

LDAF produces top notch seedlings

State Reforestation Chief Randy Rentz is again counting on the aging, but reliable industrial-sized walk-in cooler located at the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's tree nursery in Columbia.

The nursery is part of a proud legacy of LDAF's dedication to providing hardy, disease-resistant and affordable tree seedlings for the state of Louisiana. The Columbia Nursery, located near the banks of the Ouachita River in Caldwell Parish just north of former Governor John McKeithen's hometown, is one of three tree seedling operations owned by the state.

The cooler can store about two million freshly harvested pine seedlings.

Rentz and Columbia Nursery Superintendent Allen Brown planted more than 14 million loblolly and slash pine seedlings last spring at the Columbia location and expect to harvest 12 million by the time March 15 rolls around.

Twelve million is a large number. Think of 12 million cars. 12 million is three times that of Louisiana's population. It would take more than 164 Superdomes lined end to end to hold 12 million of

the Who Dat Nation.

Will the seedling cooler be able to handle the volume?

"Yes," Rentz says. "We harvest the seedlings as we take orders so we never fill the cooler up unless the seedlings are ready for delivery."

Rentz is also over the LDAF's Beauregard Nursery in DeRidder and says Beauregard Nursery Superintendent Kinney Hanchey planted eight million loblolly, slash and longleaf pines.

All together 22 million pine seedlings were grown at both nurseries. In addition to the pines, a state hardwood nursery is located at the LDAF facil-


ity in Monroe and specializes in hardwoods like baldcypress and oaks. In all, 31 different species of hardwoods are grown there.

Seedling customers are mostly private landowners, forestry consultants and private industry that are replanting clear-cut land. Other customers are taking advantage of government programs that pay to reforest marginal farmland that will eventually

LDAF completes advanced emergency response training

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's (LDAF) all-hazard incident management team recently completed advanced training in the federal Incident Command System (ICS) and is one of the most highly-trained emergency response teams among state agencies, Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. said.

"Our command and general staff completed the 430-level class in Operations Section Chief training jointly with United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) personnel from Louisiana, Oklahoma and Mississippi. A representative from the Mississippi Board of

Animal Health also participated in the training that took place in early January," Strain said. "Our department is compliant with National Incident Management Systems (NIMS) training requirements."

Management of emergencies, or incidents, is based on NIMS principals that help emergency responders organize to contain and control the impact of a disaster, which can be as large as a hurricane or as small as a high-way chemical spill.

The three-day class was conducted by John Roberts and Mark Goeller of Oklahoma. The training was held at LDAF headquarters in Baton Rouge.

Roberts was part of the emergency response team that dealt with the World Trade Center terrorist attack on September 11, 2001. Roberts also worked with emergency operations after Hurricane Katrina struck Louisiana in 2005.

Roberts is accredited by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and USDA to teach advanced emergency response training.

Goeller served on the Columbia Shuttle recovery operations and hurricanes Ivan and Rita emergency response teams. Goeller is also fully certified to train emergency management teams.

Strain said the training was

paid for by the State Homeland Security Program grant funds.

The LDAF all-hazard incident management team has completed ICS course levels 100, 200, 700 and 800, which are Internet based. The 300 and 400 level courses are taught in the classroom. Roberts also conducted the LDAF's 300 level class in August 2009, Strain said.

"I'm proud of the level of commitment the LDAF staff has displayed in undertaking this higher training and responsibility," Strain said. "I believe that when the time comes to respond to a crisis, the LDAF will be there to protect the agricultural interests of Louisiana.

provide wildlife habitat.

Brown and Rentz walk out into the 20 acres of fields that have been planted, not only with pine seedlings, but with specialty hardwood seeds like catalpa, mayhaw and red mulberry.

Two tractors followed by a harvesting crew is moving side by side down the four-foot wide elevated rows. The rows are saturated with tiny pine trees.

Brown began supervising the harvest in late November.

The harvesting tractor passes and pulls a lifting machine which pushes a cutting blade below the soil surface just underneath the taproot of the pine seedlings and uproots or "lifts" the plant from the dirt. Field hands following the tractor gather the seedlings, which are about ten inches in length, and lay them inside plastic tubs. When the tubs are full they are brought to the trailing packing trailer where they are treated with root protection solution and bundled into measures of 1,000.

Brown said some planters want to plant their seedlings in November before they go dormant in a process known as hot planting, but most planters wait to reforest until the dead of winter.

But whenever the pine seedlings are planted, customers know they are getting a seedling product that is as good or better than any on the market.

"The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's seedlings are as good a seedling as anyone can grow," Rentz says. "We are growing superior and advanced generation loblolly and slash

pine."

Rentz says the LDAF's advanced generation loblolly seedlings will have a 34 percent gain over an unimproved variety. The slash pine will reflect a 48 percent gain.

"Louisiana Forestry was one of the original members of the Western Gulf Forest Tree Improvement Co-Op in 1969," Rentz said. "The group was started to improve the quality of material used in reforestation efforts across the South."

Rentz says the co-op's work has been nothing short of stellar.

"It was a unified effort between the state, private and industry interests to reforest land quickly and efficiently," Rentz says. "It means less land can be used to grow trees and the trees are providing more volume."

The co-op does an extensive amount of testing before it will release a new tree for planting, Rentz says.

"It's seven to ten years of progressive testing," he says. "They measure for height, form and disease resistance."

"When I started in Louisiana forestry 29 years ago, three-quarters of the seeds used to plant our nurseries were woods-run seed. By 1984, all of the seed we planted was genetically improved and came from the state's seed orchards."

Rentz says the improved pine seed are better for the environment because they can grow just as quickly without harsh chemical soil treatments.

"The Environmental Protection Agency is limiting the use of some soil treatments, like methyl bromide, to fumigate the land

for planting," Rentz says. "For the last five years about half of our crop at Columbia has been grown without the use of methyl bromide and our trees are performing as good as or better than they ever have."

The bottom line is the quality.

"We're providing Louisiana landowners with a high quality genetically improved tree at a reasonable price," Rentz says.

Purchase high quality shade tree seedlings from LDAF

Louisiana's homeowners, hobby urban foresters and gardeners alike have come to anticipate the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's annual Shade Tree Packet Sale.

They know they'll be able to purchase a variety of shade tree hardwood and pine seedlings that are descended from superior stock. Residents can also purchase the seedlings in small packets.

This year the sale will run from March 1 through March 5. In the Lafayette and Opelousas area, the sale will start on Feb. 27 and end March 6.

The trees available include baldcypress, Chinese elm, cow oak, Shumard oak, river birch, and red maple.

Loblolly pine seedling packets will be available at all locations

except Lafayette and Opelousas. Instead of loblolly, slash pine will be offered for sale in Lafayette and New Orleans.

The seedling sale will be at a variety of locations across the state at LDAF district facilities.

From March 1 through March 5, seedling packets will be presented for sale at special tables inside the forestry offices in Baton Rouge, Haughton, Monroe, Jena, Oberlin, Opelousas, Hammond and New Orleans.

In Lafayette, the seedling sale will be one day only on Feb. 27. In Opelousas, the sale takes place from March 1 through March 6.

The individual species packets of pine and hardwoods are \$3.00 per packet.

The pine packet contains 20 seedlings.

The hardwood packets contain 6 seedlings and include 2 baldcypress and one Chinese elm, cow oak, Shumard oak and river birch

Additionally, individual species packets of red maple and river birch may be purchased and will contain 6 seedlings.

Protect your trees

Landscape beds, parking lots and construction activities around trees are all possible without harming the trees if you understand where the tree roots are and what they need to survive.

A tree's important feeder roots are located in the surface soil and radiate out in all directions far beyond the crown spread of the tree. To survive, roots need oxygen, adequate moisture and organic soil components. Fill dirt, soil compaction, soil contaminants and damaging or cutting roots will kill trees.

Use the following guidelines to protect trees in potentially damaging situations:

Landscape beds

- Use a coarse organic soil mix when constructing beds around

trees. Do not use any soil mix that has clay or silt in it.

- Do not till or dig up the existing soil around the tree.

- Only dig the holes necessary to install landscape plants.

- Do not install plants within two feet of the trunk or root collar of the tree.

- Install irrigation in beds around trees very carefully. Do not cut through feeder roots to install irrigation pipes. Do not arrange sprinkle heads so that water hits the trunk of the tree.

- Select drought-tolerant plants for beds under trees. Some landscape plants require more water than most trees. Irrigate as little as possible.

- Check the irrigation system

often and fix leaks immediately. Parking lots

- Use tree species that are tolerant of heat and root restrictions. Consider the growth form of tree selections. Live oak and Chinese elm have low-spreading forms that require almost constant pruning.

- Root barriers or deflectors can be installed to prevent roots from lifting or otherwise damaging parking surfaces.

- The critical soil space for a tree in a parking lot is 100 square feet with a 5-foot minimum width.

- In concrete or asphalt parking lots, a minimum of 400 square feet (20 feet x 20 feet) planting area for each tree is necessary for healthier, more long-lived trees.

- Porous parking lots made of

gravel, limestone or grass pavers are much better for trees because the roots can survive under the parking lot and are not as restricted by the size of the planting space. Construction sites

- The first thing that should be done to protect trees in a construction area is to communicate with the construction crew and educate them about protecting the trees from construction activities.

- Protect the critical root zone with a fence completely around the tree. The critical root zone is equal at minimum to the crown spread of the tree. A fence is more substantial and works much better than flagging.

- Before construction begins, treat the critical root zone area by aerating the soil, applying a root stimula-

tor and mulching. This should continue for a year after construction.

- Do not trench for electrical, water, sewer, gas or any other reason in the root zone.

- Do not grade, fill or otherwise disturb the soil in the root zone.

- Do not park vehicles or heavy equipment or store materials within the fenced area.

- Do not dump concrete, drywall, paint or any other material in the root zone.

- Do not attach signs or otherwise damage the trunk or branches.

- Do not allow anyone except an arborist to prune the tree for any reason.

- Do not take down the fence until all construction is finished.

Oustanding ag producers honored at luncheon

Three awards for outstanding achievement in agriculture were presented at the North Louisiana Agri-Business Council Annual Awards and Legislative Appreciation Luncheon. The event was held at the University of Louisiana at Monroe Library January 15.

Jason Anderson of Union Parish was selected as the 2009 Young Agricultural Producer Award while Mike Smith of Winn Parish took home the 2009 Outstanding Agricultural Producer award and Fred Bolding of West Carroll Parish received the 2009 Distinguished Service to Agriculture Award.

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., was the keynote speaker.

The luncheon is held annually as part of Ag Expo. This year's luncheon was sponsored by the North Louisiana Agri-Business Council and LSU AgCenter. Ag Expo 2010 celebrated its 28th year.

Anderson and his wife, Anne, took over the Binford Farm in 2005 after the death of his mother-in-law, Mrs. Barbara Binford.

With no prior farming experience, Anderson learned the poultry and cattle business quickly. He retrofitted four poultry houses himself, built manure storage and composting facilities thus reviving an aging poultry farm into one of the top producing farms in the parish.

After the poultry industry downturn, Anderson took to growing watermelons to supplement his family's income during these very uncertain times.

Smith, a cattleman, was involved in agriculture at a very young age. He showed livestock in 4-H and Future Farming of America competitions throughout grade school.

After earning his bachelor's degree in agriculture at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, Smith returned to his farming roots in Winn Parish. Smith works about 2200 acres with

over 400 acres in hay and 800 acres in timber production. The Winnfield native has one of the largest Hereford herds in the South, with more than 600 head.

Smith also produces top notch F1 cattle. He incorporates forestry and hay production in his cattle operation to utilize every aspect of his property.

Smith is a member of a numerous organizations including the Winn Parish Cattlemen's Association, Louisiana Cattlemen's, Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation and the Winn Parish LSU AgCenter Agriculture Advisory Council.

Bolding's farm career spans more than four decades and began with a modest operation of 160 acres. He now owns more than 1000 acres of farmland in West Carroll Parish where he produces soybeans as well as wheat, grain sorghum and cattle.

Bolding is also active in many organizations, including the West Carroll Farm Bureau Federation, Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation (LFBF), Louisiana Soybean Association, Louisiana Cattlemen's Association, Louisiana Sweet Potato Association and the Northeast Louisiana Agri-business Council.

Bolding has been recognized for his outstanding farming practices and accomplishments over the years and in 2009 he was named Farmer of the Year by the Louisiana Agri-News Network, Louisiana Department of Agriculture & Forestry, LSU AgCenter, LFBF.
