

Johnson's Boucaniere: A new Acadiana tradition

Lori Johnson Walls didn't know how much she would miss the smoked sausage her grandfather and father used to prepare when the family business, Johnson's Grocery of Eunice, closed in 2005.

She has a faint remembrance of the screen door thwacking against the door frame, muddy work boots scuffling upon the oiled pine wood floors and the aroma of boudin cooking in the back kitchen. French was the language of commerce at Johnson's Grocery. Those memories made up a big part of Lori's life.

Today, her conception of Johnson's Boucaniere in Lafayette is not only keeping her Cajun prairie memories alive, she's offered them to the next generation of young Acadians.

Arneastor Johnson and his wife, Doris, first opened the doors of Johnson's Grocery in 1937. Arneastor's first language was, of

course, French. Though he learned English, he was never formally educated. Arneastor's sister, Marie, who had just graduated from St. Edmund's High School, became an integral part of Johnson's Grocery by virtue of her education.

The old country store, located on Maple Street in Eunice, was strictly a dry goods store and made its mark selling rice, corn, green coffee and cracked corn by the barrel or pound. With limited refrigeration, most country folks took care of their own meat and dairy needs by raising pigs, chicken and milk cows.

"People back then knew how to take care of a pig," said Wallace Johnson, Lori's father. "They used everything on the pig."

Mr. Wallace is 81 years old now, but he remembers his father's first foray into the prepared food business.

"Daddy used to buy boudin from

the farmers who made it at their houses," Mr. Wallace said. "Daddy would re-sell the boudin to his customers. That was in 1948. No one was selling boudin in their stores back then."


The store quickly went from selling boudin to making its own smoked sausage and other *viande boucanés* (Cajun French for smoked meats) like tasso and pork roasts.

As Johnson's Grocery's reputation for quality smoked meat and delicious boudin grew, Mr. Wallace's brothers, Matt and Stephen, and another sister, Lorita, came into the business to help.

Growing up in her grandfather's and later her father's grocery store was a wonderful experience for Lori. She learned the value of a dollar and hard work. She and her sister, Claire, brother Kevin and their cousins earned spending

DNA evidence cited in man's guilty plea

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said a St. Tammany Parish man pleaded guilty to simple arson and manufacture of a delayed action incendiary device and was sentenced to ten years hard labor by Judge Richard Schwartz of the 22nd Judicial Court in Covington.

Kenneth W. Singletary, 49, 72533 R. Singletary Road, Pearl River, was arrested in March 2006 and charged with two counts of simple arson and manufacture of an incen-

diary device. Singletary set fires on land owned by Weyerhaeuser Forest Products along La. Hwy. 1088 between Hwy. 36 and Interstate 12.

Singletary pleaded guilty on Sept. 17.

Strain said Forestry Investigator Roy St. Pierre collected DNA evidence from the remains of delayed incendiary devices found at the fire scenes and sent the specimens to the Louisiana State Police Crime Laboratory for analysis. An arrest

was made after the State Police Lab matched the DNA to Singletary.

"Roy conducted a thorough investigation that combined old-fashioned investigatory techniques as well as incorporating the latest advances in DNA match technology and forensic science," Strain said.

In addition to the State Police, Strain said the St. Tammany Sheriff's Office, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and U.S. Forest Service all assisted in

the investigation.

"The fires were all contained quickly but any woods fire has the potential to cause major damage to property and homes," Strain said. "Woods arson is a very serious crime and the Department of Agriculture and Forestry will investigate all cases fully."

Schwartz suspended Singletary's sentence, ordered him to pay a \$2,500 fine and restitution. Singletary will also be under probation for five years.

Applications for renewal must be received no later than September 1. If the owner fails to renew his brand, it will be forfeited on the last day of the year and may thereafter be issued to another applicant.

money working the checkout counter, keeping the onion bin clean, stocking soft drink coolers and fronting shelves.

As the country changed, so did the country store. Grocery stores became supermarkets. Chain stores moved in and the competition for the consumer's dollar was deadly. Convenience stores in high traffic areas shut down many of the tiny neighborhood markets.

The Johnson children, part of a Cajun generation that had more educational, business and social opportunities than ever before, were moving beyond the life of a green grocer. Mr. Wallace grew older and when it came time to retire, the Johnson clan reached a painful decision: Johnson's Grocery would close in 2005.

"My cousins made an effort to keep the store open but the family decided to close the business," Lori said. "I was living in Lafayette with my family. I'd go back on weekends to help out. Saturday was always a big boudin day, but Claire was in Birmingham."

Tears flowed when the doors of Johnson's Grocery closed for the last time, but the family held their head high. The Johnson's had served their customers well for 68 years and made their reputation on the motto "the customer is always right."

But two years later Lori's husband, Greg, noticed something was very, very wrong in the Walls household.

"Greg wanted to know why I had stopped making gumbo," Lori said.

Stopped making gumbo? In some Louisiana towns that's practically grounds for divorce. But Lori, a devoted wife and mother, confided to Greg that she just wasn't pleased with her gumbo any more because she couldn't find any smoked sausage that tasted like the old Johnson's Grocery brand.

There is an old saying that when the going gets tough the tough get going. It mostly applies to football teams and not sausage makers, but drastic times call for drastic measures. Lori decided to make her own smoked sausage, not only to keep marital peace, but to satisfy her own *envie pour le gombo*. In English that means Lori had a powerful hankering for some good old-fashioned chicken and sausage gumbo – made with smoked sausage worthy of Johnson's Grocery.

Lori had learned a lot by watching as her daddy and other family members prepared the meat for the *boucaniere* (pronounced boo-kahn-yerre, which is Cajun French for smokehouse) and thought she knew enough to take a shot at recreating the Johnson's Grocery unique brand of sausage.

"Greg and I converted the brick barbecue pit in our back yard into a smoker," Lori said. "We bought a meat grinder and mixed up 20 pounds of sausage ingredients and we put it in the barbecue pit/smoker."

Lori's father, serving as a technical advisor, proudly observed as Lori's first batch of sausage was lowered into the backyard smoker.

"I was worried that the neighbors would complain about the smoke," Lori said. None did.

"My neighbors and family all said next time you make a batch, make some for us."

Pretty soon Lori was taking orders for a long list of family members, friends and neighbors.

She and Greg had purchased a prime piece of real estate on St. John Street, a chip shot from St. John's Cathedral. Greg, a builder and intern architect, had plans to develop the lots into a mixed-used development with residential and commercial opportunities. The two decided to open a new eatery in the heart of Lafayette that would not only honor their parents and other ancestors, but also preserve that family tradition as master *boucaniers* and serve only the best sausage, brisket and pulled pork they could produce.

The first order of business was to select a name. Lori turned to her father to recommend an appropriate moniker for their Johnson smokehouse. Mr. Wallace didn't have to think very hard or long.

"Daddy said the Cajuns called a smokehouse *une boucaniere* so we named it Johnson's Boucaniere," Lori said.

Johnson's Boucaniere was a success the moment it opened its doors for business in April 2008.

Lori built the menu around the tasty Johnson's sausage recipe and expanded into tasso and beef jerky.

Plate lunches featuring the sausage as well as pulled pork and beef brisket round out the lunch menu, but specialty plate lunches like shrimp stew, pork chops and cabbage rolls are featured on a rotating basis.

Johnson's Boucaniere also serves boudin, the Cajun rice sausage that is the original fast food of South Louisiana.

Lori said she didn't plan to feature boudin at all but the customers who remembered the delicious Johnson's Grocery recipe demanded it.

"I got with Uncle Matt to reduce the recipe from hundreds of pounds to a smaller amount," Lori said. "He used to measure out the ingredients in scoops. We had to figure out how that translated into tablespoons and everything."

In addition to serving boudin links, Johnson's Boucaniere features a boudin burger.

Lori credits Uncle Matt with the creation of the boudin burger.


A boudin burger is boudin dressing flattened into a patty, dusted with a light bread-ing batter and fried. It's served on a bun with Matt's secret sauce and American cheese.

The creation of the boudin burger paid big dividends as the new sandwich took first place honors in the recent Lafayette Boudin Cookoff in the unlinked category.

It's not just the food that sets Johnson's Boucaniere apart from the pack. The building that Greg conceptualized and built for Johnson's Boucaniere is just as fundamental to the Cajun heritage as the noon time plate lunches.

The distinctive two-story building on St. John primarily uses a material, Galvalume, that resembles the ubiquitous corrugated tin roofs of many older Cajun cottages. Though Lori envisioned their restaurant as strictly a take-out service, a stylish open-air dining deck with nouveau picnic tables and benches was added because the customers wanted seating.

"I used regional material in a different

way," Greg said. "I believe that if you use regional materials that are familiar that people will be accepting. I just reoriented some of the materials to emphasize the linear aspects of the design."

Included in the plan was a large 12' by 20' smoke house located at the back of the restaurant.

Greg and Lori and their two children will live in the upstairs apartment for a year while plans are finalized to develop the rest of the property.

With outstanding quality and delicious food, Lori's business grew rapidly. She needed more help. Mr. Wallace decided to leave his newfound retirement and drive down from Eunice on a daily basis to help Lori with counter duties. Sister Claire was enticed to relocate from Birmingham, Alabama, to the Hub City to help.

Last year for the holiday season Johnson's Boucaniere sold smoked pork roasts and briskets for Thanksgiving and Christmas. This year they'll be adding smoked turkeys

into the mix.

Lori, Claire and Mr. Wallace all attribute the success of Johnson's Boucaniere to two things: quality ingredients and quality service.

"We use quality meat and we smoke our sausage just a little bit longer," Lori said. "And we live by the customer is always right."

More importantly, the family business has been reborn.

"It's an honor to have Dad here working alongside me and Claire," Lori said. "I'm glad customers come in and share stories with him about the old store and I love to hear the stories. I know how much it means to him."

What does *boucaniere* mean?

The origin of the word for smoke house, *boucaniere* (boo-kahn-**yerre**), comes from the French for buccaneer, *boucanier* (boo-kahn-**ear**). The French buccaneers were said to have smoked their meat to provide nourishment for long voyages.

Not to sully the image of a swash-buckling Errol Flynn engaging renegade pirates in the movie *Captain Blood* or even Captain Jack Sparrow sashaying about in *Pirates of the Carribean*, but the original *boucaniers* were barbecue chefs.

The first recorded use of the French word *boucanier* referred to a person on the islands of Hispaniola and Tortuga who hunted wild oxen and boars and

smoked the meat in a barbecue frame known in French as a *boucan* (boo-kahn).

Boucan came from a Tupi word meaning "a rack used for roasting or for storing things."

At some point these early barbecuers or *boucaniers* gave up their pastoral life of hunting wild pigs for a more lucrative profession like piracy. Apparently, the *boucaniers* could make a good living attacking ships laden with gold departing from the Spanish Main.

The English language borrowed the word and it originally meant meat smoker in 1661. By 1690, the word had taken on the meaning of pirate.

"Hot Boudin Today" is a sign everyone likes to encounter in South Louisiana.

It means the boudin is freshly made.

The effective hand-crafted "Hot Boudin Today" sign placed on the grassy area in front of Johnson's Boucaniere on St. John Street in Lafayette is the same sign that once advertised the delicious Cajun staple at Johnson's Grocery in Eunice.

Wallace Johnson, 81, said his business was well-served by the primitive plywood sign but it's a small miracle the placard made it to the new shop in Lafayette. It was once reported stolen.

Mr. Wallace said a busload of unnamed attorneys on a "Boudin Tour" stopped every year at his store for a boudin sampling. As usual, the attorneys called in their order enroute and descended upon the market to make their purchases.

Saturday was always a busy boudin day for Johnson's Grocery.

It was the day when Mr. Wallace's brother, Matt, would arrive at 2:30 a.m. to begin cooking a 400-pound



batch of the fresh rice and pork sausage.

The rowdy lawyers' ultimate destination was Fred's Lounge in Mamou where they could participate in KVPI's live Cajun music radio broadcast of "Saturday at Fred's."

The attorneys planned to quaff a few adult beverages and dance the morning away at the famous watering hole.

It was shortly after the Boudin Tour bus left Johnson's Grocery

when Mr. Wallace noticed his "Hot Boudin Today" sign had gone missing. Suspicion immediately fell upon the officers of the court. There were hints and allegations of wrongdoing but nothing could be proved. One thing was for certain: someone had absconded with the "Hot Boudin Today" beacon.

Two weeks later, someone from Fred's Lounge called and informed Mr. Wallace the "Hot Boudin Today" sign had been recovered at the honky-tonk.

Was it a pang of conscience that caused the guilty party to leave the sign at Fred's? It's doubtful – we're talking about lawyers after all. More likely, it was a clear case of amnesia brought on by inebriation.

But Mr. Wallace learned a valuable lesson. The next year when the attorney's infamous Boudin Tour bus rolled into the Johnson's Grocery parking lot, he picked up his "Hot Boudin Today" sign and brought it indoors.

5-mile trail system to open at Burden Center

The Burden Horticulture Society will conduct a ribbon-cutting ceremony at 10 a.m. Nov. 7 to celebrate for the grand opening of Trees and Trails, a 5-mile system of pedestrian, recreational and educational trails located at the LSU AgCenter's Burden Center in the heart of Baton Rouge.

"The backbone of these trails was originally designed by Steele Burden as meandering paths through part of the Burden Woods, a natural resource and wildlife treasure in the historic 440 acres of Burden Center," said Jeff Kuehny, an LSU AgCenter horticulturist. "These trails provide a natural location for education and exercise," Kuehny said, pointing out they were established through the financial support of the Louisiana Recreational Trails Fund Program, the Junior League, Forum 35, Baton Rouge Green and the Burden Center.

"These organizations spent many hours of volunteer labor to lay out and construct the nature trails, design and build bridges, reforest and plant native shrubs and trees, and install signage," he said.

The Louisiana Recreational Trails Fund Program provided funds last summer to help repair trails and signage and restore the forest following major damage from Hurricane Gustav.

"These trails will support a vari-

ety of activities, including hiking, accessibility for people with disabilities, and interpretative and educational activities for adventure and discovery," Kuehny said.

"This provides a framework of nature experiences with interpretative rest stop areas, while at the same time accommodating the need of the general public for access to a safe environment designed to promote exercise and fitness," he added.

On January 15, Louisiana's Arbor Day, the Burden Horticulture Society will host a tree planting as part of the reforestation plan, the LSU AgCenter horticulturist said. The public is invited to join in planting trees along the trail system and purchase trees for planting.

Trees and Trails provides opportunities for youth recreation programming, and plans are in the works to build an outdoor classroom to bring students in touch with the natural world, the urban ecosystem and the cultural heritage of the region, Kuehny said.

"The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry has worked closely with many of the project partners to develop learning opportunities along the trails that will use award-winning Project Learning Tree activities," he said.

Christmas tree forecast looking very merry

Everything looks good for the Christmas tree crop in Louisiana, said Don Reed, LSU AgCenter forestry and wildlife specialist.

Reed, who also is a Christmas tree grower, and Dora Ann Hatch, an LSU AgCenter community rural development agent, recently met with 70 Christmas tree farmers from Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama at the annual meeting of the Southern Christmas Tree Association in Pitkin. "We haven't had any hurricanes, and that is always good news," Reed said. "This will be as good a year as any."

Hatch said people are motivated to buy real trees because of tradition, memories and "going green." She explained when consumers go green they recycle the trees for sand and soil erosion barriers and for fish shelters in ponds.

Artificial trees, on the other hand, are petroleum-based products that consume vast resources during fabrication and are not biodegradable, Reed added.

The meeting also covered agritourism. "A lot of the growers are doing more than trees," Reed said, citing pumpkin patches and arts and crafts. He used Curry Farms in Start as an example in which the operation branched out to offer a corn maze, pumpkins and parties.

Curry Farms began growing trees

in 1981 and sold its first crop in 1983. "We've been selling ever since," said Bentley Curry, who operates the business with his wife, Sandy.

The corn maze is in its fourth year, and a pumpkin patch returned for the second time.

All of the trees are choose-and-cut. Prices average \$10 per foot, with trees ranging from 5 to 13 feet tall.

"The most important benefit from choose-and-cut is freshness," Reed said. "You know it's going to last well past Christmas."

He advised knowing the size of tree needed before shopping and to place it in water as soon as you get home. "Keep it away from a heat source," he added.

The sales target at Curry is 1,000 trees this year, Bentley said. Trees encompass 7 acres of planted area and take up 12 acres including the road. The whole farm is a former 40-acre cotton field.

"People really want a tree that holds needles and supports heavy ornaments," Sandy Curry said, adding that pre-lit trees are major competition, but they don't offer an aroma.

She said the LSU AgCenter has been a source of information. "As individuals, there is no way to compile all the information and do the research they do," she noted.

Weeds and herbicides were another

part of the meeting.

"Christmas tree growers who are able to identify troublesome weeds can tailor a weed management program based on their most difficult weed problems," said Ron Strahan, weed specialist for the LSU AgCenter, in an interview following the meeting.

"At the very basic level, a Christmas tree grower needs to be able to identify if the weed is a broadleaf, grass or sedge," Strahan said, explaining, that broadleaf weeds have netted leaf veins, tap roots, showy flowers and in many cases, as the name implies, broader leaves than other plants.

Grasses have fibrous roots, parallel leaf veins and non-showy flowers while sedges are grass-like plants with triangular stems, the weed scientist added.

The base of weed control should be timely applications of pre-emergence herbicides. Another strategy is to tank-mix post-emergence herbicides with pre-emergence herbicides. "This will allow the control of existing weeds and prevent several troublesome weeds from having an opportunity to compete with the Christmas trees," Strahan said.


