Louisiana dairy gets state of the art milking machine

Third generation dairy farmer, Brent Duncan, was visiting California when he was introduced to the milking parlor concept that would eventually change not only the way he milked his cows, but also the way he does business.

“I was amazed when I saw it,” said Duncan. What he saw was a rotary milking parlor (or carousel), where cows step on to a rotating platform to be milked. As it makes a single rotation, the cows are milked and pertinent data such as milk volume and quality information is collected electronically. After visiting several rotary installations and confirming the equipment reliability with existing users, Duncan purchased and has been using the equipment at Duncan Acres Dairy Farm in Franklinton for about a year. This is the only operational rotary milking parlor in the state of Louisiana.

“The rotary parlor can milk more cows more quickly than conventional milking facilities which makes it easier on the cows. They’re not standing for long periods of time,” said Duncan. It takes about seven minutes for the cows to make one revolution on the carousel, with actual milking averaging about four and a half minutes.

“It’s slow moving and a very comfortable and calm-

ing setting for the cows. They each have their own stalls,” added Duncan. Forty cows can be milked at one time.

For data collection, each cow has an electronic ear tag. Once they step onto the platform of the carousel, the data collected lets Duncan and his staff know a particular cow’s average milk time, how much milk she produces and if there is anything qualitatively wrong with the milk.

Once the cows leave the milking center, they move to the feeding/loafing barns where they eat under fans that help keep them cool and comfortable. To enhance health and milk quality they even have the option to stand under what’s called a “swinging cow brush.” “They love to get their massage. It really relaxes them. They just love it,” said Duncan who clearly enjoys spoiling his cows.

Duncan Acres Dairy produces milk for the organic market, which means they don’t use pesticides or commercial fertilizer. They recycle most of their own fertilizers and feed the cows primarily forage grown on the farm. Duncan Acres milks approximately 500 cows and sells its milk to 1,500 Publix grocery stores located in the southeastern part of the United States.

Prepare for Hurricane Season

Hurricane season is underway and the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) is reminding livestock and pet owners to be ready in the event of severe weather. This is the time to double check the condition of livestock trailers and other equipment used to move large animals out of

harm's way. The family pet should be considered as well. If there's an evacuation, you need to know ahead of time what animals will be accepted where. When evacuations are recommended, large and small animal owners should leave as early as possible to avoid road closures and excessive delays

in hot weather which can cause stress to animals.

Tips on preparing livestock trailers:

- ♦Check tire pressure and rubber for wear

- ♦Test brake and running lights

- ♦Inspect the overall condition of the trailer

Important items to take dur-

ing an evacuation:

- ♦Health records (especially proof of EIA testing for horses)

- ♦Food and water

- ♦Special medications

- ♦Bridles or leads

Proper identification for livestock that are evacuated is crucial during a natural disaster.

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

Balsamic Marinated Flank Steak

1 beef Flank Steak (about 1-1/2 pounds)
Salt & pepper

Balsamic Marinade:
1/4 cup balsamic vinegar
2 tbsps. olive oil
1 tbsp. chopped fresh basil
1 1/2 tsp. Dijon-style mustard
1 clove garlic, minced
1/2 tsp. sugar

Combine marinade ingredients in small bowl. Place beef steak and marinade in food-safe plastic bag; turn steak to coat. Close bag securely and marinate in refrigerator 6 hours or as long as overnight, turning occasionally. Remove steak from marinade; discard marinade. Place steak on grill over medium, ash-covered coals. Grill, covered, 11 to 16 minutes for medium rare (145 degrees) to medium (160 degrees), turning occasionally. Carve steak crosswise into thin slices.

Spy Thai Beef

1 pound Ground Beef (93% lean)
1/4 cup water
3 tbsps. reduced-fat creamy peanut butter
2 tbsps. reduced-sodium soy sauce

2 tbsps. fresh lime juice
3/4 tsp. garlic powder
3/4 tsp. ground ginger
1/8 crushed red pepper
Baked wonton wrappers

Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add Ground Beef; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking into 1/2-inch crumbles and stirring occasionally. Remove drippings. Meanwhile, combine water, peanut butter, soy sauce, lime juice, garlic powder, ground ginger and red pepper. Stir peanut butter mixture into beef. Continue to cook over medium heat 2 to 3 minutes or until heated through, stirring occasionally. Evenly divided beef mixture over six wonton triangles, if desired. Garnish with toppings, as desired. Topping suggestions: red bell pepper strips, shredded carrots, cucumber slices, sliced green onion, sliced fresh pea pods, sliced basil or cilantro leaves, shelled edamame, pickled ginger, lime wedges.

Sweet Onion & Pepper Beef Sandwiches

3 to 3-1/2 lbs. beef stew meat, cut into 1 inch pieces
2 medium sweet onions, cut into 1/2-inch wedges
2 red bell pepper, cut lengthwise into 1-inch wide strips

1 cup reduced-sodium beef broth
1/3 cup reduced-sodium soy sauce
1/2 cup no salt added tomato paste
6 cloves garlic, minced
8 to 10 French bread rolls, split, warmed

Place onions in 5-1/2 quart slow cooker; top with beef, then pepper slices. Combine beef broth, tomato paste, soy sauce and garlic; add to slow cooker. Cover and cook on high 6 to 7 hours or low 8 to 9 hours or until beef is fork-tender. (No stirring is necessary during cooking.) Skim fat from cooking liquid, if necessary.

Citrus-Marinated Beef & Fruit Kabobs

1 pound beef Top Sirloin Steak Boneless, cut 1 inch thick
1 medium orange
1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro
1 tablespoon smoked paprika

1/4 teaspoon ground red pepper (optional)
4 cups cubed mango, watermelon, peaches and/or plums
Salt

Grate peel and squeeze 2 tablespoons orange juice; reserve juice. Combine orange peel, cilantro, paprika, and ground red pepper, in small bowl. Cut beef steak into 1-1/4-inch pieces. Place beef and 2-1/2 tablespoons cilantro mixture in food-safe plastic bag; turn to coat. Place remaining cilantro mixture and fruit in separate food-safe plastic bag; turn to coat. Close bags securely. Marinate beef and fruit in refrigerator 15 minutes to 2 hours. Soak eight 9 inch bamboo skewers in water 10 minutes; drain. Thread beef evenly onto four skewers leaving small space between pieces. Thread fruit onto remaining four separate skewers. Place kabobs on grill over medium, ash-covered coals. Grill beef kabobs, covered, 8 to 10 minutes for medium rare (145 degrees) to medium (160°F) doneness, turning occasionally. Season beef with salt, as desired. Drizzle reserved orange juice over fruit kabobs.

Slow Cooker Pot Roast Soup

1 beef shoulder roast boneless (2-1/2 lbs)
2 cups chopped onions
1 can (14-1/2 oz.) diced tomatoes with green peppers and onions, undrained
1 cup frozen hash brown potatoe cubes
1 cup beef broth

1 tbsp. minced garlic
1 tsp. dried thyme leaves
1/2 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. pepper
2 cups broccoli slaw
1/2 cup frozen peas

Cut beef roast into 12 equal pieces. Place in 4-1/2 to 5-1/2-quart slow cooker. Add onions, tomatoes, potatoes, broth, garlic, thyme, salt and pepper. Cover and cook on HIGH 5 to 6 hours, or on LOW 8 to 9 hours, or until beef is fork-tender. (No stirring is necessary during cooking.) Stir in broccoli slaw; continue cooking, covered, 30 minutes or until broccoli slaw is crisp-tender. Turn off slow cooker. Stir in peas; let stand, covered, 5 minutes.

Chimichurri Steak Wraps

12 ozs. grilled beef steak, sliced
3 cups fresh baby spinach
1/2 large red bell pepper, cut into thin strips
4 medium whole wheat tortillas (8 to 10-inch diameter)

Chimichurri Sauce:
1 cup fresh parsley leaves
2 cloves garlic
3 tbsps. olive oil
1 tbsp. red wine vinegar
1/4 tsp. salt

Place parsley and garlic in food processor or blender container. Cover; process until finely chopped. Add oil, vinegar and salt; process just until blended. Spread each tortilla evenly with Chimichurri Sauce, leaving 1/4-inch border around edge. Top with equal amounts spinach, bell pepper slices and beef slices on top two-thirds of tortilla. Fold bottom of tortilla up over filling. Fold right and left sides to center overlapping edges; secure with wooden picks; if desired.

Going gluten-free can remove nutrients from diet

The gluten-free label is becoming more popular on items in the grocery store.

Gluten is a protein found in wheat, barley, rye and triticale. People who have the autoimmune disease, celiac disease, experience a toxic immune response when they ingest gluten and should eliminate gluten from their diets, according to LSU AgCenter registered dietician Denise Holston-West.

Only about one to three percent of people in the U.S. have celiac disease, she said. But people without a diagnosis of celiac disease are choosing to go gluten-free.

"I think a lot of people may think that gluten-free means healthy. But if you don't have celiac disease and you go gluten-free, you are putting yourself at risk for nutrition deficiencies," Holston-West said.

Whole-grain products are an important part of our diet, Holston-West said. Eliminating gluten can lead to deficiencies of folate, iron and the B-vitamins that enrich grains.

People with celiac disease must work closely with a registered dietician to develop a diet that includes supplements to replace

the nutrients they are losing, she said.

"Some people can have a non-celiac sensitivity to gluten," Holston-West said. "But the research on that is scant."

She recommended that people who suspect they may have a gluten sensitivity talk to a doctor and get a blood test because that is how celiac disease is diagnosed. They also can try eliminating certain foods then reintroducing them to see how they do.

Celiac disease can have symptoms similar to irritable bowel syndrome, diverticulitis or anemia, so it is important to confirm it.

Not only are there no substantiated health benefits of eating gluten-free unless a person has celiac disease, it can also cost more at the grocery store, Holston-West said.

"Gluten-free products can be about twice as much as regular grain products," she said.

She recommended eating a diet that has foods from all groups and said people who have made long-term positive changes to their health did it in moderation.

"They don't take any drastic measures against what they would normally do," Holston-West said.

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SU official has been with Cooperative Extension 50 of its 100 years

BATON ROUGE, La. – Nationwide and in Louisiana, the Cooperative Extension Service is celebrating its 100th anniversary, having been founded in 1914 with the passage of the Smith-Lever Act. For half of those years, a Louisianian, Leodrey Williams, has worked in extension, serving in a variety of capacities at both Southern University and in national leadership positions.

Williams is currently the chancellor of the Southern University Agricultural Research and Extension Center. But his career began

with a job title that became illegal six weeks after he was hired: assistant county agent for work with Negroes in Richland Parish. As civil rights reforms took effect, the Department of Justice ordered extension to change those titles.

It was 1965, just five months after the Civil Rights Act passed. Although his work was occasionally disrupted by civil rights marches and rallies, Williams was an energetic one-man band, providing residents with information on everything from science to youth development to horticulture and community resource development.

As activists promoted social changes that were resisted in the South, Williams met farmers who were reluctant to change their methods and did not always appreciate visits from county agents.

Williams once stopped by a farm owned by

a man who said he didn't need any help — in fact, he claimed to teach county agents things they didn't know. Williams believed him upon seeing his beautiful garden.

"I said, 'I'd like to see everybody with a garden like this. I can't help you, but I can get you to help me to have everybody have a garden like this,'" Williams said. "That put him in a supporting role. He knew more about gardening, and he could help his neighbors."

Getting people involved mattered because skeptical farmers could better learn from one another, Williams said. As an agent, he said it was important to draw on people's knowledge and use it to help in the big picture.

All extension work in Louisiana originally took place through LSU. In 1971, Southern University set up its own extension office, where Williams was hired as an agriculture specialist. The only other employees at the time were the extension coordinator and two secretaries. The small team worked together to recruit staff and develop programs.

In 1976, Williams came to LSU to serve as associate state agent, director of Equal Employment Opportunity and associate professor in the Department of Extension and International Education, positions he held for four years.

Williams became the extension director at Southern University in 1980 and began gaining national recognition. In the early 1990s, he co-chaired a task force that examined ways to ensure the "upward mobility of extension," Williams said, which was a monumental effort.

One major issue was funding, which comes from federal, state and local sources. At the time, participation in certain programs was limited to land-grant universities formed by the 1862 Morrill Act. But historically black universities, which were given land-grant status through the 1890 Morrill Act, were excluded. No one wanted to give up funding to help the other group, Williams said, so the task force established funding baselines that applied to all extension programs.

Another recommendation the task force made was to designate an ombudsman to carry out their reforms. The national director asked Williams to fill that position. He was not sure he wanted the job because he would have to move to Washington, D.C.

"I started thinking, I've served on many task forces and committees where nothing happened after they did their work," Williams said. "Now they're trying to implement something, and I've helped give leadership to this, and I'm refusing to do it."

He agreed to take the job.

Four months later, the national director retired and Williams took over. Now in charge of funding extension programs at the nation's 104 land-grant universities, Williams found himself in the middle of a national conversation about reorganizing government.

As the U.S. Department of Agriculture downsized, Williams led the effort to merge the Cooperative State Research Service and Cooperative Extension System into one entity — the Cooperative State Research, Education and Extension Service, where he served as associate administrator of the newly formed agency.

Williams returned as Southern's extension director in 1995. Soon after, he joined the 9/99 Club — a group of agriculture and extension professionals who aimed to retire on Sept. 9, 1999. The club included former LSU

AgCenter Extension Director Jack Bagent, who retired in 2001, the same year Williams was asked to lead the newly-formed Southern University Agricultural Research and Extension Center.

Today, Williams jokes that he is the best chancellor the Southern Ag Center has ever had — a justifiable statement, he explained, because he is the only one so far.

Gina E. Eubanks, LSU AgCenter associate vice chancellor and program leader for food and nutrition sciences, who holds a joint appointment with the Southern Ag Center, said Williams' impact on extension is largely a result of his open-mindedness and ability to embrace change.

"Dr. Williams has always been willing to work with people who have new and different ideas that can improve programs and benefit the citizens of Louisiana," Eubanks said. "He's a talented leader who believes in extension's ability to accomplish great things. But he also believes in allowing people to do their job how they know best."

As chancellor, Williams has focused on developing the campus as a positive force in Louisiana and the agriculture community. Williams, who was inducted to the International Adult and Continuing Education Hall of Fame in 1996, said it is easy to stay busy if one is willing to learn from people and find ways to use knowledge to benefit everyone.

To Williams, that is what extension is all about.

"It's about people," he said. "No matter what you do, whether it's in community development, if it's in small business development, it's enhancing the socioeconomic quality of life for people. You have more people now than you had 100 years ago. As long as there are people with problems, there will be a need for extension."

AgCenter entomologists explore mosquito control effects on bees

BATON ROUGE, La. – The LSU AgCenter is always buzzing with research, and this project is no exception — literally.

AgCenter entomologists Kristen Healy and Jim Ottea are studying how insecticides used for mosquito control affect honeybees. They hope to develop better management practices for beekeepers and mosquito control practices that are safer for bees.

The project is funded by a \$168,000 grant from the Environmental Protection Agency that was awarded in January. Healy and Ottea are collaborating with scientists at East Baton Rouge Parish Mosquito Abatement and Rodent Control and the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Honey Bee Breeding, Genetics and Physiology Research Laboratory in Baton Rouge.

While bees are particularly sen-

sitive to insecticides, Healy said, they normally are not in much danger because they are in their hives at night when mosquito trucks spray. "Normally" is the key word. In hot Louisiana summers, bees sometimes must go outside their hives to cool off.

Because bees spend most of their time at night inside hives, they do not come in contact with insecticides often enough to build up any resistance. Mosquitoes must be controlled because they carry public health concerns, Healy said, but there are steps beekeepers can take to minimize harm to bees.

To identify what strategies might be best, Healy and Ottea are doing field studies to learn more about how different insecticides at different doses affect bees and mosquitoes. With help from entomology students, postdoctoral researchers, USDA agricultural engineers and

parish employees, they clamp containers of bees and mosquitoes to T-shaped stands in a field.

A mosquito truck sprays the area, and the insects are collected after 15 minutes. They are then transferred to a lab, where they are monitored for 48 hours.

Mosquito trucks' spray reaches about 300 feet out, so one option may be to simply keep beehives a sufficient distance from the road. However, bees also face risks from aerial spraying, which is harder to protect from. Adding vents to hives could help, Healy said.

Insecticides are probably not the main reason why, but bees are in danger globally, making it important to study things that can hurt them.

"Mites, viruses and habitat loss are all contributing to an overall bee population decline," Ottea said.

That is scary, he said, because bees are responsible for pollinating about one-third of every mouthful of food people eat.

Gathering data on one piece of the puzzle helps in the big picture as scientists work to help sustain

healthy bee populations.

"People like bees," Healy said. "They're charismatic, and they produce honey. But they're also extremely important because they pollinate a lot of the world's crops."
