Most horses can be trained to do one thing really well.

Cowhorses can learn to lightning bolt through an arena to roping range in mere seconds. Some ponies excel at the stop-and-turn-on-a-dime maneuver during a hell-bent for leather barrel race. Surefooted mustangs can climb and descend ravines on the open range like a mountain climber. Noble thoroughbreds can run for the roses and some horses are bred just to look pretty.

The small town arena is the home of equine competitions and bragging rights are earned in the ring. Trophies like oversized belt buckles and beautiful saddles are awarded for the best cutting horses, best barrel riders and best ropers.

Professional rodeos are for determining the best overall cowboy and the racetrack is the proving ground for the fastest horse.

And then there are the informal contests. Who has the best-looking horse, the nicest saddle, the filly with the longest mane?

In some events, the skill of the rider is the determining factor. In others, it's all horse. So how do equestrians determine who is the best rider and horse combination?

The new-to-Louisiana Craig Cameron Extreme Cowboy Association racing event is where a combination of skills from both rider and horse come into play.


Cameron, a life-long Texas rancher, working cowboy and horse trainer, brought his "Ride Smart" method through the RFD network to millions of viewers. The television show was so popular Cameron developed the Extreme Cowboy Race program for RFD.

The Extreme Cowboy Race challenged competitors to ride their horses on a timed course laden with a variety of obstacles designed to highlight how well riders and mounts work together.

Dianne Edwards and members of her family were enthralled with the Extreme Cowboy Racing concept and created the Ultimate Cowboy Showdown of Amite City.

The Ultimate Cowboy Showdown group built an obstacle course on family land on Mixon Road and held timed races for a year. When the Craig Cameron group formed the Extreme Cowboy Association (EXCA) in 2009, the Ultimate Cowboy Showdown was convinced they could introduce the sport to Louisiana riders. The promoters of the Cowboy Showdown, Dianne Edwards and her husband, Clay, Edwards' sister, Melinda Busby and parents James and Margie Busby, agreed to give it a shot.

The Ultimate Cowboy Showdown events were based strictly on time, but EXCA rules called for a measure of *See horse racing, continued on page 5*

Citrus pest found in Plaquemines Parish

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the Diaprepes root weevil (*Diaprepes abbreviatus*), a multi-crop pest, has been found in a commercial citrus grove south of Buras and appropriate actions have been initiated to control the insect.

Strain said the 400-tree orchard was quarantined in July and surveys were conducted in the area to determine the spread of the weevil. Additional evidence of Diaprepes

weevil infestation was discovered in mid-August at a residential property within 100 yards of the original find.

The root weevil is already established in California, Texas and Florida.

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry horticulture officials said feeding weevil larvae girdle citrus tree root systems which causes foliage discoloration, twig and branch dieback

and ultimately tree death. Adults feed on foliage, creating notched leaf margins with a scalloped appearance.

Strain said the Diaprepes weevil has 270 reported host plants, including most ornamental plants commonly found in Louisiana landscapes. The weevil also attacks prominent state crops like sugarcane, sweet potatoes, cotton and corn.

LDAF officials have worked with

LSU AgCenter personnel to devise an effective chemical treatment plan, which involves a root drench and spray, to contain and limit movement of the weevil. Natural control methods, such as nematodes, fungi and parasitic wasps, are not useful in Louisiana's soil and climate.

Strain said treatment of infested areas will be mandatory to lift any state-imposed restrictions on properties where the weevil is detected.

horsemanship rendered by a panel of judges. In addition, the new EXCA offered a chance to compete in state, regional and national competitions.

Edwards connected with the EXCA and the Ultimate Cowboy Showdown group set up a course to EXCA specifications at the Mixon Road site. The location is near Jenkins' Nursery.

"I had to make sure I knew all the rules," Edwards said. "I designed the course and we had our first race in July."

Edwards said the July race drew about 15 riders of all ages. The follow-up event held August 22 more than doubled the entries and attracted riders from Texas and Arkansas, as well as Louisiana.

Two more events are set for September 26-27 and October 17-18. The first day of each event will be held at the Florida Parishes Arena in Amite. The second round will be held at the outdoor course on Mixon Road. Winners from these events may have an opportunity to compete in the EXCA national finals in Topeka, Kansas this November.

Louisiana was assigned to the EXCA's Lone Star region, which is comprised of Louisiana and Texas, Edwards said. Point totals from the races will determine the state champions and qualify riders for the regional and nationals.

The new Cowboy Showdown/EXCA course, set over a rolling grassy pasture in Tangipahoa Parish, was comprised of twelve obstacles, including a water hazard.

Some of the other obstacles featured were a hay bale maze, bucket drill, circle drill, tunnel, jump and a curtained gateway.

The curtained gateway is essentially a sheet of plastic cut into several hanging sections that flutter in the wind. No problem for a four-year-old kid walking through a haunted house

attraction, but to a horse, the general effect was spooky.

Wendy Stephens of Vivian in Caddo Parish competed with The Bailif, a 13.2H Class B Welsh pony stallion. This team has won the Craig Cameron Extreme Cowboy Race and placed several times in EXCA events.

Stephens is also the EXCA Lone Star Regional Director.

Stephens said the ideal horse for the extreme race should have a "willing, working disposition."

Speed also plays a role but it's more about control and trust, she said.

"If you're going too fast you could have a wild ride," Stephens said. "If you're going too slow, you're not showing much control of your speed."

Stephens added that the mount has to be courageous.

"Your horse has to be brave and go through tarps and tunnels and water crossings and has to trust that you are going to take care of him," Stephens said.

Susan Morris of Pride had a wild ride.

Morris and Cajun, an eight-year-old quarter-

horse stallion, galloped across the plain and looked as if they had been working as a team forever.

Morris should look natural

on a horse. Morris runs the Sandy Creek Ranch for Harvey Honore in East Baton Rouge Parish. She's a real cowgirl and Cajun is a real working cowhorse.

But even cowgirls get the blues and Morris and Cajun emerged from the second water cross-

ing completely soaked from a spill in the hazard.

"I don't like swimming but it was fun and exciting," Morris said.

Morris said this was the second time she and Cajun competed in an extreme race.

"I show Cajun in cutting and reining events and I thought this would be fun for him," Morris said.

Morris and Cajun recovered well from the mishap and finished strong.

"Cajun trusts me even when I get in a bad situation," Morris said. "You find out just how much your horse trusts you. That was a scary

situation for him and Cajun just stood right there and let me get up and get back on him. He's a very nice horse."

Leah Burke from Frankston, Texas has competed in non-sanctioned extreme races and ultimately placed in the top four of an east Texas Craig Cameron extreme race for women last year. Her top finish garnered an invite to Cameron's national event.

Burke believes extreme racing has an appeal for all riding skill levels and ages.

She rode SonnyMan, a quarterhorse gelding. "My goal is to have a good all-around horse. You don't have to be an expert roper to compete in this event," Burke said. "It's a great idea for kids and a great event for the whole family."

Stephens finished first in the pro division while Josh Himel and Old Two Eyes is Back took second.

In the non-pro category, Burke finished first. Morris and Cajun finished second.

Francis Jones and Big Cowboy of Winona, Texas took first place honors in the ride smart division, followed by Janice Early and JJ, of Linden, Texas.

First place in novice were Pamela Nale and Fancypaint, of El Dorado, Arkansas; second, Angie Jean of Slidell and Moe.

Jessie Temple and Britches won first place in the youth category and Jeremiah Finn and Crystal took second, both of Abita Springs.

Paris Jean and Mac of Slidell won the young guns class.

Thai Chicken And Rice Lettuce Wraps

1 tbsp. oil	1 1/2 cups diced, peeled mango
3 cups cooked brown rice	1 cup julienne red bell pepper strips
1 cup bottled peanut sauce plus extra for dipping	Salt and pepper to taste
2 (6-10-oz.) pkgs. refrigerated, grilled chicken strips, cut into 1/2-inch pieces.	12 whole large leaves Boston or iceberg lettuce

Heat oil in large nonstick skillet over medium heat; add cooked rice. Lightly saute rice, stirring frequently about 3 minutes. In large bowl, combine rice, peanut sauce, chicken, mango and bell pepper; toss to coat. Season with salt and pepper. Arrange lettuce leaves on large platter. Spoon rice mixture into center of each lettuce leaf and roll around filling to eat. Serve with additional peanut sauce for dipping, if desired.

Lemon Velvet Chicken Rice Soup

4 (14-1/2-oz. cans) roasted garlic chicken broth, divided	2 (6-oz. pkg.) precooked, grilled chicken strips
2 large lemons	1/3 cup chopped chives
3 cups cooked rice, divided	Salt and black pepper, to taste
1 cup heavy cream	chives, for garnish
	lemon peel, for garnish

Heat broth, reserving 1/4 cup, in 3- to 4-quart saucepan over medium heat until it comes to a simmer. Meanwhile, zest lemon peel; set aside. Juice lemons; set aside. In a food processor or blender, combine 1 1/2 cups cooked rice, heavy cream and remaining 1/4 cup broth; process until smooth. Add rice mixture, remaining cooked rice, lemon juice and chicken strips to broth. Simmer 5 to 8 minutes, or until heated through. Add chopped chives; cook 1 minute. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Garnish with lemon peel and chives, if desired.

Chocolate Chip Banana Nut Rice Pudding

3 cups cooked medium grain rice	2 medium bananas, sliced
2 cups milk	1/2 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
1 (14-oz.) can sweetened condensed milk	1/2 cup chopped pecans

Combine rice, milk and sweetened condensed milk in 2-quart saucepan. Cook over medium heat until thick and creamy, 20 to 25 minutes, stirring frequently. Remove from heat. Alternate layers of bananas, chocolate chips, pecans and rice pudding in parfait glasses. Garnish with chocolate chips and pecans.

Cappuccino Rice Pudding Cups

3 cups cooked medium or long grain white rice	1 tbsp. instant coffee granules
2 cups whole or 2% milk	Sweetened whipped cream
1 14-oz. can sweetened condensed milk	Ground cinnamon
	Chocolate shavings (optional)

Combine rice, milk and sweetened condensed milk in large saucepan over medium-high heat bringing just to a boil. Reduce heat to medium; cook 20 minutes, stirring frequently or until thickened. Remove from heat, stir in instant coffee granules until dissolved. Cool slightly. Spoon equal amounts of warm pudding* into 8 small coffee cups. Top with whipped cream and sprinkle with cinnamon. Garnish with chocolate shavings, if desired.

Strain encourages FFA students to study hard

LDAF monitors all cotton plants for boll weevils

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry officials say cotton plants may look beautiful in private home landscapes but the state must monitor all planted cotton, including those used for ornamental purposes, for boll weevil presence.

Todd Parker, LDAF assistant commissioner for the Office of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, said state boll weevil eradication laws provide that anyone who wants to plant any cotton for non-commercial purposes must receive prior permission from the Commissioner of Agriculture and Forestry.

"We need to know where all the cotton plants are located throughout the state to monitor for the boll weevil to protect Louisiana's cotton industry," Parker said. "The LDAF puts out more than 100,000 traps in cotton fields annually to check for the presence of boll weevils."

Parker said increasing amounts of gardeners outside of traditional cotton growing areas are planting cotton to spruce up their garden landscapes. Others plant small plots for fiber to

spin their own thread for fabrics. The LDAF must place a boll weevil trap at these locations, Parker said.

Historically, the boll weevil has been cotton's most destructive pest. All cotton-growing states have eradication programs.

Cotton remains one of Louisiana's leading crops and was worth more than \$200 million to the state in 2007 but declined in 2008 due to harvesting issues caused by hurricanes Gustav and Ike. The 2008 numbers totaled to more than 290,000 acres planted with a gross farm value of \$134 million.

Asian soybean rust continues to spread across Louisiana

The detection of Asian soybean rust in a soybean field in Iberville Parish on Aug. 18 was the latest of four finds of this potentially serious disease.

All of the rust discoveries were found during a two day period.

So far the finds are in soybean plants that have already formed the beans and are nearing harvest, making them immune to any yield damage that could be caused by the disease, said Clayton Hollier, LSU AgCenter extension plant pathologist.

The other three recent discoveries were in West Baton Rouge, Pointe Coupee and East Carroll parishes, Hollier said.

All told, Asian soybean rust has been found in 14 parishes across the state in 2009, mostly in kudzu but also in soybeans.

"What's of concern now are the soybeans out there that were planted late – mostly after wheat harvest – that are in the pod-forming stages (R3 to R5)," Hollier said. "These fields should be treated as soon as possible, if good yield potential exists."

The treatment for Asian soybean rust and other late-season diseases is fungicides. Hollier said a number of options are available, and farmers need to check with their local parish LSU AgCenter extension agents for their recommendations.

"We're a little ahead this year than we have been in the past," Hollier said, meaning that more rust was found this year than since the disease was first discovered in Louisiana in late 2004.

Asian soybean rust is a disease that dries up a plant rapidly and spreads quickly so it can and has destroyed

much soybean acreage in other countries, mostly in Africa and South America.

"We found a lot in kudzu early on – more than usual," Hollier said. "But then it got dry. Now with the rains coming back, we're finding more."

Kudzu serves as a host plant for Asian soybean rust, allowing it to overwinter in states in the Deep South, including Louisiana. Extremely cold weather might kill the spores that cause this disease.

Hollier expects that his associate, Patricia Bollich, who serves as the state's chief scout for the disease, will be finding more as she travels around the state.

"As long as farmers treat the fields that are still vulnerable to the disease, we should have no problem managing the disease this year," Hollier said.

He said Midwestern soybean farmers are concerned about the finds of Asian soybean rust in southern Arkansas, Mississippi and Louisiana, with the tropical storm and hurricane season starting to get into gear. The concern is that the winds will blow the spores north.

"I'm sure soybean farmers in the Midwest are beginning to scout their soybean fields to determine the need for fungicides," Hollier said.

To reduce problems with Asian soybean rust, it's best to plant soybeans in Louisiana on time in the spring. But sometimes weather – either too wet or too dry – can delay the planting of soybeans. Also, some farmers double-crop soybeans with wheat and get a late start planting soybeans after they've harvested their wheat.

"Weather conditions currently favor Asian soybean rust development," Hollier said.
