Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain said the rooftop aeroponic garden at Rouses Downtown Supermarket in New Orleans is a great example of how farmers will feed the growing world population in the future.

"There's a garden on the rooftop and I hope to see more gardens on the rooftops," Strain said. "We will not be able to feed the world unless we change our ways. We must have local food production. It's good for the economy and it's necessary to feed ourselves."

Strain made his comments at the Rouses Downtown Market to about a hundred locavores gathered for the kickoff of the New Orleans 2012 Eat Local Challenge.

A locavore is a term used to describe a person interested in eating food that is grown locally and not transported long distances to markets.

For the month of June, Eat Local Challenge participants pledge to eat only foods that come from within a 200-mile radius of New Orleans.

Strain elicited cheers of delight when he held up a ripe Creole tomato for the crowd.

"There's nothing finer than a Louisiana Creole tomato," Strain said. "You're getting the freshest product and something that tastes absolutely great."

Strain toured the rooftop garden, dubbed Root on the Rooftop, along with the other participants of the Eat Local Challenge.

"I want to thank Rouses for their innovation and support of local farmers," Strain said.

The aeroponic garden was installed by Aquaponics Modular Production Systems (AMPS), a member of the Recirculating Farms Coalition.

Roots on the Rooftop is growing herbs using a form of hydroponics called aeroponics, said AMPS co-

founder Doug Jacobs.

"The plants are suspended in air and roots are intermittently sprinkled with nutrient-rich water," Jacobs said. "This is inventive, eco-friendly and exciting."

Recirculating farming is an eco-friendly method of agriculture that uses clean, recycled water in place of soil to grow plants (hydroponics), fish (aquaculture), or a combination of both

plants and fish (aquaponics).

Because recirculating farms use water in place of soil, they are well-suited for urban environments, where available growing space may be paved over, or on rooftops.

Marianne Cufone, Executive Director of the Recirculating Farms Coalition, said the launch of Rouses rooftop garden could serve as a catalyst to encourage other grocers, restaurateurs, and consumers to get involved in growing local food.

Although southern Louisiana is home to many farmers and fishermen who provide top-notch products, eating exclusively local is not easy, Cufone said.

"Even in a city like New Orleans with rich local food traditions, the lack of access to enough affordable fresh food makes it very difficult to eat only from local sources," Cufone said. "A challenge like this highlights the need for more local food production, and recirculating farms are an excellent way to ramp up growing—especially since they can be built in virtually any setting."

"We hope more New Orleans businesses and residents will be inspired to set up their own recirculating systems and make local eating easier," said Cufone.

An open letter to the People of Louisiana

My Dear Friends,

Of late, there has been a great deal of discussion in reference to the budget of the state. Accordingly, a number of different viewpoints have been expressed. I write to you today to ask for support as we move forward and face difficult times.

As a former legislator, and current Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry, I have had the honor to serve our state in both good times and bad. As state officials, we have a fundamental duty to govern. We are charged with the health, safety, education and protection of our citizens as well as the orderly facilitation of commerce.

Throughout the debate, compelling arguments have been made for budget stabilization, for and against use of one time monies, use

of the rainy day fund, use of fund balances, etc. Each of us, from legislators to state wide officials represent distinct constituencies and have differing challenges and needs.

The people do not send us here to blindly agree, but rather to vigorously debate and challenge the issues and to find the most feasible solution agreed upon by the majority, without harming, ignoring, or violating the rights of the minority.

Once passed, the measure becomes the collective consciousness of the body until it is revisited in a later session.

The House and Senate are designed to be a reflection of the citizen populace, and are specifically charged with putting into place the parameters by which the executive and judicial branches are to govern.

Bills and resolutions set the long-term course of the state whereas the budget is implemented to express the people's will in the immediate future.

As statewide officials, we are charged with management of our respective agencies within the boundaries of the constitution as ratified by the people and the parameters of law as passed by the legislature.

Each statewide official is further charged with specific duties and responsibilities to be carried out according to state and federal law. When viewed from the Capitol, the swinging of the pendulum of the balance of power often seems to be personal, emotional, and sometimes erratic in nature.







Saucy Beef Wraps

1 lb. lean ground beef	1 tbsp. white vinegar
1/3 cup chopped onion	1/2 tsp. chili powder
1/4 cup chopped green bell pepper	1/4 tsp. salt
1 to 2 cloves garlic, minced	1 cup fresh baby spinach
3/4 cup water	1/3 cup canned black beans, rinsed
1/3 cup tomato paste	1/4 cup shredded carrots
2 tbsps. packed brown sugar	4 (8" to 9") flour tortillas, warmed

Brown ground beef with onion, bell pepper and garlic in large nonstick skillet over medium heat 8 to 10 minutes, breaking beef up into 1/2-inch crumbles. Pour off drippings, if necessary. Stir in water, tomato paste, brown sugar, vinegar, chili powder and salt; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer 5 minutes or until slightly thickened. Add spinach, beans and carrots; continue simmering until heated through. Spoon filling evenly in a row across center of each tortilla, leaving 1-1/2-inch border on right and left sides. Fold right and left sides of tortilla over filling. Fold bottom edge up over filling and roll up.

Steak and Blue Cheese Wraps

1 lb. beef round tip steaks, cut 1/4 inch thick	4 tbsps. reduced-fat blue cheese dressing
1-1/2 tbsps. seasoned pepper blend	4 medium flour tortillas, warmed
2 tbsps. vegetable oil	4 romaine lettuce leaves
Salt	Toppings: Sliced tomatoes, sliced red onion

Stack beef steaks; cut lengthwise in half, then crosswise into 1-inch wide strips. Combine beef and garlic-pepper in medium bowl; toss to coat. Heat 1 teaspoon oil in large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Add half of beef; stir-fry 1 to 3 minutes or until outside surface of beef is no longer pink. (Do not overcook.) Remove from skillet. Repeat with remaining beef and oil. Season with salt, as desired. Spread dressing evenly on tortillas; top with lettuce leaf. Divide beef and toppings, as desired, among tortillas. Roll up tightly.

Asian Beef Lettuce Wraps

Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add ground beef; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking into small crumbles and stirring occasionally. Pour off drippings. Stir in hoisin sauce and peanut sauce; heat through. Just before serving, add cucumber, carrots and torn mint; toss gently. Season with salt and pepper. Serve beef mixture in lettuce leaves. Garnish with mint.

Garlic-Herb Crusted Beef Roast

1 boneless beef round rump roast
Salt and ground black pepper

Rub:

2 tbsps. garlic-pepper seasoning
2 tbsps. dried basil leaves, crushed
2 tbsps. dried thyme leaves, crushed
1 tsp. dried parsley leaves, crushed

Heat oven to 325 degrees. Combine rub ingredients in small bowl; press evenly onto all surfaces of beef roast. Place roast on rack in shallow roasting pan. Insert ovenproof meat thermometer so tip is centered in thickest part of beef, not resting in fat. Do not add water or cover. Roast in 325 degree oven 1-1/2 to 2 hours for medium rare doneness. Remove roast when meat thermometer registers 135 degrees for medium rare. Transfer roast to carving board; tent loosely with aluminum foil. Let stand 15 to 20 minutes. Carve roast into thin slices; season with salt and black pepper, as desired.

Sicilian Beef Short Ribs-part 2

Heat stockpot over medium heat until hot. Brown beef short ribs, in batches if necessary, on all sides. Pour off drippings. Season beef with 1/4 teaspoon salt and pepper. Return beef to stockpot. Add onion and garlic. Combine broth, juice, ketchup, Worcestershire sauce and soy sauce in medium bowl. Pour over beef; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover tightly and simmer 1-1/2 to 2-1/2 hours or until beef is fork-tender. Meanwhile, prepare Pasta. Cook noodles in boiling water with 1 teaspoon salt according to package directions; drain. Return noodles to pan; stir in tomatoes and thyme. Cover; keep warm over low heat. Remove beef; discard any loose bones. Skim fat from cooking liquid; stir in thyme. Bring to a boil; reduce heat to medium-high. Cook 15 to 20 minutes or until sauce is reduced and thickened. Place noodle mixture on serving platter; top with beef. Spoon sauce over beef and noodles. Garnish with parsley, if desired.

2 nuisance caterpillars are out in greater numbers this year

The inch-long saddleback caterpillar can be dangerous, and it's hard to spot. If you see one, proceed cautiously. Catch it, if you can, and destroy it. Or leave it alone. The fall webworm can be destructive to ornamental and fruit trees. It can be anywhere from a half inch to 1.5 inches in length. The silk tents of the fall webworm are conspicuous to spot. Two nuisance caterpillars are out in greater numbers than usual this year in Louisiana. One is a dangerous stinging caterpillar, and the other can wreak havoc in small fruit and ornamental trees.

The inch-long saddleback caterpillar looks like it has two heads with spiky features at both ends. Its primary color is reddish brown. But it has a chartreuse and white "blanket" over its midsection with a reddish brown oval "saddle" straddling the top.

"It is reputed by many experts to be the most dangerous caterpillar in North America," said Tim Schowalter, LSU AgCenter entomologist and head of the Department of Entomology, adding that people must use extreme caution if they see one.

Schowalter says stings can be treated by putting adhesive tape over the stung area repeatedly to remove any spine tips. Use a fresh strip of tape each time. Then thoroughly wash the area with soap and water to help remove irritating venom.

"Prompt application of an ice pack and a baking soda poultice can help reduce pain and swelling," he said. "Oral or topical antihistamines may help relieve itching and burning."

These caterpillars can be encountered on a variety of host plants, including oak, maple, willow, apple, aster, blueberry, buttonbush,

citrus and corn.

"They appear to be more common than usual in the South this year," Schowalter said. "Even so, their numbers probably do not warrant insecticide application."

Schowalter says be on the lookout for the saddleback caterpillar. Avoid it. If you see one, try to carefully remove and destroy.

The second is the fall webworm, a pale tan-yellow caterpillar that can be anywhere from a half inch to 1.5 inches in length.

"Despite its name, it is common now in Louisiana," Schowalter said.

The caterpillars' silk tents are conspicuous on a variety of forest, fruit and ornamental trees. Damage is usually restricted to a few branches, but this can be serious for small fruit or ornamental trees.

Schowalter says these caterpillars can be controlled by clipping and removing the affected branch or spraying with Confirm 2F, Dylox 80% SP, Spintor 2 (spinosad), Malathion 57% EC and Methoxychlor 50WP at labeled rates.

Dale Pollet, retired extension entomologist, says the spinosad formulation will work on these caterpillars and is safer for homeowners.
