider vinegar
½ bell pepper, chopped	1 ½ tsp. salt
2 green onions, chopped	¾ tsp. fresh ground black pepper
	½ tsp. cayenne pepper
	½ tsp. garlic powder

In a large bowl, combine salad ingredients as listed. In a smaller bowl, whisk together the dressing ingredients. Let dressing sit at least 30 minutes so that sugar dissolves completely. Mix dressing into salad & combine thoroughly.

### Broccoli Salad

One or two heads of broccoli, finely chopped	½ cup sweet onion or red onion, chopped
1 cup raisins	Add dried cranberries & red bell pepper if desired.
1 cup cheddar cheese, grated	

Combine above ingredients, then mix in the following:

1 cup mayonnaise	2 tbsp. pecans or walnuts
¼ cup apple cider vinegar	add sugar to taste

Mix mayonnaise & vinegar. Add sugar to taste, fold in nuts and pour over salad.

### Janet's Over Night Coleslaw

1 (16 oz) pkg. coleslaw mix	1/3 cup sugar or 2 pkgs. Splenda
2 pkgs. Ramen noodles, (beef or chicken)	¾ cup vegetable oil
1 cup sliced almonds	1/3 cup apple cider vinegar
1 cup sunflower kernels	Optional: 1 can mandarin oranges, drained
1 bunch green onions, chopped	

Crush noodles as bottom layer in dish, then layer mix, coleslaw, almonds, sunflower kernels, oranges and green onions. Layer the above, but do not mix. Mix one flavor packet from noodles with sugar, oil & vinegar. Pour over layered salad. Do not mix. Refrigerate. Toss before serving.

### Louisiana Peach Crisp

6 cups fresh peaches, peeled & sliced	1 ½ cup light brown sugar, firmly packed, divided
2 tsp. cinnamon, ground (divided)	½ cup butter, softened
1 ½ cups all-purpose flour (divided)	¼ tsp. salt

Place peaches in a mixing bowl. Mix together ½ c. flour, ½ c. brown sugar & 1 tsp. cinnamon, mix well with sliced peaches. Place peach mixture in the bottom of a lightly buttered 9x13 inch baking dish, set aside. Combine remaining flour, sugar & cinnamon with the salt in a medium mixing bowl; cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse meal. Sprinkle mixture evenly over peaches in dish. Bake in a pre-heated 375 degree oven for 45 minutes or until golden brown. Serve warm with vanilla ice cream.

## TWILA, not your grandpa's farm report

If you like news stories about dogs trapped in drain gutters, tune into your local TV station's news broadcast.

I'm with Paul Simon, the songwriter, and "get the news I need from the weather report." That's usually enough, but people who rely on the weather to make their living, that is, farmers, ranchers, horticulturists and fishermen, watch TWILA.

TWILA is not the name of a choreographer. This Week In Louisiana Agriculture, produced in Baton Rouge, is the arguably the most solid news broadcast on the cable system today. The subject matter is firmly rooted in agriculture. And with consumer interest in farmers markets, food safety, organic fruits and vegetables, bio-fuel, cooking and carbon footprints at an all-time high, TWILA is the best place to find out what's going on in the garden, chicken coop, pasture, strawberry patch and the cotton field. In other words, it ain't your grandpa's pork belly report anymore.

And you don't have to be a news junkie to enjoy TWILA, because the news is mostly about something everybody loves: food.

Host Mike Danna provides TWILA's gravitas. Danna, a savvy student of the media, has transformed the farm world into a news-you-can-use 21st century experience. In most TV markets, the half-hour show is broadcast in the early

## Farm Bureau honors Franklin's Regnal Wallace

*Regnal Wallace created both the Louisiana Farm Bureau Radio Network and the television show, This Week in Louisiana Agriculture.*

Franklin Parish's Regnal Wallace has been one of the most recognizable voices for Louisiana agriculture for more than four decades.

"He taught me everything I know about telling a good farm news story," said Mike Danna, the host of "This Week in Louisiana Agriculture" and director of public relations for the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation.

Wallace, 76, was honored here Thursday night at the Farm Bureau Federation's 89th annual meeting with the Farm Bureau's Lifetime Achievement Award for his career and the work he continues to do as host of a daily news radio talk show on Winnsboro's KMAR-

FM (95.9).

"I just feel fortunate to have had the opportunity to serve agriculture," said Wallace, who lives in the same Crowville farmhouse in which he grew up. "I love doing what I do and I hope my health allows me to continue doing it for a long time to come."

Wallace, a broadcast journalist educated at Louisiana College, worked as a reporter at an Alexandria TV station for seven years before finding his way back to agriculture when he was hired as director of public relations for the Farm Bureau.

He spent the next 30 years in that role, developing both the "This Week in Louisiana

Agriculture" television show, which has been on the air for 30 years, and the Louisiana Farm Bureau Radio Network, which continues to provide 50 daily radio reports to 24 stations.

"At the time, I was really hoping it would be successful because the equipment and technology was a big capital expense and my job depended on making it work," Wallace said. "I think it turned out to be a good investment."

Danna, a former reporter at The News-Star, said the TV show and radio network showcase Louisiana agriculture and convey its importance to the general public and the state's economy.

"They are vehicles to allow us to connect the dots for the general public with agriculture,"

Danna said. "They allow us to go beyond stories about food production and explore legislative, environmental and consumer issues, and none of it would have happened without Reg."

When Wallace retired from the Farm Bureau in 1999, it didn't take long for him to go back to work. Ironically, Wallace's next stop would be at the same place he landed his first job as a teenager.

"(KMAR station owner) Tom Gay called and asked if I was interested," said Wallace, whose program airs from 11 a.m.-noon. "I told him I'd do it as long as he was happy and I was happy. I can tell you this, I'm still happy going to work every day."
