

You know it's late fall in south Louisiana when farmers burn sugarcane in the field. Cane burning has been a cultural practice for centuries in Louisiana. A pre-harvest burn makes the plant easier to cut while a post-harvest burn removes leaf mulch from the field so the second crop can grow better.

As urban sprawl creeps into areas traditionally set aside for farming, sugarcane farmers have been asked to consider their new neighbors when they burn their fields. Most producers cooperate and follow best management practices to minimize the effects of field burning, but the very nature of the sugarcane plant and harvest techniques will always leave a lot of organic material in the field.

If only there was a way for the farmer and processors to use all of the plant.

The plant is 75 percent water, 10 percent sugar and 15 percent fiber. After the water and sucrose has been squeezed from the stalk at the sugar refinery, the fibrous substance left over, called bagasse, must be stored somewhere.

At one time building material manufacturers used bagasse to make a kind of wallboard known as

Cellotex or bagasse board. Bagasse currently has limited commercial value.

So what to do with this vast amount of organic waste product?

It's not uncommon in south Louisiana to see mountains of bagasse piled high in the sky next to sugar mills and occupying valuable real estate.

In recent years, considerable attention has been given to sugarcane and its potential to produce ethanol. Brazil has devoted considerable resources to develop an ethanol product and industry for fuel.


The Louisiana sugar industry is also interested in other uses for sugarcane. But investment in a faulty technology could mean millions of lost dollars if the wrong decision is made.


Officials at Raceland Raw Sugar Corporation wanted to make sure they considered all possible options before investing their hard-earned capital into untested technologies. Their solution took them back to the future. They are going to burn their bagasse.

Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

Plant adds to unprecedented agricultural infrastructure investment

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said he expects to see a significant increase in Louisiana sweet potato production with the start up of the new ConAgra Foods Lamb Weston sweet potato processing facility planned for Delhi in Richland Parish.

The sweet potato plant is scheduled to open in November of 2010.

"Sweet potatoes are one of the nation's hottest food items," Strain said. "National consumption is up 21 percent over the last five years. It seems like everyone across the country has discovered what we've known in Louisiana for years, that sweet potatoes taste great and Louisiana's sweet potatoes are the best."

"With the expected help from

Lamb Weston, I think the smaller Louisiana row crop farmer will now have a chance to cultivate sweet potatoes, a high-value crop," Strain said.

Strain said Louisiana farmers currently have 13,500 acres in sweet potato production, but that figure could increase significantly and surpass 25,000 acres, the norm in the late 1990s.

"Lamb Weston is lining up national quick-service restaurant chains to buy high-quality sweet potato fries," Strain said. "State farmers have a real opportunity to be part of the sweet potato supply and demand chain."

Strain said Delhi is a perfect location to handle expanding production anticipated in neighboring states in response to the Louisiana processing

facility.

"The plant is strategically located with easy access to rail and water transportation," Strain said.

Strain said the state Economic Development office committed between \$32.4 million and \$37.4 million from the economic development megafund toward completion of the project. The state requires Lamb Weston to employ a minimum of 275 workers when the factory goes into production in 2010 and 500 employees by 2015.

The average salary of the jobs the plant creates will be between \$34,000 and \$35,000, Lamb Weston officials said.

"This has been a year of unprecedented growth in the state's agricultural industries," Strain said. "New investment and partnership with a

viable poultry player in north Louisiana and a new frozen chicken processing facility in New Orleans will keep the state poultry industry strong for years to come. State investment in a bulk rice loading facility servicing the Port of Lake Charles has been approved and will benefit southwestern Louisiana.

"Rural economic development continues to be one of the top priorities of my administration and Lamb Weston's sweet potato processing plant is exactly the type of project that will maintain economic stability, attract jobs and promote growth in northeast Louisiana.

"Louisiana is an agricultural state and we continue to draw excellent support from the legislature. Senator Francis Thompson and Representative Charles "Bubba"

thus more efficient to transport to bio-fuel plants.

But Plant Manager and Chief Engineer Neville Dolan said a new technique that compresses the bagasse into a super-dense briquette will have more profitable applications as a fuel source than as a biomass. The bagasse briquette looks like an oversized pellet.

A team from Raceland has worked on this value-added project for the past four years and for the past two have worked closely with a Brazilian manufacturer to build a machine that can dry and compress the fluffy fibrous residue into a 1 1/2" diameter briquette.

Dolan said loose bagasse is a lightweight material and only weighs about five pounds per cubic foot. The unprofitable lightness makes bagasse impractical to transport.

"Using this compression method the bagasse will weigh 42 to 50 pounds per cubic foot," Dolan said.

The first compressing machine plant is now

installed at Raceland and the first phase of the commissioning complete. Production tests will commence soon in order to ascertain the economic and technical feasibility of the unit.

Raceland Raw Sugar will look at other issues such as wear characteristics, labor requirements and fuel inputs before making a final decision but early tests are promising.

Initial indications are that the fuel input to compress the bagasse could be zero. After the bagasse drying process, the bagasse is screened to remove the bagacillo, also called the "fines". This bagacillo is returned to the fireboxes on the dryer where it is burned to create the heat in the same dryer. It is anticipated that the dryer will use ten percent of the bagasse and bagacillo for this purpose.

Probably the most important question to be asked is about the market for these briquettes. Would the denser material have value as a biomass for use in an ethanol or biodiesel product?

Maybe, but Raceland Sugar officials decid-

ed they would try out basic technologies before they invested a lot of money into expensive research. Briquettes can be sold as a renewable fuel in the "pellet" market both domestically and internationally.

Raceland Raw Sugar, not to mention every farmer and resident of south Louisiana, already knows that dried stalks and cane leaves will burn easily in the fields and furnace. The question now was how efficient does bagasse burn?

Dolan ran tests and determined that the compressed bagasse will deliver 7,000 BTUs of heat per pound.

One ton of these briquettes at 7,000 BTU can produce enough electricity for an average household for one month.

"That is a good fuel value," Dolan said.

A good fuel value led to the next question. Does bagasse burn clean?

In a word, yes.

Dolan said there is zero sulfur dioxide emitted when the bagasse briquette is burned.

In addition to the low emissions, the anticipated cost of production is about \$8 to \$10 a ton.

It's too soon to say what the open market will pay for a ton of compressed bagasse but Dolan said conditions are favorable.

One plus that is sure to thrill farmers: Raceland Raw Sugar will want the entire cane stalk, leaves and all, delivered to the mill. That means producers will not have to run the gas-guzzling cane combine blowers to separate the refuse from the cane.

"When the farmer turns off the blowers, he has at least 50 percent fuel savings," Dolan said.

Dolan, South African by birth, is a real hands-on engineer.

"There's always a lot of talk about research and development," Dolan says. "But it's time to stop the research and do the development."

With any luck, Dolan and the Raceland Raw Sugar Corporation will have a real winner on their hand.

LSU AgCenter develops new product

A new technology developed by an LSU AgCenter researcher has serendipitously found its way into the oil industry, resulting in a new company and the reinvigoration of an existing company in Louisiana.

The patented process, developed by Qinglin Wu in the School of Renewable Natural Resources, involves making material from recycled plastics, including used motor oil containers and wood waste, that can be used in oil and gas drilling to prevent the drilling fluid from seeping into the environment.

This material, which has been trademarked as Tiger Bullets, are marketed to oil companies by a start-up company aptly called Hole Pluggers, which is based in New Iberia.

"We're recycling the oil containers back into the oil business," said Tom Parker, one of the owners of Hole Pluggers, who licensed the technology from the AgCenter. "That's one of the advantages of our product."

Tiger Bullets are manufactured at Wallace Moulding and Millworks of Columbia in Caldwell Parish, a company that also makes the parts for windows, doors and cabinets for houses. With the decline in the housing market, Dan Wallace, the owner, had been in search of new business and, after consulting with Wu, had invested in equipment to move into the manufacture of plastic lumber. Then along came Tiger Bullets.

"Talk about being in the right place at the right time," Wallace said. "We were already set up with equipment that can manufacture this material."

Wallace was able to hire back some of the 30 employees he'd had to lay off and hopes to have all 45 of his employees back – and possibly more employees – by the first of the year.

"This is another success story of how technology developed at a university can transform an existing business and industry, leading to new jobs and growth in the state's economy," said Wade Baumgartner, associate director of the LSU AgCenter's Office of Intellectual Property.

Here's how serendipity played a role in the unfolding of this story.

On March 30, 2008, Parker, an entrepreneur in the oil business, saw an article in the Baton Rouge Advocate newspaper about Wu and his wood-plastic composites research. Wu is the Roy O. Martin Professor of Composites and Engineered Wood Products at the AgCenter.

The article described how Wu was using discarded motor oil containers in combination with cellulosic fibers, which absorbed the residual oil, to create strong composite materials.

Wu had been conducting this research at the request of Dan Cadigan, a senior official with BP Global Supply Chain in Port

Allen, who had contacted Wu a year before, ironically, after reading an article in the Advocate about Wu's research.

"Wu's research sounded like it offered the perfect solution to recycling oil containers," Cadigan said.

Wu has spent his research career creating wood-plastic composites using waste products from the agricultural and forestry industry including wood chips, sugarcane bagasse and rice hulls.

In 2006, Wu's research team received an \$800,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the U.S. Department of Energy to create composite products that can be commercialized in Louisiana. Wallace had been one of the Louisiana busi-

ness owners Wu had approached with ideas for new products.

In reading about Wu's and Cadigan's project, Parker saw immediate application for the composite material that included plastic oil containers as an ingredient in the drilling fluid "mud" used in drilling for oil and gas. He himself had been trying to develop the perfect mud additive that could effectively seal off fractures in the earth and permeable formations.

The drilling mud both lubricates and cools the drill bit as it goes down into the earth, sometimes as far as 30,000 feet or

more. Ideally, the mud comes back up with the drill cuttings after the tunnel is dug. But when the mud seeps away, that's called "lost circulation" and is a huge, expensive problem.

"This costs money for the oil and gas industry, and it's not good for the environment," Wu said.

Other drilling fluid ingredients on the market are not as good at filling and sealing off cracks and porous areas as Tiger Bullets, Parker said. One reason is Wu's patented process allows the material to be custom-made into multiple-sized particles to fit the particular geology of the drilling operation. The varying-sized material can immediately seal off and plug any size fissure or surface porosity, preventing seepage.

Wu's material has been used successfully with all three types of drilling fluid – synthetic, water-based and oil-based. Parker has tested the Tiger Bullets in oil drilling operations in the mountains of Colorado, the plains of Arkansas and off-shore in the Gulf of Mexico, and they perform well.

"Wu did a great job of simulating the effects of drilling in the laboratory. His technology came off the drawing board and worked in the real world better than expectations," Parker said.

Tiger Bullets' environmental advantage is another selling point. Although Wu's technology can use any kind of plastic waste in the material, used plastic motor oil containers work perfectly.

"There are few current uses for the oil container plastics, and they are very expensive to get rid of," Wu said. "This is not a problem with our process because the material is converted to a green, proprietary blend of materials to make a lost circulation material that does not contain any free oil."

Cadigan said Louisiana produces more oil containers than probably any other state. So having them come back to the state after they've been used and create new business and jobs is the perfect "cradle to cradle" scenario.

Cadigan credits Kelsey Short with the Louisiana Economic Development office with helping connect Wallace with the Northeast Louisiana Economic Development Alliance, which provided some funding for Wallace's new equipment.

Like the rest of the economy, the oil business is down right now, but it will bounce back and bring with it a bright future for Hole Pluggers.

"The LSU AgCenter has a history of conducting research with practical application for industry," said David Boethel, LSU AgCenter vice chancellor for research. "This is another example."

And both Parker and Cadigan agree it pays to read the newspaper.

Catfish Almandine Rosa

1/3 cup grated Parmesan cheese	1 ½ tsp. paprika
1/3 cup all-purpose flour	¼ cup milk
¼ tsp. salt	1 egg white, beaten
½ tsp. pepper	6 (6 oz.) Louisiana farm-raised catfish filets
	3 tbsps. sliced almonds

Combine cheese, flour, salt, pepper and paprika. Set aside. Combine milk and beaten egg. Dip filets in egg-milk mixture and dredge in flour mixture. Arrange in a 9x13x2 inch baking dish. Spray each filet with vegetable cooking spray and sprinkle with almonds. Bake, covered at 350 degrees for 35-40 minutes.

Catfish with Tomato-Zucchini Sauce

2 tbsps. olive oil	1 (28 oz. can) diced tomatoes in juice, drained, ½ cup juice reserved
1 small onion, chopped	4 (6 oz.) Louisiana farm-raised catfish filets
3 large garlic cloves, chopped	
3 small zucchini, trimmed and cut into ½" pieces	
1 ½ tsp. dried oregano	

Heat oil in a large, heavy skillet over medium heat. Add onion and garlic and sauté until onion is almost tender, about 3 minutes. Add zucchini and oregano and sauté until zucchini begins to soften, about 5 minutes. Add tomatoes and reserve juice and bring to a boil. Sprinkle fish with salt and pepper. Place fish on top of vegetables in skillet. Cover skillet, reduce heat to medium-low and simmer about 5 minutes. Transfer fish to platter and tent with foil to keep warm. Increase skillet heat and boil mixture until liquid thickens to sauce consistency, about 5 minutes. Season sauce with salt and pepper. Spoon sauce over fish.

Easy Catfish Stir-Fry

1 lb. Louisiana farm-raised catfish filets, cut into thin strips	¼ cup dry sherry
4 green onion, cut in 2"-3" strips	2 tbsps. sesame oil
1 red bell pepper, cut in strips	½ lb. mushrooms, sliced
3 tbsps. peanut oil	2 cup shredded fresh spinach leaves
	Cooked rice or noodles

Prepare filets and vegetables, making sure to thoroughly clean and stem spinach. Add oil to hot wok or skillet. Add catfish strips, green onions and red bell pepper to hot oil and stir-fry over high heat for 1-2 minutes. Reduce heat and add remaining ingredients. Cover and steam a few minutes until mushrooms and spinach are wilted. Stir occasionally. Serve over hot cooked rice or noodles.

Catfish Potato Scallop

6 (6 oz.) Louisiana farm-raised catfish filets	1 tbsp. chopped chives
1 tsp. salt	2 tbsps. chopped parsley
½ tsp. pepper	3 tbsps. chopped pimento
4 cups thinly sliced cooked potatoes	¼ cup water
1 can cream of celery soup	6 slices bacon
1 cup sour cream	Pimento strips

Season catfish with salt and pepper. Combine soup, sour cream, chives, parsley, chopped pimento and salt and pepper to taste. Set aside ¾ cup soup mixture for topping. Place alternate layers of potato and soup mixture in a well greased 13x9x2 inch baking dish. Place fish on top of potatoes. Spread reserved soup mixture over fish. Place one slice of bacon on top of each filet. Bake at 400 degrees for 30-35 minutes until bacon is crisp and fish flakes easily with a fork. Garnish with pimento strips.

Sesame Catfish with Lemon Parsley Sauce

2 lbs. Louisiana farm-raised catfish filets	½ cup crushed saltine crackers
1 tsp. salt	3 tbsps. sesame seeds
¼ tsp. white pepper	Oil for frying
¼ cup all-purpose flour	Sauce:
1 egg, beaten	1/3 cup finely chopped onion
2 tbsps. milk	¼ cup finely chopped parsley
	¼ cup lemon juice

Season catfish with salt and pepper. Coat lightly with flour. Combine egg and milk. Combine cracker crumbs and sesame seed. Heat oil in large skillet to 360 degrees. Dip catfish into egg mixture and roll in crumb mixture. Fry catfish in a single layer for 4-5 minutes on each side for until brown and flakes easily. Drain on paper towels and make sauce. Combine all sauce ingredients in saucepan and heat to boiling. Serve over catfish.

Catfish Stuffed with Spinach and Olives

4 (4 oz.) Louisiana farm-raised catfish filets	½ cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese
Salt and pepper to taste	1 cup dry white wine
1 (10 oz.) pkg. frozen spinach, thawed and squeezed dry	2 tbsps. butter or margarine
½ cup chopped black olives	2 tsp. cornstarch, dissolved in ¼ cup water

Choose filets that are uniform in shape and size. Season fish with salt and pepper. Combine spinach, olives, cheese and additional pepper to taste. Mix well. Spread filling on fish filets. Roll each filet and place seam-side down in a large 10" skillet. Add wine and butter. Cover and bring to a boil. Lower heat and simmer covered for 7 minutes or until fish flakes easily. Transfer fish to serving place. Add cornstarch mixture to wine sauce in pan. Heat, stirring, until sauce is thickened.



Horsing around with Pam Kaster

There is something about the outside of a horse that is good for the inside of a man. ~Winston Churchill

There is a special bond between people and their horses that equine photographer and children's book author Pam Kaster has a knack for capturing on film.

Kaster shared her secrets of taking great horse photos at an equine photography clinic she conducted at the 40th annual Louisiana 4-H, Future Farmers of America state horse show that was held July 6-11 in West Monroe at the Ike Hamilton Expo Center.

Kaster, a Zachary resident, is a member of the Equine Photographers Network, National Association of Photoshop Photographers and trained under famed German equine photographer Gabrielle Boiselle. Most recently, Kaster was named the winner of the 2008 American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Henry Bergh® Children's Book Award for her book "Molly the Pony - A True Story."

Kaster, a horsewoman, said when she took up photography as a hobby, human subjects were of little interest to her.

"When I started I found my horses more

interesting to photograph than people," Kaster said. "Since my granddaughter was born, I've had a change of heart; she's now my favorite human model to photograph."

More than a dozen eager horse and photography enthusiasts attended the Monroe workshop. They were armed with an array of digital cameras from little point and shoot cameras to fancy digital single lens reflex (SLR) models with all the bells and whistles. They were anxious to learn techniques to improve their photography skills.

Kaster said aspiring photographers should have the basic essentials, like a 70-200 mm lens, the camera owner's manual, card reader and a computer.

"You don't need to have a high-end digital camera to take great photographs," Kaster said. "Point and shoots

can produce great pictures, but as your skill level improves, you may find your point and shoot limiting and decide to upgrade to a camera that affords you more flexibility."

Kaster said distortion, lighting and distracting background are common problems that most beginner photographers don't recognize at first.

Avoid shooting when the sun is directly overhead. Ideally you want to shoot either early in the morning or late in the evening, Kaster said. "After the sun goes down there's about a 10 minute window where the lighting is just magical."

Kaster said some horses are easier to shoot than others.

"I believe white horses are the best horses in the world to photograph," Kaster said.

"They reflect the light where black horses suck the light out of an image so you must

accommodate by adjusting your lighting and speed."

Kaster suggests composing your image to avoid distracting backgrounds, for instance removing a trash can from the frame.

Kaster recommended shooting through a stall door or alley way to create a beautiful silhouetted image.

Following the lecture, Kaster and the clinic attendees put their newfound knowledge to the test and photographed 13-year-old Abby Theriot of Bourg riding her horse Smokey. The group did their best to use Kaster's recommendations.

One participant said she can't wait to get home and photograph her horses.
