Fruit, vegetable growers learn new FDA food safety rules

WINNSBORO, La. – A complex set of federal food safety regulations will affect many producers of agricultural products and require more record keeping, an LSU AgCenter specialist told fruit and vegetable growers at the Northeast Louisiana Fruit and Vegetable Growers Conference here on Oct. 17.

“This is the law that will reshape agriculture as we know it,” said Charlie Graham, LSU AgCenter pecan specialist.

Graham said the cornerstone of the Food Safety Modernization Act is prevention, and it will result in tighter rules for growers. He said many companies have not been routinely inspected by the Food and Drug Administration in the past, but the new act will require inspections for all high-risk domestic facilities within five years of enactment and at least every three years thereafter.

Possible microbial contamination sources – water, farm worker

hygiene, soil amendments, animals in growing areas, equipment, tools and buildings – are being targeted.

Farms or processors that grow, harvest, package or hold produce in a raw or natural state are covered by FSMA, he said. The food includes vegetables, fruit, nuts, mushrooms and sprouts.

Grain or cereal crops intended for human consumption have been excluded from the rules because exemptions are made for foods, such as sweet potatoes, that are seldom consumed raw.

Imported food will also be required to be grown and processed under the same standards, he said, and companies bringing food into the United States will have to be certified under a third party certification.

He said more extensive record keeping will be required, and records must be available within 48 hours.

Until now, food recalls have been

voluntary, Graham said, but the law will allow the FDA to impose mandatory recalls when public safety is at risk.

He said the first two of five proposed rules under FSMA were released in January. The FDA is still in the rule-making stage, with the public comment period open until Nov. 15, although the deadline has been extended twice already.

Rules for animal feed are still being developed but should be released soon.

Growers will be required to store farm equipment in enclosed buildings. Testing will be required for water used for irrigation unless it is from a treated source.

Biological soil amendments, including manure, must be applied no later than nine months before harvest. “I know that will have an effect on a lot of pecan growers,” said Graham, who explained that cattle are often grazed in orchards.

He said the only food safety issue involving pecans was a salmonella infection traced to a processing plant in Texas and not an orchard.

Graham said the Food Safety Preventive Controls Alliance will help educate and train growers. He said the LSU AgCenter is in the process of hiring a specialist to advise growers and processors on FSMA rules.

There are exemptions under FSMA, Graham said. For instance, a farm with less than \$25,000 in annual sales averaged over the past three years would be exempt. An exemption from the rules is granted to a farm with more than \$500,000 in sales that sells most of its food directly to the public or a qualified end-user, such as a restaurant within the same state where the food is produced or no more than 275 miles from the farm.

Implementation of the rules would be staggered based on farm size. Producers that sold no more than \$250,000 of food annually in the past

three years would have four years to comply after a date has been set. The \$500,000 threshold would require compliance within three years, and water standards would have to be met in five years.

All other businesses would have two years, with four years to meet water quality requirements.

Also at the conference, Beatrix Haggard, LSU AgCenter soils specialist, talked about the importance of soil testing. She said a pH between 5.8 and 6.8 is good for most plants, although some plants such as blueberries require more acidic soil.

She advised growers to check fertilizer labels to make sure the solubility is more than 50 percent. “Be aware that not all fertilizers are equal.”

Harry Schexnayder, of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry, said LDAF no longer certifies organic growers, and certification now must be done by private companies.

He said growers with less than \$5,000 in annual sales can promote their products as organic without certification. Others can still run an organic operation without certification but cannot use the organic distinction on their promotion efforts without certification, he said.

Sweet potato grower Eva Dawson, of Delhi, talked about her sales to national chains, including Walmart.

She said selling to national chains requires a large amount of documentation and record keeping. “You need to back up everything you say.”

Katherine Fontenot, LSU AgCenter horticulturist, said the state has 376 fruit and vegetable operations.

She said part of her work involves testing plant varieties. One of her tests this year was on tomatoes, and she found the best-producing variety was Tribute No. 1, and the Tribeca variety had the best taste.

Todd Cooper, LSU AgCenter extension associate, said growers should consider registering their commercial operations with the free online MarketMaker program. Cooper said 460 Louisiana producers are registered now.

“We average 100,000 to 110,000 visits to our website per month,” Cooper said.

Steve Hotard, LSU AgCenter area horticulture agent in Ouachita Parish, said the state had 2,022 Master Gardeners in 2012, and they provided more than 70,000 hours in volunteer work on horticulture projects.

Mavis Finger, LSU AgCenter sweet potato specialist, said this year’s sweet potato crop at 7,500 acres was a decrease of 25 percent from last year.

She said the crop was delayed by a cool, wet spring followed by a dry spell late in the season. “Producers with irrigation were able to keep their crop on schedule.”

Finger said the new variety, LA 07-146, is out-yielding the Beauregard variety by 15 to 20 percent. The new variety Orleans also is performing well, she said.

La. rice farmers restructure research & promotion programs

Rice farmers in Louisiana are restructuring the way they fund research and promotion programs following a ruling from the state Supreme Court.

The ruling states the method used by the state legislature to create the check off programs, a means to collect money from all rice farmers to promote the industry, is unconstitutional. From this point forward, the money will be collected on a voluntary basis.

“The majority of Louisiana rice farmers support the check off programs. The court’s decision was not about the programs themselves, but rather the legislative tool used to create them,” explained Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. “The court acknowledges the goal was to promote the growth and development of the rice industry in Louisiana, stating there is no

question that the legislature clearly expressed the policy behind the rice statutes. However, the court found the legislature improperly delegated its authority to private citizens to conduct the referendum on assessments. These statutes and programs have been in place for approximately 35 years.”

The Louisiana check off program also funds agriculture rice research programs at LSU and

elsewhere.

“These funds have been invaluable in providing farmers better ways to grow their crop and then maintain and expand markets for U.S. rice,” said Steve Linscombe, director of the Louisiana State University AgCenter Rice Research Station in Crowley, La.

“I hope the industry is able to quickly fix the programs so our important work can go uninterrupted.”

COZY FALL RECIPES

Nacho Chicken

1 (10 3/4 oz.) can cream of chicken soup	1/3 cup instant nonfat dry milk
1 1/2 cups shredded processed American cheese	2 tbsps. flour
1 (4 oz.) can diced mild green chilies	Water
1/2 cup sliced green onions	1 cup crushed tortilla chips
	2 cups cooked, cubed chicken

Combine soup, 1 cup cheese, chilies and onions in a medium bowl. Stir together nonfat dry milk and flour. Gradually add enough water to make 2/3 cup. Add to soup mixture; stir to blend. Place 1/3 cup tortilla chips in bottom of 10x6x2 inch baking dish. Top with half of the chicken, then half the soup mixture. Repeat layers. Sprinkle remaining cheese over top. Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until heated through. Sprinkle remaining tortillas chips around edges of the dish.

Cajun Beef Steaks

1/4 cup cooking oil	1 onion, chopped
Salt and pepper to taste	1/2 bell pepper, chopped
1 tsp. cayenne pepper	1 clove garlic, minced
Beef tips or round steak, cut into bite-size pieces	1 can Coca-Cola

Put cooking oil into pot and heat. Season meat with salt, pepper and cayenne. Add meat a little at a time and sear. Remove from pot and set aside. Add onion, bell pepper and garlic; sauté for five minutes, stirring while cooking. Add meat back to mixture and stir. Add one glass of water and Coca-Cola. Cook over medium heat for 45 minutes to 1 hour. Serve over rice.

Glaze: 2 cups powdered sugar
1 tbsp. vanilla
4 tpsps. milk

Mix sugar, vanilla and milk. Stir over low heat and pour over hot cake.

Carrot Cake

2 cups flour	3 eggs
1 tsp. baking soda	2 cups finely grated carrots
2 tsp. cinnamon	1 cup well drained crushed pineapple
1 tsp. salt	1 cup coconut
2 cups sugar	1 cup chopped Louisiana pecans
1 1/2 cups oil	1 tsp. vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Sift flour, baking soda, cinnamon and salt, set aside. Beat sugar, oil and eggs with electric mixer. Gradually add flour mixture, carrots, pineapple, coconut, Louisiana pecans and vanilla. Bake in 9 x 12 inch pan at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Let cool completely, then frost with Cream Cheese Frosting.

Have You Sold Cattle on the Farm?

The beef check-off law goes into effect every time cattle are sold. This includes purebred sales and private treaty sales on the farm. The law requires that you must collect the national, plus the 50 cents state check-off money during your sale. The 50 cents state check-off is now a Mandatory Collection as a result of Act 298 passed in the 1995 Louisiana legislature, but producers may request a refund of this amount only, by written request to the Louisiana Beef Industry Council.

The seller is also responsible under the law. The seller may collect and remit the \$1.50 per head in a private treaty transaction. This is the best way to handle purebred sales. To avoid a late payment charge, money must be remitted by the 15th of the month following the sale. Penalties of up to \$5,000 per transaction applies to violators. All sale transactions are subject to audit to insure compliance with the check-off law.

Now is the time to plant broccoli

The LSU AgCenter recommends planting broccoli in fall vegetable gardens, and October is a perfect month for planting transplants or small seedlings.

You can choose from many varieties of broccoli. The LSU AgCenter typically recommends varieties that not only produce abundant yields but also have sloping heads (or florets) so that moisture doesn't collect on the edible portion and cause unsightly spots. Varieties that have produced well in past trials include Diplomat and Packman.

LSU AgCenter horticulturists Kiki Fontenot and Charlie Johnson are conducting a broccoli variety trial at Burden Museum and Gardens in Baton Rouge. We are growing 21 varieties to develop recommendations for both home gardeners and commercial producers. We should have results in late December.

When grown using recommended production practices, broccoli will produce throughout the winter season. Here are a few tips on successfully growing broccoli in your home garden.

Broccoli is a medium feeder, meaning you'll want to incorporate

fertilizer into the garden prior to planting. Soil testing and calculating your total area help when determining how much fertilizer to add. We typically recommend incorporating five to seven pounds of 13-13-13 per 100 feet of garden row prior to planting. A 10-foot row, then, that would require only 1/2 to 3/4 of a pound. One pound of 13-13-13 fertilizer is about 2 cups. Of course, you have other choices, including organic options.

Space broccoli plants 9 to 12 inches apart within the row or designated space in your garden area. Broccoli can be "double drilled" – you can stagger plants on either side of the row, maintaining the recommended spacing between plants. Three and six weeks after transplanting, side dress with a little nitrogen. One teaspoon of calcium nitrate per plant is plenty. Water it in immediately.

Speaking of watering, the most critical times to irrigate your broccoli plants are the first two weeks after planting and during head initiation. Of course, consistent watering throughout the season is key to producing great vegetable crops.

Watch broccoli carefully for

insects such as aphids and worms. Bring insect samples into your local AgCenter agent for correct identification and for control recommendations.

Fortunately we don't have many disease issues with fall broccoli. Newer gardeners, however, may be unaware of broccoli's high boron requirements. Boron deficiencies often show up after harvest as hollow stems. This is a classic symptom of boron deficiency. You can correct this through foliar applications of Solubor boron fertilizer spray (follow directions on the label) or by incorporating a fertilizer with the micronutrient boron into the soil prior to planting.

Once heads start to develop and grow, harvest them while individual flower buds are still tightly compact. If you see the yellow petals starting to show, you've missed the optimum eating stage. But don't fret. Broccoli flowers are pretty and will attract many pollinators to your garden.

Frequent harvest will encourage side shoots to develop. By cutting the main head with a short stem you will encourage more side shoots and increase your harvest throughout the season.
