

The Shreveport-Bossier City urban area is growing. And as the city goes, suburbia grows. Wooded areas once considered rural are being gobbled up by the creep of urban sprawl and new neighborhoods are popping up in Benton, Keithville and Haughton at breakneck speed. A well-known verse says only God can make a tree. LSU AgCenter forester Ricky Kilpatrick says poor construction practices can kill it.

LSU AgCenter forester Ricky Kilpatrick says the biggest problem for trees in Shreveport-Bossier area is construction damage.

Kilpatrick presented his annual top ten tree troubles for the Caddo-Bossier metro area at a summer Lunch and Ag Discovery session at the LSU AgCenter's Red River Research Station in Bossier City.

Kilpatrick based his list on observations of local problems and presented it to the gathered foresters David Letterman-style. He has been keeping the list since 1999.

By construction damage, Kilpatrick means

neighborhood development in which a lot of soil is moved, killing the trees.

"Many times soil movement, compaction, mechanical injury and other damage resulting from construction are the culprits in the decline and death of yard trees," Kilpatrick said. Many trees, especially oaks, have shallow root systems, and adding, removing or compacting the soil on the roots is detrimental.

Number two is graft compatibility. Recently, Bradford pear trees have been declining in Shreveport-Bossier. Many trees were turning to fall colors in mid summer

and then shedding their leaves. On close inspection, many of these trees had been grafted, and it appears the root stock is growing more slowly than the scion or top material, Kilpatrick said.

The forestry agent listed bad pruning as third in his top ten list.

After ice storms, homeowners want to prune back large trees to reduce the chances of limbs falling through the house, Kilpatrick said. But improper pruning results in limbs weaker than those that are pruned out.

Pampering the yard to death ranked fourth. Often homeowners with good intentions

cause problems for their trees while tending their lawns. One of the worst problems is improper use of lawn chemicals, Kilpatrick said.

Another common problem is lawn mower and weed trimmer damage. Trunk and root injuries not only stress and weaken trees but also create points of entry for insects and diseases, Kilpatrick said.

Fifth on the list is hardwood scolytids – wood-boring insects that may cause dead and dying leaves on the outer tips of branches.

"They have been common in magnolias, dogwoods and maples recently," Kilpatrick said.

The next culprit is the Eastern tent caterpillar, which builds its web in the crotch of a branch.

"If you have pear trees, you'll have fire blight," Kilpatrick said, calling this bacterial disease number seven on his list.

Number eight is species/site selection – or planting the wrong type of tree for the soil structure, the forester said. Studying the site and understanding soil characteristics is the beginning step in planning for landscape trees.

"One good hint is to look at what is growing naturally nearby," Kilpatrick said.

Homeowners should take a soil sample and use the results to select the appropriate trees to plant. "Every parish has soils maps," Kilpatrick said.

The LSU AgCenter can evaluate soil for nutrients and minerals, along with pH and provide customized recommendations for whatever crop or plant is to be grown. More information is available at LSU AgCenter parish offices or on the Internet at www.lsuagcenter.com.

Oak decline/root rot is ninth on Kilpatrick's list.

Oak decline often is a result of a complex interaction of various environmental stresses and pests, he said, while root rot commonly is found in these stressed trees.

Homeowners can promote good tree health by pruning to reduce competition for moisture and nutrients and to favor the more vigorous section of the tree, Kilpatrick said. Other practices include mulching to reduce competition from sod and to reduce or alleviate soil compaction, fertilizing to correct nutritional deficiencies, using insecticides as needed to reduce defoliation and watering.

Tenth on Kilpatrick's list of problems are galls, which often are a problem in hickory trees and more recently in oaks.

The trees are attacked by a group of small insects called gall makers that cause deformities known as galls, Kilpatrick said. The galls form when the female insects lay their eggs on the leaves or twigs. The reaction between chemicals deposited by the insect and the plant's hormones results in the formation of the gall, he said.

Receiving "honorable mentions" on Kilpatrick's problem list were oak anthracnose, oak leaf blister and giant bark aphids.

Anthracnose symptoms include rapidly developing blight of leaves and shoots, characterized by browning and shriveling of young leaves, Kilpatrick said.

Leaf blister favors mild, moist conditions during the early phases of leaf growth. It is more prevalent in the southeastern Gulf States. Severe cases may cause heavy premature defoliation, but tree deaths caused by leaf blister haven't been reported in this area, Kilpatrick said.

Bark aphids cluster on small twigs of oaks and other hardwoods where they pierce the stems and feed on the sap.

Vittles big hit with LDAF employees

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry hosted the August grand opening of Vittles, a breakfast and lunch counter located in the downstairs atrium of the LDAF building in Baton Rouge.

Vittles, owned by Janice Foster, is the latest beneficiary of the Randolph-Sheppard Business Enterprise Program.

Vittles's menu offers hot breakfasts, plate lunches and traditional short order sandwiches.

The program provides consumers who are blind with vocational training.

With the opening of Vittles, the Randolph-Sheppard Vending Facility Program currently has 87 vending facilities located statewide.

The Randolph-Sheppard program is administered under the umbrella of the Louisiana Department of Social Services, Louisiana Rehabilitation Services and Vocational Rehabilitation Services.

Foster lost her sight eight years ago as a result of diabetes.

"I refused to allow my vision loss to keep me from doing what I love, which is cooking," said Foster. "I'm thankful to LRS, because of this program I am able to provide for my family."

LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. cut the ribbon along with Foster.

"We're so happy for Miss Janice," Strain said. "We're looking forward to including her in our LDAF family and wish her great success."

The opening of the restaurant means LDAF employees and visitors will not have to leave the building for lunch.

"It will be a great convenience for our employees and all the folks who drive a long distance to come to Baton

Rouge for meetings," Strain said.

The legislation that fosters and encourages entrepreneurship and business opportunities for Americans who are blind and visually impaired is known as the Randolph-Sheppard Act.

The bill was named after Senator Jennings Randolph of West Virginia and Senator Morris Sheppard of Texas who sponsored the measure in 1936.

Since that time, the Randolph-Sheppard Act has provided a means for tens of thousands of blind and visually impaired Americans to earn a living, competing not only as employees, but also as entrepreneurs in a field that would otherwise be virtually inaccessible to them.

These entrepreneurs manage a wide variety of food-service operations, including cafeterias, coffee and snack shops, vending machine locations, highway rest area vending sites and retail facilities in federal, state and other government buildings and military facilities.

In 2007, the national average annual earnings of a vendor was \$46,753.

"Through this program, consumers who are blind become independent, tax-paying citizens and proud business owners," said LRS Executive Director for Blind Services Kevin Monk. "This is an opportunity to educate customers as to the broad range of abilities of individuals who are blind."

Eligibility for the Randolph-Sheppard Business Enterprise Program is based upon an individual with a significant visual disability benefiting from vocational rehabilitation services in terms of achieving employment.

Africanized bees found in Winn

Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry Mike Strain, D.V.M. said the August 11 confirmation of Africanized honeybees in Winn Parish was not unexpected.

"We had already moved our trap line twenty or so miles east of Winn Parish after Africanized honeybees were found in LaSalle Parish last June," Strain said. "Our duty is to notify the public and beekeepers in the Winn Parish area that Africanized bees are present."

Strain cautioned that residents who spend a lot of time outdoors should use good judgment when they come across unexpected beehives.

"There is always a lag time between the initial report of suspected Africanized honeybees in an area and confirmation," Strain said. "The best thing to do is to simply leave any feral bee colony you come across alone. There is a possibility the bees may be Africanized."

Strain said the Winn Parish Africanized honeybees were trapped June 24 at a LDAF monitoring point two miles southeast of Joyce off U.S. Hwy. 84.

The bee sample was sent to the Carl Hayden Bee Research Center in Tucson, Ariz. for testing. The LDAF received the confirmation

on August 11.

The Africanized honeybee is smaller than its European counterpart commonly raised for honey production but the size differential can only be measured under magnification.


Though the venom in Africanized honeybees is the same as that in the European, Africanized honeybees will sting in greater numbers which can lead to a toxic reaction in some cases. Seeking cover immediately helps to reduce the number of stings in a confrontation with Africanized bees.

Africanized honeybees were first confirmed in Louisiana in July

2005 from a sample trapped near the town of Rodessa in north Caddo Parish. It was the first case of Africanized bees moving into the state through natural range expansion.

LDAF maintains a line of traps running north and south through the state in order to detect the progression of the Africanized honeybees. The traps are placed roughly two miles apart and contain a queen bee pheromone that attracts swarms of bees.

The current trap line runs on a north-south line from Morehouse Parish to Charenton in St. Martin Parish.

Are you prepared?

Packing a box you can “grab and go” in case you need to evacuate could save you from financial disasters and hardships, according to LSU AgCenter family economist Dr. Jeanette Tucker.

“You may not be able to prevent hurricanes and storms that interrupt your routine or destroy your home, but you can make plans to keep them from disrupting everything,” Tucker says. “An ‘evacuation box’ that’s ready to ‘grab and go’ is one item every household should have to prevent financial disasters and other hardships.”

Calling it a “grab-and-go box,” for short, Tucker says it actually can be a plastic tub, a file box, a backpack or any other durable container you would like – although she says a fireproof and waterproof box or a waterproof backpack are recommended.

“The contents really are the important part,” she says, adding, “Just put it all in something that’s easy to store and easy to take with you, and make sure it’s something that will hold up and help to protect the valuable items you have inside.”

The LSU AgCenter expert says the contents should include copies of important papers, emergency cash or traveler’s checks, lists of emergency phone numbers, safe

deposit box keys and backups of computer records. It should always be packed and ready to “grab and go” in case you need to evacuate, she says.

“After hurricanes Katrina and Rita, people around here have a renewed sense of why it’s important for every family and every individual to have evacuation plans in place,” Tucker says.

“Although everyone’s emergency plans may be a little different, there are a lot of common elements – and some sort of evacuation ‘to go’ box should be one of those elements.”

Tucker says to keep the “box” somewhere in your home where you can get to it easily.

“Then if you must evacuate, keep the box with you at all times,” she says.

Among the items you’ll probably want to include are:

–Cash or traveler’s checks to cover several days’ living expenses,

dries and other needs.

–Emergency phone numbers, including those to doctors, pharmacies, financial advisers, clergy, repair contractors and family members. Don’t forget to include cell phones of those who also may be away from home!

–Copies of prescriptions for medicines and eyeglasses, copies of children’s immunization records and copies of medical, dental and prescription insurance cards (or policy information).

–Copies of auto, flood, renter’s and/or homeowner’s insurance policies (or at least the policy numbers) as well as contact information for your local agents and the companies’ headquarters.

–Copies of other important papers such as deeds, titles, wills, trust documents, powers of attor-

ney, health care directives, stock and bond certificates, recent investment statements, home inventory, birth certificates, death certificates, adoption certificates, marriage certificates, passports and/or other identity documents, employee benefit documents and federal and state tax returns (at least the first two pages).

–Backup copies of computerized financial records.

–Keys to safe deposit box.

–Combination to safe (if you have one).

–Negatives or digital copies of irreplaceable personal photos.

–Computer user names and passwords.

–Lists of Social Security numbers, credit card numbers, bank account numbers, driver’s license numbers, loan numbers, investment account numbers and any other important numbers.

–List of debt obligations, due dates of payments and contact information for companies.

Tucker says it’s also a good idea to place papers in sealed, waterproof plastic bags.

“Some planning and a few relatively simple preparations can prevent the unexpected from becoming even more disastrous,” Tucker says.
