Preserving History and the Julien Cane Planter

With only a fourth grade education, one could say Leonard Julien was way before his time.

"He farmed sugarcane all his life. It's hard work, but he always felt there was an easier way to plant sugarcane. So he went to LSU to see what they were building, but even then he knew there had to be a simpler way," said Leonard Julien, Jr.

On a warm day in June, six of Julien's 11 children (seven boys, four girls) gathered at the River Road African American Museum in Donaldsonville to reminisce about their father who they call "a jack of all trades" but they also know he was much more than that.

"Even though he only had a fourth grade education, he was an innovator. He was always building something," said son Ron Julien. While Julien built a ditch witch in the 1960s, it was sugarcane for which he was most eager to find an easier way to grab the cane and pull it into the chute.

"Planting sugarcane is just so labor intensive," added Anthony Julien.

"It was a dangerous job. The sugarcane would cut you as it would be pulled out of the cart and dropped over the side. Then you would get knicked by the sugarcane blades," said Leonard, Jr.

Family members say Leonard, Sr. came up with a

hand crank and brought his idea to J.P. Wiggins, a mechanical engineer, who helped him draw up the plans.

"He perfected how to grab the sugarcane, but now the goal was to make it mechanical," said Ron. Leonard, Sr.'s brother, Harold, was a welder and helped construct the machine.

Daughter, Alyce, said their father learned to read well enough to start working on a patent. "You have to realize, he had very little formal education, but he taught himself how to read and he taught himself and us how to play music. He played every instrument. There wasn't much he couldn't do," said Alyce.

By 1964, his first model was built. Family members said it was huge and cumbersome. The patent was issued and by 1965-1966, his self-propelled version allowed him to release the cart from the tractor so the tractor could move to an empty cart which made working in the field faster and more efficient. He also added a helicopter hydraulic pump which made the machine more powerful. Leonard, Sr. was officially in the sugarcane planter business.

"He started selling his planters through Castagnos and B. Lehmann Bros. He sold 150 of them for \$7,500 each," said Leonard, Jr. "Every machine built could *See Planter, continued on page 20*

Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

Second listening session on EPA water rules set for July 30 in Winnsboro

Baton Rouge, LA - A second listening session is scheduled July 30 to hear comments from Louisiana's agricultural community about proposed water rules from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The event will be held at the Scott Extension Education Center in Winnsboro. Registration and lunch (provided) will begin at noon.

The proposed rule was released for public comment on March 25, 2014, whereby the EPA and the Army Corps of Engineers seek to revise the definition of "Waters of the United States" (WOTUS) under the Clean Water Act (CWA). The agencies emphasize that the proposal seeks to

provide regulatory clarity after significant uncertainty following two Supreme Court decisions. This proposal is being evaluated by many agricultural organizations, and agricultural producers are encouraged to comment on the proposed rule.

The public has an opportunity to comment on the proposal until Oct. 20, 2014. Ron Curry, EPA Region 6 administrator out of Dallas, Texas, said, "We are very interested in hearing the producers' perspective on this very important rule. It is our job to listen and encourage producers to comment as to how the proposed rule may affect agriculture."

According to the EPA, the pro-

posed rule preserves existing CWA exemptions and exclusions for agricultural activities. Additionally, the agencies, in coordination with the USDA's Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS), will now exempt 56 established NRCS conservation practices from the CWA Section 404 dredged or fill permitting requirements, if they occur in waters covered by the CWA.

Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry Mike Strain, D.V.M., said, "Because of the participation and input gathered at the first listening session in south Louisiana, we felt it was important to have a second ses-

sion."

"The LSU AgCenter recognizes the importance of water resources to the future of agriculture in Louisiana. We are committed to conducting research and outreach to ensure a safe and plentiful water supply," added Bill Richardson, LSU vice president for agriculture.

Crop Progress, Condition Report as of July 13

According to USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service Crop Progress and Condition report for the week ending July 13, 2014, there were nearly six full days suitable for fieldwork across Louisiana. Topsoil moisture supplies were four percent very short, 26 percent short, 59 percent adequate and 11 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were two percent very short, 19 percent short, 66 percent adequate and 13 percent surplus.

The state's corn crop progress was reported at ninety-one percent in the dough stage, 64 percent dented and six percent mature. As for corn condition, only two percent of the crop was reported in poor condition, 12 percent fair, while 63 percent good and 23 percent was excellent.

Cotton progress stood at 92 percent squaring with 59 percent setting bolls and condition was reported at one percent poor, 11 percent fair, 64 percent good and 24 percent excellent.


Louisiana rice crop was 72 percent headed and condition was listed at one percent poor, 19 percent fair, 57 percent good and 23 percent excellent.

Soybean crop progress was 85 percent in the bloom stage with 57 percent setting pods. Soybean condition was reported at two percent in very poor shape, six percent poor, 15 percent fair, 49 percent good and 28 percent excellent.

The sugarcane crop is now listed at two percent very poor, 10 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 42 percent good and 13 percent excellent.

Creamy Squash Casserole

6 cups large diced Louisiana yellow squash	1 cup grated cheddar cheese
1 large onion, chopped	1 cup crushed butter crackers or bread crumbs
4 tbsps. butter	Salt and pepper to taste
1/2 cup sour cream	

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease a 2 1/2-quart casserole dish. Put squash in a pot and add water to cover. Bring to a boil and cook 10-12 minutes or until diced squash are tender. Drain well, put in a large bowl, and set aside. In a skillet, sauté the onion in butter for 5 minutes. In a separate bowl, combine all ingredients together except crumbs. Pour mixture into the casserole dish and top with cracker crumbs. Bake until center is set, about 30 minutes. Serves 6-8.

Season with parsley, Creole seasoning, salt, and pepper. Increase heat to medium high and add ground beef. Cook until beef is evenly browned. Stir in ham and cook for 5 minutes. Add shrimp and cook for 2 more minutes. Remove from heat, and stir in stuffing mix. Stuff each bell pepper half and lightly sprinkle with bread crumbs. Place stuffed bell pepper halves in ungreased baking dish. Bake in preheated oven for 1 hour.

Note: Because the stuffing is fully cooked prior to baking, you can reduce the baking time by half (30 to 35 minutes) if you blanch the bell peppers in boiling water for 3 minutes before stuffing.

Smoked Gouda -Peach Salad

2 (10 ounce) bags baby spinach leaves	1/4 - 1/2 cup sliced green onions
1/2 lb. smoked Gouda cheese, cubed	1 1/3 cups honey Dijon salad dressing
4 fresh peaches, sliced	

Combine all ingredients and toss Serves about 8. Enjoy!

Hot Kale

2 bunches red kale	1/4 cup pecan oil
1 shallot pod, chopped fine	1 tsp. red pepper flakes
2 garlic toes, minced	Salt and pepper to taste

Wash kale thoroughly, remove the toughest stems and tear into bite size pieces. Heat oil in pan on medium heat, add shallots and cook to soften. Add garlic, but do not let brown. Push garlic and onion to the sides of the pan and add kale. Wilt kale and add red pepper, salt and black pepper. Serve warm, when kale has reduced.

Plan for changes in new farm bill

Although signup is months away, agricultural landowners and producers need to begin planning for decisions they will have to make because of the new farm bill, according to LSU AgCenter economist Mike Salassi.

The Agricultural Act of 2014, which was signed into law in February, authorizes U.S. nutrition and agriculture programs through 2018 and updates how support payments are calculated. A change in the new law is the end of direct payment subsidies, which farmers received regardless of yield, price or acreage.

Instead, farmers will have to choose between the agriculture risk coverage (ARC) and price loss coverage (PLC) income support programs. ARC is based on revenue while PLC is based on price, making the choice between the two hinge largely on which crops a farmer grows.

"Rice producers are more concerned about price risk," Salassi said. "Because rice is irrigated, the yields don't vary from year to year as much as crops like corn or soybeans, which would prefer the ARC program. Most of the rice growers are going to pick the PLC program."

Under PLC, farmers are paid if the price of rice drops below \$14 per hundredweight.

Growers will have the opportunity to update their program yield for PLC, Salassi said. The updated program yield will be 90 percent of the average rice farm yield for the 2008-2012 crop years. Most program yields for rice were set in

the 1980s, he said, and yields have improved significantly since then.

The ARC program could help corn and soybean growers because it addresses both yield and price risks, Salassi said. Payments are based on income per acre, so if yields drop, "that could trigger some payments," he said.

Farmers will also be able to reallocate their base acres based on their 2009-2012 planting history. Base acres, which are used to calculate both ARC and PLC payments, are the average number of acres of a crop grown over a four-year period.

"If a farm had 80 acres of rice base and 20 acres of wheat base, but in the past four years they've planted all rice, they could reallocate it," Salassi said.

A supplemental coverage option, which pays for part of the deductible of regular crop insurance, is available to farms in the PLC program. The program will begin in 2015 for corn, grain sorghum, rice, soybeans and wheat in selected Louisiana parishes.

Cotton is no longer included because of trade distortion concerns, but a new Stacked Income Protection Plan, or STAX, for those growers is in the works, Salassi said.

The deadline for signing up for the 2014 crop will be sometime in early 2015. The exact date will depend on how soon regulations for the new farm bill are written.

cover at least three sugarcane rows as opposed to one which dad thought was a waste of time," added Ron.

Donald Songy, former Ascension Parish School Superintendent, said he remembered when the sugarcane planter was developed. "At the time, sugarcane was the biggest industry in the parish. It was a really big deal when Mr. Julien built the planter. I was a teenager and I remember when it was developed. My dad, Claude, was a county agent and very supportive of it. It made planting so much more efficient."

From a historical standpoint, Songy said the Julien Cane Planter was groundbreaking on many levels. "Not only did Mr. Julien change things agriculturally, but he also made an impact socially for the African-American community. He built this machine during the civil rights era."

By the 1970s, there was more competition. Leonard, Sr. lost his patent which opened the playing field. "People took his ideas and advanced them, but not by much," said Ron. "His principals are still used today," added Anthony.

Today, there are very few of the original Julien Cane Planters.

Herman Walet of Loreauville donated the planter that is located on the grounds of the River Road African American Museum in Donaldsonville. However, the machine is uncovered and being in the natural elements has taken a toll on it. Kathe Hambrick-Jackson, Executive Director of the museum, says they hope to raise enough money to build a shed to house the planter. "The River Road African American Museum is looking for sponsors to help build the Julien Cane Planter Pavilion. We have developed a "Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, Art & Math" (STREAM) program as an outdoor learning experience for children."

"Our father always said that you could do anything you put your mind to. That was his philosophy," said Leonard, Jr.

"He always made us figure things out. If you were told to do something, he never told you how to do it, he made you figure it out. Use your head is what he wanted us to do," added Ron.

Leonard Julien, Sr. passed away in 1994 at the age of 84. Julien's children say they believe their father always knew he had done something special but was humble

about it. "The only thing he would say is, "When I'm gone, y'all gonna always talk about me," added Ron.

The estimated cost to build a shelter for the Julien Cane Planter is \$15,000 according to museum officials. For more information on
