


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Conventional sweet potatoes



Rendezvous ON THE BAYOU

National Sweet Potato Council President Mark Fields said despite the problems Louisiana farmers face from the ravages of hurricane Gustav and Ike, the national sweet potato market remained strong.

Fields helped host the Rendezvous on the Bayou, the 47th National Sweet Potato Council annual convention in Baton Rouge in January.

More than 300 growers and agribusiness professionals from California to the Carolinas descended on the river city for the January three-day event, Fields said.

"We have growers and other folks here in Baton Rouge from California, Canada, Michigan, Wisconsin, the Carolinas, New Jersey, Mississippi, Arkansas, Texas, Louisiana and other states," Fields said.

Fields said continued national growth for the sweet potato is expected because the sweet potato is such a healthy and nutritious food choice.

"Value added product will be strong," Fields said. "The sweet potato French fry is developing.

"On the nutritional side, the fresh market is very, very strong and our canned processing side is strong. Per capita consump-

tion is on its way up and that has to do with the nutritious, wholesome aspect of the sweet potato."

Fields also believes a niche market for organic sweet potatoes is growing.

"There's an opportunity there and organic sweet potatoes has great potential because of its marketing scheme," Field said.

Fields said the Louisiana-developed Beauregard sweet potato variety remains a standard but is receiving competition from the Covington variety developed in North Carolina.

"We in Louisiana like to think the Beauregard variety is the sweet potato of choice but the North Carolina Covington variety has come on the scene and is very good," Fields said. "We also believe a new variety, the Evangeline, is going to make an impact."

Fields said the 2008 hurricane season affected more than 90 percent of the sweet potato acreage in Louisiana and caused losses ranging from 50 to 75 percent. 90 percent of the acreage was affected and 60 to 75 percent losses.

"Nationally, that's going to have a slight impact on supply because Louisiana yams are always in demand," Fields said. **See Sweet potatoes, continued on page 2**

"We've got enough yams in storage to carry us through Easter, but the supply to carry us until the new crops come in is going to cost us money."

Louisiana Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., believes adequate crop insurance could protect farmers, but it is not available in every parish of the Louisiana.

"Crop insurance for sweet potatoes in Louisiana is provisional," Strain said. "You can't even get crop insurance in every parish, and in the parishes where insurance is available, there are significant issues in the way a marketable sweet potato is determined and ruled lost or damaged that need to be resolved."

Strain made his comments at a jambalaya luncheon for the conventioners at the Louisiana State Museum.

The luncheon was sponsored by the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry.

The sweet potato farmers were bussed in to the museum from the Hilton Capitol Center convention headquarters.

Strain said excessive rain and backwater floods from hurricanes Gustav and Ike covered much of Louisiana's sweet potato acreage for more than a week at prime harvest time and caused the crop to sour in the ground.

Nearly seventy-five percent of the sweet potato crop was abandoned in the field, Strain said.

The LSU AgCenter estimated the sweet potato loss to be in excess of \$48 million.

"We have to find a fair and equitable way to insure the sweet potato," Strain said. "We also need to make it so you can buy crop insurance in all parishes at reasonable rates."

Strain said he urged the United States

Senate after hurricane Gustav and Ike to pass Senator Mary Landrieu's emergency disaster aid bill that would have provided \$1.1 billion in aid for farmers in Louisiana, Texas, Oklahoma, Mississippi, Iowa, Illinois, Arkansas and other areas affected by the natural disasters of 2008.

Senator Tom Coburn of Oklahoma was the only Senator to object to Landrieu's bill and blocked the vote.

"If we had adequate crop insurance we wouldn't need all these federal disaster programs," Strain said.

Strain said he was returning to Washington this week to continue lobbying efforts for farm disaster aid for Louisiana agriculture.

Currently, Louisiana has procured \$50 million in community development block grants to help farmers replant for the 2009 growing season.

The sign up period for the CDBG program is expected to begin in early April.

Fields said the next sweet potato convention will be held at the Beau Rivage Hotel and Casino Resort in Biloxi, Mississippi.

Conventioners also enjoyed coffee and cookies with Mrs. Supriya Jindal, Governor Bobby Jindal's wife, at the Governor's Mansion and tours of Baton Rouge and plantation homes along the Mississippi River. Noted Baton Rouge chef and Louisiana Sweet Potato Association spokesperson Holly Clegg was also on hand to sign copies of her new cookbook, "Trim and Terrific: Gulf Coast Favorites."

In addition to the Louisiana Sweet Potato Association, staff members of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry along with the Baton Rouge Convention and Visitors Bureau helped put on the event.

Quarantine lifted at New Orleans racetrack

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said five thoroughbred racehorses that were directly exposed and initially tested positive in December for equine herpes virus were released from all quarantines and restrictions on January 21.

"Due to the cooperation between the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry, the Louisiana Racing Commission, and the LSU School of Veterinary Medicine, and the Fair Grounds, the planned protocols were put in place early to contain potential spread," Strain said. "We're glad the safety measures proved effective."

Biosecurity protocols were vol-

untarily initiated at Fair Grounds Race Course and Slots in New Orleans on Barns 4A and 4B December 26 after test results confirmed that a thoroughbred filly was infected with equine herpes virus (EHV-1).

The filly displayed unusual neurologic symptoms after a workout on December 23 and was shipped to Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky the same day. Specialists at the Kentucky facility diagnosed the horse with EHV-1. The horse received treatment and improved.

Five of the 72 horses housed in Barns 4A and 4B with the infected filly initially tested positive for EHV-1 and were removed from the facility.

All 72 horses underwent nasal swabbing and blood testing. The recommended quarantine period for equine herpes virus is generally up to 21 days after potential exposure to the virus. The 66 that initially tested negative were quarantined in the barns until January 15, when subsequent testing showed no trace of the virus.

EHV-1 is a viral disease that can evolve into a neurological condition.

Experts in EHV-1 have indicated, however, that as many as five percent of horses will normally carry some variant of the virus in their system. Physical symptoms of the EHV-1 virus include fever, upper respiratory infection, nasal discharge, cough, lethargy and

loss of appetite. The biosecurity protocols were previously established by the Veterinary Health Division of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry, and agreed to by the Louisiana Racing Commission and LSU School of Veterinary Medicine.

The protocols were designed to have minimal impact on Fair Grounds' racing schedule.

In severe cases, horses can suffer a loss of coordination and an inability to stand. The illness can be fatal.

The Louisiana procedures are similar to those used by the Kentucky equine industry, which has controlled outbreaks of EHV-1 in recent years, Strain added.

Crawfish and Cheese Manicotti

1 box manicotti noodles	1 tbsp. garlic powder
1 lb. mozzarella cheese	1 tbsp. parsley
1 lb. longhorn colby cheese	2 eggs
½ cup Parmesan cheese	1 (16 oz.) jar chunky spaghetti sauce
2 lbs. Louisiana crawfish tailmeat	1 cup oil
½ cup Italian bread crumbs	Salt and pepper to taste

Heat water to boiling in a pot large enough to hold noodles. Add oil and drop noodles singly into boiling water. Boil until soft, drain and rinse. Cut cheese into cubes. Mix all ingredients except spaghetti sauce and fill noodles. Place noodles in a single layer into baking dish. Cover with spaghetti sauce. Bake at 350 degrees for 35 to 40 minutes.

Crawfish Macque Choux

1 large onion, chopped	1 can cream-style corn
1 green bell pepper, chopped	1 can Rotel tomatoes, chopped
½ cup chopped green onions	1 lb. Louisiana crawfish tailmeat
1 stick butter	Salt and pepper to taste
2 cans whole kernel corn, drained	

Sauté onion, bell pepper and green onions in butter. Add corn and tomatoes. Simmer for 5 minutes. Add crawfish and seasonings and simmer for 20-30 minutes. Serves 8.

Crawfish Stuffed Trout

1 large filet per serving	2 bay leaves
1 can seasoned bread crumbs	1 onion, chopped
2 cups chopped crawfish tailmeat	2 cloves garlic, minced
Olive oil	2 stalks celery, finely chopped
6 oz. crabmeat	2 tbsps. minced parsley
Salt, pepper & lemon juice to taste	Lemon wedges and parsley

Salt and pepper fish and set aside. Sauté 1 bay leaf, finely chopped, in olive oil with half of the onion, celery, parsley, salt, pepper and lemon juice. Cook until wilted. Add water to bread crumbs to soften, then add crabmeat and finely chopped crawfish tailmeat. Add to vegetable mixture and cook 10 minutes. Mound dressing on each filet, roll and secure with toothpicks. Flour the rolled filets well and put in a saucepan, combine tomatoes with the other half of the onion, garlic, celery and parsley, 1 bay leaf and salt and pepper to taste. Add water to achieve desired consistency. Cook about 5 minutes, remove bay leaf and pour sauce over fish. Cook an additional 30 minutes, basting often. Serve on a platter garnished with lemon wedges and parsley.

Marinated Crawfish Pasta Salad

2 lbs. Louisiana Crawfish tailmeat	¼ tsp. pepper
1 onion, finely chopped	2 tps. minced parsley
1 cup vegetable oil	2 tps. minced chives
3 tbsps. white vinegar	2 tbsps. drained capers
2 tbsps. pickle relish	Cooked, chilled pasta
1 tsp. dry mustard	Sliced fresh broccoli, cauliflower, peas, zucchini etc.
1 tsp. salt	

Wash and drain crawfish tails. Toss together crawfish and onions. Heat next six ingredients to boiling. Stir in remaining ingredients except pasta and fresh vegetables and pour over crawfish mixture. Refrigerate at least 24 hours, tossing occasionally. Combine pasta, crawfish and vegetables, toss and serve. Serves 14.


