Major Louisiana Citrus Grower Takes Steps to Protect Crop

For fifth generation Louisiana citrus grower, Ricky Becnel, the news was not good. A disease called citrus canker was discovered in south Louisiana and it had him worried. It didn't take long for him to spring into action to protect his precious commodity.

"Fortunately, we never detected citrus canker or citrus greening (another citrus disease) in our nurseries, but we weren't about to risk it. So we retro-fitted our greenhouses to make them canker proof," said Becnel.

They sealed up the framework of the greenhouses, created double door entrances and added an aluminum covering, called Aluminet, on top of the greenhouses that Becnel says keeps the heat from being too harsh on the plants that are in the screened in structures. An Optinet 50 mesh is a material he uses to keep out flying insects and canker bacteria.

"Being proactive means that if we ever get quarantined, it will be business as usual for us," said Becnel. The bolstered greenhouses now meet USDA's federal require-

ments for protection against citrus greening and citrus canker, allowing for plants grown inside the structures to be shipped out of state under federal certification, even if these diseases are found in the area.

"You never know what's coming," said Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., who toured the Saxon Becnel and Sons Citrus Nursery in Plaquemines Parish. "On average, Florida gets 13 new species each year."

After taking a look at what Florida has done to try to protect its citrus industry, Becnel said it was imperative to "think outside the box" and ramp up even more. It was also time to strengthen the greenhouses and further protect them from hurricanes. "We believe these retro-fitted structures can now withstand up to 100 mph winds," added Becnel.

Becnel has six greenhouses and produces approximately 110,000 citrus plants each year. Citrus is a two-year crop.

Emerald Ash Borer discovered in Arkansas

Baton Rouge, LA (July 23, 2014) – Louisiana Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the USDA is conducting trap surveys across Louisiana to watch for possible Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) beetles following the recent discovery of the ash tree pest in Arkansas.

The EAB is an invasive beetle that attacks and kills ash trees. Louisiana’s ash trees are primarily located along the Atchafalaya Basin and the Mississippi River Delta. However, there are ash trees in urban areas, as well. The EAB has never been found in Louisiana.

The EAB beetle is a pest to all types of ash trees but does not attack other hardwoods or pines. Strain said, “Not only is ash one of the predominant trees planted in the Conservation Reserve Program, it is also a tree that is com-

mon in urban areas and has aesthetic appeal. If the trees start dying, it could be costly for residents or city officials to have them removed.”

The beetle is often transported into an area by infested firewood, but it is not known how the EAB entered Arkansas. Officials say the best way to prevent the spread of EAB is to not move firewood.

In October, the LDAF will start a new campaign, affiliated with the national campaign called “Don’t Move Firewood”, which is geared toward educating people about the risks of transporting pests to other locations where some can do harm. It is best to purchase firewood not more than 10 miles from where it will be burned. When traveling, burn firewood where you purchased it and make sure

to burn all of it.

EAB is a native insect of Asia. In 2002, EAB was discovered in Michigan and is now present in 24 states, Arkansas being the most recent location. EAB is a federally-regulated pest. States survey for EAB and if it is found, quarantine boundaries are established by the state.

The LDAF and USDA used traps to monitor for EAB from 2009 until 2011. Since 2012, the USDA has taken over trapping the beetle and currently has more than 55 traps statewide.

Chicken Tortilla Casserole

4 whole boneless chicken breasts, cooked and cut into 1-inch pieces (reserve ¼ cup cooking broth)
10 (6-inch) flour tortillas, cut into ½ inch x 2 inches strips
2 medium-sized onions, chopped
1 tsp. canola oil
1 (10 ¾ oz.) can fat-free chicken broth
1 (10 ¾ oz.) can cream of mushroom soup
2 (4 oz.) cans mild green chilies, chopped
1 egg
1 cup low-fat cheddar cheese, grated

Pour reserved chicken broth in slow cooker sprayed with non-fat cooking spray. Scatter half the tortilla strips in bottom of slow cooker. Mix remaining ingredients together, except the second half of the tortilla strips and the cheese. Layer half the chicken mixture into the cooker, followed by the other half of the tortillas, followed by the rest of the chicken mix. Cover. Cook on LOW 4-6 hours or on HIGH 3-5 hours. Add the cheese to the top of the dish during the last 20-30 minutes of cooking. Uncover and allow casserole to rest 15 minutes before serving.

Chicken & Turkey Sausage Pastalaya

1 (10.5 oz.) can beef broth
½ cup water
½ lb. chicken breast, sliced into bite-size pieces
½ lb. turkey sausage, sliced into small pieces
Cajun or Creole seasoning, to taste
Tabasco brand pepper sauce to taste
½ stick butter, chopped
1 (10 oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chilies
1 onion, chopped fine
½ bell pepper, chopped fine
5 cloves garlic, minced
8 oz. pack elbow macaroni, cooked according to package directions

Coat the chicken and sausage with Cajun seasoning; brown for 10 minutes in skillet. Add all ingredients except pasta to slow cooker, stir, cover and cook on LOW for 7 hours. Add cooked macaroni to slow cooker, being careful not to add too much and overcrowd it, stir well, and serve. Makes 1 ¾ quarts.

Catfish Sauce Piquante

1 lb. catfish fillets, cut into bite-sized pieces
2 tsp. or more Cajun or Creole seasoning
Tabasco brand pepper sauce, to taste
1 (10-oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chilies
1 (6-oz.) can tomato paste
1 onion, chopped
1 medium bell pepper, chopped
7 cloves garlic, minced
3 green onion tops, chopped
½ stick butter, chopped
½ tsp. sugar
1 cup water
Hot, fluffy rice

Put the catfish pieces in a bowl and season well; cover and reserve in refrigerator. Add remaining ingredients to slow cooker except rice. Stir, cover and cook on LOW for 7 hours, then add catfish and cook for 1 hour on LOW or until fish is cooked. Serve over hot rice.

Pizza Pastalaya

1 lb. lean ground beef or turkey, browned, drained
Salt and pepper, to taste
1 (10 oz.) can beef broth
1 (1 lb. 10 oz.) jar spaghetti or pizza sauce
4 oz. pepperoni slices
1 medium onion, chopped
3 cloves garlic, minced
1 small bell pepper, chopped
Tabasco brand pepper sauce to taste
Shredded mozzarella cheese
2 cups elbow macaroni, uncooked

In a skillet, brown the meat and season well with salt and pepper. Add all remaining ingredients to slow cooker except cheese and macaroni, stir, cover and cook on LOW for 3 ½ hours. Cook the macaroni in a pot on stove according to package directions. Add cooked macaroni to slow cooker, stir well to combine and serve; add cheese on top of each serving.

Chicken Italiano

2 large whole boneless chicken breasts, each cut into 3 pieces
¾ tsp. salt
¼ tsp. black pepper
¼ tsp. dried oregano
½ tsp. dried basil
2 bay leaves
1 (26 oz.) jar meatless spaghetti sauce

Place chicken in bottom of slow cooker and sprinkle seasonings over chicken. Pour sauce over seasoned meat, stirring to be sure chicken is completely covered. Cover and cook on LOW 6 hours or on HIGH 3 ½ - 4 hours. Serve over pasta.

Hearty Corn & Black-Eyed Pea Pastalaya

1 lb. grown beef, browned in skillet, drained
Salt, black and red pepper, to taste
1 (15.25 oz.) can whole kernel corn, undrained
1 (15.5 oz.) can black-eyed peas, undrained
1 (10 oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chilies
1 (10.5 oz.) can beef broth
1 (10.5 oz.) can cream of celery soup
½ bell pepper, chopped
1 onion, chopped
3 cloves garlic, minced
1 tsp. onion powder
Tabasco brand pepper sauce to taste
2 cups elbow macaroni, cooked according to package instructions

Season browned beef with salt and peppers; place in slow cooker. Add all remaining ingredients to slow cooker except pasta, stir, cover and cook on HIGH for 3 hours or LOW for 6 hours. Add cooked pasta to slow cooker, mix together and serve immediately.

Keep horses cool when hauling this summer

BATON ROUGE – Summer abounds with horse shows, competitions, sales and trail rides. However, hauling horses in Louisiana’s hot, humid summers can put them at risk for dehydration, heatstroke and exhaustion.

“While you cannot plan for every situation, taking a few precautions and practicing some common sense can help ensure that you and your horse will arrive safely,” said LSU AgCenter equine specialist Neely Walker.

Before hitting the road, horse owners should make sure their vehicle is in top towing condition. Tires on the truck and trailer should be fully inflated.

Check tires before traveling while they are cool, Walker said. In hot weather, fully inflated tires flex less and ride cooler, decreasing chances of a blowout.

Walker recommends placing two rubber mats on the trailer floor to reduce the heat on horses’ legs.

Horse owners should carry ample drinking water for horses while traveling. However, leav-

ing water buckets hanging in the trailer while moving is a bad idea, Walker said. Sudden stops can lead to spilt water and slippery floors, which pose a safety hazard.

Walker said it is best to haul in the early morning or evening when temperatures are cooler. Open trailer vents to create airflow, she said, but don’t allow horses to ride with their head out of the trailer window. Flying debris and bugs can cause serious eye injuries.

If the destination is more than 12 hours away, stop during the trip to unload horses and give them a break from the trailer, Walker said. Check their vitals and offer water every four or five hours. Each stop should last a minimum of 20 minutes.

As always, Walker said, make sure to bring copies of all important identification paperwork. Also, expect the unexpected, she said. If you get stuck on an interstate, ensure as much ventilation as possible inside the trailer without unloading the horses.

New research shows promise in controlling feral hogs

BATON ROUGE, La. – LSU AgCenter researchers are beginning to look at baits containing sodium nitrite as a way to control the feral hog populations in the state.

After years of looking at numerous ways to control feral hogs in the state with minimal success, LSU AgCenter animal science researcher Glen Gentry said his current research project is part of a grant funded by the Pennington Family Foundation.

“With this grant, we will be looking at the use of sodium nitrite as bait that shows some promise in eliminating feral hogs,” he said.

There are three thrusts involved in being successful in the use of this chemical in dispatching the animals, he said.

“First, we need to find an effective dose to eliminate the animal,” Gentry said. “Second, we need a medium to effectively administer the dose, and third, we need a delivery mechanism to selectively target this animal.”

Currently he is testing different flavors that the pigs are attracted to, which is proving to be more difficult than first expected.

“What we are finding is that the pigs are attracted to certain flavors, such as strawberry, which they seem to like,” Gentry said. “However, the grain-based bait has some problems.”

When the sodium nitrite is added to the mix, consumption tends to drop off, he said.

“Thus we are looking at semi-solid bait forms developed by LSU AgCenter researcher Zhijun Liu in the School of Renewable Resources,” Gentry said. “Just like using gummy bears, this is a way to hide the salty and bitter taste of sodium nitrite.”

The sodium nitrite is effective in taking the oxygen out of the hog’s blood through the formation of methemoglobin. The process causes them to become drowsy, lie down and expire. At the right level, this will happen in most mammals, but deer and some other animals are less sensitive to the chemical.

“All mammals, including humans, have an enzyme that is able to change methemoglobin, which cannot bind oxygen back to hemoglobin,” Gentry said. “But pigs don’t have as much of this enzyme, so it takes less sodium nitrite to overload their system.”

“We’re at the stage right now where we’re looking for the right dose, which varies

according to the size of the pig,” he said.

Research, using grain-based baits has been conducted in Texas for the past few years and in Australia before then. There is a huge feral hog problem in the Queensland area of Australia, Gentry said.

“The question on most people’s minds right now is how long before we have something that works? And I’m saying probably eight months to a year,” he said. “In my opinion we are looking at probably four years down the road before we will have something the public can use, with all of the regulatory aspects that you have to go through with EPA and FDA.”

Also as part of the project, landowners in the parishes of East Feliciana, West Feliciana and East Baton Rouge parishes will have access to traps they can check out from their LSU AgCenter parish office to use in capturing pigs on their property, Gentry said.

“Basically what will happen is a farmer who has a problem will come to the county agent,” he said. “They will set up feeders and cameras to start monitoring, and when the pigs show up they will set up the trap. We have three of these traps right now.”

Typically the plan will be to catch the pigs in an area, then move the trap, thus giving farmers some short-term relief.

“When we catch pigs in the traps, we take

them to our isolation unit where we are doing the dosage trials,” Gentry said. “For landowners, when they catch them, they are to kill them. We don’t want them transported around because that is partially how we got the problem that we have now.”

The meat from animals that have consumed the sodium nitrite should be fine for human consumption. The problem would

occur if you consumed the stomach contents because it breaks down slower, he said.

LSU AgCenter wildlife specialist Don Reed said feral hogs are the biggest problem that landowners have in the state.

“So the popular saying right now is that there are two types of people in the state,” Gentry said. “There are those who have feral hogs and those who will have feral hogs.”

Citrus canker is a highly contagious disease that can impact all citrus varieties. The bacterium is dispersed through wind-borne rain, landscaping equipment and people carrying the infection on their hands, clothing or equipment. The disease is also easily spread through the movement of a citrus plant to a different location or by storms like hurricanes and tornadoes.

The disease starts out as tiny raised lesions that become tan to brown and develop yellow halos as the disease progresses. It ultimately causes defoliation, premature fruit drop, blemished fruit and tree decline. Severely infected trees may stop producing fruit.

Citrus infected with the canker disease is safe to eat.

Louisiana residents are urged not to move any

infected citrus plant material within or out of the state. Louisiana has a state quarantine that prohibits entry of citrus nursery stock from outside the state. Homeowners must buy citrus trees from certified Louisiana nurseries only.

Like Saxon Becnel and Sons, Paul Becnel Nursery, Star Nursery 1 and Star Nursery 2, also in Plaquemines Parish, have all enclosed their citrus in federally approved structures. All grow citrus nursery stock for sale in state and out-of-state.

If you believe your citrus trees are infected with citrus canker, please do not take any samples or transport any part of the plant. Instead, contact the Horticulture and Quarantine Division of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry at 225-952-8100.
