

Students demonstrate skills in the kitchen

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain met with Jefferson Davis Parish high school students and their parents at the West End Instructional Center in Jennings last month. He encouraged the students to pursue their studies and complete their education. After his short speech, the Commissioner sat down with the parents and ate lunch.

It's not unusual for parents to have lunch with their children at school. And it's not uncommon for Strain to visit schools, spreading the word about Louisiana agriculture and forestry.

What is remarkable is that the students prepared the meal entirely on their own and served a feast made completely of Louisiana food products.

Crawfish étouffée, chicken and sausage gumbo, pork jambalaya, candied yams, fried okra, tomatoes in a Creole vinaigrette, stuffed strawberries and pecan pie topped with local ice cream was the day's fare.

Culinary Arts Instructor Fran Stroud said it's all part of a plan to enhance career opportunities for high school students in Jefferson Davis Parish.

The school board authorized the creation of the culinary arts program for the 2005-2006 school year, originally intending it to be a traditional home economics type class designed to teach cooking skills and kitchen awareness.

But after hurricanes Katrina and Rita plowed through the coastal parishes in 2005, Louisiana

chefs, cooks, waiters and bus staff left the state to find work elsewhere.

"Many of the state's trained food service workers left the area and found work in Houston, Dallas and other cities and didn't return," Stroud said. "Our restaurants were begging for trained wait staff."

So the culinary arts program shifted its focus and fashioned a mini-restaurant, dubbed the Café West End, inside the West End Instructional Center's cafeteria. The café offered practical training in the food service industry for the students.

"We held special events with food every six weeks or so at the café," Stroud said. "The public enjoyed this so much they asked us to prepare meals on a regular basis."

Stroud said the program has grown and program participants now prepare food on a daily basis for fellow students and the adults who work at the center.


"They're able to purchase a meal every day," Stroud said. "Sometimes it's just a hot dog and other times it's more."

The students do all the food preparation, planning, food ordering, food check-in and food storage on a daily basis.

Stroud said the students wear different colored aprons to denote their level of experience within the program. Green is the first level, then red, and finally blue, representing the uppermost skill set.

Strain: Prepare now for hurricane season

Louisiana Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said that past hurricane experiences have taught Louisiana residents that a lack of hurricane awareness and preparation are common to major hurricane disasters.

"We don't know how many hurricanes will hit Louisiana, but we do know if we're prepared, it can lessen the hardship after the storm blows through," Strain said. "Livestock and pet owners especially need to be prepared well in advance of the season."

The hurricane season began on June 1 and will run through November 30. National hurricane research centers predict 13 or 14 named storms and about seven hurricanes for 2009.

Strain advised that all large and

small animal owners should check and double-check their paperwork to make sure they have proper animal ownership and vaccination documentation and other items for their livestock and pets before any evacuation is ordered.

"Ownership is an individual responsibility," Strain said. "A prepared owner is one who has taken the proper steps for their animals' well being, and that includes an evacuation plan for pets and livestock."

Strain said livestock owners should have plans in place to protect their herds during hurricane emergencies. The LSU AgCenter and local county agents can help livestock owners with their plans, Strain said.

Small animal owners should check and plan early for a travel

location that accommodates pets before an evacuation is called. Pet owners may be able to leave their pets at a pre-arranged boarding kennel along their evacuation route. If they are unable to find adequate pet boarding, an Internet search may help evacuees locate pet friendly hotels at evacuation destinations.

Strain said pet and livestock owners should maintain vaccinations, proof of ownership and identification of their animals and bring these documents with them if they need to evacuate.

"Transport your pets in a pet carrier," Strain said. "It's their home away from home. In addition, always have at least three to four days worth of pet food and daily medications and make sure to bring plenty of water for your

pets."

Strain urged animal owners who know beforehand that they will need assistance to evacuate animals to pre-register with their local parish office of emergency preparedness.

"If an emergency of any type should occur, contact your parish emergency preparedness officials first," Strain said. "Emergency planners have worked hard to develop a quick method to get problems handled, first at the local level and, then, at the state level."

Strain said the LDAF Animal Evacuation Information Center on the LDAF Website has information on how best to prepare your animal and yourself for hurricane emergencies.

A student manager is appointed each week to run Café West End.

"The top, most experienced students are the student managers," Stroud said. "The student manager assigns all the tasks to the 18 other students. One week you might be the bus boy, the cook, beverage manager, dessert manager or host. Everybody will experience all the jobs you normally see in a restaurant at one point or another."

Stroud said the students find a number of sources for the recipes they use.

"They use the Internet and search cookbooks," Stroud said. "Some of them bring in their grandmother's recipes."

Stroud said the students had recently completed a lesson on the food products of Louisiana and chose to incorporate their knowledge in a special luncheon serving only homegrown dishes.


"We learned about the foods of Louisiana and how those products contribute to the local economy," Stroud said. "The students learned about buying locally."

Stroud said the students were also thrilled to have Commissioner Strain visit with them and sample their cooking.

"It was a great honor to have the commissioner, who oversees all Louisiana agricultural production, share with us and celebrate Louisiana," Stroud said.

Not all of the students participating in the culinary arts program said they would pursue jobs in the food preparation sector, but they all agreed the entire West End Instructional Center has taught them valuable life lessons.

"It's been a good experience," said 16-year-old Cade Stephens of Jennings. "The program teaches you the main things you have to learn to live on your own."



Dreamin' of a big, juicy steak?

The summer months are great for family get-togethers and outdoor cooking festivities.

One of the best summer food bargains for grilling fare is the good old-fashioned steak. But a steak is one of the easiest entrees to ruin.

The problem many folks have with grilling is not lack of enthusiasm. A walk through any outdoor center or mass merchandiser will reveal a wide selection of outdoor gas grills, barbecue pits and kitchens especially designed for the great outdoors.

The trouble most folks have in reaching grilling nirvana is that they simply just don't know how to roast a good steak.

Who has time to go to culinary school to learn the secrets of cooking the perfect steak?

Not many, but fear not, the Market Bulletin can lead you through the grilling jungle if you follow these grilling tips.

Choose your meat wisely, pilgrim. The selection of meat is absolutely the most important decision you'll ever make in your life.

There is a contingent of meat lovers that thinks the filet or tenderloin is the best choice here. Choosing a tenderloin often means sacrificing flavor for tenderness.

Ribeyes have great flavor but tend to be fatty. A New York strip falls somewhere in between.

If you're on a budget, a good chuck steak offers enough marbling for juiciness and enough meatiness for flavor, but freshness is the key. If possible, buy your meat at a real butcher shop. You can watch the butcher slice your steak to your preferred thickness and you'll know the meat is the freshest possible.

When grilling day arrives, (a day not unlike Christmas in many households) the first thing the grill cook must do is absolutely, positively allow the steak to come to room temperature.

Many would-be grillers just throw the steak onto a red-hot grill straight out of the refrigerator. This is just about the worst thing one could do to a steak. Unfortunately, there are no state laws that prevent this sort of criminal behavior.

Please, please, please let the steak reach

room temperature. While you're waiting for the steak to reach room temperature you can begin preparing your family's famous baked beans recipe.

Once the steak has reached room temperature, trim away any excess fat. Fat around the steak should be a quarter of an inch thick or less.

Fat trimmed, now you can go ahead and season the meat.

There are no set rules when it comes to the proper seasoning of the steak.

If you've got a great cut of beef and really love the meat flavor, then salt and pepper is usually sufficient.

If the budget has you buying a lesser cut of meat, perhaps a good marinade is in your

future. The goal is not to overpower the steak with a lot of competing flavors.

Once you are satisfied that you have the steak seasoned to the culinary standard of your household, you are almost ready to cook.

Be still at this point and reflect on the enormity of your next step.

Voltaire, the 18th century French philosopher, told us we must all tend to our own garden. What you may not know is that he also wanted you to tend to your fire.

Most prime steak restaurants can heat up their cooking grills to 1000 degrees Fahrenheit. You probably won't be able to reach that temperature on your grill at home without the fire department paying you a

visit, but it's important to get your cooking surface as hot as possible.

Gas grills should be turned up to high and be allowed to thoroughly warm up. A skillet on the stove should also be allowed to heat up properly. If you're cooking with charcoal, a single layer of white-hot coals on the grilling bed is desirable.

The more sear, the better the steer. Notwithstanding the terrible pun, the more sear you can get on your prime steak, the more beef flavor you will lock into your meat. The steak should just sizzle and sear, but make sure you don't lose it to the flames of the charcoal, so pay attention. Want to see a grown man cry? Burn a \$30 steak.

We've read this little adage on menus at fine steakhouses: the longer you cook a steak, the sooner it becomes a mistake. Truer words have never been spoken.

A good steak should be cooked medium rare to an internal temperature of 130 to 135 degrees F.

Anything over medium is sinful and well-done is a crime in Texas. You'll do hard time if you grill your steak to this level.

With practice, you'll be able to determine if your steak is cooked just right with a gentle prodding of the cooking tongs. Most of us aren't that skilled, so you should get a good meat thermometer.

Cook the steak for one minute, then turn it over. Grill another minute and turn over.

Turn the steak over again, cook for two minutes, and add a minute for each one-half inch thickness of the steak. Turn over again (a total of four turns) and continue grilling for another two minutes plus one minute per half-inch.

Remove the steak from the grill and let it simmer in its own juices for five minutes. Cover it with tin foil to keep it warm.

If you follow these steps, you'll impress your wife, (or husband), friends, children and relations. With practice, you'll be able to cook the perfect steak every time. Your neighbors will be proud to know you and your opinion will be considered important.

Congratulations, you have reached beef nirvana.

State Officials Urge Changes to Federal Nutrition Program

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., and several other state officials sent a letter in late May to U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack urging him to combat obesity in America by make policy changes to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), a program many Louisiana households rely on to feed their families.

In Louisiana, more than one-third of children ages 10-17 and nearly two-thirds of adults are either overweight or obese-twice the national level. Louisiana ranks fourth nationwide for obesity.

In the letter, Strain, Department of Social Services Secretary Kristy Nichols, Department of Health and Hospitals Secretary Alan Levine and state representative Patrick Williams advocate sweeping changes to SNAP by introducing incentives for the purchase of healthy food products and the expansion of SNAP pilot programs that "double" benefits spent on fruits and vegetables purchased at local farmers' markets.

"We recommend policies that further the promotion of nutrition and healthy food choices along with increased access to fresh local fruits and vegetables," wrote Strain, Williams, Nichols and Levine.

The coexistence of obesity and poverty in Louisiana is also troubling; according to the National Coalition for a Healthy America, nearly 35 percent of Louisianians between 100 and 200 percent of the federal poverty level are obese. That number is 3 percent higher than the national average.

"Childhood obesity is a deep-seated issue that should

cause us all great concern. But, bringing attention to the issue and treating the disease of obesity isn't enough," said Williams. "We must take strong preventive steps and start early. Instead of treating childhood obesity after it happens, we shouldn't let children become obese to begin with. I look forward to our collective work to fight for the future of our children."

Strain said the proposed program expansion could help Louisiana's farm economy.

"Louisiana farmers markets offer a number of safe, healthy and fresh food choices," Strain said. "These proposed changes to SNAP will not only help our farm economy but also benefit the overall health of Louisiana."

Nichols continued, "We want to encourage healthy food choices for Louisiana's families. In addition to educational programs, a financial incentive to fill grocery baskets with peaches, broccoli and whole grains instead of processed and unhealthy food could help Louisiana move out of the bottom rankings for obesity."

Levine said, "Preventive steps such as making healthier food choices and incentivizing those healthier choices are the best ways our State can improve its health outcomes. Just like our children deserve the best health care when they are sick, they and their families deserve options that can help them achieve their potential while avoiding chronic disease."

For low-income families, SNAP, formerly known as the food stamp program, is a vital source of funds for food purchases. In April, 284,410 Louisiana households received more than \$91 million in SNAP benefits.

Beef Sirloin Pasta Portobello

1-1/4 lbs. boneless beef top sirloin steak, cut 1 inch thick	1 tbsp. olive oil
8 oz. uncooked linguine	8 oz. portobello mushroom caps, cut in half, then cut crosswise into 1/4 inch thick slices
1 to 2 tbsps. olive oil	1 medium red, yellow or green bell pepper, cut into 1/8 inch thick strips
2 large cloves garlic, crushed	2 tbsps. thinly sliced fresh basil leaves
1/2 tsp. salt	1/3 cup freshly grated Romano cheese
1/2 tsp. pepper	

Cook pasta according to package directions; drain. Keep warm. Meanwhile trim fat from beef steak. Cut steak lengthwise in half and then crosswise into 1/8-inch thick strips. In wok or large nonstick skillet, heat 1 to 2 tablespoons oil over medium-high heat until hot. Add beef and garlic, 1/2 at a time, and stir-fry 1 to 2 minutes or until outside surface is no longer pink. Remove from pan with slotted spoon; season with salt and pepper. Keep warm. In same pan, heat 1 tablespoon oil. Add mushrooms and bell pepper strips; stir-fry 3 to 4 minutes or until mushrooms are tender. Remove from heat. Return beef to pan; add sliced basil and toss. Place pasta on large deep oval platter; arrange beef mixture on pasta. Sprinkle cheese over beef and pasta.

Beefy Mexican Lasagna

1-1/2 lbs ground beef sirloin (95% lean)	1 tsp. ground cumin
9 corn tortillas	1-1/2 cups shredded Mexican cheese blend
2 cans (10 oz. each) mild enchilada sauce	1/2 cup chopped tomato
1 can (15 oz.) black beans, rinsed, drained	2 tbsp. chopped fresh cilantro
1-1/2 cups frozen corn	

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add ground beef; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking into crumbles and stirring occasionally. Remove from skillet with slotted spoon; pour off drippings. Return beef to skillet; stir in 1 can enchilada sauce, black beans, corn and cumin; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Spray 11-3/4 x 7-1/2 inch baking dish with nonstick cooking spray. Arrange 3 tortillas in dish, cutting as needed to cover bottom. Spread 1/4 cup remaining enchilada sauce over tortillas; cover with 1/3 beef mixture, then 1/3 cheese. Repeat layers twice, omitting final cheese layer. Pour remaining enchilada sauce over top. Cover with aluminum foil. Bake 30 minutes then sprinkle with remaining 1/2 cup cheese. Bake, uncovered, 5 minutes or until cheese is melted. Top with tomato and cilantro.

Tangy Lime Grilled Top Round Steak

1 beef top round steak, cut 3/4 inch thick (about 1 pound)	2 tablespoons vegetable oil
1/4 cup fresh lime juice	1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
2 tablespoons brown sugar	3 large cloves garlic, crushed

Combine lime juice, sugar, oil, Worcestershire and garlic in small bowl. Place beef steak and lime mixture in food-safe plastic bag; turn steak to coat. Close bag securely and marinate in refrigerator 6 hours or overnight; turning occasionally. Remove steak from marinade; discard marinade. Place steak on grid over medium, ash-covered coals. Grill, uncovered, 8 to 9 minutes for medium rare doneness, turning occasionally. (Do not overcook.) Carve steak into thin slices. Season with salt and pepper, as desired.

Mexican Beef Stew Over Chipotle Sweet Potatoes

2 lbs. beef for stew, cut into 1 to 1-1/2-inch pieces	1-1/2 cups frozen mixed red, yellow and green bell pepper blend
1/3 cup flour	1 can (14-1/2 oz.) diced tomatoes, undrained
1 tbsp. unsweetened cocoa powder	1-1/2 cups beef broth
1 tbsp. ground ancho chili pepper	1 tsp. minced chipotle peppers in adobo sauce
1 to 2 tbsps. butter	1 tsp. adobo sauce
1/2 tsp. salt	
1/4 tsp. ground black pepper	

Combine flour, cocoa and ancho chile pepper in large bowl. Add beef and toss to coat evenly with flour mixture. Remove beef; reserve any excess flour mixture. Heat 1 tablespoon butter in stockpot over medium heat until hot. Brown 1/2 of beef; remove from stockpot. Repeat with remaining beef, adding remaining 1 tablespoon butter if needed. Remove beef from stockpot; season with salt and black pepper. Add bell peppers; cook and stir 3 minutes. Stir in tomatoes, broth, chipotle pepper, adobo sauce and reserved flour mixture. Return beef to stockpot; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover tightly and simmer 1-3/4 to 2-1/4 hours or until beef is fork-tender. **recipe continued on card below*

2 lbs. sweet potatoes, peeled, cut into 1-1/2 to 2-inch pieces	1 tsp. adobo sauce from chipotle peppers

1 tsp. minced chipotle peppers in adobo sauce	1/2 tsp. ancho chili pepper

Meanwhile prepare Chipotle Sweet Potatoes. Place sweet potatoes in large saucepan; cover with water. Bring to a boil; cook 12 to 15 minutes or until tender. Drain, reserving 1/4 cup cooking liquid. Return potatoes and reserved cooking liquid to saucepan; add butter, if desired, chipotle pepper, adobo sauce, salt and ancho chile pepper. Mash potatoes until just blended and slightly chunky. Serve stew over sweet potatoes.

Lemony Beef & Barley with Sugar Snap Peas

1 lb. lean ground beef	1/2 cup quick-cooking barley
1/2 lb. mushrooms, sliced	1/2 teaspoon salt
1 medium onion, chopped	1/4 teaspoon black pepper
1 large carrot, thinly sliced	1 package (8 ounces) frozen sugar snap peas, defrosted
1 clove garlic, crushed	1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley
1 can (14 to 14 1/2 ounces) ready-to-serve beef broth	1 teaspoon grated lemon peel

In large nonstick skillet, cook and stir ground beef, mushrooms, onion, carrot and garlic over medium heat 8 to 10 minutes or until beef is no longer pink, breaking up into 3/4-inch crumbles. Pour off drippings. Stir in broth, barley, salt and pepper. Bring to a boil; reduce heat to medium-low. Cover tightly and simmer 10 minutes. Add peas; continue cooking 2 to 5 minutes or until barley is tender. Stir in parsley and lemon peel.
