



Grassroots effort blooms into community

Just below Interstate-10 in Downtown Baton Rouge, is a garden that sits on a city lot. Brian Goad picks green beans while his wife, Liz, picks blackberries. “We had blackberry cobbler just last week made with blackberries we grew,” said Liz.

With its lush green leaves and vibrant colors from vegetables, fruits and flowers that are grown there, the garden brings a taste of nature to the big city.

In 2010, Brian was the president of the Beauregard Town Civic Association when he came up with an idea. “A lot of people who live in Beauregard Town don’t have big yards so we thought that it would be nice to have a community garden,” he said. The idea went a step further when they teamed up with nearby First United Methodist Church. The two organizations collaborated, shared resources and volunteers, and the garden soon became a joint

project.


“One of the ideas was to mix the residents and parishioners so there would be a conversation between people who would not normally interact,” added Brian.

With the concept in place, the next step was to find land. A corner lot near the church sat empty and overgrown. When the church did a title search to find out who owned the land, not only did the family not realize they owned it, but they wound up donating it to the church. At that point, things moved into high gear.

Brian, who is a landscape architect by profession, designed the layout. Each box is four by 12 feet. “It’s a basket weave concept. It’s like you’re weaving together the church and the community.”

The garden had a capacity for 24 plots. In the beginning, he planned to build four plots to gauge interest in the community. After he sent out an email to the neighborhood, the demand for the garden boxes were so high that all 24 plots were reserved within a few days. He knew that the interest was there, so they decided to build out the entire garden.

For people like Liz Goad who had limited experience gardening, she said she’s gotten a lot out of it. “This has been a nice introduction to gardening for me. It’s not as intimidating because it’s a small space. Plus, there’s always someone here who

knows more than you do about gardening.” Brian added, “It’s nice because there are gardeners at every level and they share their expertise.”

Sharing knowledge translates into a community working together. Everything that’s planted is done organically. The gardeners do not use pesticides, they favor the use of horse manure and they make their own compost. The result is a thriving garden of health and beauty. Not to mention that from an economic standpoint, it serves a purpose there as well.

“This supplements our grocery store trips too. It’s fresh and it tastes a whole lot better,” added Liz.

Each gardener decides what he or she wants to plant. Each box is rented for \$75 a year, which goes toward water and insurance bills.

Brian added the excess food is shared with the local food bank, volunteers who help maintain the garden and with the church.

The gardeners also hold community events under the interstate a few times a year. The interstate provides a shelter.

Animal health notice: Vesicular Stomatitis

Baton Rouge, La. (June 26, 2014) – Due to an increasing number of confirmed Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) cases in Texas, Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry animal health officials are imposing enhanced requirements on livestock entering Louisiana from a state that has diagnosed cases of VS.

VS Requirements: Any livestock (equine, bovine, porcine, caprine, or ovine) entering Louisiana from a county where

VS has been diagnosed within the last thirty (30) days must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection written within ten (10) days of entry containing the following statement: “All animals identified on this certificate have been examined and found free from signs of VS, have not been exposed to VS, and have not originated from a premises which is under quarantine for VS.”

VS is a viral disease that primarily affects horses and cattle but

can also affect swine, sheep, goats, deer, llamas and alpacas.

State animal health officials say symptoms of VS may start as excessive salivation and then progress to blisters and crusty sores in the mouth and on the lips, nostrils, coronary band, prepuce, vulva, and teats and the disease may be spread by direct contact with infected animals or by biting insects. The disease is rarely fatal.

Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) announced recently the nation’s first case of

VS for the year in horses. The disease was detected in five horses in southwest Texas. Since that time more Texas counties have identified cases of VS with a total of 10 confirmed cases in Kinney, Hidalgo, Nueces and San Patricio counties. The six affected premises in those counties are currently under quarantine by the TAHC.

The disease is reportable to the Louisiana State Veterinarian’s Office at 225-925-3980 or to the USDA District Office at 601-936-8580.

Virgin bulls must have a breeder's certification of virgin status signed by the breeder, the breeder's agent or an accredited veterinarian. Reminder: Cotton Planting and Boll Weevil Eradication

All cotton planted in the state, including cotton grown in ornamental gardens and other non-traditional locations must be registered with the state to be monitored for possible boll weevil presence. State boll weevil eradication law provides that anyone who intends to plant cotton for non-commercial purposes must receive prior permission from the Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry Mike Strain, D.V.M.

“The state is officially boll weevil-free but we must monitor all cotton grown in the state to protect Louisiana’s cotton industry,” Strain said. “Boll weevil traps are set along the edges of cotton fields, but gardeners outside traditional cotton growing areas may plant cotton, for example, to spin their own thread for

fabric. Gardeners may also grow cotton for its ornamental appeal. If so, we have to place a boll weevil trap nearby to be sure we preserve our boll weevil-free status.”

Historically, the boll weevil has been cotton’s most destructive pest. All cotton-growing states have eradication programs.

Cotton remains one of Louisiana’s leading crops. Although only 126,647 acres of cotton were harvested in 2013, record yields were achieved and the total value of the crop was set at almost \$148 million.

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Pine colaspis beetle common problem this time of year

Baton Rouge, La., (July 3, 2014) - In recent weeks, the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) has received phone calls pertaining to the "browning" of pine trees. LDAF forestry officials say if landowners who have pine trees growing on their property notice the needles turning a reddish brown, it may not be anything of concern.

"Before you remove the tree, take a close look at the foliage or pine needles. It may very well be temporary damage caused by the Pine Colaspis beetle (*Colaspis pini* Barber). They are found throughout the Southeast and are common along the gulf states," said LDAF Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry Mike Strain, D.V.M.

LDAF forestry officials say they are not considered a serious pest, but can produce a browning effect when feeding in large numbers. It is very common to see foliage damage, from the Pine Colaspis beetle, from June through August.

Emerging adult beetles will feed along the edges of the needles, causing temporary damage. When

high concentrations of the beetles are feeding, the host trees' foliage will take on a "red to brown" color. Trees that are attacked rarely die and suffer very little, if any, growth loss. Attacked trees will usually "green up" by the end of the summer.

Visual Indicators of Pine Colaspis Infestations

1. Pines needles begin to turn "brown or red" during late-spring/early summer months.

2. Pine needles have "sawlike" edges as a result of the beetles feeding on the foliage.

3. Identification of Beetles: 1/4 inch long, elongated-oval, rusty yellow or brown beetle with green reflections.

Under forest conditions, no control measures are recommended. Residential trees may be sprayed with an approved insecticide to prevent the unsightly damage, if desired.

It's hummingbird time in the landscape

HAMMOND, La. –Many people think attracting hummingbirds is as easy as hanging a feeder. But that is not always successful because many hummingbirds are not accustomed to using feeders. It can be

frustrating to put out a feeder and never see a hummingbird.

Many people have found that planting a garden full of hummingbird-attracting plants, in addition to maintaining feeders, is a more reli-

able method for successfully attracting hummers. It's important to be patient the first year. A hummingbird garden is an invitation, and it may take some time for the garden to be a destination for hum-

mingbirds. The longer you stay with a good plan to bring hummingbirds to your garden, the better it will work.

A well-chosen variety of flowering trees, shrubs, vines, annual flowers and flowering perennials can produce an excellent supply of nectar over a long time. At the same time, the landscape will be beautified. Insects that live on the plants and the flowers' nectar will provide hummingbirds with a complete, balanced diet. Because they obtain nearly all the water they need from their foods, it's not necessary to provide them with drinking water.

Typical hummingbird flowers are red, have a tubular shape and don't have a strong fragrance. There are however exceptions. Many plants with red flowers may not have nectar, and not all good nectar plants have red flowers. Roses, petunias, geraniums and zinnias have brilliant flower colors – with red prominent – but little nectar.

Plants that produce an abundance of flowers over longer periods and those that are low-maintenance and require little care are good choices. When several color varieties of a plant are available, select the brightest red.

Insecticides generally should not be used in hummingbird gardens. If

absolutely needed, they should be used sparingly and only on non-flowering plants. Use pesticides low in toxicity, such as horticultural oils and insecticidal soaps. Never use systemic insecticides or rotenone on plants where hummingbirds may feed.

Trees to add to the landscape for hummingbirds include the crybaby tree, loquat (Japanese plum), mimosa and citrus.

Good shrubs for the hummingbird landscape include Turk's cap, pagoda plant, Mexican cigar plant, shrimp plant, firespike, hibiscus, bird of paradise, azalea and red buckeye.

Hummingbirds like the following vines – coral honeysuckle, Japanese honeysuckle, cape honeysuckle, cypress vine, bleeding heart vine and trumpet creeper.

Annual and perennial flowers for hummingbirds include salvia, iris, red hot poker, impatiens, cardinal flower, standing cypress, bee balm, pentas and lantana.
