The crawfish of the 2009-2010 season made a splashy debut on the national television cablecast of the LSU-Arkansas football game on Nov. 28.

ESPN color announcer Todd Blackledge featured boiled crawfish on his Taste of the Town second quarter segment during the game. Blackledge visited Sammy's Grill on Highland Road and shot plenty of video of Louisiana crawfish, one of the state's most visible crustacean ambassadors.

"I've always loved coming to Baton Rouge," Blackledge said. "People love to cook and love to eat."

True that, but no doubt many viewers forgot about the crawfish feature after LSU's thrilling come-from-behind victory over the Razorbacks. The moment wasn't wasted on the crawfish industry. Crawfish producers know if conditions are favorable in the late fall and early winter that crawfish will run. It means a chance to get an early start on recouping their annual investment in the equipment, bait, and manpower they put into their business.


Blackledge, a former college quarterback at Penn State, knows all about a game plan but he didn't exactly know how to peel crawfish. He said the peeling technique was a little similar to shelling pistachios.

"You've got to get a system (to peel crawfish)," Blackledge said. He had to come up with his own game plan to effectively peel the shell, but when he did, he easily polished off the four-pound tray. As Blackledge ate his first perfectly seasoned crawfish tail from Sammy's Grill, he looked up at the camera then down at the heaping mound of crawfish and said, "Time to go to work."



Sammy Nagem, owner of Sammy's, went to work on his Highland Road restaurant back in 1988. Since then he has created a reputation of considerable stature based on crawfish. Sammy's Grill prides itself on being the first restaurant to serve boiled crawfish in the capitol city every year.

Arkansas man arrested on timber theft

Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry investigators recently arrested an Arkansas man on felony timber theft charges.

Ernest Biddle, 56, of 908 Bourbon Street, Lewisville, Ark., was arrested Dec. 10, 2009, by LDAF forestry investigators at the Bossier Parish Medium Security Jail in Benton.

Forestry Enforcement Manager Jim Baldwin said the charges resulted from a complaint filed in

early 2009. The complaint alleges that while Biddle was cutting timber for a Bossier Parish landowner, he also cut three acres of timber from an adjoining piece of property.

"After the landowner, a logger himself, discovered Mr. Biddle had pushed a logging road across his property without permission, both the landowner and his brother showed Mr. Biddle the property lines and instructed him not to cut any of their property," Baldwin said. "Several days later

the landowner returned to his property and discovered nearly three acres of his timber had been cut.

Biddle cut about three loads of hardwood pulpwood and one load of hardwood ties valued at \$3,000.

Biddle was also arrested earlier this year by forestry investigators on timber theft charges for failing to pay a Bossier Parish landowner for \$4,000 worth of timber he was legally logging.

"LDAF investigators take agri-

culture and forestry related crimes very seriously and they will seek justice when individuals break the law," Strain said. "But I advise everyone who believes they may be victim of timber theft to immediately report a suspected crime. The sooner investigators can get started investigating the better."

Strain urged anyone suspecting they may have been a victim of timber theft to call the Baton Rouge headquarters at 225-925-4500.

fish in the mid-1990s.

Just like it takes a while for a crawfish pot to come to boil, it took time for Sammy's to acquire the reputation as the best restaurant to get boiled crawfish in Baton Rouge.

Finding reliable sources of live crawfish, fine-tuning the process of washing the product and perfecting the recipe was not easy.

"At first we had to scramble find the best possible live crawfish," Nagem said.

With having to create an outdoor kitchen to handle the volume of crawfish, the boiling temperatures and spicy seasonings the costs are figured differently at Sammy's.

"Serving boiled crawfish in a restaurant is very labor intensive," Nagem said. "When we do our food cost calculations for the restaurant, we do a separate cost analysis for crawfish and a different one for the other menu items."

As far as advertising, Nagem took a grass roots approach.

"It took us a few years to build crawfish up," Nagem said. "We went with word of mouth instead of any major marketing push."

The LSU-Arkansas football game Taste of the Town feature was lagniappe advertising for Sammy's.

"We got a lot of response from around the country, not only for the boiled crawfish, but also for the shrimp Bienville recipe that was also featured," Nagem said. "The main thing the segment did for our crawfish business was that it let everyone in Baton

Rouge area know we have crawfish earlier than they usually know."

About the shrimp Bienville recipe: Nagem said they had so many questions about the dish, he posted the recipe on the Sammy's Website at www.SammysGrillOnline.com. It is also listed here in the Market Bulletin.

Sammy's Grill will serve hot boiled crawfish from November to June. During that period, Nagem estimates his restaurant will go through a half-million pounds of crawfish.

"Seafood sales peak during Lent but the best crawfish comes after Easter," Nagem said. "We'll keep on selling boiled crawfish after Easter and as long as they meet our quality standards."

Nagem said it is a lot of work to create an efficient restaurant cooking environment to serve boiled crawfish but he is expecting to expand his Baton Rouge market. He also has plans on bringing a Sammy's Grill and his boiled crawfish setup to out of state location such as Dallas.

According to LSU AgCenter statistics, more than a 2,600 crawfish farmers and wild crawfish fisherman trapped nearly 134 million pounds of live crawfish during the 2008 season. The total value-added value was calculated at almost \$330 million.

It's too soon to say how good a crawfish season restaurant's like Sammy's Grill will have, but everyone knows if you want to have the best crawfish, you should always get Louisiana crawfish.

Sammy's Grill shrimp Bienville recipe



In addition to having Sammy's Grill boiled crawfish featured on the ESPN national telecast of the LSU-Arkansas football game on Nov. 28, the restaurant's delicious shrimp Bienville dish was also mentioned.

Sammy Nagem, owner of Sammy's Grill, said he received so many phone calls about the recipe he decided to feature it on his Web site for a limited time.

With permission, the Louisiana Market Bulletin has posted the recipe here.

Shrimp Bienville

French bread
16/20 count Shrimp, peeled, tail on (8 per serving)
1.5 oz. Butter
1 oz. (vol.) Blackening Seasoning
1 oz. (vol.) Green onions, finely diced
12 oz. (vol.) White Sauce (recipe below)

Cut two about 5 inch lengths from a loaf of French bread. Cut each piece in half at a severe diagonal, creating a round base with a point toward the top of the bread when laid on the flat base. Cut a 2" length from the remainder of the loaf of bread, creating a piece resembling a hockey puck. Place the bread face down on a hot flame grill to mark the bread and slightly toast it. Place the pointed bread pieces on end around the second piece.

Heat butter in a skillet on high. Add 8 shrimp, green onion, and blackening seasoning. Sauté shrimp until pink, eliminating all grey color. Immediately add white sauce to skillet. Mix thoroughly allowing sauce to heat to a boil, mixing all ingredients well.

Once sauce has boiled, immediately cut the heat off and ladle the sauce over the bread slices and pour the shrimp and remaining sauce over the center piece. Garnish with parsley over entire

dish and the rim of the plate. Also sprinkle with sliced green onions, and garnish the rim of the plate with blackening seasoning.

*White Sauce

1 stick Butter
2 cups Monterrey Jack Cheese
3 pods garlic
¼ cup Parmesan Cheese
½ cup diced onions
½ tsp. red pepper
2/3 cup flour
½ tsp. salt
3 cups half & half

Melt butter in skillet. Process onion and garlic in processor, then sauté in butter. Add flour, stirring constantly until smooth. Slowly add half & half, then cheeses, salt and pepper, stirring constantly.

Cook on low heat until smooth.

Boll Weevil program important for La. cotton industry

The boll weevil is an invasive and destructive cotton pest that has plagued the cotton industry in Louisiana and the United States for more than one hundred years. The Boll Weevil Eradication Program has been a hot topic lately given the state's budget problems and efforts by the Streamlining Commission to look for ways to cut costs. This important agricultural program affecting one of Louisiana's leading crops should not be among programs targeted for elimination.

The cotton industry is not only critical to the economic stability of our rural parishes, but to the entire state. In 2007, cotton was worth more than \$200 million to the state but declined in 2008 due to harvesting issues caused by hurricanes Gustav and Ike. The 2008 numbers totaled to more than 290,000 acres planted with a gross farm value of \$122 million with a total value to the state's economy of \$185.4 million. Since 1997, approximately \$167 million dollars has been spent on boll weevil eradication (\$77.6 million by the state, \$25 million by USDA, and \$64.3 million by the cotton growers) in a unified eradication program. During this time, cotton production has increased from 605 lbs. per acre to an average of 1,137 lbs. per acre in 2007.

The Boll Weevil Eradication Program is part of a nation-wide effort to eradicate this pest from the United States. At the national level, the program started on each coast in North Carolina and California, and moved toward the center of the cotton region and will ultimately end in Texas at the Mexican border.

After enduring five hurricane events since 2005, the program is making significant progress. This year, the program monitored and surveyed 229,869 acres of cotton in the state. This acreage comprises all areas of cotton production within the state. The cotton growing parishes along the Red River (formerly the Red River Zone) remain free of boll weevils and continue to be monitored with in-field traps. Additionally, cotton harvesting equipment moving into Louisiana is inspected and phytosanitary certificates reviewed to ensure compliance with regula-

tions to prevent boll weevil reintroduction by mechanical means. Based on survey data and program protocol, for crop year 2009, a cumulative total of 99,865 acres were treated for boll weevils in the northeast region of the state resulting in a 98% reduction in boll weevil population from the previous crop year.

The goal of the Boll Weevil Eradication Program is to complete eradication by the end of the next crop year. If the program is properly funded by the legislature for one more year, we can achieve complete eradica-

tion by the end of the next crop year and eliminate the boll weevil as an imminent threat to our cotton industry, one year ahead of previous projections. Our efforts will then turn to surveillance and containment financed solely on the acreage assessment paid by the cotton producers themselves.

Failure to aggressively finish this program has many consequences, including: the boll weevil re-establishing itself and spreading as it can reproduce and cycle 7 times on one growing season; the loss of investment and revenue to-date given the potential returns on such an investment; movement of cotton material and equipment would be restricted and allowed only within Louisiana state boundaries when the proposed federal quarantine for boll weevils goes into effect (the anticipated date is June 2011); increases in boll weevil population would result in an increase in the amount of insecticides adversely impacting the environment in addition to loss of investments in Best Management Practices (BMP); reduction in cotton acreage due to increased insect control cost; and the loss of jobs and existing infrastructure due to reduction of cotton acreage.

After 100 years and \$167 million, we are within reach of containing this pest and permanently eliminating this threat to our vital cotton industry. I would like to thank our cotton producers, applicators, Boll Weevil Eradication Commission members, Technical Advisory Committee members, the Department of Agriculture and Forestry program personnel, and the taxpayers for working so hard together to achieve this goal.

LSU AgCenter establishes Louisiana biofuels institute

The LSU AgCenter has received the go-ahead from the Board of Regents to begin establishing the Louisiana Institute for Biofuels and Bioprocessing.

"This has moved us a step forward in our efforts to boost the biofuels business in the state," said John Russin, LSU AgCenter associate vice chancellor and institute director. "The institute puts a face on our biofuels research and will help us obtain grants."

Russin said the Regents' approval is conditional for one year, during which time the LSU AgCenter is to form an advisory board and set up the structure for expansion of bioenergy research.

"The LSU AgCenter made a major commitment about five years ago to funnel resources into bioenergy research because of the critical need," said David Boethel,

LSU AgCenter vice chancellor for research. "Louisiana is uniquely positioned for production of biofuels because of our diverse agricultural and forestry production sectors."

One research focus at the AgCenter has been the development of new crop varieties high in biomass, which can be converted into biofuel. One of the AgCenter's accomplishments so far is the development of three sugarcane varieties, known as "energy cane," which are higher in fiber than regular sugarcane and yet produce raw sugar.

"These varieties serve a dual purpose – as a source of sugar and fiber, which can be converted to ethanol," Russin said. "They offer the opportunity of new markets for our sugarcane farmers."

Scientists at the Audubon Sugar Institute,

a research unit within the AgCenter located in St. Gabriel, have been conducting research on more cost-effective processes for converting the sugarcane fiber, known as bagasse, into ethanol and have received several patents for their discoveries. They are testing these processes in their laboratories for potential adoption by sugar mills in the state.

Another crop under investigation as a source for ethanol is sweet sorghum – a high-fiber plant that's a cousin of grain sorghum but looks more like sugarcane. Its advantage is it can grow on marginal soils and can be harvested with the same equipment as sugarcane.

In north Louisiana, LSU AgCenter researchers are conducting experiments with switchgrass, a highly fibrous grass that

grows quickly and can be grown amidst pine trees, allowing landowners to get more value from their land.

Other research projects under way include determining the biofuel potential from low-value trees, wood waste and the Chinese tallow tree.

A new area of research is finding ways to grow algae and extract biofuel ingredients. The LSU AgCenter has already been funded for two projects on algae this year, Russin said.

"Having this institute as sort of a one-stop shop will help strengthen our ability to bring in outside funding and broaden our research," Russin said. "This has tremendous potential for economic development in the state."
