## Port of Lake Charles Facts

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce has recognized Louisiana as one of the top export performers in the country.

The Lake Charles Harbor and Terminal District is the 11th largest Port District in the United States and is located on the Calcasieu Ship Channel

The Port of Lake Charles exports about 600,000 tons per year of agricultural products, including bagged and bulk rice (much of it Louisiana grown), wheat and flour. As such, POLC is important to SW Louisiana farmers in getting their product to the international market.

Port officials, shipping companies and harbor pilots want the Calcasieu Ship Channel maintained to a 400 foot width and a 40 foot depth as mandated by United States Army Corps of Engineers standards. The Corps is barely maintaining the channel depth of 40 feet, but in some areas, it has allowed channel width to shrink to 175 feet (barely the beam of a larger tanker vessel).

To put the current issue in perspective, shippers estimate that a one-foot reduction in channel depth means a \$13 million plus annual increase in the cost of shipping on the Calcasieu Waterway.

## Strain holds press conference at the Port of Lake Charles

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the Port of Lake Charles will benefit from passage of the Realize America's Maritime Promise (RAMP) Act sponsored by Congressman Charles Boustany of Lafayette.


"The problem is that the Calcasieu Ship Channel is filling up with sediment," Strain said at a press conference at the Port of Lake Charles office Sept. 23. "The Port of Lake Charles is the 11th largest port in the United States. This port is responsible for 60,000 jobs and an economic impact of more than \$3.5 billion."

Strain said the ports of Louisiana and the nation's waterways are the lifeblood of America and keeping them clear and operational are critical for agriculture.

"This year, the American farmer will export more than \$137 billion worth of product," Strain said. "Agriculture is the only sector in America with a

positive balance of trade."

Strain said the Calcasieu River Channel must be maintained to a 400 foot width and a 40 foot depth. Currently, the channel width is only 175 feet in some locations.

"It is inconceivable that we don't do everything we can to fix this problem to move these products," Strain said. "Tax money is collected from the shippers. Each year, between \$1.3 and \$1.6 billion is collected and goes into the Harbor Maintenance Trust fund but less than \$750 million is spent on maintaining the river systems. This must be addressed."

## Louisiana adds seed coating labeling requirements

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry will require anyone selling seed in Louisiana with coating material such as moisture retainers and other substances in 2012 to list the amount of coating and related information on the front of the package plainly visible to the buyer.

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the measure was necessary to inform the consumer how much of the package contents are actual seed and how much are considered "inert material." Inert material is defined as all matter within the seed pack-

age that is not actually seed.

Coated seeds are defined as seeds covered with any substance that changes the size, shape or weight of the original seed.

Strain said many seed packagers coat their seed, particularly grass seed, with various materials that claim to aid in germination once the seed is planted. Some grass seed packages currently sold contain more than 90 percent of coating material.

"The measure protects the consumer," Strain said. "We want the seed buyer to know exactly how much seed is in the package."

Seed Programs Director Kevin

Wofford said consumers purchasing coated seed in three pound packs or more may be unaware the package contains a high amount of inert material.

The new regulation states that the maximum amount of coating material must be listed on the front of the package and include a statement referring the purchaser to the product label, which contains detailed information on the germination and purity quality of the seed. The label is usually found on the back or side of the bag, and mainly goes unnoticed by the buyer, Wofford said.

Strain said the new regulations

do not affect the current labeling requirements for treated seed. "Treated seed" refers to a process of covering or "treating" seed with insecticides, fungicides or other beneficial germination enhancements. The treated seed process does not change the size, shape or weight of the seed.

"Louisiana is the first state to require this type of additional labeling for coated seed," Strain said. "Other states are looking at the ruling and may decide to change their labeling requirements based on our action. This measure could have a national impact on the way coated seed is labeled."

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

spoke at the press conference. State Senator Blade Morrish of Jennings and State Representatives John Guinn, Jennings and Senator-Elect Ronnie Johns of Lake Charles also attended.

This is the third press conference on the subject of waterway dredging that Strain has led. Strain addressed the Big River Coalition, a group com-

prised of Mississippi River port officials, pilots and shippers at the Port of Baton Rouge in February. Strain also addressed the issue at a press conference at the Port of New Orleans in June.

"There will be a ripple effect on our national economy and supply chain if ships can't negotiate our river channels," Strain said.

### Ag export facts

◆USDA farm income reports that both net cash income and net farm income are record in nominal terms and, adjusting for inflation, are at their highest levels since the early 1970s. Meanwhile, total farm debt declined nearly 2 percent.

◆A new forecast of U.S. agricultural exports confirmed that 'Grown in America' products remain in high regard and high demand in the rest of the world.

◆The current U.S. export forecast for fiscal year 2011 is \$137 billion, \$22 billion higher than the previous record set

in 2008 and \$28 billion above 2010.

◆Exports for 2012 will remain equally strong and help to support over one million American jobs. Taken as a whole, the United States is in the midst of experiencing the three best years in our history in terms of agricultural exports.

◆Strong exports have enabled agriculture to remain one of only a few sectors of the U.S. economy to enjoy a trade surplus. This year's surplus is projected at \$42.5 billion—a record—and next year should be \$32 billion, the third-highest.

## Ground covers are great for fall planting

As we head toward fall, you may want to consider ground covers for those problem areas in your landscape. You may have shady areas that can no longer support lush turfgrass. Maybe you have a sloping area where mowing is difficult. Planting a ground cover may be an option.

The term ground cover is applied to low-growing plants, other than turfgrass, used to cover areas of the landscape. Perennial, evergreen plants having a sprawling, or spreading, habit are most often used. The plants used for ground covers generally are 1 foot or less in height, but taller plants can be appropriate in certain situations.

In addition to the beauty they provide, ground covers have many practical uses. They provide barriers to foot traffic and can guide movement through a site. Some ground covers are effective in erosion control. Because they don't have to be mowed, ground covers reduce landscape maintenance and are especially useful in problem areas such as on steep slopes, under low-branched trees and shrubs, where large tree roots protrude and in confined areas where mowing is difficult. They also are the best solution to areas under trees that have become too shady for grass to grow.

You must carefully consider the characteristics you would like the ground cover to have – height, texture, color and so forth – when making your selection. You also need to think about the growing conditions where it will be planted – such as sunny or shady, dry or moist. Then look at the size of the area to be planted. Only the most reliable, fast-spreading and reasonably priced ground covers should be considered for large areas.

Monkey grass or mondo grass, creeping lily turf (liriope) and Japanese ardisia are good choices for shade-to-part-shade areas, although many liriope perform well in full sun also. Asian jasmine is excellent for sun to part shade. Whatever type of ground cover you choose,

proper preparation of the planting area will help ensure good establishment and faster growth.

Ground covers provide several functions in the home landscape, including:

- Erosion control on slopes.
- Vegetative growth where grass is difficult to grow.
- Reduced temperature and glare.
- Less lawn maintenance.
- Filling in of narrow or oddly shaped areas in the landscape where mowing is difficult.

Give careful consideration when selecting ground covers. Selection will depend on the location where it will be used. Consider the amount of sunlight present, irrigation availability, height, growth habit and growth rate.

## Farmers, industry reps meet with Rep. Boustany

Farmers and agriculture industry representatives met Sept. 16 with Congressman Charles Boustany in Crowley to express frustration with the increased burden of more federal regulations.

Boustany said a bill is pending in the House that would roll back many of the regulations coming from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Sam Phillips, of the state Department of Environmental Quality, said new water quality standards being imposed by the EPA can be handled on the state level with few effects on farmers, and voluntary measures can be used by farmers to prevent EPA from enforcing the requirements.

Phillips also said the LSU AgCenter has been working on guidelines to help farmers comply with a requirement to make improvements to prevent fuel spills from storage tanks.

A four-page brochure has been printed to help farmers meet the EPA requirements with several low-cost solutions for dealing with the regulations, said Ernest Girouard, LSU AgCenter director of the Louisiana Master Farmer Program. The material resulted from a cooperative endeavor among several state agencies.

DEQ will focus on industrial fuel tanks, Phillips said. "We don't go on farms because that's not where the problems are."

The LSU AgCenter is essential for agriculture interests in the state, said Bobby Simoneaux of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry. "A lot of our job we could not do without the help of the LSU AgCenter."

EPA's role in controlling water quality in the Chesapeake Bay has damaged that area's economic future, said Don Parrish of the American Farm Bureau. "They are cutting economic growth in half."

Water quality in the Mermentau River could be improved if water from the Atchafalaya Basin could be used to increase the flow, said Jefferson Davis Parish farmer Kevin Berken.

Water diversion would be a way of improving water quality to comply with more restrictive federal water quality standards, Phillips added.

Berken's brother, Clarence, also of Jefferson Davis Parish, said farmland in the southern part of the parish was damaged by saltwater from the Gulf. He said water diverted from the Atchafalaya Basin into Bayou Vermilion has helped farmers in Vermilion Parish with encroaching saltwater.

Mike Strain, LDAF secretary, said he is trying to get the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to work on a diversion program but he has run into "first encounters of a bureaucratic kind."





## Mexican rice borer continues its move into Louisiana

The Mexican rice borer continues to expand its territory in Louisiana after migrating from Texas.

An adult Mexican rice borer was found recently in a monitoring trap in southeast Beauregard Parish just a few miles north of the Calcasieu Parish line, according to Tad Hardy, Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry entomologist.

Hardy revealed the discovery Sept. 14 at an LSU AgCenter meeting for county agents and crop consultants to discuss the best ways to treat the insect. He said the trap was not located in a crop field.

"It is possible it will be a serious pest problem for us," said LSU AgCenter entomologist Natalie Hummel.

Based on the insect's past movement of 15 miles per year, Hummel estimated it could be in the heart of Louisiana rice country in two years. She said it's likely it will be more of a problem in sugarcane than rice.

Stubble management is important to deprive the insect of potential overwintering vegetation. She said that could be done by cutting rice lower with combines, mowing or plowing stubble, or establishing crawfish ponds on rice fields.

Mowing ditch banks and field edges could also make a field less attractive for borers, she said.

The pest was first found in Louisiana in 2008 in Calcasieu Parish near Vinton, and it was found late last year on the eastern edge of Calcasieu Parish. But have been found in traps in neighboring Jefferson Davis Parish.

The borer has been a pest in Texas rice since 1988, said Texas A&M entomologist Mo Way.

"We've been able to manage it over the years."

Some rice varieties are more susceptible than others, Way said. Natural hosts for the insect include several weeds, such as Johnsongrass, sprangletop and vaseygrass. It could be the insect has thrived in Texas because of the large amount of fallow ground and pastureland there.

Texas A&M benefits from work by LSU AgCenter researchers on the insect, Way said. "We rely on the LSU AgCenter for a lot of our work in Texas."

Chemical control has involved spraying a pyrethroid insecticide at the 1-inch to 2-inch panicle stage, followed by an application at late boot or early heading that can be tank-mixed with a fungicide.

It's likely that the insect can be controlled in Louisiana rice, said LSU AgCenter entomologist Mike Stout. "I'm hopeful we're not going to have big problems."

The sugarcane borer, an insect similar to the Mexican rice borer, has not been as much of a problem in Louisiana as it is in Texas, Stout said. "That suggests there is some difference between the states."

Monitoring traps maintained by the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry have given Louisiana advance warning that the insect has arrived in the state, he said. Continued scouting, destroying overwintering sites, and aggressive treatment with pyrethroids and Dermacor seed treatment could keep the insect in check.

"We at least ought to try to slow the spread," Stout said. "We're in a unique position because we've caught it early."
